CHAIR GAIL BENJAMIN: Good evening. Happy holidays and welcome to tonight's public meeting of the 2019 New York City Charter Revision Commission. I am Gail Benjamin, the Chair of the Commission and I am joined tonight by the following Commission Members: Sal Albanese, Dr. Lilliam Barrios-Paoli, Lisette Camilo, James Caras, Eduardo Cordero Sr., Stephen Fiala, Paula Gavin, Lindsay Greene, Sateesh Nori, and Carl Weisbrod. With these Commissioners present we have a quorum. Tonight we are ready to enter into the next phase of our work for developing proposals for changes to the way our Government is structured and operates. Our goal from the beginning has been to look at the lessons of the last 30 years since the extensive changes made by the 1989 Charter Revision Commission and voted in by the public in order to inform our deliberations about how best to set the City up for success and progress over the next 30 years. Over the course of the last five months, we have heard 19 hours of public testimony

1 CHARTER REVISION COMMISSION 2019 2 areas and proposals that have been refined based on these criteria and begin a period of more in-depth 3 study including a set of focused hearings featuring 4 5 testimony from subject matter experts. With all that in mind, we have a resolution before the Commission 6 7 that would instruct the Staff to consider the following criteria in the course of its review and 8 evaluation of the ideas and proposals we have 9 received and to recommend to the Commission those 10 ideas and proposals for potential changes to the City 11 12 Charter which should be further studied. focus on changes that would likely I just; nevermind, 13 let's start again. First, focus on changes that 14 15 likely would not be accomplished by Local Law without 16 a referendum. In other words, changes that would likely require a Charter Commission or Referendum to 17 18 accomplish. Second, focus on changes that are not precluded by Federal or State Law or Federal or State 19 20 Constitutions. Third, focus on ideas and proposals that would A) improve Government effectiveness, 21 2.2 transparency, accountability or efficiency. 23 Encourage meaningful participation by New Yorkers or C) Provide for balance between Local and Citywide 24

interests. Fourth, focus on ideas and proposals that

this very complicated process. Just on focus one I

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had some concerns about it which have been addressed regarding the fact that if the Council could do something by Local Law that we can't without the need for a referendum we can't propose a uhm an item and I was happy to see that we've, we've allowed for some giggle room. Specifically, I am concerned about political reform. Political reform like public finance and the campaigns, term limits or issues that Legislatures are not likely to pass. That's just the way that it is, not the City Council but if you look across the country whenever you see what you see when it comes to political reform has been done by referendum. So even though technically we can do things by Local Law, Legislatures can do it the fact of the matter is that that's the nature of Legislatures. When I served on one for 15 years is that, they, they tend not to look favorably on competition or opening up the process. That's just the way it is and it's to about this Legislative body. So, I will be voting yes with the caveat that I believe that we can, there is some wiggle room to introduce Legislation that might technically be allowed by the Council without a referendum that we can also consider issues that are likely not to be
