Executive Director's Monthly Report December 2023 (Statistics for November 2023)

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Executive Summary

The Civilian Complaint Review Board ("CCRB") is an independent municipal Agency that investigates complaints of NYPD misconduct. Every month, the CCRB prepares an Executive Director report for its public meeting. Data for November 2023 included the following highlights:

- 1) Of the cases in the CCRB active investigations docket, 49% have been open for 4 months or fewer, and 71% have been open for 7 months or fewer (page 10). In November, the CCRB opened 414 new cases (page 4), and currently has a total open docket of 3,791 cases (page 11).
- 2) The CCRB substantiated allegations in 25% of its fully investigated cases in November (page 17).
- 3) The CCRB fully investigated 58% of the cases it closed in November (page 14). The Agency closed 32% of the cases as unable to investigate/withdrawn (page 14).
- 4) For November, investigations using video evidence resulted in substantiated allegations in 26% of cases compared to 9% of cases in which video was not available (page 24).
- 5) The Monthly Report includes a breakdown of complaints and substantiations by NYPD precinct and borough of occurrence (pages 5-6, 26-34).
- 6) In November the Police Commissioner finalized 16 decision(s) against police officers in Administrative Prosecution Unit (APU) cases (page 40). The CCRB's APU prosecutes the most serious allegations of misconduct. The APU conducted 38 trials against members of the NYPD year-to-date; 10 trials were conducted against respondent officers in November.

The CCRB is committed to producing monthly reports that are valuable to the public, and welcomes feedback on how to make its data more accessible.

Glossary

In this glossary we have included a list of terms that regularly appear in our reports.

Allegation: An allegation is a specific act of misconduct. The same "complaint" can have multiple allegations – excessive force and discourteous language, for example. Each allegation is reviewed separately during an investigation.

APU: The Administrative Prosecution Unit is the division of the CCRB that has prosecuted "charges" cases since April 2013, after the signing of a 2012 Memorandum of Understanding between the CCRB and NYPD.

Board Panel: The "Board" of the CCRB has 15 members. Following a completed investigation by the CCRB staff, three Board members, sitting as a Board Panel, will make a finding on whether misconduct occurred and will make a recommendation on what level of penalty should follow.

Case/Complaint: For the purposes of CCRB data, a "case" or "complaint" is defined as any incident within the Agency's jurisdiction, brought to resolution by the CCRB.

Disposition: The Board's finding as to the outcome of a case (i.e. if misconduct occurred).

FADO: Under the City Charter, the CCRB has jurisdiction to investigate the following categories of police misconduct: Force, Abuse of Authority, Discourtesy and Offensive Language, collectively known as "FADO".

FADO&U: A ballot measure revising the New York City Charter, which passed on November 5, 2019, authorized the CCRB to investigate the truthfulness of an official statement made by a subject officer during a CCRB investigation into a FADO allegation. This expanded jurisdiction—Force, Abuse of Authority, Discourtesy, Offensive Language, and Untruthful Statements (FADO&U)—went into effect on March 31, 2020.

Intake: CCRB's intake team initially handles complaints from the public. Intake takes complaints that come via live phone calls, voicemails, an online complaint form, or in-person.

Investigation: CCRB investigators gather evidence and interview witnesses to prepare reports on misconduct allegations. An investigation ends when a closing report is prepared detailing the evidence and legal analysis, and the case is given to the Board for disposition.

Mediation: A complainant may mediate his or her case with the subject officer, in lieu of an investigation, with the CCRB providing a neutral, third-party mediator.

Unable to Investigate / Withdrawn: When the CCRB is unable to obtain a sworn statement from the complainant/alleged victim, the case is closed as unable to investigate. When the complainant/alleged victim asks that their complaint be withdrawn, the case is closed as withdrawn.

Closed Pending Litigation: Sometimes when a complainant is involved in criminal or civil litigation, their attorney advises against making sworn statements until the conclusion of the court case. When a complainant declines to cooperate with an investigation on the advice of their attorney, the complaint disposition is "Closed Pending Litigation."

Complaints Received




Figure 1: Total Intake by Month (January 2022 - November 2023)







Figure 3: New CCRB Complaints by Year (YTD 2010 - YTD 2023)

The CCRB's Intake team processes misconduct complaints from the public and referrals from the NYPD. Under the New York City Charter, the CCRB's jurisdiction is limited to allegations of misconduct related to Force, Abuse of Authority, Discourtesy and Offensive Language. All other complaints are referred to the appropriate agency. Figure 1 refers to all complaints that the CCRB receives and Figures 2 and 3 refer to new cases that remain with the Agency. In November 2023, the CCRB initiated 414 new complaints.

Figure 4: CCRB Complaints Received By Borough of Occurrence (November 2023)




Figure 5: CCRB Complaints Received By Borough of Occurrence (YTD 2023)




Figure 6: CCRB Complaints Received By Precinct of Occurrence (November 2023)






Figure 9: CCRB Complaints Received By Type of Allegation (YTD 2022 vs. YTD 2023)

Figure 15: Number of Active Investigations (January 2022 - November 2023)




Figure 16: Open Docket Analysis




Figure 17: Open Docket Analysis with % Change

Body Worn Camera Footage Requests

Since the widespread roll out of body worn cameras in 2018, the collection of footage from these cameras has become an integral part of CCRB investigations.

The timeliness of the response to BWC footage requests has a direct impact on the length of time it takes to complete an investigation. The longer it takes to fulfill BWC requests, the longer CCRB investigations remain on the open docket.

Figure 20: Percentage of Open Investigations Docket with Pending BWC Requests (January 2022 - November 2023)






Figure 21: Fulfilled BWC Requests (January 2022 - November 2023)



Closed Cases

Dispositions

Cases fully investigated by the CCRB generally receive one of five outcomes:

- If the alleged misconduct is found to have occurred, based on the preponderance of the evidence, the allegation is closed as **substantiated**.
- If there is not enough evidence to determine whether or not the alleged misconduct occurred, the allegation is closed as **unable to determine**.*
- If the preponderance of the evidence suggests that the event or alleged act did not occur, the allegation is closed as **unfounded**.
- If the event did occur, but was not improper by a preponderance of evidence, the allegation is closed as within NYPD guidelines.**
- If the CCRB was unable to identify any of the officers accused of misconduct, the case is closed as **officer unidentified**.

Additionally, a case might be **mediated**, with the subject officer and complainant discussing the incident in the presence of a neutral third-party moderator, or closed as **mediation attempted**, the designation for a case in which both the officer and the civilian agree to mediate, but the civilian fails to appear twice for the scheduled mediation session or fails to respond to attempts to schedule a mediation session. Finally, a case that cannot be fully investigated because the CCRB was unable to obtain a sworn statement from the complainant/victim is closed as **unable to investigate**.

Case Abstracts

The following case abstracts are taken from complaints closed this month and serve as examples of what the different CCRB dispositions mean in practice:

1. Substantiated

An individual was in a subway station playing music on a portable speaker. The subject officer approached the individual and told him to turn off the music. The individual went to buy a MetroCard as the subject officer followed him. The individual turned off the music and flipped the subject officer off. The subject officer told the individual to leave the station and the individual said he wasn't leaving because he was on his way to work. The subject officer tried to grab the individual's arm and the individual took his arm away. The subject officer then shoved the individual in his chest. The subject officer kept pushing the individual out of the station and the individual asked him at least twice for his name and shield number. The subject officer only gave his name and command but not his shield number. The incident was captured on BWC. It showed the subject officer shoving the individual in the chest and pushing him out of the station while the individual cursed at him and flipped him off. It showed that the subject officer did not provide his shield number to the individual. The Board substantiated the Abuse of Authority allegations.

2. Unable to Determine

An individual stated that he had called a precinct to discuss noise ordinances and an unidentified officer answered the call. The individual stated that the unidentified officer told him to "go fuck yourself" and hung up the phone. The individual called back and spoke to the subject officer to file a complaint about the unidentified officer's conduct. The subject officer told the individual that he could not file the complaint over the phone, that there were no physical complaint forms at the precinct and that the individual had to call CCRB. The subject officer provided the individual with CCRB's phone number, and the individual ended the phone call. The subject officer at his interview stated that he asked the individual if they wanted to file a CCRB complaint and he did not refuse to file the individual's complaint. Without the testimony of other witnesses, the investigation could not determine whether the subject officer refused to file the individual's complaint. The Board closed the Abuse of Authority allegation as Unable to Determine.

3. Unfounded

An individual walked through an emergency gate at a subway station when he was approached by the subject officer. The individual alleged that the subject officer threatened to arrest him before issuing the individual a summons. The incident was captured on BWC and MTA video. The videos show the individual walking through the emergency gate and being approached by the subject officer who asked for the individual's ID. The subject officer continued speaking to the individual and the individual asked about the summons and court dates. The BWC doesn't show the subject officer threatening to arrest the individual. The Board closed the Abuse of Authority allegation as Unfounded.

4. Within NYPD Guidelines

An individual stated that she jumped the turnstile at a subway station. She was stopped by the two subject officers who asked her for ID. She provided it and the subject officers ran her ID and arrested her for an active I-card. The incident was captured on BWC. It showed the individual being stopped and being arrested. The investigation found that the I-card was a suspect-only with no probable cause to arrest. The investigation found that because the individual was observed committing fare evasion, which is a misdemeanor offense, the subject officers were within their discretion to arrest her for that offense. The Board closed the Abuse of Authority allegations as being Within NYPD Guidelines.

5. Officer Unidentified

An individual stated that she came home from work and was unable to enter her apartment. She was informed by the superintendent's wife that "SWAT" and "FDNY" broke down her door and entered her apartment. The individual went to the precinct and was told that officers broke down her door because there was a 911 call for a dead body in her apartment. The individual was told that no dead body was found at her apartment. The individual was given access to her apartment and she saw signs of a search including her curtains on the ground. The investigation found that two officers had arrived at the individual's apartment but left after they knocked on the individual's door and received no answer. The officers left for another incident and had called ESU to assist with the new incident. The officers surmised that ESU might have been mistakenly sent to the individual's apartment. Without additional pertinent information, the investigation could not identify a subject officer. The Board closed the Abuse of Authority allegations as Officer Unidentified.

^{*} Unable to determine is reported to the Commissioner as Unsubstantiated, meaning that there was insufficient evidence to establish whether or not there was an act of misconduct.

^{**} Within NYPD Guidelines is reported to the Commissioner as Exonerated, meaning there was a preponderance of the evidence that the acts alleged occurred but did not constitute misconduct.

Figure 23: Disposition Counts of Full Investigations (November 2023)





Figure 24: Disposition Counts of Full Investigations (YTD 2023)

Dispositions - Allegations

"Allegations" are different than "cases." A case or complaint is based on an incident and may contain one or more allegations of police misconduct. The allegation substantiation rate is 16% for the month of November 2023, and the allegation substantiation rate is 16% year-to-date.

Dispositions - Untruthful Statement Allegations

Following the 2019 passage of Ballot Question #2 and the subsequent City Charter Revision, CCRB's jurisdiction was expanded to include untruthful material statements made by police officers. As a result, CCRB added a new "Untruthful Statement" category of allegations.

There are four specific allegations in the new "Untruthful Statement" category: 1) False official statement, 2) Misleading official statement, 3) Inaccurate official statement and 4) Impeding an investigation.

Dispositions - Bias-Based Policing Allegations

The Racial Profiling and Bias Based Policing ("RPBP") Unit is a unit at the CCRB focused on investigating civilian complaints of profiling/biased policing by uniformed (not civilian) members of the NYPD based on 10 different protected categories: race, national origin/ethnicity, color, religion, age, immigration or citizenship status, gender/gender identity, sexual orientation, disability, and housing status.

Figure 33: Percentage of Cases Substantiated (January 2022 - November 2023)





Figure 34: Disposition of Substantiated Complaints* (2023)

Figure 35: Substantiation Rates for Full Investigations without Video (Jan 2022 - Nov 2023) (% substantiated shown)





Figure 36: Substantiation Rates for Full Investigations with Video (Jan 2022 - Nov 2023) (% substantiated shown)



Board Discipline Recommendations for Substantiated Officers

After a CCRB investigative team has completed its investigation, a panel of Board members determines whether to substantiate the allegation(s) and make a disciplinary recommendation against the officer(s).

- "Charges and Specifications" are the most severe form of discipline. A decision to assign
 Charges commences a process that may result in an administrative trial in the NYPD Trial
 Room. An officer may lose vacation days, be suspended, or be terminated if the officer is
 found guilty.
- "Command Discipline B" and "Command Discipline A" are recommended for misconduct that is moderately serious. An officer can lose up to ten vacation days as a result of Command Discipline B and up to five vacation days as a result of Command Discipline A.
- "Formalized Training" are the least severe discipline, often recommended for officers who misunderstand a policy. This determination results in training at the Police Academy or NYPD Legal Bureau (Formalized Training).
- When the Board has recommended Formalized Training or Command Discipline, the case is sent to the NYPD Commissioner to impose training and/or other penalties. Cases where the Board recommends charges are prosecuted by the CCRB's Administrative Prosecution Unit.
