B. Rina Mahani - Executive Director and Co-Founder, Start Lighthouse

Start Light was founded to combat the low number of students (146,790) not reading proficiently in the Bronx (and city-wide) in addition to the low percentage of books that exist depicting characters from diverse backgrounds. The strategies for this organization are for students to see themselves in what they read, engage family members and caregivers, and revitalize literacy culture at Title I schools. Programs include: Literary Adventures, Woke Activists, and Empowered Readers.

HERO Dads are also invited to participate in a research study. The goal of the study is to determine what factors of parenting and relationship education improve family stability and relationship quality. All services are FREE.

HERO Dads runs twice a month with Morning, Evening and Weekend workshops available.

Upcoming workshops begin MAY 5th and Program Perks: include: Up to \$450 in rewards, access to exclusive trainings and employers, assistance for benefits, childcare, child support, and more.
