ROLL CALL

Chairperson Ms. Fuller requested District Manager Mr. Esposito to call the roll. He informed the chairperson that there were 28 board members present, a sufficient number to conduct the public hearing.

APPROVAL OF THE AGENDA

Mr. Solano made a motion to approve the agenda for the March 13, 2018 Public Hearing as written. The motion was seconded by Ms. Kaminski. The motion was unanimously carried.

DCA-UNENCLOSED SIDEWALK CAFÉ APPLICATION: — Latte LLC., dba Gelateria Gentile, 253 Wythe Avenue, Brooklyn, NY 11249-4127, #2211-2018-ASWC; 9 Tables; 18 Chairs. (New) - Mr. Robert Callahan, from the office of Michael Kelly, presented on the application for a new unenclosed sidewalk café at 253 Wythe Avenue. A completed questionnaire was submitted and distributed for review. There were no questions raised at this time.

DCA-UNENCLOSED SIDEWALK CAFÉ APPLICATION: - Lafitte LLC., dba Sauvage, 905 Lorimer Street, Brooklyn, NY 11222-3103, # 2019774-DCA; 14 Tables; 28 Chairs. (Renewal) - Mr. Joshua T. Boissy, one of the principal owners of the establishment, was present and spoke on the renewal. There were no changes in the sidewalk café and there were no complaints. No questions were raised at this time.

DCA-UNENCLOSED SIDEWALK CAFÉ APPLICATION: - Hop Stock & Barrel II LLC, dba Mekelburg's, 325 Kent Avenue, Brooklyn, NY 11249-5268, # 1643-2018-ASWC; 7 Tables; 26 Chairs. (New) - Ms. Alicia Mckelburg, one of the owners, spoke on the plans. She submitted a completed questionnaire. There were no questions at this time.

It was noted that these three unenclosed sidewalk cafes would be reviewed at the next meeting of the SLA Review & DCA Committee, scheduled for Tuesday, March 27, 2018, 6:30PM, at the CB #1's District Office, 435 Graham Avenue.

<u>PRESENTATION: MTA NYC- ADA Project</u>: Scheduled at the Greenpoint Avenue G station within Community Board 1.

Mr. Andrew Ingelsby, Assistant Director, Government and Community Relations, MTA NYC Transit, began the presentation. He noted that he was joined with his colleague, who would be assisting in the presentation. This is for the proposed ADA upgrade of the Greenpoint Avenue Station "G" Crosstown Line. He noted that the Greenpoint Avenue Station is located on Manhattan Avenue between Greenpoint Avenue and India Street, It is a below-ground bi-level station constructed in 1933. Platform level consists of two side platforms with the G train service each way, northbound Queens and Southbound Brooklyn. The scope of work was noted. A copy of the presentation is attached.

The following was noted:

- Ridership is increasing every year.
- 14 Ft. Glass Elevator
- Sidewalk will be extended 8 ft.
- -Sidewalk will be bumped up
- It is in front of the existing Bagel Store
- Will not block Starbuck's marquee
- Schedule: Award Spring 2018; 28 Months/Construction duration

There was some discussion by the board members about the location for the elevator. Mr. Jeremy Rosen, owner of the bagel shop, raised concerns about the elevator and its location impacting his business. He noted that the "L" train shutdown will also have an impact on the businesses. Ms. Cynthia Kulsereni, raised concern about the location. She noted that property owners and residents are concerned about the elevator being in front of their property. They had questions about cleanliness and homeless sleeping in the structure.

PRESENTATION: NYC PARKS: The reconstruction of Penn Triangle, (Penn Street & Wythe Avenue) is funded for \$1.1M through the Community Parks Initiative. Goals for the project are to increase play opportunities for the 2-5 age group, maximize the use of space within the site, and to facilitate passive use within and around the park. Presentation by Chris Yandoli, Brooklyn Director of Capital Projects. Ms. Mary Salig, from the Parks Department, introduced the project and noted the designer was present to speak on the reconstruction project for Penn Triangle. A scoping meeting was held in November. Mr. Jabari Taylor, from the Prospect Park Alliance, provided a PowerPoint slide presentation for all to view.

- Penn Triangle is bounded by Penn Street, Wythe Avenue and Williamsburg Street East.
- Goals are to increase play opportunities for 2-5 age group; maximize the use of space within the site; facilitate passive use within and around the park.
- Budget is \$1.1million
- Project size: 0.15 acres

Mr. Taylor highlighted several points regarding this triangular shaped park, including the existing conditions, and the proposed design. He noted that they received community input and that there were a lot of children there. He noted that they would be doing seating, with some seating on the outside. They will be adding some street trees. Play equipment will have color motifs with warm neutrals, gray scales and primary colors. Some ornamental trees will be planted for shade. Existing lighting will be used and flood lights will be added. Foresters have gone out and inventoried the trees and recommended the replacements. There is no water play area. There is a ramped feature to allow for more ADA accessibility to the park. (See attached)

BOARD MEETING

MOMENT OF SILENCE

Chairperson Ms. Dealice Fuller called for a moment of silence.

ROLL CALL

Chairperson Ms. Fuller requested District Manager Mr. Esposito to call the roll. He informed the chairperson that there were 37 board members present, a sufficient number for a quorum to conduct the board meeting.

APPROVAL OF THE AGENDA

Mr. Solano made a motion to approve the agenda for the March 13, 2018 Board Meeting as written. The motion was seconded by Ms. Teague. The motion was unanimously carried.

APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES

Ms. Cabrera made a motion to approve the minutes for the February 13, 2018 Combined Public Hearing and Board Meeting as written. The motion was seconded by Mr. Indig. The motion was unanimously carried.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Chairperson Ms. Fuller called upon the committee chairpersons to present their reports.

Land Use, ULURP, and Landmarks (subcommittee) Committee – Ms. Teague presented the Land Use portion of the report (see attached). She read the report and requested a vote on the item. Ms. McKeever presented the Landmarks portion of the report (see attached).

 Cabrera made a motion to support the committee's recommendation to approve the waiver. The motion was seconded by Mr. Weidberg. The vote was as follows: 37 "YES"; 0 "NO"; 0 "ABSTENTIONS"; 0 "RESCUALS". The motion was unanimously carried.

Landmarks Item -

126 Kent Street - Ms. McKeever presented the Landmarks Subcommittee's report (see attached).
 Ms. McKeever made a motion to support the committee's recommendation. The motion was seconded by Ms. Teague. The vote was as follows: 38 "YES"; 0 "NO"; 0 "ABSTENTIONS"; 0 "RESCUALS". The motion was unanimously carried

Parks & Waterfront Committee – Mr. Caponegro presented a verbal report. He discussed a request by the McCarren Tennis Court. They were seeking a letter of support from CB #1 for them to not have to remove the clubhouse in April. They want to maintain the structure all year round and install bathrooms for all to us. After a brief discussion, the item was referred back o the Parks & Waterfront Committee. Mr. Caponegro related that it would be heard at upcoming Parks & Waterfront Committee scheduled for Thursday, March 29, 2018, at 6:30 PM, in the CB #1's District Office.

<u>Transportation Committee</u> – Mr. Bruzaitis submitted a written report that was distributed for review (see attached). He read the report and noted the items and actions requested.

<u>Previous Concerns</u> – were highlighted in the report (Kent Ave/Flushing Ave/Wallabout St.; Flushing Ave.; and Kent Ave & Williamsburg Street West) and would be follow-up with DOT.

Brooklyn Navy Yard Shuttle Discontinuation - Mr. Bruzaitis noted that Ms. Shani Leibowitz & Ms. Nora Daniel from the BNY's Planning & Transportation Department appeared to explain their justification for discontinuing this branch of 'last leg' service.

MTA/DOT L Train Presentation Review - Following the MTA/DOT open houses and their presentation to the Full Board on February 13th, the committee and the public had an open discussion on specific issues that had either not been fully addressed, or should be considered before the agencies implement their final mitigation plan during the L Train shutdown. Ms. Mary Odomirok was particularly concerned that the North Side is not being properly served by the planned bus routes. After some discussion the committee voted unanimously to ask the board to draft a letter to the MTA.

The members discussed this matter about extending the B32 bus. Mr. Bruzaitis asked for a motion on this portion of the report and add about the extension of the buses into Manhattan to (B32 into Manhattan; and the other Northside bus to not end in Nolita but to go to 14th Street and First Ave.) Mr. Solano made a motion to support the report with the changes. Ms. Teague seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously carried.

Identifying Off-Route Truck Hot Spots & Proactive steps during L shutdown traffic rerouting. Organizations United for Trash Reduction And Garbage Equity (OUTRAGE) has reconvened its Illegal Truck Enforcement Task Force. The Transportation Committee will continue to identify hot spots and address complaints to the board office through regular channels, as well as with this working group. A form for relating complaints was made available.

New Business: TLC Licenses/Renewals. Mr. Bruzaitis noted that the committee voted 8-0 in favor of a renewal for the following item: TLC License # B01525, Northside Luxury Inc., 207 Bedford Avenue, Brooklyn, NY 11211. Mr. Weiser made a motion to support the committee's recommendation to approve the renewal. The motion was seconded by Ms. Teague. The motion was unanimously carried. The vote was: 39 "YES"; 0 "NO"; 0 "ABSTENTIONS"; 0 "RECUSALS". The motion was unanimously carried.

Attendance Committee - Mr. Bruzaitis presented a verbal report on behalf of the committee. The attendance report is as written. A meeting was held last evening.
