# NYC: STOP THE SPREAD OF CORONAVIRUS!

New Yorkers working together can slow the spread of Coronavirus (COVID-19) in New York City.

### PROTECT YOURSELF AND OTHERS

- Wash your hand with soap and water often.
- Cover your nose and mouth with a tissue or sleeve when sneezing or coughing.

### BK ROT FOOD SCRAP DROP OFF

We hope you are holding up well and taking care of each other. Our hearts go out to everyone impacted by COVID-19. The Coronavirus is illuminating unsustainable realities many communities already know and have been organizing to change. At BK ROT we understand the importance of caring for

one another, nurturing our web and continuing to change our culture rooted in waste to one of regeneration.

As this unprecedented situation continues, we are evolving our response. We are pausing our residential services (home pick-up and drop off) and compost distribution for at least 2 weeks. Our heart is heavy to pause these services, but we believe it is the best action to encourage physical distancing and ensure the safety of our community. We encourage folks to either save scraps (freeze/store them). Stay tuned for updates on our website and social media for more information on how to reduce food waste and set up small home composting systems.

We will continue commercial pick-ups for those who are still operating and also continue to process and transform food waste to compost. Our team is identifying how we can support mutual aid efforts. BK ROT Staff will not work if they show signs of sickness. We are committed to covering wages lost as much as possible.

It's wild for our team to simultaneously sanitize our hands, tools and surfaces and at the same time hold deep respect for the

vast number of beneficial microorganisms that sustain our work. Thank you for holding onto this bigger picture, for your patience and understanding in this process and for your dedication to composting with us.



**NYC Department of Health and Mental Hygiene (DOHMH)**

In response to the COVID-19 outbreak, many Health Department staff have been activated as part of the citywide response. Additionally, social distancing recommendations include minimizing personal contact and shifting activities to online. The Health Department has made the following changes to our services, in order to maximize available staff and follow social distancing recommendations:

### VITAL RECORDS

- In-person ordering of NYC birth and death certificates will be suspended until further notice.
- If you have an emergency request due to healthcare coverage, government services, military, immigration, or employment, please call 311 or email [nycdohvr@health.nyc.gov](mailto:nycdohvr@health.nyc.gov)
- During this time, you can order

certificates:

- Online at: [nyc.gov/vitalrecords](https://nyc.gov/vitalrecords)
- Via mail by mailing a copy of the birth or death certificate application
- For the time being, there will be ONE emergency window open for emergency vital records inquiries. But given social distancing recommendations, we would prefer all service inquiries go via electronic means.

### DOHMH CLINICS

- All NYC Sexual Health Clinics are closed for non-emergency walk-in services until further notice.
- Clinics will only see patients who were contacted by clinic staff for urgent follow-up, or who need emergency contraception or HIV post-exposure prophylaxis (PEP). These patients can receive services on the following dates at the following clinics:
  - March 19 - March 20: Morrisania, Central Harlem, Chelsea, Fort Greene, Crown Heights, Jamaica and Corona
  - March 23 until further notice: Chelsea only
- All immunization testing services are suspended at all clinics.
- All tuberculosis clinics will be closed starting March 22, except for the Fort Greene Chest Center, which will remain open.

### **DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTION**

To reduce exposure for COVID-19, DOC will suspend in-person visitation beginning Wednesday, March 18.
