 - 1. Luis Mendez, (LuisMendez@NYPL.org), director of the department shared information about their programming and activities for teenagers ages 13-17. The department gave out books and recommendations on reading materials and resources for homework. They also offer college and career pathways help, writing and book clubs, arts and crafts, and a newsletter.



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2. The department does outreach by physically traveling to schools and tabling with library cards and other promotional items and goodies (bags, t-shirts, school supplies). Teachers are able to reach out and schedule library visits. The department also recently purchased a 3D printer.

B. Mexican Studies Institute at CUNY Lehman College

- 1. Efren Ordonez, Asst director for outreach and partnership (MSI.eoi@lehman.cuny.edu). The institute was founded in 2012 as a research center that serves the entire CUNY community but has expanded to many initiatives including:
 - **a)** Educational opportunities, such as boosting the Mexican American immigrant community at CUNY.
 - **b)** Helping Spanish speaking people with processes and navigating bureaucracies
 - c) Workshops about the different resources offered in New York City
 - d) A Spanish book fair called 'FILNYC'
 - e) Financial literacy workshops
 - f) Mexican Studies Scholarship Fund for those who have participated with the community
- **2.** Anyone is welcome to seek help at the Mexican Studies Institute

C. Oyate Group

1. Program coordinators Neysy Vicente & Alexander Reyes presented and shared information about the nonprofit organization. The organization is located in the South Bronx with the mission to target and alleviate poverty



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- 2. They are currently promoting a free youth leadership program for HS sophomores and juniors which offers art, civic engagement, design, and technology programs. Students get a \$100 stipend and includes a fully covered international trip at the end of the program to Costa Rica. They are looking to recruit 30 students. Deadline December 1st.
- **3.** Oyate Group also offers student internships. Undocumented students are welcome
- **4.** They have an entrepreneurial program (shark tank style) with no age limits. All can apply for grants to those trying to pitch a small business idea. Prize money up to \$75k. They offer mentorship for young entrepreneurs as well as office space for organizations that offer programs and services to the community.
