

Obtain a: Special Rigger License

New License Application Service Notice – Starting September 7, 2021, all new license applications are required to be submitted online at www.nyc.gov/dobnow. See the New License Application User Guide for step-by-step directions.

The Licensing & Exams Unit will **not** be accepting any walk-in transactions, or paper applications for this process

STEP 1: EXAM GUIDELINES

To obtain a Special Rigger License, you must meet the following qualifications:

- Be at least eighteen (18) years old
- Be able to read and write the English language
- Be fit to perform the work authorized by the particular license
- Have at least one (1) year of practical experience in the hoisting and rigging business within three (3) years prior to application
- Have satisfactorily completed a Department-approved thirty (30) hour training course
- Have knowledge of and be able to explain the risks of such work and necessary safety precautions that must be taken.

NOTE: Please see the full text of Title 28 of the New York City Administrative Code for all the qualifications requirements

STEP 2: APPLYING FOR THE EXAM

You **must** complete a practical exam in order to become a Special Rigger. First, complete the practical exam application (**LIC42**), check the box that indicates you are a Special Rigger candidate and submit the application with the \$350.00 fee, **payable by money order only**, to:

STEP 3: SCHEDULING YOUR EXAM

After submitting your exam application, next you **must** schedule your exam.

- If your application is accepted, you will receive an email from the exam administrator in three (3) to four (4) weeks with instructions on how to schedule your exam. Exams are given at several locations in the State.
- The practical exam assesses your knowledge of the rules and regulations governing hoisting and
 rigging in New York City, weights of various materials to be hoisted, knowledge of safety
 measures, accident prevention and related matter and your ability to perform rigging
 operations. You will **not** be allowed to use reference materials during the exam.
- If you pass the practical exam, you will receive a letter via US Mail by CPS approximately three (3) to four (4) weeks after the date of the practical exam.



STEP 4: BACKGROUND INVESTIGATION

To become a Special Rigger, you will need to upload **scanned PDFs** via the <u>DOB NOW Portal</u>. Applicants that do not currently have an eFiling account will need to create an account by completing the **registration form**.

You **must** upload **PDF scans**. Pictures of documents will not be accepted. The following documentation is required:

- Examination Score Report
- LIC2 License Application
- Typed LIC34: Licensing Supplemental Affidavit, if applicable
- LIC51 application

NOTE: Applicants may fill out the **LIC51** Voluntary Authorization for Service of Process by Email even if they would like to receive Notices of Violation (NOV)/Summonses via email.

- Supplemental Investigation Questionnaire
- Notarized Background Investigation Questionnaire
- Experience Verification Forms from all supervisors for the years you are claiming as experience

NOTE: The Experience Verification Forms from company Human Resources will not be accepted.

Social Security History of Earnings for the years you are claiming as experience. This
is NOT the Social Security Statement.

NOTE: There is a fee charged by the Social Security Administration for this service. You must request the report to be run by 'company name.' You may request the information by mail or in-person (ordinarily you can receive this instantly in person). Visit (http://www.ssa.gov/online/ssa-7050.html) for more information.

- Photo ID (driver's license, learner's permit, State ID, green card, or passport)
- Original Social Security Card
- 30 hour Department-approved Course Certificate
- LIC61 Form, must be completed by a physician within 90 days prior to the appointment date
- Typed and notarized letter from the Licensee listing the name, address and telephone number
 of the laboratory that performed the substance abuse test and a statement giving consent for
 the laboratory to the release such information to the Department
- Substance Abuse Attestation Form (this will be provided at the Department)
- Original birth certificate, current passport or green card
- Proof of Residence (utility bill, bank statement, lease or deed) or a typed notarized letter and bill from the person you are residing with

NOTE: Cell phone bills will not be accepted.



- Latest pay stub or W-2
- Child Support Certification Form
- Background Investigation Fee \$500.00 payable within the DOB NOW Portal

- License Issuance Fee \$100.00 payable within the DOB NOW Portal

STEP 5: OBTAINING THE LICENSE CARD

Once you have passed the practical exam and the background investigation, you need to obtain your Special Rigger license card.

- If you pass the practical exam and the background investigation, you will be able to schedule an appointment within the DOB NOW Portal to take picture and receive the Special Rigger license card.
- If you are approved for the license you are required to be an officer, partner or sole proprietor
 of a business/company, and the business must have a place of business in New York City that
 complies with all Zoning Code regulations (i.e. within a commercial zone)
- All applicants will be required to submit insurance certificates for General Liability, Worker's Compensation and Disability in order to obtain the license.
- You have one (1) year from the date of notification to submit the required documents for your license. If you do not complete the process within one (1) year of the date notification, you will be required to retake the exam.
