The CCRB Youth Advisory Council

- In 2018, the CCRB created a Youth Advisory Council (YAC):
 - Young people ages 10-24 from across New York City
 - Advises the Agency on how best to engage young people
 - Coordinates events and creates public information materials in cooperation with CCRB staff
 - Serves as community leaders and liaisons on issues of social justice and policing



The CCRB Youth Summit

- On February 26, 2019, the YAC helped organize "Speak Up Speak Out: A Youth Summit on Policing in New York City," an event co-hosted by the CCRB, the NYU McSilver Institute for Poverty, Policy, and Research, and the New York University Law Center on Race, Inequality and the Law
- Over 250 young people from all 5 boroughs attended

The CCRB Youth Report

Adults reported most incidents to the CCRB.

(p. 7)

Most of the complaints involved young males of color.

(p. 7)

Young people of color were stopped for seemingly innocuous activities.

(p.8)

Plainclothes officers represented a large portion of Officer Unidentified cases in the CCRB's review.

(p. 34)

Recommendations for the NYPD

Use of Force data should include age and race.

Consider victims' ages when making penalty recommendations.

Train officers on the differences between policing adults and policing youth.

Take this report into account when finalizing the Department's new youth initiative.

Strengthen requirement for officers to notify parents or guardians.
