Special Permit for Use and Bulk Modifications for Cultural Use in Certain C6-2 Districts

In order to support a concentration of cultural uses and public open spaces in the C6-2 District bounded by Flatbush Avenue, Hanson Place, St. Felix Street and Lafayette Avenue, for

#buildings# intended to be occupied in whole or in part by cultural uses, the City Planning Commission may permit the maximum #community facility floor area ratio# to be increased from 6.5 to 7.0, may permit modifications of the special #street wall# location regulations of Section 101-41, and the height and setback regulations of Section 23-632 as applied to the #residential# portion of a #building#, and modifications of applicable #sign# regulations in accordance with this Section. For the purposes of this Section 101-81, "cultural use" shall be defined as public or non-profit libraries, theaters, museums, visual or performing arts spaces, or art, music, dance, theatrical studios or other comparable uses and space occupied by such cultural use shall qualify as #community facility floor area#.

In order to grant such special permit, the conditions of paragraph (a) and the findings of paragraph (b) shall be met. In addition, special regulations pertaining to the certificate of occupancy of such #building# shall apply as set forth in paragraph (c).

#### (a) Conditions

(1) A letter from the Office of the Mayor shall be submitted certifying that:

(i) a preliminary agreement has been executed providing for a cultural facility consisting of at least 40,000 square feet of interior gross square feet in the #building# to be transferred for cultural uses and for the construction of the core and shell of such cultural facility by the applicant; and

(ii) floor plans have been provided to the Office of the Mayor which demonstrate that the cultural facility is well-suited for cultural uses, and

(2) A legal commitment in the form of declaration of restrictions shall be executed and delivered to the City for recording upon the approval of the permit, restricting use of the #floor area# to be occupied by cultural uses to cultural use for the life of the related #development#, provided, that in the event the majority of the #zoning lot# containing such #floor area# is in the ownership of a not for profit corporation under contract with the City to provide economic development services at the time of the grant of such permit, execution and recording of such declaration of restrictions shall be made at the time of the transfer of ownership of the majority of such #zoning lot# for purposes of facilitating the related #development#.

#### (b) In order to grant such permit, the Commission shall find that:

(1) the #building# including such cultural uses is designed and arranged on the

#zoning lot# in a manner that results in ample visibility of and access to the cultural uses from surrounding #streets#;

(2) any #street wall# modifications will facilitate access to #open space# on the lot and result in a #development# that activates the pedestrian environment;

(3) any #bulk# modifications will result in a better distribution of #bulk# on the #zoning lot# by providing for increased light and air to #open space# on the #zoning lot#;

(4) the appearance of #bulk# is minimized through an enhanced articulation of the base and tower elements of the #building#, an enhanced relationship between the #building# and the #open space# on the #zoning lot#, and an enhanced amount and arrangement of the fenestration of the #building#; and

(5) any modifications to #sign# regulations will result in greater visibility for the cultural uses provided on the #zoning lot#.

The City Planning Commission may prescribe appropriate additional conditions and safeguards in order to enhance the character of the #development# and to minimize adverse effects on the character of the surrounding area.

#### (c) Certificate of Occupancy

The Commissioner of Buildings shall not issue a temporary or permanent certificate of occupancy for more than an amount of #floor area# in the #building# equal to the #floor area# to be occupied by non-cultural uses minus 40,000 square feet of #floor area# unless the Department of Buildings has received a letter from the Office of the Mayor certifying that:

(1) A deed transferring ownership of a majority of the #zoning lot# has been recorded and that such deed or other recorded document provides for:

(i) the construction by transferee of the core and shell of the cultural facility described in paragraph (a)(1)(i) of this Section;

(ii) the creation of a condominium unit for such cultural facility and the transfer of ownership thereof to the City; and

(iii) a right of the transferor to re-enter and re-acquire the #zoning lot# should the applicant fail to complete the construction of the core and shell of the cultural facility.

Should the certification by the Office of the Mayor not be issued within 30 days of the recording of the deed or other document with the stated provisions, a copy of such deed or document may be provided to the Department of Buildings in satisfaction of such certification.

Berkshire, ABRY, HarborVest and Pamlico will hold 44.2 percent, 11.0 percent, 11.9 percent and 10.1 percent equity interests, respectively, in LTS Holdings. The remaining 22.8 percent equity in LTS Holdings will be held by various smaller interests, none of which is expected to hold individually more than 3.3 percent of the equity of LTS Holdings.

#### STATEMENT OF BASIS AND PURPOSE

The Commissioner of the New York City Department of Transportation (DOT) is authorized to promulgate rules regarding parking and traffic operations in the City pursuant to Section 2903(a) of the New York City Charter.

The purpose of the proposed rule is to amend Section 4-12(p)(4) of the Rules of the City of New York to conform the rule with legislative changes made to sections 10-157 and 10-157.1 of the Administrative Code.

#### Background

On October 25, 2012, Local Laws 52, 54, 55 and 56 of 2012 were enacted. These laws related to commercial bicyclists and were passed to clarify and streamline requirements for businesses using bicycles for commercial purposes and their bicycle operators. Additionally, DOT was provided explicit enforcement authority for these sections of the Administrative Code.

As a result of these legislative changes, DOT is proposing revisions to its rules to change the requirements for the commercial bicyclist poster provided for in the Administrative Code and DOT's rules. These proposed rule amendments would align the poster to the new law and would make the poster more user-friendly.

New text is underlined, and deleted material is in [brackets].

"Shall" and "must" denote mandatory requirements and may be used interchangeably in the rules of this office, unless otherwise specified or unless the context clearly indicates otherwise.

**§1. It is proposed that Section 4-12(p)(4) of Title 34 of the Rules of the City of New York be amended to read as follows:**

(4) Bicycle safety poster.

(i) [Every] For purposes of this subsection, a "business using a bicycle for commercial purposes" shall mean a person, firm, partnership, joint venture, association [or], corporation, or other entity that engages in the course of its business, either on behalf of itself or others, in delivering packages, parcels, papers or articles of any type by bicycle.

(ii) Every business using a bicycle for commercial purposes shall post one or more bicycle safety posters at each [employment] business site using the bicycle for commercial purposes.

[(iii)] (iii) The bicycle safety poster shall be in English, Spanish and any other language spoken predominately by any bicycle operator utilized by the business. It shall be clear, [conspicuous,] prominent, and large enough to be visible to the bicycle operators and patrons of the business, however, at a minimum the poster must be in 10 size font on 11x17 size paper.

[(iii)] (iv) The poster shall be printed in a manner to be legible even to the colorblind.

[(iv)] (v) [A model] An example of the poster shall be made available on the Department's website.

[(v)] (vi) The poster shall [include the following] consist of a header or title, which shall appear at the top of the poster, Sections 1 through 4, and a footer, which shall appear at the bottom of the poster, as more fully described below:

[(A) Commercial Bicyclists Must:

Obey Traffic Signs and Signals

- Bicyclists are subject to all applicable New York state and local laws, rules and regulations, including NYC Traffic Rules.

Wear a Helmet

- While working, commercial bicyclists must wear a properly fitted bicycle helmet.

Never Ride Against Traffic

- Bicyclists cannot ride against the flow of traffic. Ride with traffic to avoid accidents.

- If available, bicyclists must use bicycle lanes.

Stay Off Sidewalks and Limited Access Roadways

Be Safe

- Yield to pedestrians.

- Keep at least one hand on the steering device or handlebars at all times.

- Do not wear more than one earphone attached to a radio, tape player or other audio device while riding.

- Do not attach bicycle to another vehicle being operated on the roadway.

- Any bicyclist involved in an accident resulting in property damage, injury or death must stop and give their name, address, insurance information, etc., and report the accident to the police department.

## Be Visible

- Stay visible at night with light-colored clothing reflective materials.
- From dusk to dawn, bicyclist must use a white headlight and red taillight.

## Be Prepared

- Bicycle operators must wear upper body apparel with the business' name and the operator's identification number.
- Bicycle operators must also carry and produce, on demand, a numbered business ID card with the operator's photo, name, home address and business' name, address and phone number. It is recommended that the operator also carry a second form of photo identification.

## (B) Business Owners Who Employ Commercial Bicyclists Must:

Provide their bicycle operators with the following:

- A bicycle helmet in good condition, which fits properly;
- Upper body apparel with the business' name and operator's identification number;
- A metal or plastic sign to the bicycle's rear or both sides with the business name and a unique bicycle ID number
- Numbered business ID card with the operator's photo, name, home address and the business' name, address and phone number;
- A white headlight and red taillight;
- A bell or other audible signal (not whistle);
- Working brakes;
- Reflective tires and/or other reflective devices on new bicycles.

Businesses must maintain a log book, which must be available for inspection during regular and usual business hours.

Some of the responsibilities listed above are imposed by law and failure to comply with them may subject violators to legal sanctions.]

## (A) Header/Title: Commercial Bicyclist Safety

(B) Section 1: This poster must be displayed where delivery cyclists will easily see it.

Sections §10-157 and §10.157.1 of the New York City Administrative Code regulate businesses using a bicycle for commercial purposes. The responsibilities listed below are imposed by law. Failure to comply with these requirements may subject violators to legal sanctions.

(C) Section 2: Commercial bicyclists must obey all traffic laws and rules. These laws include, but are not limited to, the following requirements:

- Yield to pedestrians.
- Ride in the direction of traffic
- Stay off the sidewalk
- Stop at all red lights and stop signs
- Do not wear more than one earphone while riding
- Use a white headlight and red taillight at night

## (D) Section 3: Commercial bicyclists must:

- Wear retro-reflective upper body apparel with the business's name and bicyclist's 3 -digit ID number on the back in lettering at least 1 inch high.
- Wear a bicycle helmet in good condition
- Carry a business ID card at all times when riding on behalf of the business, which includes the information below:
  - Business name, address and phone number
  - Bicyclist's name, photo and 3 -digit ID number
- Business owners must provide the above items.

## (E) Section 4: Business owners who employ commercial bicyclists must:

- Equip each commercial bicycle with the following, in addition to the items required above:
  - A bell or other audible device
  - White headlight and red taillight
  - Reflex reflectors
  - Brakes
  - Metal or plastic sign in good condition at least 3 inches by 5 inches with the business's name and a unique bicycle ID number for each bicycle in

lettering at least 1 inch high. The sign must be affixed to the rear or both sides of the bicycle.

- Make available at the site a roster to include each cyclist's:
  - Name, residence address, date of employment and, where applicable, date of discharge from employment
  - Unique 3-digit ID number
  - Confirmation of cyclist's completed review of DOT Commercial Cyclist Safety course
