CCRB Complaints and LGBTQIA+ Complainants

How the CCRB Tracks Gender Identity and Sexual Orientation

- All demographic data is self-reported
- Investigators do not ask about sexual orientation, but record the data if the complainant discloses it

How the CCRB Tracks Gender Identity and Sexual Orientation

- Demographic data options have evolved over time:
 - 2015: CCRB begins recording sexual orientation with options “Straight,” “Gay or Lesbian,” “Bisexual,” and “Other.”
 - 2015: “Transman” and “Transwoman” added to prior gender options of “Male” and “Female.”
 - 2017: “Gender nonconforming” added as a gender option.

Where possible, begin studying long-term trends in complaints that might help illuminate areas of concern and better illustrate intersectional issues, including race and ethnicity
