**EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT TO THE BOARD**  
**MONTHLY PUBLIC BOARD MEETING**  
**July 10, 2013**

The CCRB received 447 complaints in June. This is 55 fewer complaints than in the same period of 2012, when the CCRB received 502. This is an 11% decrease in complaint activity for this period.

From January to June, the CCRB received 2,566 complaints within its jurisdiction. This is a 10% decrease in complaint activity compared to the same period of last year. Total complaint intake, which includes complaints within our jurisdiction and those we refer out, has declined by 34%.

The board closed 538 cases in June. In the first six months of 2013, the board closed 1,130 cases and substantiated 177 cases which was a substantiation rate of 16% of fully investigated cases. The truncation rate was 57%. This was 7 points higher than in the first half of 2012, when the truncation rate was 50%.

In June, the mediation unit closed 10 cases as mediated and 35 cases as mediation attempted. Year-to-date, the mediation unit has scheduled 35 mediation sessions and 34 have been successful. The mediation unit has also closed 76 as mediation attempted and 9 cases with other outcomes, such as complaint withdrawn.

The agency's docket at the end of June stood at 2,809 cases, which is an 0.4% decrease over the open docket in May when it stood at 2,821. Ninety-one percent of our open investigations were filed within the last year, and 63% were filed in the last four months. Of the open cases, 685 are awaiting panel review, or 24% of the docket; 1,777 are being investigated; and 347 cases are in the mediation program.

By date of incident, 10 cases in the CCRB's open docket are 18 months and older as compared to 9 in June of 2012. This is 0.4% of the open docket. Two cases are on District Attorney hold; 3 cases were filed months after the date of incident. Two cases are pending panel review, two cases are pending mediation, and one case has been re-opened.

In May, the police department closed 28 substantiated cases involving 38 officers. The Department did not impose discipline against 19 officers. Year-to-date, the disciplinary action rate is 57% and the department declined to prosecute rate is 26%. In cases in which the department pursued charges and specifications, the conviction rate is 79%. This includes officers who pled guilty to charges and officers who were found guilty after disciplinary trials. The guilty after trial rate is 56%.
