





In 2007, my office partnered with GEMS to provide dating violence prevention education to their youth clients and we regularly educate their staff on violence prevention. GEMS is strong organization that has made a tremendous difference in the lives of young victims of trafficking.

The partnership between the Mayor's Office and GEMS will serve all of New York City by educating people about trafficking, while directly reaching out and educating teens in vulnerable


Dear Dr. Gil:


