Resolution of the Civic Engagement Commission:

WHEREAS, the New York City Civic Engagement Commission is charged with the mission of enhancing civic participation, in order to enhance civic trust and strengthen democracy in New York City; and

WHEREAS, the Commission is charged under section 3202 of the New York City Charter with implementing a citywide participatory budgeting program to promote the participation of residents; and

WHEREAS, the Commission ran from September 2021 through June 2022 the first cycle of a participatory budgeting program in 33 neighborhoods hardest hit by COVID-19 identified by the Taskforce for Racial Inclusion & Equity, resulting in the selection of programs that target a variety of community needs, including programs that address hunger, mental health and gun violence and facilitate youth programming;

WHEREAS, the Commission intends to run borough-wide participatory budgeting programs in the Bronx, Manhattan, Queens, Brooklyn, and Staten Island that will entail the solicitation of proposals for local projects, voting, and selection of projects for funding; and

WHEREAS, the Commission seeks to enhance civic engagement throughout the five boroughs and particularly in areas of the City with the greatest need; and

WHEREAS, the proposed funding methodology described below was developed with advice and feedback from the participatory budgeting advisory committee and the participatory budgeting intergovernmental working group;

Now, therefore, be it RESOLVED that:

- 1. The Commission adopts a proposed funding methodology as described in this resolution, provided that such methodology may be subject to alteration in the course of future rulemaking.
- 2. Such methodology sets forth target allocations per borough that may be adjusted in future cycles as necessary.
- 3. Borough allocations shall be informed by a weighted average of borough population and percentage of borough population below the poverty guidelines, as set by the city poverty measure, as follows:

- a. Calculate the citywide population that is under a 100% poverty level
- b. Calculate the borough population that is under 100% poverty level for each borough
- c. Calculate the percent of borough population that is under 100% poverty level based on the citywide population that is below 100% poverty level
- d. Allocate funding proportional to percent of borough population that is under 100% poverty level
