CCRB TO HOST NEW YORK STATE OVERSIGHT CONSORTIUM'S SPRING CONFERENCE

NEW YORK – The New York City Civilian Complaint Review Board (CCRB) is proud to partner with the New York State Oversight Consortium, the Rochester Police Accountability Board (PAB), and the National Association for Civilian Oversight of Law Enforcement (NACOLE) to host the Consortium's Spring Conference on Tuesday, April 14, 2026, at CUNY City Tech.

The state's leading organizations advancing civilian oversight of police are bringing together advocates, policymakers, and others to host dialogue and build public trust in police oversight systems.

The event will include panel discussions, networking opportunities, and other areas for knowledge sharing and skill development.

Presenting the Keynote Address will be Gwen Carr, mother of Eric Garner and Justice Committee member. Garner was killed by New York City Police Officers in 2014, sparking a social movement led by Carr that built to the termination of one officer and reforms to the use of force by the NYPD.
