I'd like to call 2 3 this meeting Wednesday, December 12, 2018, meeting of the Civilian Complaint Review 4 Board to order. 5 6 And before I give a few brief 7 remarks, I'd like to entertain a motion to 8 approve the minutes. 9 Is there a motion? MR. DWYER: So motioned. 10 11 MR. DAVIE: Is there a second? 12 MR. RIVADENEYRA: Aye. 13 MR. DAVIE: Are there any 14 corrections or additions to the minutes? 15 (No response.) 16 MR. DAVIE: Hearing none. 17 All those in favor of approving the minutes as we have them please say 18 19 aye. 20 (Chorus of ayes.) 21 MR. DAVIE: Opposed no. 22 (No response.) 23 MR. DAVIE: The ayes have it. The 24 minutes are passed. 25 I want to welcome you to this

2	meeting. As is the case with many of us	
3	the end of the year is a time for	
4	reflection. It's a time for reflection	
5	for me and I've been thinking a great deal	
6	about my time at CCRB over the last year.	
7	At about this time in 2017, Mayor	
8	de Blasio appointed me as acting chair of	
9	the agency. At the time I had been a	
10	member of the board for a little over a	
11	year. And I quickly learned being chair	
12	that with being chair comes a whole new	
13	level of responsibility.	
14	Is that right, Mr. Eason?	
15	MR. EASON: Absolutely.	
16	MR. DAVIE: Okay. Just checking.	
17	But it also comes with a whole lot	
18	of opportunity to make a difference in the	
19	City of New York. And that's really at	
20	the heart of why I take seriously this job	
21	as chair of the CCRB.	
22	But I think the greatest lesson	
23	I've learned thus far is that it really is	
24	a team effort and it involves everybody	
25	here. The CCRB wouldn't have been able to

2	accomplish the things that it did in 2018			
3	without the tireless efforts of my			
4	colleagues on this board and all of you			
5	who are the agency staff and who actually			
6	do all of the work every day.			
7	This year we passed a resolution			
8	that declared the CCRB's authority to			
9	investigate allegations of sexual			
10	misconduct. And investigators took on the			
11	work of training on that front so that we			
12	can better serve all New Yorkers. We			
13	engaged in a city-wide effort to ensure			
14	that residents of this city understand the			
15	Right to Know Act, a new law aimed at			
16	protecting the rights of civilians and			
17	ultimately moving us toward better			
18	police-community relations.			
19	We delivered hundreds of			
20	presentations at schools, senior centers,			
21	libraries, and other locations going to			
22	all five boroughs so that more New Yorkers			
23	can understand how the CCRB can be a			
24	resource to them.			
25	As I think about all that, I also			

7 1 Proceedings 2 think about how this all started. On 3 Monday -- this past Monday -- we had the great fortune, as most of you know, of 4 5 being able to recognize Mayor David 6 Dinkins for his foresight and political 7 courage in creating an independent 8 oversight agency more than 25 years ago. 9 And I'm old enough to remember when it actually happened. 10 After such a wonderful celebration 11 12 of the past and a reflection of where we are at present, I am inspired and hopeful 13 about the future of the CCRB perhaps now 14 15 more than ever. I think John is going to talk to 16 17 you in a few minutes about the Youth Summit. But I want to -- I also want to 18 19 note that the Youth Summit is part of that 20 hope that I feel. 21 We're closing 2018 and looking 22 forward to starting 2019 by hearing from 23 young people, the next generation of New 24 Yorkers, about their experiences with 25 members of the NYPD. The enthusiasm and

2	optimism we see in these young people; the			
3	belief that they can make a difference;			
4	that's what drives me. And I think it			
5	drives all of us at here at the CCRB to do			
6	all that we can, not only to hold police			
7	accountable and to improve oversight of

10	improve community relations, to make this			
11	city a safer and better place for			
12	everyone.			
13	Thank you and I'll now turn it to			
14	our Executive Director, Mr. Darche.			
15	MR. DARCHE: Thank you, Mr. Chair.			
16	Fred very eloquently described			
17	Monday's event. I just want to thank the			
18	board for allowing me to participate. It			
19	was an amazing event. It was an honor to			
20	be a part of it.			
21	I'm not going to go through the			
22	list that Fred went through of all the			
23	things we've done this year, but I want to			
24	thank the staff for their hard work. And			
25	let you all know that next year I expect

We've actually set up a youth 6 advisory council because we want this 7 summit to be about youth, for youth, by 8 youth so that we can really listen to 9 members of the community who are sometimes the least heard but most affected by 10 11 police. 12 We originally set out to have 15 13 members of the youth advisory council but we had such an overwhelming response, 14 15 we've increased the number of members to 20. 16 It will have young people ages 11 to 17 24 from all five boroughs. And we're looking forward to their insight in 18 19 planning February's Youth Summit. 20 As many of you know, agency and 21 NYPD disciplinary records are covered by 22 50 -- Civil Rights Law 50a. So when 23 people speak in the public session right 24 now we're going to ask that you not 25 discuss individual incidents that might
