Presentation and review of a Certificate of Appropriateness application submitted to the Landmarks Preservation Commission for a rooftop addition to rear of the building and bulkhead addition to the roof at 854 Union Street (between 7th/8th Avenues), Park Slope Historic District.

Motion was made by Bill Blum, seconded by Jerry Armer to approve conditionally as follows: that the structure be moved back further to avoid seeing it from the street and a friendly amendment by Glenn Kelly to use more appropriate materials on the long-side, south-side (facing yard) to match the color and condition of the existing structure.

Presentation and review of a Certificate of Appropriateness application submitted to the Landmarks Preservation Commission for the repair and replacement of bluestone sidewalk at 26 8th Avenue (NW corner Lincoln Place/8th Avenue), Park Slope Historic District

Motion was made by Jerry Armer, seconded by Lou Sones to approve as presented.

Presentation and review of a Certificate of Appropriateness application submitted to the Landmarks Preservation Commission for front facade alterations including a new door, new railings and enlargement of parlor floor window openings and a two-story rear-yard extension with a deck at 37 Cheever Place (between Kane/Degraw Streets), in the Cobble Hill Historic District.

Motion was made by Jerry Armer, seconded by Alison Reeves to approve the front facade alterations including a new door, new railings and enlargement of parlor floor window openings as presented with the following conditions for the rear of the building:

- 1. two-story rear-yard extension with a deck are approved, but the fenestration for the parlor floor be three full-length wood windows that line up with the windows on the 2nd and third floor.
- 2. No parlor floor balcony.
- 3. Ground floor French doors and window matching alignment of third and fourth floors.

Presentation and review of a Certificate of Appropriateness application submitted to the Landmarks Preservation Commission for the renovation of the storefront at 232 Court Street (southwest corner Court/Baltic Streets), in the Cobble Hill Historic District.

Motion was made by Jerry Armer, seconded by Lou Sones to approve as presented.

Presentation and review of a Certificate of Appropriateness application submitted to the Landmarks Preservation Commission for the construction of new townhouse buildings at 110-120 Congress Street, and the restoration of buildings at 122-128 Congress Street, collectively known as 118 Congress Street, (southeast corner Congress/Hicks Streets), in the Cobble Hill Historic District.

Motion was made by Jerry Armer, seconded by Madelaine Murphy.

Recommend conditional approval as follows:

- 1. The old building stoops be made of a more appropriate material, the metal stoops presented are not in keeping with the historic nature of the district.
- 2. Roof addition on old buildings be pulled back so to be made invisible from street.
- 3. Fenestration on first and second floors of new building (over the garages), be made to match-up with the upper floors.
- 4. On the new building replace the casement window treatments with double-hung wood or at least something more appropriate to the historic district.

- 5. On the new building window sills and lentils be added to all windows.
- 6. Garage doors not be made of modern materials and made to more closely resemble old carriage house doors.
- 7. Front doors on new building be more in keeping with row houses, i.e., no side lights.

Motion by Madelaine Murphy, seconded by Bill Blum: That the Landmarks Preservation Commission hold open their decision on the above matters until they receive our recommendations.
