CCRB Chair Davie on Arrest of NYPD Officer Vincent D'Andraia

New York, NY – New York City Civilian Complaint Review Board (CCRB) Chair Fred Davie issued the following statement on Friday regarding the arrest of Officer Vincent D'Andraia:

“By taking swift action to address police misconduct, the Brooklyn District Attorney’s Office is moving our city in the right direction. This is far from the full extent of the change that needs to happen within the New York City Police Department, however. For our city, this should be the floor, not the ceiling.”

“As New York continues to carve a path forward for police accountability, the Civilian Complaint Review Board will continue the work of investigating allegations of misconduct. As always, the CCRB’s investigations, which will be independent of any criminal proceedings, will be thorough and impartial.”

The New York City Civilian Complaint Review Board (CCRB) is the largest police oversight entity in the nation and is empowered to investigate, mediate, prosecute, and recommend disciplinary action for complaints alleging misconduct by NYPD officers. See NYC Charter § 440(c)(1). The agency's jurisdiction includes excessive and unnecessary force, abuse of authority, discourtesy, and use of offensive language. To further this mission, CCRB issues monthly, biannual, and special statistical and qualitative reports analyzing trends and recurring issues arising from the many thousands of civilian complaints it receives each year.
