MINUTES

Meeting began at 1:05 p.m.

1. Introductions
 H. Lasky took attendance, announcing the agencies and elected official representatives present.
2. Community Board Report
 No report in meeting.
3. Agency Reports
 E. Ardizzone, DEP, reported no major updates.
 C. Rodriguez, CB11 Chair, mentioned issues with several catch basins that may need to be reviewed.
 Ardizzone clarified that maintenance is complaint-driven and basins typically function properly after being drained by heavy rain.
 K. Johnson, DOHMH, announced a new respiratory illness data portal will replace previous surveillance reports. Johnson encouraged everyone to get flu shots after a recent influx of flu and COVID cases. Free vaccination sites available on HealthMap.
 J. Soto, Bronx DOT, forwarded catch basin issue to roadway crew and reported a wrap up on paving locations in District 11. Outstanding projects will be schedules for 2026.
 C. Tepelus, MPBID, raised ongoing concerns regarding broken flags following an annual parade. The NYPD claimed to be in communication with the event organizer, but no action has been taken. Tepelus will attend a hearing to testify.
 M. Gray, WPRBID, reported upcoming agency events and requested status on White Plains lighting study and mobile scooter speed limits.
 Soto responded that the bus shelters were approved, and limits were enacted on sidewalks in East Tremont.

Conduct Statement

Community Board 11 meetings must be held in a professional and hostile-free environment.

The following rules of conduct are applicable to members of the public, Community Board 11 and Community Board 11 staff:

- Any action or behavior that disrupts or interferes with Community Board 11 business will not be tolerated during any Community Board 11 meeting and may result in the individual(s) being asked to leave. If the action or behavior continues, this may be considered disturbing the peace, and the appropriate authorities may be summoned. If the meeting is held remotely, the person may be muted or expelled for the remainder.
- Repeated violations by the same person or group of people may result in further action by the Community Board.
- All public speakers must address the Full Board or the Committee with their concerns.
- Electioneering for a position other than an officer of Community Board 11 is prohibited.
- Engaging in acts of violence (including threats) are grounds for immediate suspension of the right to attend meetings, pending review by the Ethics and Disciplinary committee.
- Respect the equality, diversity and privacy of all people by respecting and valuing differences of culture and opinion.
- Refrain from unpleasant or disparaging remarks and other actions.
- Abstain from all forms of harassment by actively discouraging it.

- Disseminating false information is prohibited.
