#### **GENERAL COMMUNITY BOARD MEETING MINUTES**

Tuesday, January 16, 2018 @ 6:30 PM | Tracey Towers

- I) Adaline opened the meeting at 6:30 pm with a greeting to all.
- II) Public Session
  - A) Dilletta Pina, who wished to express her admiration and thanks for the care that Montefiore Hospital, gave her son during his recent surgery.
  - B) Robert Amaya is a striking worker out of work for 10 months from Spectrum Cable Co. He seeks support from elected officials to intervene in the negotiations for medical benefits and pension.
  - C) Chad Royer reported that he has had no response from the Postmaster to his concerns about handicap accessibility at the 10468 Post Office.
  - D) Jean Happersaud, from the Bronx Library Center announcing the available access at 6 pm on January 17<sup>th</sup>, the presence of 3 authors from the Bronx on Sat., Jan. 22<sup>nd</sup>, a movie on Saturday, January 20<sup>th</sup>, computer classes schedule for January and free tax preparations at Manhattan Libraries.
  - E) Jennifer Tausig reported from the Mosholu Preservation and the BID about the DOT study to beautify the area with lights, benches, planters, greening the neighborhood and plans for a sculpture to be erected.
    - 1) A salesperson will be hired by the Norwood News to seek ads.
  - F) Richard Montenegro, from the District 10 Educational Council reported about a meeting to discuss failed programs in district schools due to poor administration.
    - 1) All are invited to a meeting on January 18<sup>th</sup> at 6:30 pm at 3202 Steuben Avenue.
      - (a) NYC Officials are invited.
  - G) Jane Addison-Amoya, from the Mosholu Library announced the hiring of 2 new librarians allowing the children's programs to be restored.
    - 1) The first one will be on February 12<sup>th</sup> from 3 pm to 6 pm On February 15<sup>th</sup> at 10:30 am there will be story time for young children.
  - H) Ken Small announced a new office address at 3133 Webster Avenue (near 205<sup>th</sup> Street).
    - 1) Ken thanked all for their support in helping him find space.
  - I) Detective June Cortez, from the 52<sup>nd</sup> precinct introduced Officer Tara from Sector Charlie who has been assisting him.

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- 1) He reviewed the stats and reported on arrests of suspects who have committed crimes in the area.
- 2) Detective Cortez reported on bank account scams warning people to beware of free offerings of trips from Delta Airlines.
- 3) Burglaries continue through unlocked fire escape windows and mailbox fishing is still a problem.
  - (a) Warnings to all to beware of their surroundings especially at Target where purses have been stolen.
- 4) On March 15<sup>th</sup>, there will be a meeting for the community on safety issues at St. Philip Neri School, where all are invited.
- J) Elizabeth Quaranta, from Friends of Mosholu Pkwy is looking for volunteers to help out in beautifying the Parkway.
  - 1) The first project will be on April 1st.
- K) Mercedes De La Cruz, from Independent Cares Systems explained the services offered in managed home care i.e. health, special services, assistance with Medicaid eligibility and mental health trainings.
  - 1) Ms. De La Cruz is available for presentations.
- L) Claire McLeveighn, from Councilman Cabrera's office reported that the Councilman was unanimously elected Majority Whip of the City Council which is the third highest leadership position in the Council.
  - 1) He will also serve as Chair of Governmental Operations.
  - 2) He will be re-introducing 65 bills from the previous session that addresses public safety, health and mental health, environment, education, safe affordable housing and other matters.
    - (a) We are very proud of our Councilman.
- M) Adolfo Abreu, who represents Councilman Ritchie Torres, reported the availability of free tax preparations at his office.
  - 1) Adolfo also mentioned the combined assistance of his office with local churches in assisting the recent fire victims with food clothing and shelter.
  - 2) Other services offered are immigration questions, housing, green cards and domestic violence problems.
- N) Mariel De La Cruz, from NYC Comptroller Scott Stringer's office announced an invitation to the Trailblazers program and award ceremony in honor of African American History Month on Tuesday, February 6<sup>th</sup>, 2018 from 6:30 pm to 8:30 pm at 2116 Adam Clayton Powell, Jr. Boulevard, on the 3<sup>rd</sup> floor.
  - 1) Mariel also distributed a transit study on the NYC Bus System prepared by Mr. Stringer.

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- O) Ranell Ogilvie, from State Senator Jamaal Bailey's office announced they are having a coat drive on January 18<sup>th</sup> from 1:00 pm to 5:00 pm at 959 East 233 Street.
  - 1) On January 26<sup>th</sup>, there will be a Human Trafficking Awareness Assembly from 9:00 am to 11:00 am at 3710 Barnes Ave.
  - 2) The FBI and the NYPD will be presenting data, trends, tips and other information regarding their work in combating human trafficking in the Bronx and nationally.
    - (a) All are invited.
- P) Ariana Calludo, from Councilman Andy Cohen's office announced that the Councilman is sponsoring a Landlord/Tenant Forum with an Immigration attorney present on February 24<sup>th</sup> at Tracey Towers.
- Q) Frederic Klein, from Assemblyman Jeffrey Dinowitz's office reported that the Assemblyman is in Albany working on court evidence issues.
  - 1) There is assistance available at his office for anyone who has problems with tenant leases.
    - (a) Often tenants receive increases for major capital improvements when none have been done.
- R) Andy Toledo, from the BP's office reminding CB members to send in their reappointment letters as soon as possible.
  - 1) Applications to serve on the CB are available to the public.
    - (a) All are encouraged to apply.
  - 2) There is information at the BP's office for home owner's exceptions.
    - (a) Call for further information.
- S) Hideke Salazar, from Assemblyman Victor Pichardo's office reported that housing assistance is available every Thursday from 11:00 am to 3 pm at 2175 Jerome Avenue, Suite C.
  - 1) The Assemblyman is sponsoring a "Know Your Rights" Forum to learn about immigrants' rights and how to avoid immigration fraud and other services available to the community.
    - (a) It will be held at 8 Clinton Place in the Bronx on January 24<sup>th</sup> from 6:30 to 8:30 pm.

- A) Adaline introduced the newly hired District Manager Ischia Bravo who spoke a few words.
- B) Adaline continued reporting on meetings and information pertinent to the community.
- C) At the DSC meeting on January 10<sup>th</sup>, the new Deputy BP was introduced who spoke of the BP's issues of concern and how they are handled.
  - 1) One issue is snow removal on subway stairs.
    - (a) The advice is to call 511 when a problem is encountered.
  - 2) With the severe cold weather, fire prevention remains as a topic of concern.
    - (a) Tips are available.
- D) The DOE has finally sent a representative to cabinet meetings.
  - 1) It was mentioned that School Construction is looking for space for new schools.
  - 2) Plans for a Community Resource Fair are in the works.
  - 3) More information is forthcoming.

- F) Board Chairs have been instructed to select Vice Chairs for their committees in case of their absence.

  - 1) These appointments were approved with one "no" vote from Cynthia O' Neal–Riley.
- D) The WAM Committee gathered sufficient petitions to support the WAM Committee in its request to become a full-fledged committee.
  - 1) The vote on this petition will take place at the February meeting of the full Board.
- E) Nominations for the 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice Chair were conducted:
  - 1) Helene Hartman-Kutnowsky was nominated and accepted.
  - 2) Jean Hill was nominated and accepted.
  - 3) Lorita Watson was nominated and accepted.
    - (a) Election will take place at February's General Board meeting.
- F) The MAS contracts for Women's Empowerment, Bus Tour and the Newsletter were described.
- G) A motion was made to spend an additional \$1,500 to print the newsletter in Spanish.
  - 1) The motion was approved.
- VI) Committee Reports:
  - A) Budget, Personnel & Ethics
    - 1) The MAS Contracts were reviewed and approved.
    - 2) The attendance records of Board members at were reviewed and it was decided to send letters to those who have missed 3 consecutive meetings.

  - 2) Plans are on-going on the proposed use of the Old Fordham Library.
    - (a) It is likely that the site will be used as a workforce development site where people can take Civil Service Exams.
    - (b) There will be a public review which will allow the public to express their opinion on the use of the building.
  - 3) Reminder of the January 20<sup>th</sup> Women's March.

  - 2) There was a presentation by Grace Institute about the program they offer which provides women with support in economic self-sufficiency, lifelong learning, gender equality and professionalism.

  - 1) Helene recommended that Committee reports be given before the Public Session.
  - 2) The report from the Committee was that the gas station property on Van Cortlandt was approved.
  - 3) The conditions at St. George Crescent are questionable, with parking in the area compromised.
  - 4) The graffiti on Van Cortlandt has been removed.
  - 5) DOH will do a presentation on Rat Prevention.
    - (a) Additional money was added to the NYC budget to support this initiative.

- J) Senior Services
  - 1) There was a presentation on Long Term Care by Independent Care Systems.
    - (a) They described their services and the assistance available to apply for Medicaid and eligibility if needed.
  - 2) Lowell also encouraged seniors to take advantage of the Fitness Center at the Oval.
  - 3) There is a program for seniors at the cost of \$25 a year.
  - 4) A computer lab will take place on January 14<sup>th</sup> at 6:30 pm.
