

Ocean Avenue Pedestrian Bridge

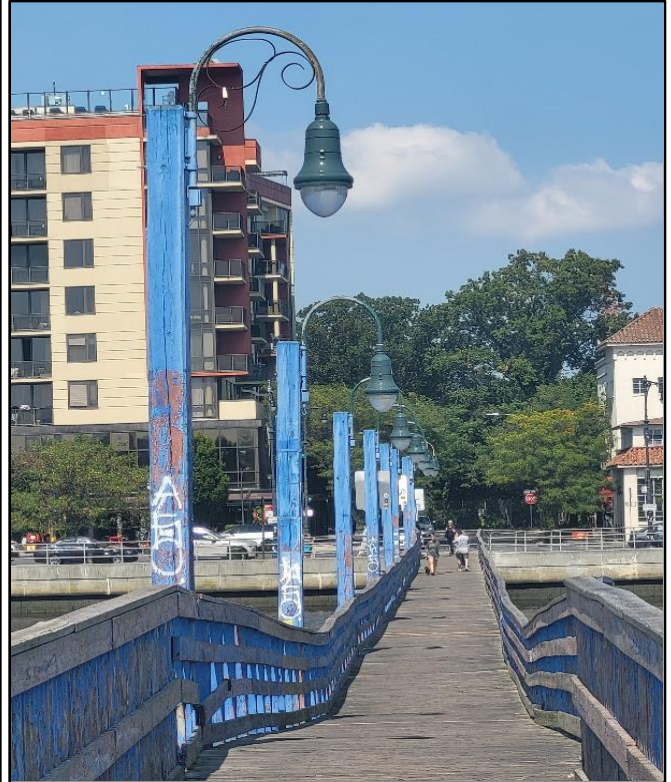

The Ocean Avenue Bridge is a wooden pedestrian bridge spanning Sheepshead Bay from Emmons Avenue and East 19th Street (one block east of Ocean Avenue) to Manhattan Beach. The bridge was first constructed in 1880 at Ocean Avenue and reconstructed in 1930.

Scope of Work

- All work is being performed by the Division of Bridges In-House forces
- Work is scheduled to begin Monday October 7th
- Total duration of repairs is approximately 4 months
- The bridge will be fully closed from Monday at 7:00 a.m. through Friday at 2:00 p.m.
- ***The Bridge will remain open from 2:00 p.m. Friday through the weekend until Monday morning at 7:00 a.m.***
- No metered parking will be removed for the project



- The total project cost is about \$1.7M dollars and is being undertaken with a \$750 thousand dollar grant from local elected officials.
- NYC DOT has also acquired an historic luminaire which will be installed on the last light near Shore Blvd on to replace the "cobra head" luminaire.
