

Case Summary

On May 22, 2020, an unidentified caller filed this complaint via phone with IAB regarding an incident involving § 87(2)(b) On June 3, 2020, the CCRB received this complaint from IAB. On May 22, 2020, at approximately 7:35 p.m., \$\frac{8.87(2)(b)}{2} was walking east of the intersection of Alexander Avenue and East 137th Street in the Bronx, on East 137th Street. approached PO Brian Greaige of PSA 7, who stood between \$87(2)(6) and a simultaneous incident involving multiple other officers of PSA 7, including Lieutenant Eric Dym, SGT Wilmer Maruqez, SGT Tiffany Batista, PO John Joyce, PO Brian Moynihan, PO Cristopher Boyce, PO Sebastian Bernard, PO Joseph Canale, PO Forrester Johnson, and PO Kelvis Rodriguez. PO Greaige asked § 87(2)(b) where he was going, and then pushed [87(2)(b) backwards when \$7(2) did not verbally respond (Allegation A: Force, \$87(2)(g) PO Greaige then walked and pushed him for a second time (Allegation B: Force, \$87(2)(g) toward Greaige, PO Moynihan, PO Boyce, and PO Bernard took to the ground and repeatedly punched and kicked \$\frac{\\$87(2)(b)}{\} in his head, ribs, and stomach (Allegation C-F: Force, While on the ground, an unknown officer kneed and struck § 87(2)(b) on his head was placed into handcuffs and stood up, (Allegation G: Force, § 87(2)(g) after which an additional unknown officer punched him in his face and on his back (Allegation H: While \(\frac{\frac{\frac{8}{87(2)(b)}}{6}}{} was being arrested, PO Rodriguez threatened an individual making a video recording of the arrest with a summons (Allegation I: Abuse of Authority, § 87(2)(g) was then transported to the PSA 7 stationhouse by PO Greaige and PO Moynihan. While driving PO Greaige yelled at an unknown pedestrian, "Fucking Minnie Mouse! Fucking Anthony Brown" (Allegation J: Discourtesy, \$87(2)(9) was arrested during this incident for obstruction of governmental administration and for disorderly conduct (Board Review 01). [\$ 87(2)(6)] [\$ 86(1)(3)&(4)] [\$ 87(2)(6)] The CCRB obtained BWC videos of this incident recorded by PO Greaige (Board Review 03) (Board Review 04), PO Boyce (Board Review 05), PO Joyce (Board Review 06), PO Johnson (Board Review 07), PO Rodriguez (Board Review 08), SGT Marquez (Board Review 09), PO Canale (Board Review 10), and PO Bernard (Board Review 13). The CCRB also obtained a video recording provided by § 87(2)(b) (Board Review 14). Finally, the CCRB obtained surveillance footage of this incident from NYCHA (Board Review 15), which was exported into a viewable format (Board Review 16). **Findings and Recommendations** Allegation (A) Force: At \$87(2)(6) in the Bronx, Police Officer Brian Greaige used physical force against \$87(2)(b) Allegation (B) Force: At \$87(2)(b) in the Bronx, Police Officer Brian Greaige used physical force against § 87(2)(b) Allegation (C) Force: At \$87(2)(b) in the Bronx, Police Officer Brian Greaige used physical force against § 87(2)(b) Allegation (D) Force: At \$87(2)(b) in the Bronx, Police Officer Christophe Boyce




needed to walk around if he wished to go to a development. S87(2)(6) came within arm's reach of PO Greaige, and then stated he would not go around because he lived at a location inside the housing development. PO Greaige believed that \$87(2)(6) could have crossed to the opposite side of the street and continued into the housing development without any issues. PO Greaige told \$37(2)(b) three or four times to walk around the group, and then grabbed left shoulder to guide him around the group in a different direction. §87(2)(6) shrugged his shoulder away from PO Greaige's hand, made several statements that PO Greaige could not recall, and then clenched his right hand into a fist as if he was getting ready to swing at PO Greaige. PO Greaige, who believed that \$87(2)(b) was about to strike him, grabbed \$87(2)(b) by his arm and put him against a fence on the southern side of the sidewalk. In response, \$87(2)(b) tensed his body and flailed his arms. At this point, multiple additional officers, whose identities PO Greaige could not recall, came to assist PO Greaige with \$87(2)(b) and \$87(2)(b) taken to the ground. PO Greaige stated that officers used hand strikes on §87(2)(6) but PO Greaige did not recall if used any himself. PO Greaige did not recall whether an officer used a knee strike against PO Greaige did not recall whether an officer stepped on or kicked \$87(2)(6) Greaige stated that after a few minutes of struggle \$87(2)(b) was placed into handcuffs, and that afterwards \$87(2)(b) was then removed from the scene in a police vehicle without any further use of force. During PO Moynihan's CCRB interview (Board Review 20), he stated that he overheard PO Greaige telling [87(2)(b) to go to the other side of the street to avoid police activity. PO Moynihan stated that he was looking away from PO Greaige and \$57(2)(b) at the time of this interaction, and so did not see if \$87(2)(6) attempted to strike PO Greaige. However, shortly after hearing PO Greaige telling \$87(2)(b) to walk around to avoid police activity, PO Moynihan heard what sounded like a struggle, and then turned and saw that PO Greaige and §87(2)(6) fighting. PO Moynihan immediately moved to assist PO Greaige and assisted in taking \$87(2)(6) to the ground. PO Moynihan did not recall what force was required to place \$87(2)(6) custody, and further did not recall what force he used on \$87(2)(b) PO Moynihan did not recall if he used hand strikes on \$87(2)(6) nor if any other officer used hand strikes. PO Moynihan did not recall if any officer struck \$87(2)(b) with a knee during this struggle. During PO Boyce's CCRB interview (Board Review 21), PO Boyce stated that, after was told that he would need to walk around officers to avoid interfering with police activity, pulled his arm back and attempted to punch PO Greaige. PO Boyce stated that officers then brought \$87(2)(b) to the ground, restrained him, and placed him into handcuffs. PO Boyce stated that he used multiple hand strikes on \$87(2)(b) to overcome his resistance to being arrested, but that he did not recall if those occurred while \$87(2)(b) was standing up or when he was taken to the ground. PO Boyce believed that all his hand strikes were on \$87(2)(6) lower body. PO Boyce stated that, while \$87(2)(b) was on the ground, he kicked and flailed with his legs in what PO Boyce believed to be an attempt to strike officers. § 87(2)(b) also attempted to throw punches while he was being placed into custody, in what PO Boyce believed to be a generalized attempt to harm officers. However, PO Boyce was not struck by \$87(2)(b) and he did not recall \$87(2)(b) striking or injuring any officer during this incident. PO Boyce did not recall seeing any other officer use hand strikes on \$87(2)(b) did not recall any officer kneeing \$87(2)(b) did not recall any officer striking \$87(2)(b) on his upper body, and did not recall \$87(2)(b) being struck in the head by any officer during this incident. During PO Bernard's CCRB interview (Board Review 22), he stated that he only became aware of \$87(2)(6) presence on scene after officers began to struggle with him. PO Bernard did not recall seeing a forcible takedown used by officers on \$37(2)(6) PO Bernard held at least one of \$87(2)(b) legs down during the arrest, but he did not see if \$87(2)(b) kicked any officer during the process of his arrest. PO Bernard stated that, at a point after (\$872) was taken to the ground, he punched \$87(2)(b) in the leg. PO Bernard did not believe that he struck \$87(2)(b)

the leg more than once, and he stated that he did not recall witnessing another officer using a hand strike, a knee strike, or any other strike on (\$87(2)(b) during the process of placing him under arrest. PO Bernard did not recall observing any officer strike \$57(2)(6) on his torso or his head. The CCRB obtained a Threat, Resistance, and Injury (TRI) worksheet, prepared by Deputy Inspector John Potkay in relation to this incident (Board Review 23). The TRI reported that was repeatedly told to disperse, as he was interfering with an active police investigation. I then became combative, clenching his fist, flailing his arms, and tensing his body while being arrested. The TRI reports that PO Greaige, PO Moynihan, PO Bernard, and PO Boyce conducted a forcible takedown on \$87(2)(b) and used hand strikes to place him under arrest. arrest report from this incident (Board Review 01) stated that § 87(2)(b) arrested for refusing multiple orders to disperse, and for then acting aggressively towards officers by clenching his fists, flailing his arms, and tensing his body while being arrested. The CCRB received a video provided by \$87(2)(b) recorded by an unknown civilian, capturing this incident (Board Review 14). Beginning at timecode 0:20, multiple officers can be seen taking down \$87(2)(b) who is not clearly visible under the numerous officers affecting his arrest. An unknown officer can be seen to use a knee strike, but it cannot be seen if that strike connects with \$87(2)(b) or if so where on \$87(2)(b) body it connects. No other clear use of force is captured in this video. The CCRB obtained BWC footage of this incident from PO Greaige (Board Review 03), showing the initial interaction with \$50(2)(6) At timecode 0:05-0:07, PO Greiage walks past several officers and at least three civilians who stand around the officers and are not a part of the group that the officers stopped. At timecode 0:09, \$87(2)(6) can be seen to approach the group of officers gathered on the southern side of East 137th Street in the Bronx. § 87(2)(b) slows to a stop a few feet away from PO Greaige at timecode 0:16 and appears to look at PO Greaige. \$87(2)(6) does not appear to make any statement. At timecode 0:18, PO Greaige approaches \$87(2)(b) appears to place his right hand on \$87(2)(b) left shoulder, turning \$87(2)(b) timecode 0:20, PO Greaige appears to shove [887(2)] away from officers to the west on the sidewalk. \$87(2)(b) slows to a stop and turns back towards officers. \$87(2)(b) does not appear to say anything or make any movements. §87(2)(6) hands are at his side at timecode 0:23 and are not clenched into fists: only the fingers are slightly curled but not in a fist, as shown by the fact that once can see the spaces between \$87(2)(b) fingers. PO Greaige rapidly walks towards and again grabs and pushes \$87(2)(b) at the shoulders. \$87(2)(b) appears to reach up his arms in response, and multiple officers rapidly approach and grab \$87(2)(6) However, the actions taken by specific officers are not captured. The video then suddenly ends at timecode 0:33. When presented with this BWC video, PO Greaige stated that he had already told to walk around once or twice prior to this video recording beginning. The CCRB also obtained BWC footage recorded by PO John Joyce (Board Review 06) which partially captured the use of force by officers during this incident. At timecode 0:05, PO Joyce appears to run towards a group of officers that are in the process of arresting \$87(2)(b) appears to be taken to the ground such that he is face-down, but the exact actions \$87(2)(b) and the officers take are unclear due to the poor video image quality due to the number of officers present and PO Joyce's movements during the arrest. PO Johnson's BWC footage (Board Review 07) begins as PO Johnson picks his BWC up from the ground after the conclusion to the struggle with \$87(2)(b) Though PO Rodriguez's BWC video (Board Review 08) appears to begin while officers are still struggling with \$87(2)(b) ground, PO Rodriguez first faces away from the struggle and then walks away from it, capturing only a few moments of the struggle and not capturing any knee, hand, or foot strikes to \$87(2)(b) head or neck area, nor any strike after \$87(2)(b) was placed into handcuffs. No other BWC video capturing the use of force during this incident was identified by the CCRB. As discussed in detail under **Allegation K-T**, no officer properly recorded BWC of this incident.

The CCRB also obtained surveillance footage of this incident (Board Review 15) and

exported the relevant footage in a playable format (Board Review 16). Beginning at timecode can be seen to walk into frame and move towards the officers. §87(2)(6) directly up to the group of officers, stopping in front of PO Greaige at timecode 11:20. PO Greaige appears to turn and push second who takes a few steps backwards before turning back towards PO Greaige at timecode 11:25. PO Boyce and PO Greaige then appear to approach though the subsequently interaction cannot be clearly seen due to the quality of the surveillance footage and several bushes between the surveillance camera and the sidewalk on the southern sidewalk of East 137th Street. PO Greaige and PO Boyce appear to forcibly take second ground, whereupon the entirety of \$87(2)(6) arrest, including the positioning of his person and the actions officers take against him, are obscured by a bush. At timecode 12:45 officers appear to off of the ground, and he is stood against a fence on the sidewalk off of East 137th Street. Though officers appear to hold \$3000 by his hoodie, no strike is observed from timecode 12:45 until timecode 16:45, when \$87(2)(6) is placed into an unmarked police vehicle for removal from the scene. NYPD Patrol Guide Procedure 221-01 (Board Review 25) states that officers may use force when it is reasonable to ensure the safety of a member of the service or a third person, or otherwise to protect life, or when it is reasonable to place a person in custody or to prevent escape from custody. In determining whether the use of force is reasonable, members are instructed to consider numerous factors, including the nature and severity of the crime and circumstances, the actions taken by the subject, the immediacy of the perceived threat or harm to the members of the service, actions taken by the subject, and the presence of a hostile crowd or agitators. stated that, while attempting to walk past PO Greaige, PO Greaige pushed him back and instructed him to walk around officers. While \$3000 stated that at this time of this first push he had not yet been instructed to walk around officers, PO Greaige stated that he told to walk around the group of officers and stopped individuals three to four times before While \$87(2)(b) stated that he ignored PO Greaige until PO Greaige pushed him, and that he did not say anything prior to that push, PO Greaige stated that \$87(2)(6) repeatedly replied that he would not go around officers, and that it was only after these statements that PO Greaige pushed him. The CCRB was not able to identify BWC footage with audio of PO Greaige's initial interaction with \$87(2)(6) and PO Greaige's footage does not clearly show whether or not spoke while approaching PO Greaige. However, BWC, officer testimony, and surveillance footage are all consistent in showing that save had approached to within a few feet of an active police stop. § 87(2)(g) PO Greaige's second engagement with \$3000 is shown in the BWC footage; stood still after the first push, and within seconds, PO Greaige re-engaged \$87(2)(6) attempting to push him further. Since was not attempting to walk back toward the officers—nor was he given the time to signal any form of compliance or noncompliance, PO Greaige initiated this further use of force of his own volition without any specific prompting by The physical presence of other civilian bystanders standing between the other officers and PO Greaige, who the officers did not engage, shows that there was not an active, urgent safety concern in immediately keeping civilians out of the area aside from the details covered in Allegation A with the initial redirection and push. The video footage established that [57(2)] did not clench his fists in an attempt to signal a possible punch and rather stood with his fingers slightly curled, which lessened PO Greaige's necessity of proactive self-defense. Since PO Greaige any further time to signal compliance or noncompliance with the initial did not provide § 87(2)(b) order and push, \$87(2)(g)


During PO Moynihan's CCRB interview, when presented with his BWC footage, he stated that, though he heard a voice stating, "Keep it moving Minnie Mouse! Fucking Minnie Mouse!" he had no recollection of anyone making that statement. PO Moynihan believed that he was not the one who made that statement.


A comparison of PO Moynihan's BWC footage and PO Greaige's interview audio showed that the voice captured stating, "Fucking Minnie Mouse! Fucking Anthony Brown," had the same sound and intonation as PO Greaige's voice, and thus, this allegation was pled to PO Greaige.

As per <u>Patrol Guide Procedure 200-02</u> (Board Review 27), the values of the NYPD include the pledge to maintain a higher standard of integrity than is generally expected of others and to respect the dignity of each individual and render their services with courtesy and civility.

Though officers are generally held to a higher standard of etiquette, the NYPD's disciplinary decisions have found that otherwise discourteous statements that are made in the context of stressful or dangerous law enforcement activities do not rise to the level of actionable misconduct. NYPD Disciplinary Case No. 2013-10143 (Board Review 28). However, as discussed in Disciplinary Case Number 2017-17005 (Board Review 29), the NYPD has circumscribed that exception as officers have a duty to behave in a courteous and professional manner. The NYPD held that, though a chaotic situation in which there is an immediate need to maintain order can override that duty, that exception should not overcome that duty.
