MINUTES

Meeting began at 1:05 p.m.

1. Introductions
 J. Warneke, DM, took attendance, announcing the agencies and elected official representatives present.
2. Community Board Report
 Warneke went over the community board calendar for December and announced that the CB11 Parks and Sanitation Committees have been merged. The Full board meeting will be at the Bronx Psychiatric Wellness Center and via Zoom.
3. Agency Reports
 R. Infante, SDOT, reported on the project for the Bronx River Parkway corridor.
 A. Sarvaideo, SDOT, began his presentation with a slideshow for the replacement of two Parkway bridges at East Tremont Avenue and Bronx Park and discussed the five stages of the project.
 R. Barthel, CB11 Chair representative, asked if there would be any changes or upgrades to the lighting at East 180th and Morris Park Avenue. Sarvaideo said that the lights would be replaced with new fixtures. Infante reported that the creation of the Sagamore Road entrance was requested by SDOT.
 S. Rodriguez, SDOT, reported that they will be reaching out to the original group that handles coordination with Google and Apple maps to get that ramp removed from their sites.
 Warneke reported that he reached out to the Parks and Transportation Committees about having a joint meeting in January. They will meet on January 5.

Conduct Statement

Community Board 11 meetings must be held in a professional and hostile-free environment.

The following rules of conduct are applicable to members of the public, Community Board 11 and Community Board 11 staff:

- Any action or behavior that disrupts or interferes with Community Board 11 business will not be tolerated during any Community Board 11 meeting and may result in the individual(s) being asked to leave. If the action or behavior continues, this may be considered disturbing the peace, and the appropriate

authorities may be summoned. If the meeting is held remotely, the person may be muted or expelled for the remainder.

- Repeated violations by the same person or group of people may result in further action by the Community Board.
- All public speakers must address the Full Board or the Committee with their concerns.
- Electioneering for a position other than an officer of Community Board 11 is prohibited.
- Engaging in acts of violence (including threats) are grounds for immediate suspension of the right to attend meetings, pending review by the Ethics and Disciplinary committee.
- Respect the equality, diversity and privacy of all people by respecting and valuing differences of culture and opinion.
- Refrain from unpleasant or disparaging remarks and other actions.
- Abstain from all forms of harassment by actively discouraging it.
- Disseminating false information is prohibited.
