# GENERAL COMMUNITY BOARD MEETING MINUTES Tuesday, November 15, 2011 @ 6:30 PM

Meeting held at: Monroe College ♦ 2501 Jerome Avenue ♦ Bronx, New York

- I. Public Session began with the following speakers:
  - A. Saleen Shah, Citizens Commission for NYC:
    - 1. Talked about the "Better Neighborhood Award". There are award grants of \$500 to \$3000 for volunteer-led groups
    - 2. 25 applications were made available for interested groups
  - B. Nereida Amarat, Community Resident: Expressed concerns about the quality of life in the community. She offers her services to assist any groups who needs her to help improve the neighborhood
  - C. Darrell Davis, Assemblywoman Naomi Rivera:
    - 1. Ms. Rivera is sponsoring a public health forum on November 17, 2011 at 5:30 PM at PS 83
    - 2. Annual turkey drive raffle. For information, call 718-409-0109
  - D. Socrates Caba, Bronx HIV Advocacy: Spoke regarding the information of a group to identify, support and treat patients
  - E. Cynthia Ngombe & Edison Aponte, BOEDC: Talked about a new initiative about Green Jobs "Green New York", which will provide an energy audit for home owners. Subsidy will be provided for home owners where problems are discovered
  - F. Fernando Cabrera, NYC Council Member:
    - 1. Spoke about the conditions at the Wall Street protests
    - 2. Mentioned the recent murder crime of a community member for \$15 and how the community can move forward and seek final solution for justice in this case
    - 3. The Councilman informed the community of a promise of \$1M for cameras in the immediate community to curtail crime and promises another \$1M for next year. He will work closely with the District Manager and Walter Bell, Chair of the Public Safety Committee, to expedite the installation of the cameras
    - 4. He addressed the need to deal with gangs and the need to have sports centers/youth centers especially at the Armory
  - G. Juton Horstman, Department of City Planning Commission:
    - 1. Planning workshops where community members can have input (November 30<sup>th</sup>)
  - H. Joseph Dowling, 52<sup>nd</sup> Pct. Inspector:
    - 1. Spoke about recent violent crimes in the precinct
    - 2. A picture of a violent law breaker was distributed to the attendees
    - 3. Talked about the shooting of Mr. Chanda, a Bangladesh immigrant and his promise to capture the shooter and bring him to justice. Identifying marks were described. A sketch was distributed showing identifiable clothing
    - 4. Inspector Dowling shared other violent crimes and the speedy arrest of the perpetrators
    - 5. He reviewed the stats and expressed his concerns and sadness for the recent shootings
    - 6. A questions and answer session followed
    - 7. Block watchers were suggested as a preventive measure
    - 8. Further organization of plans to mobilize to be on-going
    - 9. Speaker from the Bangladesh community addressed the Inspector and the audience and spoke about the tragedy of the shooting and the hope for justice

    - 2. As a result of Ozzie's prominence, the "Unsung Hero Award" was renamed the "Ozzie Brown" award. The first award was presented to the Brown's family, and Ozzie's son made a few remarks about his father
    - 3. The next award was given to Sally Dunford, who symbolizes what Ozzie was about
    - 4. Last award was given to our intern and helper, Mr. Brandon Rutishouser; Ozzie was a mentor and pursued in passing a legacy to the next generation
    - 5. Hector Lopez, CB7 member was recognized for his feat in running and finishing the NYC marathon
    - 6. A new Chairperson for the Long Term Planning Committee was announced. Nelson Cruz to Chair Committee. Mr. Cruz remarked about his goals for the committee especially in the area of seniors and youth
