# MINUTES OF MEETING HELD THURSDAY, APRIL 25, 2008 IN LUBIN HALL

The meeting was called to order at 7:15 PM by Vincent Prezioso, First Vice Chair.

#### I. Minutes

II. Chairman's Report - Vincent Prezioso

John stated that in this instance it was not a problem as it only involved a change to an existing home.

Al D'Angelo asked about the Mayor's tree planning program. He asked if Morris Park would be getting some of these trees.

John explained how the tree planting would be accomplished. He also went into detail on under what circumstances the city will make the repairs to the flags that have been raised due to the tree rootes. He stated that a representative from Parks will be at the next Park Committee meeting.

Bob Potter asked when Circuit City will be opening. John said that they are slated to open on or about August 1<sup>st</sup>.

Andy reported that May 3<sup>rd</sup> is Team Up to Clean Up. He stated that today was the deadline to register your area.
