ORGANICS CURBSIDE COLLECTION — Receiving Your Bin in May/June 2018

Look for an official notice in your mailbox informing you when collection is coming to your area. DSNY provides one 13-gallon bin to single-family homes, and one 21-gallon bin to 2-9 family homes. Remember to:

- Find a starter kit for each household in your brown bin which will tell you when your collection begins or call 311.
- Write your address on the brown organics bin and choose a location where the brown bin should be kept this is usually next to your other recycling bins.
- We recommend that you wait until a week before your first collection to start filling your brown bin with food scraps. For more information visit www.nyc.gov/organics.
