- 1) Department of Labor is handling a lot of unemployment applications: if anyone needs to file -please file online obtain a number and call follow their instructions. If any issues, please reach out to our office and we will do our best to help you through the process.
- m)Stimulus checks: Citizens receiving SSDI/SSI/Retirees will receive stimulus check just be patient.
- n) Antibody testing: As of 4/28/20 City MD will be conducting antibody testing.

- p) We will keep an eye out on gloves dumped on the streets and any complaints thereof.

III) Committee Reports

- a) Traffic and Transportation:
 - 1) Traffic and Transportation Chair Edgar Ramos presented to the board Motion for letter in support for the results of feasibility study of 199th Street between Marion Avenue and Webster Avenue. The committee previously voted on the motion motion passed with 4 yes; one committee member was absent and one abstention.
 - During the discussion of this motion it was agreed to change the wording of the motion to "Letter of Support Acknowledging/Accepting the results of the feasibility study of 199th Street between Marion Avenue and Webster Avenue".
 - Board vote was taken: Motion passed 20 votes and abstention by Adeline Walker-Santiago.

Also, she received complaints of tree being taken down in our area and we are in the hopes that 200 new trees will be planted back this will be monitored and provide new information in the near future.

 - 2) Discussed budget freeze throughout the City for the remainder of 2020
 - 3) There will be \$4,000 reductions in our budget
 - 4) For 2021 there will be more cuts; no new merit increases
