### HEALTH AND MENTAL HYGIENE

#### ■ NOTICE

#### ORDER OF THE BOARD OF HEALTH OF THE CITY OF NEW YORK FOR THE CLOSURE OF CERTAIN CHILD CARE PROGRAMS AND FAMILY SHELTER-BASED DROP-OFF CHILD SUPERVISION PROGRAMS

**WHEREAS**, on January 30, 2020 the World Health Organization designated the novel coronavirus disease 2019 (“COVID-19”) outbreak as a Public Health Emergency of International Concern and on March 11, 2020 characterized the outbreak as a pandemic; and

**WHEREAS**, on January 31, 2020 the United States Secretary of Health and Human Services announced a nationwide public health emergency to respond to COVID-19; and

**WHEREAS**, on March 7, 2020 New York State Governor Andrew Cuomo issued Executive Order No. 202, declaring a State disaster emergency for the entire State of New York to address the threat that COVID-19 poses to the health and welfare of New York residents and visitors; and

**WHEREAS**, on March 12, 2020, Mayor Bill de Blasio issued Emergency Executive Order No. 98 declaring a state of emergency in the City to address the threat posed by COVID-19 to the health and welfare of City residents; and such Emergency Executive Order directed all agency heads, including the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene (the “Department”) and the Board of Health (the “Board”), to take all appropriate and necessary steps to preserve public safety and to render all required and available assistance to protect the security, well-being and health of the residents of the City; and

**WHEREAS**, the Department advises the Board that the continuing widespread transmission of COVID-19 internationally and locally continues to be a threat to public health in the City of New York; and

**WHEREAS**, there is an urgent public health need in the City to slow the spread of COVID-19, and extraordinary measures have been implemented by both the State and the City to limit interactions among people who do not live in the same household; and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to Section 558 of the New York City Charter (the “Charter”), the Board may embrace in the Health Code all matters and subjects to which the power and authority of the Department extends, and pursuant to Section 556 of the Charter and Section 3.01 of the Health Code, the Department is authorized to supervise the control of communicable diseases and conditions hazardous to life and health and take such actions as may be necessary to assure the maintenance of the protection of public health; and

**WHEREAS**, Article 43 of the Health Code establishes regulatory standards for school-based instructional programs for children ages three through five, and Article 47 of the Health Code establishes regulatory standards for, and requires a permit to operate, center-based child care programs and family shelter-based drop-off child supervision programs for children ages birth through five; and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to Sections 43.29 and 47.77 of the Health Code, the Department may order a school-based program for a child aged three through five, or a center-based child care program or family shelter-based drop-off child supervision program to close and to discontinue operations if the Department determines that its operation presents a risk of endangering the health or safety of children or other persons; and

**WHEREAS**, Governor Cuomo issued Executive Order 202.4 ordering every school in the State to close no later than March 18, 2020 and to develop an alternative plan for child care with an emphasis on serving parents who work in the health care profession or first responders who are critical to the COVID-19 response effort, and issued Executive Order 202.11 extending the period of such closures and alternative plans until at least April 15, 2020; and

**WHEREAS**, the New York City Department of Education has established Regional Enrichment Centers and Emergency Childcare Centers in Department of Education buildings, Department

of Education pre-K centers, and community-based programs throughout the city to provide child care and education to children of healthcare workers, first responders and other essential government employees, food workers and pharmacy employees, and the classes in such programs are limited in size to promote physical distance among students and teachers;

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, the Board of Health hereby orders, except as described herein, all school-based instructional programs for children ages three through five, and all center-based child care programs and family shelter-based drop-off child supervision programs serving children ages birth to five and operating with a permit issued by the Department, to close and cease operations before Monday, April 6, 2020, and remain so closed as described in this Order; and

**FURTHER**, this Order shall not apply to any education and child care programs operated by or on behalf of the Department of Education for children of healthcare workers, first responders and other essential government employees, provided that such programs may also be offered to children of other essential workers and other high-need groups including but not limited to students in temporary housing, space permitting, at the discretion of the Department of Education; and

**FURTHER**, any program operated by or on behalf of the Department of Education subject to this Order may immediately seek approval from the Department of Education to serve children of healthcare workers, first responders and other essential workers and high-need groups as described herein, and if such approval is granted by midnight, April 3, 2020, such program may operate subject to the requirements and direction of the Department and the Department of Education and consistent with the requirements of this Order; and

**FURTHER**, the Department is directed to work with the Department of Education and any other agency to inform any program subject to this Order of its requirements, and enforce any provision thereof as necessary; and

**FURTHER**, this Order shall be effective immediately, and remain in effect until the date in-school instruction in schools operated by the Department of Education resumes, provided that the Commissioner, in accordance with efforts to slow the spread of COVID-19 and further the protection of public health, may permit any program subject to this Order to reopen before such in-school instruction resumes after the Governor has permitted schools to reopen.

**ORDER OF THE COMMISSIONER OF HEALTH AND MENTAL HYGIENE OF THE CITY OF NEW YORK FOR THE PROVISION OF NON-CONGREGATE SHELTERS**

**WHEREAS**, on January 30, 2020 the World Health Organization designated the novel coronavirus disease 2019 (“COVID-19”) outbreak as a Public Health Emergency of International Concern and on March 11, 2020 characterized the outbreak as a pandemic; and

**WHEREAS**, on January 31, 2020 the United States Secretary of Health and Human Services announced a nationwide public health emergency to respond to COVID-19; and

**WHEREAS**, on March 7, 2020 New York State Governor Andrew Cuomo issued Executive Order No. 202, declaring a State disaster emergency for the entire State of New York to address the threat that COVID-19 poses to the health and welfare of New York residents and visitors; and

**WHEREAS**, on March 12, 2020, Mayor Bill de Blasio issued Emergency Executive Order No. 98 declaring a state of emergency in the City to address the threat posed by COVID-19 to the health and welfare of City residents; and such Emergency Executive Order directed all agency heads, including the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene (the “Department”), to take all appropriate and necessary steps to preserve public safety and to render all required and available assistance to protect the security, well-being and health of the residents of the City; and

**WHEREAS**, I find the continuing widespread transmission of COVID-19 internationally and locally to be a threat to public health in the City of New York; and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to Section 556 of the New York City Charter (the “Charter”) and Section 3.01 of the Health Code, the Department is authorized to supervise the control of communicable diseases and conditions hazardous to life and health and take such actions as may be necessary to assure the maintenance of the protection of public health; and

**WHEREAS**, Section 17-104 of the Administrative Code of the City of New York directs the Department to adopt prompt and effective measures to prevent the communication between parts of the City infected with an infectious disease such as COVID-19; and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to Section 3.01 of the Health Code, I am authorized to declare a public health emergency and issue orders and take actions that I deem necessary for the health and safety of the City and its residents when urgent public health action is necessary to protect the public health against an existing threat; and

**WHEREAS**, non-congregate sheltering is necessary to save lives, to protect property and public health, and to ensure public safety, as well as to lessen or avert the threat of a catastrophe; and

**WHEREAS**, there is an urgent health need for non-congregate shelters for individuals who may need to be isolated or quarantined for seven days after the onset of symptoms and up to 14 days, in order to protect the health and safety of all City residents; and

**WHEREAS**, sheltering such individuals in congregate settings will further the spread of this disease, endangering populations that are particularly susceptible to COVID-19 infection, including people over 60 years of age and people with certain underlying health conditions, and a system of non-congregate shelters will save lives, protect public health, and promote public safety;

**NOW, THEREFORE,**

1. I, Oxiris Barbot, M.D., Commissioner of the New York City Department of Health and Mental Hygiene, hereby declare the existence of a public health emergency within the City of New York, for which certain orders and actions are necessary to protect the health and safety of the City of New York and its residents, and for which exercising the power of the Board of Health to prevent, mitigate, control and abate the current emergency presented by COVID-19 is necessary. I find there to be sufficient proof to authorize a declaration of great and imminent peril to the public health.

2. I hereby order the Administration for Children’s Services, the Department of Corrections, the Department of Social Service, the Department of Youth and Community Development, and any other agency that may be responsible for providing shelter to any person in the City to locate, secure, operate, and make available non-congregate sheltering to any person needing to be isolated or quarantined in order to prevent the spread of COVID-19. The provision of non-congregate shelters required by this Order shall be limited to that which is reasonable and necessary to adequately protect the public from the threat presented by the COVID-19 pandemic, as determined by the Commissioner of Emergency Management.

Such shelters may be located in hotels, convention centers and other non-traditional shelter facilities as deemed appropriate by the Commissioner of Emergency Management in consultation with myself and the Commissioners of Fire, Police, Social Services, and Buildings.

3. This Order shall be effective immediately and remain in effect until the end of the public health emergency or such earlier time as I may indicate, subject to the authority of the Board of Health to continue or rescind, alter, or modify this Order pursuant to section 3.01(d) of the New York City Health Code.
