

# Parliamentary Procedure Training: Committees

A committee is a group of one or more people appointed or elected by an assembly to consider, investigate, take action on, and/or report back to the larger body, in regard to certain matters or subjects.

# Types of Committees:

- Standing Committee- permanently established
- Special (Ad-hoc) Committee- appointed to exist until completion of a specific task
- **Committee of the Whole** consists of the entire body of members in attendance at the assembly's meeting (used mainly in large meeting/legislative bodies)

### • Quasi Committee of the Whole-

- convenient for meetings of medium size (50-100)
- Results of the votes taken are reported to the assembly for final consideration under the regular rules
- Presiding officer remains chair
- Informal consideration
  - Suited to small meetings of ordinary societies
  - o Removes normal limits on the number of times members can speak in debate
  - Presiding officer remains chair
  - Results of votes taken are decisions of the assembly, which are not voted on again

#### Methods of Committee Selection:

- Election by ballot (after nominations): perhaps useful for powerful standing committee
- **Open nominations with** *viva voce* elections: nominees are voted on one at a time until the required number are elected
- Nominations by chair with voice-vote confirmation: members may move to strike out a name, but not to insert one
- Appointment by the chair (or by the president)
- Naming the members in the motion establishing a special committee

### "The Little Things that Count"

- Resignations from committee are addressed to the appointing power
- Vacancies resulting from resignations are filled by the same appointing power, unless stated differently in the bylaws
- Standing and Special committees may appoint subcommittees from their own members
  - A subcommittee is a division of the committee, usually appointed by the committee for a specific purpose
  - All subcommittees report to the committee, not the main body
