MINUTES

GUESTS: Police Officer Tyrone Mederos (49th NYPD Precinct), Erika Diaz (Bronx District Attorney’s Office) and Roxanne Delgado (member of the public)

The meeting was called to order at 7:08 p.m.

1. Introductions
2. 49th Precinct NYPD Briefing
 - P.O. Mederos provided the following report
 - a. Crime is up 145% in the last 28 days compared to this time last year
 - b. Robberies are up 161% in the last 28 days
 - c. Unattended vehicle theft high in Allerton, Morris Park and White Plains Road
 - d. Utility vans and Hondas are #1 for being stolen or broken into
 - e. Robbery patterns: food delivery originating from 43rd Precinct; people getting robbed by a group in Van Nest
 - f. Burglary pattern in Morris Park: 3 instances, 2 with same address
 - g. January 8 there was a shooting in Parkside Houses
 - D. Williams thanked Mederos for the PD’s response to problems at Eastchester Road and Fenton Avenue.
 - E. Rodriguez asked about response time for vehicles, which were broken into. Mederos said the Precinct lost 30+ officers in the last year, and there were 4,000 quality of life complaints.
