SUBJECT: Request for Waiver of Fee - 1800-12 Pitkin Avenue, Brooklyn

Your memorandum of June 18, 1970, and Commissioner Clarke's letter of June 16, 1970, requesting a waiver of fees for examination of plans and application filed for 1800-12 Pitkin Avenue have been reviewed.

Section C26-30.0 of the Administrative Code provides that no fee shall be payable if the owner of the building property affected is a corporation or association organized and operated exclusively for religious, charitable or educational purposes.....and further provided that the property affected is to be used exclusively by such corporation or association for one or more of such purposes.

Since the property (tenement house) will not be used exclusively for religious, charitable or educational purposes, a waiver of fees may not be granted. The applicant is to be notified that a filing fee, must be paid before the application may be processed further; also a letter of reply should be sent, by you, to Commissioner Clarke.
