Rules of Order for Community Board Meetings NYC Community Board 9, Brooklyn

This meeting of the New York City Community Board 9, Brooklyn, is called to order on **September 17, 2025** at Middle School 61 400 Empire Boulevard, Brooklyn, New York 11225 on under the applicable statutes of New York State, the New York City Charter, the Bylaws of Community Board 9, and Robert's Rules of Order.

- 1. All Community Board Meetings shall be conducted pursuant to New York State Public Officers Law, the New York City Charter, the Open Meetings Law, and any other applicable laws. The Community Board's By-Laws shall govern meetings where they do not conflict with applicable laws. Robert's Rules of Order shall govern meetings where they do not conflict with applicable laws and the By-Laws.
- 2. All Community Board Members shall be provided with a reasonable opportunity to address the Community Board (the "Board") on any matter of the Board or any matter that pertains to the Board's mission.
- 3. During General Board Meetings, members of the public may be allowed to speak during the portion of the meeting designated as "Public Comment Session." Subject to any modifications and guidelines established by the Chair of the Community Board (the "Chair"), or his or her designee, each public speaker shall sign in and give a brief description of what he/she will comment upon prior to speaking. Public speakers will be allotted a time limit of three (3) minutes each commencing from the beginning of the speaker's remarks. Time cannot be shared or allotted to other speakers. If the Chair, or his or her designee, determines that there is not sufficient time at the meeting, the "Public Comment Session" period may be deferred to either the end of the General Board meeting or the beginning of the next General Board meeting. Public Comment Period shall be thirty (30) minutes duration.
- 4. During General Board Meetings and Committee Meetings (collectively, "Board Meetings") and outside of "Public Comment Session" portions of meetings, members of the public may ask questions and comment upon agenda items only when recognized by the Chair, Committee Chair, or their designee.
- 5. All Board members and members of the public shall conduct themselves in a courteous, professional and orderly manner. Obscene, threatening or harassing language, slander, threats of violence, personal attacks of any kind or offensive comments that target or disparage any ethnic, racial, age, or religious group, gender, sexual orientation or disability status are prohibited at all Board Meetings.
- 6. No members of the public shall display signs or placards in a disruptive manner, disruptively applaud participants in debate, or engage in disorderly conversation or other disorderly behavior which may disrupt the proceedings of the meeting.
- 7. Audio and video recording of Board Meetings are permitted unless they interfere with the meetings, in accordance with the Open Meetings Law. The recording must be conducted from a fixed location and in a manner which does not interfere with the meeting. The Chair, or his or her designee shall have the discretion to prohibit video or audio recording that interferes with a meeting. Recording is not permitted during Executive Session.

- 8. Any Board member or member of the public who uses obscene, threatening or harassing language, slander, threats of violence, personal attacks of any kind or offensive comments that target or disparage any ethnic, racial, age, or religious group, gender, sexual orientation or disability status or who otherwise becomes disorderly while at a Board Meeting shall be removed from the Board Meeting at the discretion of the Chair, or his or her designee.
- 9. No Board member or member of the public shall be permitted to speak on a cellular telephone during a Community Board Meeting while the meeting is in progress other than for emergency reasons. All cellular telephones are required to be turned off or on "vibrate" mode.
- 10. During General Board Meetings, the enforcement of this Code of Conduct shall be conducted under the direction of the Chair, or his or her designee. During Committee Meetings, the enforcement of this Code of Conduct shall be conducted by the Committee Chair or his or her designee. The New York City Police Department and building security may assist with the ejection of any individual from a Board Meeting or Committee Meeting for violating this Code of Conduct.

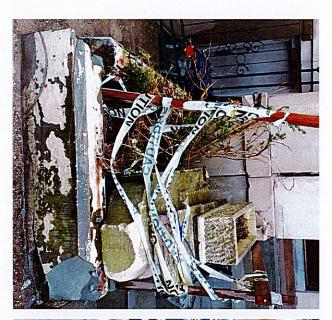

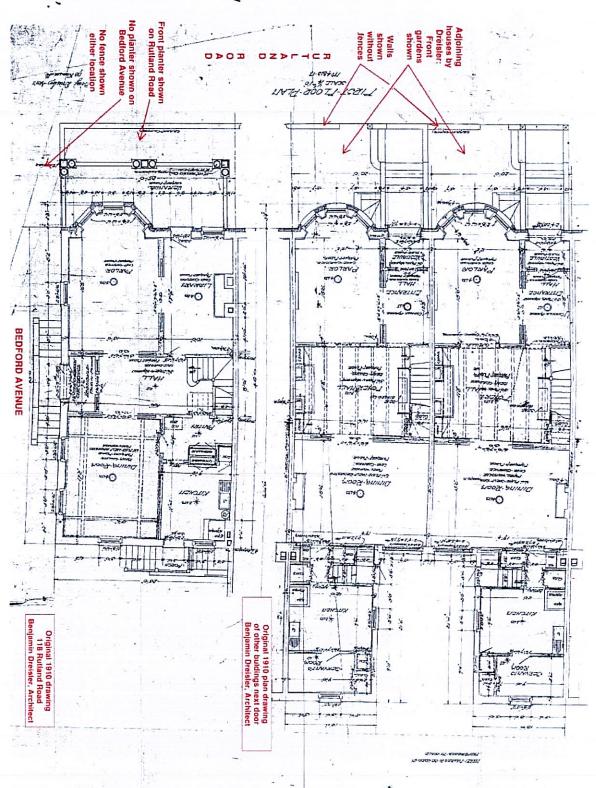




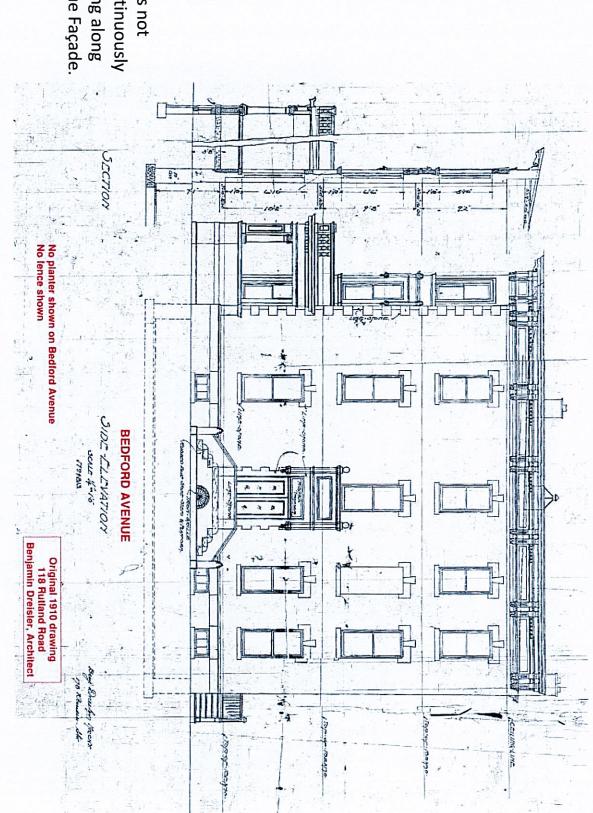

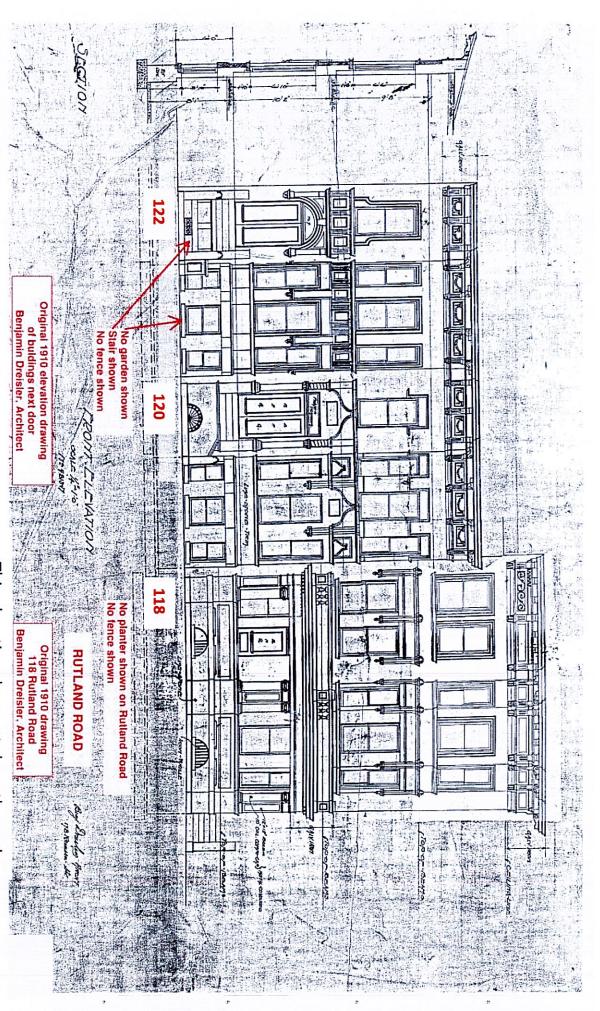


The original 1910 plans of 118 Rutland Road & adjoining properties by Benjamin Dreisler, Architect

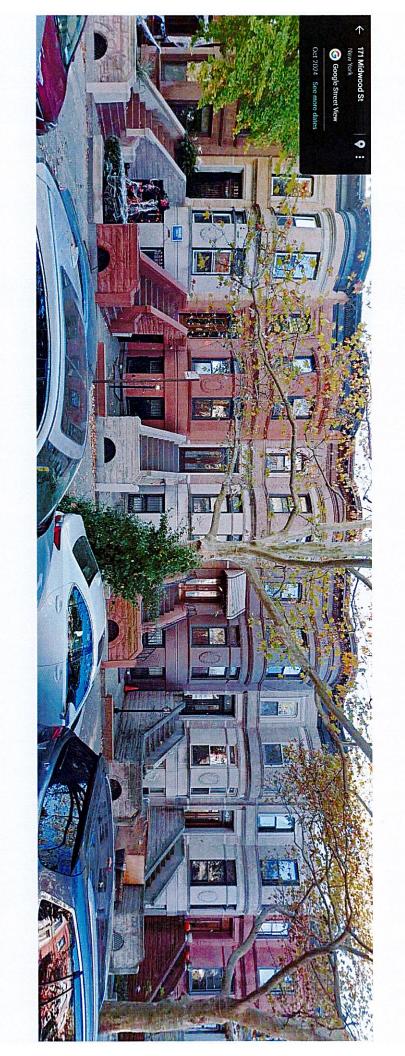

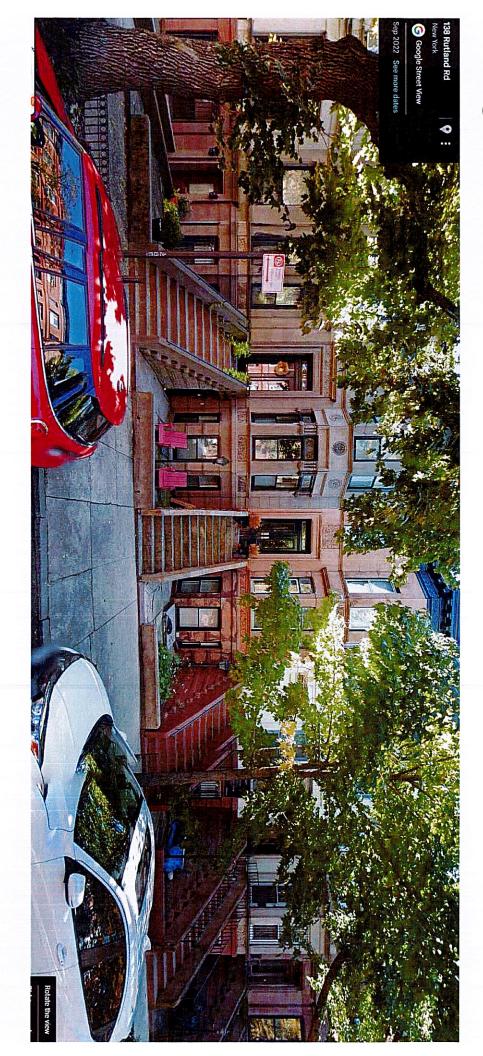

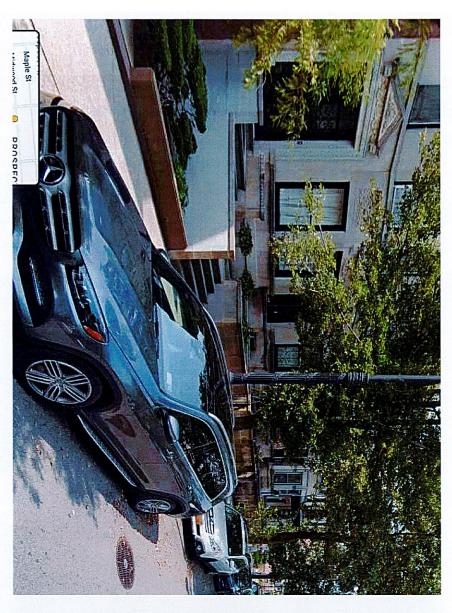

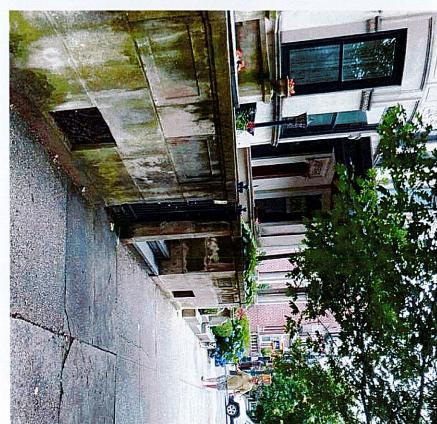


Rutland Road between Bedford & Rogers (Google street view)

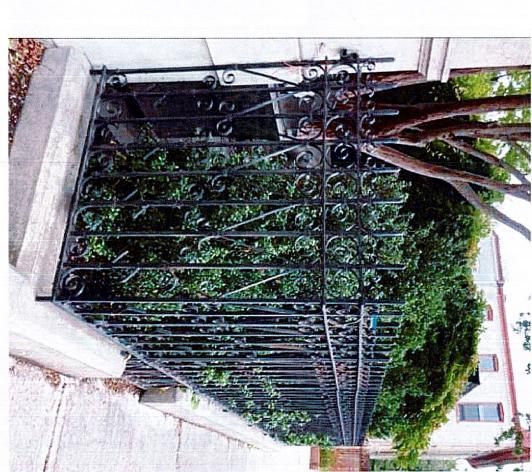

I. Call to Order

A. Committee Introductions

- 1. Location in District, Volunteer Capacity, Why Housing?
 - Returning and new members introduced themselves, their locations within the district, and interest in pursuing housing or other committee selections.

B. Landmarks Preservation Commission

1. 118 Rutland Rd

a) Architects of 118 Rutland Rd represented the homeowners LPC application to legalize the removal of the low iron fencing that was not replaced during the renovation process. A car accident in 2017 prompted repairs after accruing damage to low curbs, railing, and Rutland Rd stair entryway as it compromised facade aesthetics. Alterations for the exterior were complete by 2018, but the front iron fence was not re-installed. Applicants mentioned LPC's interest in requiring the fence was initiated when homeowners expressed interest to sell the property and not at the time renovations were completed in 2018.

- b) One of the most notable justifications for maintaining the appearance without the iron fencing was due to homeowner preference, cost, and mitigating trash and debris from loiterers seating alongside the flat top fence.
- c) Committee members reviewed facade and characteristics of the Prospect Lefferts Garden Historic District and discussed alternative options that alleviate homeowners concern for newinstallation of the iron fence.
- d) The general consensus favored LPC applicants to replace the fence, and moderate alterations that addressed homeowners primary concerns.
 - (1) Solutions leaned in favor of: hostile architecture as it aligns with the Victorian-era model of the house, as well the rear fencing that was preserved and restored with the initial renovation project in 2017. Additionally, the primary concern raised by applicants was trash and other debris accumulated from seating along the fence; spiked fencing should and could alleviate these concerns.
 - (2) Alternative materials and sourcing should be explored to mitigate extenuating costs.

C. Google Group for virtual resource distribution

- 1. Signed confirmation from each committee + resident member
 - Attended committee members confirmed permission to be included in Google Teams Groups to centralize committee resources and encourage collaborative contributions for resolution drafting.

D. 25-26 Session Planning

- 1. Committee Goals + Objectives
 - a) Members expressed varied interests, some of which include the lien sale + estate planning, possible directions focusing on transportations role within housing considerations, and balancing perspectives between individual experiences and community needs.
 - b) The committee is hoping to build goals and objectives as the session continues.

c) Community outreach was emphasized, as well as data collection / sourcing to better identify and understand housing needs and trends within the district.

E. New Business

- 1. JustFix Presentation for October
 - a) A non-profit organization that built an interactive map outlining tenant and homeowners legal protections as they apply to your individual building – Innovative Technology for Housing Justice as described by the organization.
 - b) Presentation will be for the first hour of the committee meeting, 30-45 minutes will be reserved for the presentation and remaining time will be for questions.
- 2. Anti-Harassment Homeowner + Tenant Protection Resolution
 - a) A little more information and time within the committee to discuss what to include in the resolution and will also be a collaborative editing process through the Google Teams Docs.

Meeting Goals Moving Forward

- Facilitate ongoing dialogue for consensus building.
- Support solutions that uphold landmark preservation and address property owners' concerns.
- Ensure that committee input is transparent, timely, and representative of district interests for the upcoming commission meeting.
- Unify housing and landmark goals through careful deliberation and community participation, with compromise and compliance as guiding principles.

ADDENDUM

Whereas, the architects of 118 Rutland Road presented a Landmarks Preservation Commission (LPC) application to maintain facade alterations due to a car accident in 2017. Noticeable damage along the curb, low railing, and Rutland Road stair entry were accrued prompting renovation. The repairs for the curb as well as "the original tall rear yard fencing has been preserved and restored." (17) by 2018, without the front iron fencing.

Applicants stated the front fence was not desirable to the homeowners as the low curb no longer invited trash and other debris from loiterers due to the height of the fence and flat top.

Additionally, construction was completed in 2018 and did not require fencing by LPC until homeowners demonstrated interest to sell.

Whereas, 118 Rutland Road lies in Prospect Lefferts Garden Historic District and homeowners knowingly accepted heightened restrictions for alterations.

Whereas, the housing committee did not attain quorum to place a motion regarding this application.

Whereas, applicants presented, and answered committee member questions regarding renovation processes, justifications to maintain current appearance, and alternative solutions that addressed homeowners concerns for loitering.

Therefore be it resolved, the following recommendations are on behalf of Housing Committee Chair:

Applicants are encouraged to maintain the facade of 118 Rutland Road as designated by LPC. Applicants may retain moderate flexibility for the iron fencing as long as it strongly resembles the historical, cultural, and aesthetic characteristics of the home as it was originally acquired.

1. 350 Troy Avenue Variance Presentation

- a. Congregation Yeshiva Beis Chaya Mushka seeks permission to expand an existing building for a private girls school and daycare
 - i. Current Zoning: R4
 - ii. Current Building Size: 3.0 FAR, after previous variance granted in 2005
 - iii. Proposed New Building Size: 6.0 FAR, 85 ft tall (6 stories; top floor for gym and auditorium will have double height ceiling), rooftop play area
- b. The school would like to accommodate more students. There is currently a waitlist for new students, no gym, some rooms are doubling as lunch and classroom facilities, and some grades have been combined in one classroom due to lack of space. They would like to add grades 9-12 education.
- c. Surrounding land uses include a 6-story apartment building next door on Carroll street, a commercial building across the street, a 4 story apartment building immediately behind the girls schools on President street and 2 story homes on President street. Other schools in the area are between 50-65 ft. tall but have significantly larger sites.

2. 350 Troy Avenue O&A

a. Q: How will the school ensure student safety during construction of the additional floors on top of the school A: We intend to do most of the work during the summer when the students are out of school. The columns for the original building were designed to support a larger structure than the present building

- b. Q: Have you reached out to the community, especially those living in and owning neighboring properties? A: We are required to notify all residents within 400 ft. or the plans. They will have the opportunity to testify at the BSA public hearing Q: Will you engage them beyond the required letters for example by holding a community meeting or block association meetings? A: We are willing to work with CB9 to facilitate more community outreach
- c. Q: If the demand for school spots has been steadily increasing, you already have one variance, at what point will the requests for expansion stop? Why not construct a new building there is a vacant lot across the street. A: We will stop expanding the current building after this. Our goal is to get to 1 classroom/26 students per K-12 grade plus the preschool/daycare. We've been trying to get the Verizon building across the street. We would consider using that for expansion instead if that was an option but so far, they're not selling.
- d. Q: Is there a traffic management plan because adding hundreds of students will increase the number of school buses and cars and a couple of double-parked buses during drop off and pick up could stop all traffic on Troy Ave A: We did a traffic analysis as part of the required CEQR for a variance. We have staggered bus pickups and drop-offs for the different grades to prevent traffic jams. Most of the students are walking to school as they come from the surrounding neighborhood.
- e. Q: Do you have a hearing date yet with the BSA? A: No, not yet
- f. Follow-up: Committee will vote and make a recommendation after receiving community feedback. Office to please stay in touch with applicants and forward results of any community feedback, disseminate notices of meetings to community etc. Esteban volunteers to work with applicants on door knocking for nearby tenants.

3. Committee Updates/Old Business

a. Charter Revision Ballot Amendments

- i. Mayors Charter Revision Commission recommended 3 ballot proposals that significantly change the ULURP process
- ii. City Council asked the Board of Elections not to certify the amendments because, as written, they don't make it clear that they seek to "remove the only democratically elected entity with voting power in the land-use process" which "undermines New Yorkers' ability to secure more affordable housing and investments for their neighborhoods."
- iii. The Board of Elections has certified the amendments as of Sep 11.
- iv. Community Board 9 will need to help educate voters about the full implications of the amendments
 - 1. There are hundreds of pages of zoning code changes associated with ballot amendments that are only a few lines long. Do we really know what we're voting for?
 - 2. We can't take an official position for or against, but we can educate voters.

- iv. There is a 12-story tower going up on the grounds of St. Francis of Assisi church on Maple between Nostrand and New York. Its taller than anything else in the area which are 2 story houses. What can we do? (Hannah)
 - 1. This is part of the new state historic register district. SHPO should review (Suki)
