Loren Avellino gave an update on community services available at New York-Presbyterian Brooklyn Methodist Hospital. While the hospital is not located in Community Board 9, many of our residents utilize the hospital. Upcoming events at NYP-Methodist highlighted by Loren:

VIRTUAL Prostate Health Talk with Dr. Alfred Winkler - An interactive discussion on Prostate Health with Dr. Alfred Winkler, Chief of Urology NewYork-Presbyterian Brooklyn Methodist Hospital, Assistant Professor of Clinical Urology, Weill Cornell Medicine. This lecture is part of a series on Men's Health, presented in partnership with the Brooklyn Public Library.
October is Breast Cancer Awareness month and the hospital continues to encourage regular mammogram visits at their <u>Cancer Care</u> center. Cancer screening should not be delayed because of Covid. They are hosting a symposium on Breast Health Disparities In the Era of COVID19.

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Laray Brown and Enid Dillard of One Brooklyn gave an update on what is happening at Kingsbrook Medical Center. Kingsbrook Medical Center is not closing; however medical surgical bed services will no longer be housed at Kingsbrook. Those patients will be cared for at other hospitals within the One Brooklyn network of hospitals (Interfaith and Brookdale). Current hospital staff on medical surgical teams will be reassigned within the hospital system. Kingsbrook will actually be expanding many of their services including outpatient clinic care and ambulatory services. NYSNA representative Crystal Rogers (NYSNA), who represents the nursing staff, noted that One Brooklyn and NYSNA worked together on the plans and both parties are in agreement on staffing.

Chair Leopold, committee members and residents discussed goals for this upcoming board

session. Major priorities include:		
	addressing the economic strain Covid-19 has put on the city budget and how that will affect community health services	
	Getting PPE to community members and residents who need it; NYP mentioned they do have extra masks and face shields.	
	Addressing the increased homelessness in our district since the pandemic; We discussed working with social service agencies such as the Department of Homeless Services to come up with a community plan for the situation.	
	Senior services during Covid-19 and how we can address this in the next budget cycle	
	Encouraging community members to wear masks to protect themselves against Covid- 19; We discussed how to tailor messaging to different demographics and exercising cultural competence in our approach	

The committee would like to bring in experts on sickle cell; mental health; health equity and cultural competency in health care to present at future community meetings. Loren of NYP will be able to assist with coordinating the mental health presentation.
