MTA SUBWAY SAFETY (PRESENTATION + DISCUSSION): With public disorder and safety concerns on residents' minds despite statistical decreases in major crime categories, the committee will discuss MTA subway safety issues. We encourage residents to come to discuss safety issues riding the subway, waiting for the train, in the station, etc.

at stations within Williamsburg and Greenpoint as well as those elsewhere in the city that you may experience while commuting to work, medical visits, family gatherings, shopping, or any other activities. We are interested in inviting officials from the NYPD Transit Bureau, MTA Police, 1 Police Plaza, and the MTA to hear from residents about the following:

- Platform infrastructure (planned safety barriers).
- Disorders on platforms, in subway cars, and by turnstiles.
- How surveillance cameras are used in response to incidents.
- Scenario-based discussion of situations where riders may feel unsafe, including:
 - O Step-by-step walk-through of how police response currently works + 311/911 complaint life cycle.
 - o Identifying gaps in response that erode public trust.
 - o Exploring ways to improve police response.
 - o Educating the public on what police recommend doing in unsafe situations.
