#### Bronx Community Board 12 June 27, 2019

The regularly scheduled meeting of Community Board 12, the Bronx, for June 27, 2019 was called to order at 7:54 pm at Town Hall, 4101 White Plains Road, The Bronx, by the Chairman, Dr. William Hall. Those wishing to participate were asked to stand for the Pledge of Allegiance. The Chairman requested a moment of silence for the husband of Board Member Ms. Hilary Bloomfield who has been ill.

#### I Approval of the Minutes of May 23, 2019

Motion made by Mr. Felix Roldan and seconded by Mr. Robert Hall to accept the minutes as printed with any necessary corrections. Motion passed 24 Ayes and 7 Abstentions.

#### II Good and Welfare/Community Speaks

#### Ms. Yodira Moncion/BRAG

Ms. Moncion reported that the organization has relocated to 825 E. 233<sup>rd</sup> St. She stated that the organization mediates conflict within the community and works to de-escalate conflicts.

#### Mr. Wycliffe Ferguson/Community Resident

Mr. Ferguson stated that this is his first time attending a Board Meeting and he is happy that he has a voice in the community. He reported that he operates a home and business maintenance business.

#### Ms. Lucile Boles-Wilson/RAIN

Ms. Bowles-Wilson stated that there are ongoing traffic light issues on Nereid Avenue. The Walk/Don't Walk signals are shorter than the reported 30 seconds each. She has reported the issue to the Department of Transportation.

She also stated that there is a movement to create a state holiday recognizing the 192<sup>nd</sup> year anniversary of the abolition of slavery in the US.



#### Mr. Austin Howell/Triple Deuce Restaurant

Mr. Howell stated that he is the current owner of Triple Deuce Restaurant on East 222<sup>nd</sup> Street and Boston Road, and he is asking that the Community Board support his application with the New York State Liquor Authority (SLA) for an On-Premise License. He further stated that the restaurant no longer has a lounge and bar area as the previous owners had. Mr. Michael Ferrari is the attorney for the restaurant. Mr. Ferrari asked that the Board also support Mr. Howell's application for a liquor license.

#### Pastor Dedrick Blue/Community Resident

Pastor Blue stated that he is here at the Board representing the Seventh Day Adventists Church. He stated that the community is facing many issues, for example supporting seniors, and addressing gun violence. The church is sponsoring a Community Health Event on Sunday, August 11<sup>th</sup> to address community issues, and asked for the support of the community. The church is located at 3743 Bronxwood Avenue at 218<sup>th</sup> Street.

#### Ms. Annette Simmon/Community Resident

Ms. Simmon stated that she has been a member of the community for 47 years. She reported that there is a lack of family-friendly, sit-down restaurants in the community. She noted that Triple Deuce is a family-oriented restaurant. She asked that the Board support Triple Deuce's liquor license application.

#### Ms. Dahalia Beccan/Deb's Summer Institute

Ms. Beccan reported that her organization runs a summer camp with a focus on math and reading, and includes programs in STEM, music and the arts. The camp is open 7:30am to 6:00pm and addresses the needs of students from ages 6 to 13.

#### Mr. Kenneth Nugent/President, Woodlawn Taxpayers and Community Association

Mr. Nugent stated that the developer of the proposed senior housing project on East 233<sup>rd</sup> Street has made many changes to the original proposal based on community feedback, but he is asking that the developer be requested to return to the Board to address the remaining concerns. He stated that the income threshold for occupancy is so low that most Woodlawn senior citizens will not qualify.

#### Ms. Eliza Thomas/Wakefield Taxpayers Association

Ms. Thomas stated that there is a grocery store on Pittman Avenue and Nereid Avenue with an extremely dirty back yard.

She stated that on Boston and Baychester Avenues, pedestrians cannot walk across the sidewalks on Saturdays and Sundays because they are too dirty, and residents must walk in the street. Chairman Dr. Hall advised Ms. Thomas to discuss the issue with Ms. Ursula Greene.

#### Ms. Gail Hall/Hip Hop Boulevard

Ms. Hall stated that she is the director of the Hip Hop Boulevard Organization, which promotes the Bronx as the birth place of hip hop. She stated that she was a member of the Mercedes Ladies, which was inducted into the Hip Hop Hall of Fame in 2015. Ms. Hall presented Chairman Dr. Hall with a plaque, "Hip Hop Blvd."

#### VII Committee Reports

#### **Housing Committee**

Chairman Mr. Robert Hall reported that at the last committee meeting it was recommended that a Neighborhood Community Advisory Board be formed to ensure that community residents have priority at new housing developments in the community. The committee is asking that if the B&B Urban Development is built then homeless working community residents should have priority. Priority should also be given to those community residents with mental illness.

#### **Transportation and Capital Improvements Committee**

Mr. Clinton Myke noted that the Committee supports a letter being written to recommend to the New York City Taxi and Limousine Commission (TLC) to renewal the livery license for Best Deal Taxi Company.

Mr. Myke also provided an update on the rebuilding of the Pratt Avenue retaining wall.

#### Parks and Recreation Committee

Chairman Mr. Ivan Borras provided an updated regarding the proposed fence for Seton Falls Park, to reduce dumping in the park.

Dr. Michael Burke provided an update on the Fitness in the Park program being offered in Seton Falls Park.

Dr. Burke also provided an update on B&B Urban's environmental remediation work plan submitted to the NYC Department of Environmental Protection. Community input on the remediation plan has been invited. Each interested individual should write a letter; a letter submitted by a committee on behalf of many community residents would still be treated as just one letter.

#### **Economic and Business Services Committee**

Chairman Mr. Felix Roldan presented the committee's report, recommending that the following license renewal requests be approved:

Oasis Restaurant—3398 Boston Road—On Premise—New

Motion made by 1<sup>st</sup> Vice Chairman Mr. Karl Stricker, seconded by Dr. Michael Burke, to accept the committees. Motion passed 26 Ayes and 4 Abstentions.

Motion made by Mr. Felix Roldan to recommend to New York State Liquor Authority to approve an On-Premise Liquor License for Oasis Restaurant. Motion passed 23 Ayes, 1 Nay and 8 Abstentions.

Chairman Mr. Roldan explained that a previous license application, for Triple Deuce Restaurant, was rejected by the State Liquor Authority (SLA) due to confusion about complaints received when the location was under previous ownership. Mr. Roldan reported that he will assist Triple Deuce in correcting the situation with the SLA.

#### VI Report of the Nominating Committee

The committee met on June 18. Members present were Ms. Tollyne Dickerson, Ms. Barbara Gibson LaGrant, Mr. Felix Roldan, Dr. Michael Burke, and Ms. Judy Benitez. Chairwoman Ms. Tollyne Dickerson announced the following nominations for the Board:

Chairman: Dr. William Hall and Mr. Ivan Borras

First Vice Chairman: Mr. Karl Stricker and Dr. Michael Burke

Second Vice Chairman: Mr. John Isaac

Treasurer: Ms. Tollyne Dickerson Secretary: Ms. Carmen Ortiz

All candidates accepted their nominations. Nominations from the floor will be accepted at the September 2019 meeting.

The committee is recommending that each candidate submit a short personal biography to Ursula Greene for distribution to Board members. The election will be held on Thursday, September 26, 2019.

#### **Speaker Carl Heastie**

Chairman Dr. Hall introduced Speaker Carl Heastie. Speaker Heastie reported that the Democratic majority in the State Senate has facilitated progress for the community in the Legislature.

Chairman Dr. Hall moved to enter executive session to discuss other matters. Motion seconded by Karl Stricker. Motion passed.

#### **Executive Session**

Chairman Dr. Hall stated that the June 20, 2019 Executive Committee meeting addressed an issue around the Board's by-laws: it was determined that a simple majority is not enough to approve an amendment to the by-laws; an amendment to the by-laws requires a vote of three-quarters of the board membership. The matter is still under review by the Borough President's office. In the meantime, the Board will follow the 2000 by-laws.

#### X Adjournment

There being no further matters to discuss the meeting was duly adjourned at 10:40pm.
