

Mayor's Graduate Scholarship Program

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs) 2026-2027 Scholarship Year

1. What is the Mayor's Graduate Scholarship Program (MGSP)?

The MGSP provides City government employees the opportunity to compete for scholarships at participating schools to continue their education in graduate study. For over 50 years, hundreds of applicants have been awarded scholarships thanks to the generosity of our participating colleges and universities. All scholarship awards are determined and funded by the participating school. The MGSP does not fund any scholarships.

2. How do I qualify for the Mayor's Graduate Scholarship Program?

To qualify for MGSP, you must:

- A. Be a full-time City government employee.
- B. Be actively employed by the City of New York at the time of application and while pursuing your degree.
- C. Have completed an undergraduate degree by the fall 2026 semester.

3. What are the general requirements for an MGSP award?

General requirements may vary depending on the institution and program. Some schools require that an applicant be a new entrant and fully matriculated to the school starting in the fall of the scholarship year. Check the **MGSP Scholarship Offering Guide** for more details.

4. Do I receive an award if I meet the basic requirements?

Since all scholarships are competitive, meeting the basic requirements does not guarantee an award.

5. How can I find out more information about the participating graduate schools?

Call the contact number listed in the **MGSP Scholarship Offering Guide** or visit the school's website. Schools have provided contact information for further assistance.

6. How do I obtain application materials?

To obtain application materials, visit the MGSP website at www.nyc.gov/mgsp.

7. How do I apply?

To apply you must:

- 1. Select one or more participating schools/programs from the **MGSP Scholarship Offering Guide**.
- 2. Complete an MGSP application for each school of interest and submit it to your **Agency Personnel Office** (listing on the MGSP website) for approval by the deadline date (do not submit MGSP applications to the schools). Make sure you include all accompanying materials as indicated in the application.
- 3. Send your letter(s) of intent directly to each school you are applying for MGSP. Include a copy of this letter with your MGSP application when submitting to your Agency Personnel Office.
- 4. Apply directly to the participating school(s). Once your agency has approved your application, they will submit it to New York City Department of Citywide Administrative Services, MGSP office, where it will be screened.

8. When is the next application period?

The filing period is from September 22, 2025 through November 17, 2025. MGSP application materials will be available on our [website](#) for the 2026-2027 academic year during that time. Most schools require applicants to be new entrants in the fall of 2026 to be eligible for a scholarship. (Check the MGSP Scholarship Offering Guide for details.) The deadline for submitting the MGSP application(s) to your Agency Personnel Office is Friday, November 17, 2025. Personnel Office contact information is available on the MGSP website.

9. Why are applications not processed for award selection by the school?

Applications must be completed thoroughly and accurately. It is essential to follow the instructions stated on the Application and Scholarship Offering Guide. Some of the common reasons for not processing applications are as follows:

- Did not receive approval from the agency
- Not a new entrant to the school
- Not a fall entrant
- Essays were not legible or poorly written
- Did not submit confirmation by the deadline date verifying a school application was submitted to the institution

10. How do I receive a scholarship award?

Completed MGSP applications are screened by the NYC Department of Citywide Administrative Services and forwarded to the school(s) of your choice once you provide MGSP confirmation that you completed the school application. The schools will notify you if you have been selected to receive an award.

11. How do I find out about other sources of Financial Aid?

If you need additional financial support for your graduate studies, the following sources might be useful to you:

- If applicable, check with your union to determine whether you are entitled to a tuition reimbursement for college/job related courses.
- Contact the school's financial aid office for other scholarship opportunities.
