## **NYC Emergency Management NotifyNYC**

the City's free, official emergency NYC, Notify communications program, continues to keep the public informed by providing emergency alerts and updates in multiple languages and formats. The program continues to leverage its short code messaging service (available in multiple languages) for localized emergencies, planned events, and the COVID-19 pandemic response. In fact, the Notify NYC COVID-19 short code messaging service, which touts nearly 1 million subscribers in English and Spanish.
