### **Voter Turnout in NYC**

- Despite record high participation in the June primaries, only 26.5% of eligible New Yorkers cast a ballot.
- New Yorkers set a new record for low voter turnout in the general election with only 23.3% at the polls.
- Even with abysmal turnout, voters overwhelmingly chose to rank their ballots, rating the experience favorably
- Over 5.5 million New Yorkers are registered to vote
- In 2022 61,000 new voters were registered in NYC
- Despite a myriad of reforms, NYC continues to see a dramatic drop in voter turnout in the elections

## **DemocracyNYC** – The Opportunity

- DNYC will develop a multi-lingual grass-roots organizing strategy to engage and activate voters amidst severe civic distrust by building a movement to stem the dramatic drop in voter turnout.

### STOP the DROP!

- To Stop the Drop in voter turnout we will need to identify the following:
- Of the over 5.5 million registered voters, which of them voted only once or twice in the last 6 years
- Develop focus groups and community canvasses to identify why these voters decided not to continue to vote
- Partner with academic institutions to study the demographic and psychodemographics of those who "drop"
- Develop engagement strategies to foster a culture of voting among New Yorkers


- November 2022 General Election Poll Site Map

Total Voters Served:1320

 ~13% increase over November 2020 utilization



#### **Language Access Advisory Commitee**

#### **Borough Assembly Committee Applications and Selection**

#### **BAC Borough Applications** (510 received)

Of applications, we engaged the Sortition Group to make randomized selections based on borough demographics.

#### TRIE Neighborhood Assemblies

TRIE Partners will utilize their Neighborhood Coalitions and contacts to form committees of 8-10 people.

#### **Borough Assembly Committee Meetings**

All Boroughs hold sessions in January and February

**Meeting 1** – Meet and Greet, get to know each other and learn about ideas they will be considering

**Meeting 2** – Subcommittees review 15-20 ideas and begin to think about what they need to make informed decisions on what to move forward (CEC compiles and gathers)

**Meeting 3** – CEC presents requested data and committees continue to review ideas and refine down to their top 5-10 ideas

**Meeting 4/5** - CEC provides information about implemention considerations and committees review and debate the final Idea selection for placement on the Borough Ballots

#### **Borough Assembly Committee Project Considerations**

#### Criteria

- 1. The project must be an expense project or be able to be turned into one.
- The project should benefit at least one of the CEC's eight demographic priorities (People with Disabilities, Youth, Older Adults, Public Housing residents, Veterans, People impacted by the Justice System, LGBTQIA+, People with Limited English Proficiency)
- 3. The project must be completed with-in one fiscal year (July 1, 2023 June 30, 2024)

#### **Considerations**

- Prioritize the scale of the operation # of people served (impact and benefit)
- 2. Geographic Distribution must be considered scale or area served (access and equity)
- 3. Consideration of existing services provided (fulfills an unmet need or gap in service)

Criteria for project analysis will be the same for Borough and TRIE committees
