## EDUCATION, LIBRARIES, & CULTURAL AFFAIRS COMMITTEE MINUTES Wednesday, March 9, 2011 @ 6:30 PM

- I. Meeting called to order at 6:35pm Attendance sheet on file Quorum established
- II. Civic Engagement Trainee Program (CET)
  - A. The following topics were discussed:
    - 1. Middle school vs. high school students
    - 2. Hours of participation
    - 3. Parental consent
    - 4. Legal requirements (i.e. liability, age)
    - 5. Level of interest
    - 6. Ability to handle responsibilities
  - B. Action:
    - 1. Although high school students may be more advanced, the general consensus is that 14-16 are suitable ages for participation. Middle school students represent a vulnerable age group and our goal is to reach this at risk population.
    - 2. Students will not be held past 7:45pm allowing time for them to utilize their bus passes if necessary
    - 3. Completion of a parental consent form will be a requirement for student participation
    - 4. There is not additional liability involved when students are on the premises of CB 7. Students are legally allowed to work beginning at the age of 14
    - 5. The recruitment process will draw students who are interested
    - 6. Program requirements are generally not beyond the ability/maturity level of the average 14-16 year old
  - C. Attendance at City Council meetings:
    - 1. Some CB 7 Board members raised concerns regarding the feasibility of students attending City Council meeting due to conflicts of scheduled meeting times and school hours.
    - 2. Action: Requirements were changed from attendance at City Council meeting to attendance at Public Hearings. A CB 7 member would also be in attendance at said meeting
    - 3. Internship: The internship period would last approximately 6 months. Students would be mentored by committee chairs or members. After acceptance into the program, the schedule would be as follows: Initial orientation in October student "Break-Out" session, January final wrap-up, March, program completion, April. Students would be given an opportunity (approximately 10 minutes) to present their projects to their committees as well as at the General Board meetings as public speakers.
    - 4. Program Promotion: There was discussion regarding creation of a video highlighting the program posted on Facebook. Also discussed was producing flyers for distribution to schools, libraries, etc.
    - 5. Action: The CB 7 intern was mentioned as a possible candidate for helping with the video. Education committee members are willing to supply necessary paper for flyers
