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Executive Director's Monthly Report March 2025 (Statistics for February 2025)

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Executive Summary

The Civilian Complaint Review Board ("CCRB") is an independent municipal Agency that investigates complaints of NYPD misconduct. Every month, the CCRB prepares an Executive Director report for its public meeting. Data for February 2025 included the following highlights:

- 1) Of the cases in the CCRB active investigations docket, 46% have been open for 4 months or fewer, and 64% have been open for 7 months or fewer (page 10). In February, the CCRB opened 437 new cases (page 4), and currently has a total open docket of 2,953 cases (page 11).
- 2) The CCRB substantiated allegations in 43% of its fully investigated cases in February (page 17).
- 3) The CCRB fully investigated 40% of the cases it closed in February (page 14).
- 4) For February, investigations using video evidence resulted in substantiated allegations in 44% of cases compared to 38% of cases in which video was not available (page 24).
- 5) The Monthly Report includes a breakdown of complaints and substantiations by NYPD precinct and borough of occurrence (pages 5-6, 42-51).
- 6) In February the Police Commissioner finalized 12 decision(s) against police officers in Administrative Prosecution Unit (APU) cases (page 30). The CCRB's APU prosecutes the most serious allegations of misconduct. The APU conducted 2 trials against members of the NYPD year-to-date; 2 trials were conducted against respondent officers in February.

The CCRB is committed to producing monthly reports that are valuable to the public, and welcomes feedback on how to make its data more accessible.

Glossary

In this glossary we have included a list of terms that regularly appear in our reports.

Allegation: An allegation is a specific act of misconduct. The same "complaint" can have multiple allegations – excessive force and discourteous language, for example. Each allegation is reviewed separately during an investigation.

APU: The Administrative Prosecution Unit is the division of the CCRB that has prosecuted "charges" cases since April 2013, after the signing of a 2012 Memorandum of Understanding between the CCRB and NYPD.

Board Panel: The "Board" of the CCRB has 15 members. Following a completed investigation by the CCRB staff, three Board members, sitting as a Board Panel, will make a finding on whether misconduct occurred and will make a recommendation on what level of penalty should follow.

Case/Complaint: For the purposes of CCRB data, a "case" or "complaint" is defined as any incident within the Agency's jurisdiction, brought to resolution by the CCRB.

Disposition: The Board's finding as to the outcome of a case (i.e. if misconduct occurred).

FADO: Under the City Charter, the CCRB has jurisdiction to investigate the following categories of police misconduct: Force, Abuse of Authority, Discourtesy and Offensive Language, collectively known as "FADO".

FADO&U: A ballot measure revising the New York City Charter, which passed on November 5, 2019, authorized the CCRB to investigate the truthfulness of an official statement made by a subject officer during a CCRB investigation into a FADO allegation. This expanded jurisdiction—Force, Abuse of Authority, Discourtesy, Offensive Language, and Untruthful Statements (FADO&U)—went into effect on March 31, 2020.

Intake: CCRB's intake team initially handles complaints from the public. Intake takes complaints that come via live phone calls, voicemails, an online complaint form, or in-person.

Investigation: CCRB investigators gather evidence and interview witnesses to prepare reports on misconduct allegations. An investigation ends when a closing report is prepared detailing the evidence and legal analysis, and the case is given to the Board for disposition.

Mediation: A complainant may mediate his or her case with the subject officer, in lieu of an investigation, with the CCRB providing a neutral, third-party mediator.

Unable to Investigate: A catch-all term, used for reporting purposes only, that refers to cases where the CCRB was unable to conduct an investigation, typically because no statement could be obtained from the complainant/alleged victim. "Unable to Investigate" incorporates the following CCRB dispositions: "Complainant/Alleged Victim Uncooperative", "Complainant/Alleged Victim Unavailable", "Witness Uncooperative", "Witness Unavailable", "Victim Unidentified", "OMB PEG Directive Closure", and "SRAD Closure."

Withdrawn: When the complainant/alleged victim asks that their complaint be withdrawn, the case is closed as "Withdrawn."

Closed Pending Litigation: When a complainant is involved in criminal or civil litigation, and declines to cooperate with an investigation on the advice of their attorney, the complaint disposition is "Closed Pending Litigation."

Complaints Received




Figure 1: Total Intake by Month (January 2024 - February 2025)







Figure 3: New CCRB Complaints by Year (YTD 2010 - YTD 2025)

The CCRB's Intake team processes misconduct complaints from the public and referrals from the NYPD. Under the New York City Charter, the CCRB's jurisdiction is limited to allegations of misconduct related to Force, Abuse of Authority, Discourtesy and Offensive Language. All other complaints are referred to the appropriate agency. Figure 1 refers to all complaints that the CCRB receives and Figures 2 and 3 refer to new cases that remain with the Agency. In February 2025, the CCRB initiated 437 new complaints.

Figure 4: CCRB Complaints Received By Borough of Occurrence (February 2025)




Figure 5: CCRB Complaints Received By Borough of Occurrence (YTD 2025)




Figure 6: CCRB Complaints Received By Precinct of Occurrence (February 2025)






Figure 9: CCRB Complaints Received By Type of Allegation (YTD 2024 vs. YTD 2025)

Figure 15: Number of Active Investigations (January 2024 - February 2025)




Figure 16: Open Docket Analysis




Figure 17: Open Docket Analysis with % Change

Body Worn Camera Footage Requests

Since the widespread roll out of body worn cameras in 2018, the collection of footage from these cameras has become an integral part of CCRB investigations.

The timeliness of the response to BWC footage requests has a direct impact on the length of time it takes to complete an investigation. The longer it takes to fulfill BWC requests, the longer CCRB investigations remain on the open docket.

Figure 20: Percentage of Open Investigations Docket with Pending BWC Requests (January 2024 - February 2025)





Figure 21: Fulfilled BWC Requests (January 2024 - February 2025)

Dispositions

Cases fully investigated by the CCRB generally receive one of five outcomes:

- If the alleged misconduct is found to have occurred, based on the preponderance of the evidence, the allegation is closed as **substantiated**.
- If there is not enough evidence to determine whether or not the alleged misconduct occurred, the allegation is closed as **unable to determine**.*
- If the preponderance of the evidence suggests that the event or alleged act did not occur, the allegation is closed as **unfounded**.
- If the event did occur, but was not improper by a preponderance of evidence, the allegation is closed as within NYPD guidelines.**
- If the CCRB was unable to identify any of the officers accused of misconduct, the case is closed as **officer unidentified**.

Case Abstracts

The following case abstracts are taken from complaints closed this month and serve as examples of what the different CCRB dispositions mean in practice:

1. Substantiated

An individual stated that she was asleep when subject officer 1 knocked on the window of her bedroom. He asked her if her property was next door to another and she told him no. Subject officer 1 and subject officer 2 had opened the gate to the individual's property and climbed over a chain link fence to walk through her next-door neighbor's property. The incident was captured on BWC. It showed subject officer 1 approach the fenced in property of the individual, open the fence gate, walk onto the property, walk to the side of the property where a chain link fence separated the individual's property from her neighbor's and cross into her neighbor's property. Subject officer 1 then told subject officer 2 over the phone the path he took and subject officer 2 followed the same path. The investigation found that the subject officers had no warrant to enter the individual's property, nor her neighbor's property nor did a warrant exception apply to their actions. The Board substantiated the Abuse of Authority allegations.

2. Unable to Determine

An individual stated that as he was being transported to a precinct in a police van, he stood up to request medical attention. The subject officer who was driving the van stopped the vehicle, went to the back of the van and punched the individual in his face. The subject officer stated that he had punched the individual in his face when he and other officers had been loading the individual into the van and as they tried to secure him inside the van, he started flailing his arms and opened his mouth to attempt to bite them. Once he began driving, the individual tried to stand up in the van but was unsuccessful in doing so. Two other officers recalled the individual trying to bite one of them but did not recall if any officer struck the individual in the face during the incident. Without any independent witnesses or video footage, the investigation could not determine if the subject officer's punching of the individual was reasonable. The Board closed the Use of Force allegations as Unable to Determine.

3. Unfounded

An individual stated that during a vehicle stop, the subject officer called him a "bitch ass nigga" when he was asked to exit his vehicle. The incident was captured on BWC. It showed the subject officer tell the individual, "Taser. You're about to get tased, get the fuck out of the car" as the individual asked why he needed to exit the vehicle. The individual then exited the vehicle; no other officer present said to the individual "bitch ass nigga". The investigation found that the subject officer did not make the statement to the individual. The Board closed the Discourtesy and Offensive Language allegations as Unfounded.

4. Within NYPD Guidelines

An individual stated that he was on a subway train when he was approached by six to seven officers. The subject officer grabbed him by his arm with a bit of force and escorted him off the train and used his forearm to hold the individual against a wall while he patted down his entire body. The incident was captured on BWC. The subject officers was part of a group of officers that was approached by a civilian who stated they believed that the individual was carrying a firearm. They gave a specific description of the individual and pointed him out to the officers. They confronted the individual, told him to follow them, stand by the wall so that they could frisk him. The subject officer momentarily placed a hand on the individual's shoulder, and the individual complied without any officer touching him, and no one held him with a forearm to the wall. The investigation found that the subject officer had a reasonable suspicion to stop and frisk the individual because he matched the description given by the complainant who further confirmed his identity to the officers once they had him off the train. Furthermore, the officers only patted down areas where a firearm could be concealed on the individual's person and used a minimal amount of force to get the individual off the train. The Board closed the Abuse of Authority and Use of Force allegations as being Within NYPD Guidelines.

5. Officer Unidentified

An individual stated that he was walking home from a school competition when subject officer 1 and 2 pulled up in an unmarked vehicle. Subject officer 2 exited the vehicle, while subject officer 1 asked the individual if he was okay. The individual responded that he was fine and subject officer 2 approached him, told him to wait and proceeded to frisk the individual. Once the frisk was completed, subject officer 2 began walking back to the vehicle. The individual asked for his name and subject officer 2 responded but the individual could not make out all that he said. The individual had a general description of the subject officers and believed that he had been subjected to racial profiling. The investigation found a police vehicle that was in the vicinity of the incident location and incident time and officers who had a similar sounding name as relayed by the individual and none of those officers recalled any stop of the individual. Without additional pertinent information, the investigation could not identify the subject officers who stopped and frisked the individual, failed to provide the individual with a business card, failed to turn on their body worn camera, and took law enforcement action based upon the actual or perceived race of the individual. The Board closed the Abuse of Authority allegations as Officer Unidentified.

^{*} Unable to determine is reported to the Commissioner as Unsubstantiated, meaning that there was insufficient evidence to establish whether or not there was an act of misconduct.

^{**} Within NYPD Guidelines is reported to the Commissioner as Exonerated, meaning there was a preponderance of the evidence that the acts alleged occurred but did not constitute misconduct.

Figure 23: Disposition Counts of Full Investigations (February 2025)





Figure 24: Disposition Counts of Full Investigations (YTD 2025)

Dispositions - Allegations

"Allegations" are different than "cases." A case or complaint is based on an incident and may contain one or more allegations of police misconduct.

Dispositions - Untruthful Statement Allegations

The CCRB investigates untruthful statement allegations under two different allegation categories. Official statements made directly to the CCRB are investigated under the "Untruthful Statement" allegation category. Official statements made in other contexts (e.g. in court) are investigated under the "Abuse of Authority" allegation category.

All the untruthful official statement allegations are mutually exclusive, meaning that the CCRB will not plead more than one untruthful statement allegation against an officer for the same untruthful act. There are four distinct types of untruthful statement allegation as follows: 1) False official statement, 2) Misleading official statement, 3) Inaccurate official statement and 4) Impeding an investigation.

Figure 33: Percentage of Cases Substantiated (January 2024 - February 2025)





Figure 34: Disposition of Substantiated Complaints* (2025)

Figure 35: Substantiation Rates for Full Investigations without Video (Jan 2024 - Feb 2025) (% substantiated shown)





Figure 36: Substantiation Rates for Full Investigations with Video (Jan 2024 - Feb 2025) (% substantiated shown)



Board Discipline Recommendations for Substantiated Officers

After a CCRB investigative team has completed its investigation, a panel of Board members determines whether to substantiate the allegation(s) and make a disciplinary recommendation against the officer(s).

- "Charges and Specifications" are the most severe form of discipline. A decision to assign
 Charges commences a process that may result in an administrative trial in the NYPD Trial
 Room. An officer may lose vacation days, be suspended, or be terminated if the officer is
 found guilty.
- "Command Discipline B" and "Command Discipline A" are recommended for misconduct that is moderately serious. An officer can lose up to ten vacation days as a result of Command Discipline B and up to five vacation days as a result of Command Discipline A.
- "Formalized Training" are the least severe discipline, often recommended for officers who misunderstand a policy. This determination results in training at the Police Academy or NYPD Legal Bureau (Formalized Training).
- When the Board has recommended Formalized Training or Command Discipline, the case is sent to the NYPD Commissioner to impose training and/or other penalties. Cases where the Board recommends charges are prosecuted by the CCRB's Administrative Prosecution Unit.
