## **CCRB To Hold Public Board Meeting**

New York, NY – The New York City Civilian Complaint Review Board (CCRB) will hold its monthly Board meeting online on Wednesday, December 9 at 4:00 p.m. However, this meeting will no longer be dedicated to receiving public comment on the CCRB's new rules. The public comment hearing has been postponed until Wednesday, January 13, 2021.

In lieu of the public comment hearing on the CCRB's proposed rules, the agency encourages all New Yorkers to attend and share their experiences with policing and police-community relations, and to learn about civilian oversight of the NYPD.
