encourage **HEALTHY**, **EMPOWERED**, **RESILIENT** and **OPEN** fathering by connecting dads to parenting skills workshops and employment resources. Over 4 weeks, they work with career coaches to develop professional skills and plan for a financially stable future for their family. HERO Dads are also invited to participate in a research study.
