What authorizes DOB to make this rule? Sections 643 and 1043(a) of the City Charter and Article 305 of Title 28 of the New York City Administrative Code authorize DOB to make this proposed rule. This proposed rule was included in DOB's regulatory agenda for Fiscal Year '25.

Where can I find DOB's rules? DOB's rules are in Title 1 of the Rules of the City of New York.

What rules govern the rulemaking process? DOB must meet the requirements of Section 1043 of the City Charter when creating or changing rules. This notice is made according to the requirements of Section 1043(b) of the City Charter.

Statement of Basis and Purpose of Proposed Rule

The proposed rule amendments will clarify inspection procedures and requirements for documenting retaining wall conditions found during required inspections. They will also establish procedures for notifying the Department and the owner of unsafe conditions and for taking measures to safeguard the public.

In addition, the amendments propose to increase existing civil penalties for failure to file an acceptable report from \$1,000 per year to \$5,000 per year and for late filing of a report from \$250 per month to \$1,000 per month. The rule will also establish a new one-time penalty of \$2,000 for failure to correct conditions classified as safe with repairs and/or engineering monitoring.

The proposed rule also amends the procedure for requesting civil penalty waivers to conform to the waiver language in similar rules.

Specifically the proposed amendments:

- Establish requirements for photo documentation and mapping of conditions that are unsafe, safe with minor repairs or safe with repairs and/or engineering monitoring.
- Establish guidelines for report filing classifications.
- Clarify the requirements for unsafe and subsequent reports.
- Simplify the process to request a time extension for completing repairs.

The Department of Buildings' authority for these rules is found in sections 643 and 1043 of the New York City Charter and Article 305 of Chapter 3 of Title 28 of the New York City Administrative Code.

Asterisks (***) indicate unamended text.

“Shall” and “must” denote mandatory requirements and may be used interchangeably in the rules of this department, unless otherwise specified or unless the context clearly indicates otherwise.

Section 103-09 of subchapter C of chapter 100 of Title 1 of the Rules of the City of New York is amended to read as follows:

§103-09 Periodic Inspection of Retaining [Wall Inspections, Filing Requirements, Penalties and Waivers] Walls.

- (a) **Definitions.** For the purposes of this section, the following terms have the following meanings.

[(1)] Acceptable report. A report of [condition assessment] critical examination filed by a qualified retaining wall inspector that meets the requirements of the Administrative Code and this [rule] section as determined by the Department.

[(2)] Amended report. A report of [condition assessment] critical examination filed by a qualified retaining wall inspector who certifies that the unsafe conditions reported in the initial report have been repaired and that the retaining wall is no longer unsafe.

Appurtenance. A retaining wall element including, but not limited to, fences (including attachments and other hardware), lighting fixtures, railings, protective screening, signs, mesh wires for gabion walls, coping, and any non-structural components attached to or protruding from the retaining wall.

[(3)] Close-up inspection. A physical examination performed on a retaining wall for the purpose of performing a [condition assessment] critical examination.

[(4)] Condition assessment.] Critical examination. An examination conducted to review a retaining wall and all parts of it, including any appurtenances of such wall, to determine whether the retaining wall and its parts are either safe, unsafe, safe with minor repairs, or safe with a repair and maintenance program and whether, in the judgment of a qualified retaining wall inspector, it requires remedial work.

[(5)] Filed [(in reference to a report)] report. A report is deemed filed with the Department when it has been received by the Department. The filed report must be completed in accordance with the provisions of paragraph (3) of subdivision (c) of this section.

[(6)] Filing window. The one-year period during which an acceptable report for a particular retaining wall may be filed with the Department without penalty.

[(7)] Fronting. The length of a retaining wall running parallel or near parallel to a public right-of-way.]

[(8)] Height (of retaining wall). The vertical distance, measured from the ground surface above the toe of the wall to the top of the wall, wall stem, or wall step for tiered walls, including any parapets or fencing intended for retaining material.

[(9)] Maintenance. The cyclical or recurring upkeep of a retaining wall including, but not limited to, vegetation removal, weep holes, cleaning wall drains, removing debris from culverts, replacing dislodged chinking, painting soldier piles, cleaning and sealing concrete and wood facings.

Physical examination. Hands-on engineering inspection of retaining walls and appurtenance elements applying various methods of examination other than visual, including, but not limited to, sounding, probing, coring, testing, soil test pits and soil borings.

[(10)] Public right-of-way. A public highway, railroad, street, avenue, alley, public driveway, sidewalk, roadway or any other public place or public way.

[(11)] Qualified [Retaining Wall Inspector] retaining wall inspector ("QRWI"). A qualified retaining wall inspector as defined in section 101-07 of the rules of the Department.

[(12)] Repair. The non-routine fixing and restoring of wall elements to their intended function, including, but not limited to, resetting dislodged stonework, repointing stone masonry, re-grading or reseeding adjacent slopes, patching concrete spalls, mending damaged wire baskets, and repair or replacement of the drainage system.

[(13)] Report of [condition assessment] critical examination ("Report"). A written report filed with the Department by a [qualified retaining wall inspector] QRWI clearly documenting the conditions noted during the assessment; areas that need repair, maintenance, or engineering monitoring; a final wall rating; and any other requirements mandated by this rule.

[(14)] Report filing cycle. The five-year time interval established by the Commissioner for the filing of each successive report for each successive [condition assessment] critical examination of every retaining wall subject to the requirements of Article 305 of Title 28 of the Administrative Code.

[(15)] Retaining [Wall] wall. A wall that resists lateral or other

forces caused by soil, rock, water, or other materials, thereby preventing lateral displacement and the movement of the mass by sliding to a lower elevation. Such term does not include basement walls and vault walls that are part of a building, and underground structures, including but not limited to utility vault structures, tunnels, transit stations and swimming pools.

[(16)] Safe condition. A [final] wall rating in which a retaining wall is determined to be fully functional with no action required at the time of assessment and that will not become unsafe during the next five years.

[(17)] Safe with minor repairs [or maintenance] ("SMR") condition. A [final] wall rating in which a retaining wall is found at the time of assessment to be safe[,] but requires minor repair or routine maintenance within the next five years to correct minor deficiencies in order to minimize or delay further wall deterioration and remain safe.

[(18)] Safe with repairs and/or engineering monitoring ("SREM") condition. A [final] wall rating in which a retaining wall is found at the time of assessment to be safe but requires repair within the next five years, but not less than one year, to correct [minor to severe] deficiencies in order to [minimize or delay further wall] prevent its deterioration [and remain safe] into an unsafe condition during that five-year period. In addition to repair, the [qualified retaining wall inspector] QRWI deems it necessary to regularly monitor and/or investigate further the retaining wall to determine the nature or cause of observed [distresses] distress and what action may be required.

Staggered filing cycle. The separate time intervals for filing reports as determined by borough beginning January 1, 2024, and continuing thereafter for each subsequent report filing cycle.

[(19)] Subsequent report. A technical examination report that is filed by a [qualified retaining wall inspector] QRWI after an acceptable report in order to change the status of a retaining wall for that reporting cycle to reflect changed conditions or the recommended time frame for repairs of SREM or unsafe conditions, except where an amended report should be filed.

[(20)] Unsafe condition. A condition of a retaining wall and any appurtenances found at the time of assessment that is a hazard to persons or property and requires [immediate abatement and/or public protection] repair within one (1) year of completion of critical examinations. In addition, any condition that was reported as SREM in a previous report and that is not corrected at the time of the current inspection must be reported as an unsafe condition.

(b) Responsibilities of qualified retaining wall inspectors.

- (1) A QRWI must conduct [condition assessments] critical examinations and file reports in accordance with this section and section 28-305.4 of the Administrative Code.
- (2) A QRWI must maintain records of inspections and tests for at least six years and must make such records available to the Department upon request.
- (3) A QRWI must maintain insurance coverage as set forth in paragraph (7) of subdivision (b) of section 101-07 of these rules. Copies of such insurance policies must be made available to the Department upon request.
- (4) A QRWI must be in good standing with the New York State Education Department and the New York City Department of Buildings.

(c) [Condition assessments] Critical examinations.

- (1) [In] Periodic inspection requirements. In order to maintain a retaining wall and its appurtenances in a safe condition, and in accordance with Article 305 of Title 28 of the Administrative Code, a [condition assessment of all parts] critical examination of any retaining [walls with any portion of the] wall [having]: (i) with a height of ten feet or more at any [location] point along the length of such wall; and [fronting] (ii) which fronts on a public right-of-way must be conducted by a [qualified retaining wall inspector] QRWI once every five (5) years. The results of the [condition assessment] critical examination must be submitted to the Department in [the form of a report of condition assessment] accordance with the requirements of paragraph (3) of this subdivision.
- (2) Inspection procedures.
 - (i) Before performing a [condition assessment of a retaining wall, the qualified] critical examination of a retaining wall [inspector], the QRWI retained by or on behalf of the owner must review the most recent report and any available previous reports,

structural design or repair drawings, and violations. The Department will maintain a file of such reports submitted in conformance with [article] Article 305 of Title 28 of the Administrative Code, and provide copies upon payment of fees set forth in the rules of the Department.

- (ii) Examination of retaining walls and appurtenances thereof pursuant to section 28-305.4 of the Administrative Code and this section must be performed by or under the direct supervision of a QRWI retained by the owner of such wall or a representative of the owner.
- (3) (iii) The [qualified retaining wall inspector] QRWI must design and implement an assessment program that is specific to the retaining wall to be assessed, including, but not limited to, observations of the entire length of the wall from both sides of the retaining wall, data collection and method of evaluation. The assessment program and methods to be employed must be based on the consideration of the wall construction type, wall function, year built, location [and failure consequence], age of materials, specific exposure to environmental conditions, and the presence of specific details and appurtenances. Consideration must be given to the retaining wall's history of maintenance and repairs as described in previous reports and submittals to the Department, if applicable. [The assessment program must be provided to the Department for approval no fewer than 90 days prior to implementation. The Department reserves the right to object to the proposed program.] Professional Engineers, individuals with a bachelor's degree in engineering and three years of relevant experience, or individuals with five (5) years of relevant experience working under the QRWI's direct supervision may be delegated to perform selected inspection tasks other than the final inspection.
- (4) (iv) The methods used to assess the retaining wall in question must permit a complete [condition assessment] critical examination of the wall, including, but not limited to, retaining wall type, cross sections, architectural finishes, selective probes, cores [and], measurements of wall dimensions, including, but not limited to, thickness and soil investigation.
- (5) (v) [The qualified retaining wall inspector] The QRWI must utilize a professional standard of care to assess the condition of the retaining wall and surrounding elements that impact the wall's stability. The known history of the retaining wall, the nature of the materials used, and the conditions observed will dictate the extent of the critical examination, provided, however, that the following elements must be assessed [as applicable] whenever they are present:
 - (i) (A) Primary wall elements, including, but not limited to, piles and shafts, lagging, anchor heads, wire or geo-synthetic facing elements, bins or cribs, concrete, shotcrete, mortar, manufactured block or brick, placed stone and wall foundation material.
 - (ii) (B) Secondary wall elements and appurtenances, including, but not limited to, wall drains and water management systems, architectural facing, traffic barrier, fencing, roads, sidewalks, shoulders, upslope, downslope, lateral slope, vegetation, culverts, curbs, berms and ditches.
- (6) (vi) The [qualified retaining wall inspector] QRWI must amend the scope of the [condition assessment] critical examination and add additional testing and investigation as required to characterize wall distresses, overall performance or if distresses warrant additional investigations.
- (7) (vii) During the course of the [condition assessment] critical examination, photographs must be taken and [sketches] maps made to document the exact location of all distresses that require repair, maintenance, or monitoring, or that cause a retaining wall to have a final wall rating of unsafe, SREM, or SMR.
- (8) (viii) Upon the discovery of an unsafe condition, the [qualified retaining wall inspector] QRWI must immediately notify the Department [by calling 311 and then calling the Department directly with the 311

complaint number within 24 hours of discovering the] and the owner of the property on which the retaining wall is located. The QRWI must identify the location of any unsafe condition[, advise the owner on the appropriate protective measures to be taken, and include the recommended type and location of public protection in the notification to the Department.

(9) The condition assessment must include close-up inspections of the retaining wall. It is not acceptable to base a condition assessment on a drive-by inspection or a prior report without a close-up inspection of the retaining wall.]

(ix) A critical examination is complete when the QRWI has conducted a final physical inspection to determine that the retaining wall conditions described in the report are consistent with actual conditions. Such final inspection must, at a minimum, include an in-person visual examination of the entire length from both sides of the retaining wall. A drive-by inspection is not acceptable.

(d) (3) Report requirements.

- (1) (i) The [qualified retaining wall inspector] QRWI must file a written report of critical examination with the Department and submit a copy to the owner of the retaining wall [a written report of condition assessment]. The report must clearly document all conditions noted during the assessment and state that the assessment was performed and completed in accordance with the Administrative Code and this [rule] section. [An] A separate acceptable report [may] must be prepared and filed for [multiple owners where a retaining wall which is required to comply with article 305 of Title 28 of the Administrative Code and this rule spans numerous blocks and lots] each property with a retaining wall that meets the conditions set forth in paragraph (1) of this subdivision.
- (2) (ii) Technical information in the report must adhere to and follow the sequence and the labeling of the report requirements [as] listed in [paragraph (3)] subparagraph (iii) of this [subdivision,] paragraph, and must be provided on such forms and in such format as the Department requires. Additional information may be provided. [All items in subparagraphs (i) – (xiv) of paragraph (3) must be listed in the report.] If a requirement is not applicable, this must be indicated on the report under the relevant number.
- (3) (iii) The report must include an executive overview that consists of a summary of findings and recommendations, a concise statement of the scope of the assessment and findings, the conclusions and recommendations, and a final wall rating that categorizes the retaining wall as "safe," ["safe with minor repairs or maintenance", "safe with repairs and/or engineering monitoring"] "SMR," "SREM," or "unsafe." The report must also include, but not be limited to:
 - (i) (A) The address, any a.k.a. addresses, the Block and Lot number, the Building Identification Number ("BIN"), when applicable, for the block and lot on which the retaining wall is located, and the location from the nearest cross street [and a copy of the Property Profile Overview from the Buildings Information System ("BIS") found on the Department's website];
 - (ii) (B) The name, mailing address and telephone number of the owner of the retaining wall, or, if the owner is not an individual, the name, mailing address, telephone number, and position/title of a principal of the owner;
 - (C) A detailed description of the retaining wall, including the height, plan and section dimensions, construction type, all materials present, age, and type of veneer if applicable;

- [(iii)] (D) A detailed description of any maintenance, repairs, or the results of engineering monitoring performed to the retaining wall since the previous report, including but not limited to foundation settlement, bulging or cracking of the retaining wall, movement of any elements of the remaining wall or appurtenances, or other defects or changes;
- [(iv)] (E) A detailed description of the scope and procedures used in making the [condition assessment that should include:] critical examination;
- (F) The following information:
- [(A)] The dates of start and completion of the condition assessment;]
- [(B)] 1. The extent and location of all physical examinations and tests performed;
2. The names, addresses, telephone numbers, and license or registration numbers of contractors and consultants involved in the critical examination;
- [(C)] 3. A location or plot plan of a discernible scale and with a north arrow that shows the entire earth-retaining length of the wall[.];
4. [all] All structures located on the [block or] lot or on the adjacent lots and within the zone of influence of the wall[, including]. The information provided shall include the number of stories and the type of occupancy of all structures, and [any and] all public rights-of-way [adjacent to the retaining wall; and];
- [(D)] locations and] 5. The dates [of close-up inspections and tests performed;] when the critical examination was started and completed and when tests were performed; and
6. Dated photo documentation of the QRWI or, where applicable, persons supervised by the QRWI as permitted by this section, performing physical examinations;
- [(v)] (G) At least one cross-section of the retaining wall with details adequate to indicate the following:
- [(A)] 1. Retaining wall construction type;
- [(B)] 2. Architectural finishes or surface treatment;
- [(C)] 3. Maximum exposed wall height;
- [(D)] 4. Height of earth on each side of the retaining wall;
- [(E)] 5. Average vertical distance from the public right-of-way to cut wall toe or ground-line at the top of the fill wall;
- [(F)] 6. Horizontal distance to wall face from the edge of the public right-of-way;
- [(G)] 7. Wall face angle (batter) measured from the vertical;
- [(H)] 8. Maximum earth retaining length of the wall;
- [(I)] 9. Surcharges applied to the wall; and
- [(J)] 10. Additional cross-sections when the wall geometry [and/or] plumbness changes;
- (H) A description, classification and the location of each significant condition observed, including deterioration and any movement detected. The description must also include a list of all appurtenances and their condition. Each condition must be classified as safe, unsafe, SMR, or SREM. If the retaining wall structure is classified as unsafe, SMR, or SREM, the compliance report must include the locations and descriptions of all unsafe, SREM, or SMR conditions. If unsafe conditions are noted, the report must recommend the type and location of public protection or clearly delineate the extent of areas that have been cordoned off
- and the methods used. Photographs must be labeled and the report must include key plans and locator drawings documenting these conditions. Guards and railings must be inspected to ensure that their components, including balusters, intermediate railings, and panel fillers, are positively secured against movement, such as by welds, bolts, or screws. If any guard or railing is found not to be positively secured, the condition must be classified as unsafe and made safe pursuant to the requirements of paragraph (5) of this subdivision;
- [(vi)] A description of each significant distress observed with supporting photographic documentation. Distresses must be mapped using gridlines enabling all distresses to be positively located;]
- [(vii)] (I) An analysis of the [cause of each significant distress] causes of the conditions reported as unsafe or SREM;
- [(viii)] A final wall rating that categorizes the retaining wall as “safe,” “safe with minor repairs or maintenance,” “safe with repairs and/or engineering monitoring” or “unsafe.” A detailed description of the overall rating and factors attributing to the rating assigned must accompany the final wall rating.]
- (J) A detailed status report of maintenance work performed up to the date of submission of the report and the maintenance plan implemented for the retaining wall;
- [(ix)] (K) Where a retaining wall is categorized with a final wall rating of [safe with repairs and engineering monitoring] SREM:
- [(A)] 1. A plan detailing the proposed monitoring program;
- [(B)] 2. The name of the engineer performing the monitoring; [and]
- [(C)] 3. A stability analysis of the retaining wall that reports a “[factor of safety]” which shows that the wall is stable under current and expected loading conditions[.]; and
4. If only repairs are required, with no monitoring, a statement to that effect.
- [(x)] (L) A comparison of currently observed conditions with conditions observed during the previous [report filing cycle] examinations, including the status of the repairs or maintenance performed with respect to the prior conditions. The following must be included and discussed:
- [(A)] 1. Work permit numbers relating to repairs performed;
- [(B)] 2. Job numbers, status and sign-off dates for any retaining wall related jobs, where applicable; and
- [(C)] 3. Violation numbers of any open Environmental Control Board (“ECB”) violations associated with the retaining wall and the status of the repairs of the conditions cited in the ECB violations.
- [(xi)] Detailed recommendations] (M) Recommendations for repairs or maintenance [for retaining walls with final wall ratings of “safe with minor repairs or maintenance” or “safe with repairs and/or engineering monitoring,”] of conditions classified as unsafe, SMR or SREM, including:
1. If a retaining wall is categorized as SREM:
- [(A)] A. The [recommended] QRWI must provide the time frame for [such] any required repairs or maintenance to be [performed, which must indicate the date by which the work will be performed] completed (MM/DD/YYYY) to prevent the conditions from becoming unsafe and not the date on which work is planned or scheduled; and
- [(B)] B. Time frames of less than one (1) year, “ASAP,” or “immediately,” will not

- be accepted.
2. If a retaining wall is categorized as unsafe:
- A. The QRWI must provide the time frame for repairs to be completed to bring the retaining wall to SREM, SMR, or safe status and must indicate the date by which the work will be completed (MM/DD/YYYY); and
- B. Time frames of more than five (5) years will not be accepted.
- [(xii)] (N) A list and description of the work permits required to accomplish the necessary work. If no work permits will be required, the reason must be indicated;
- (O) All photographs must be dated, printed in color, clearly legible, and high resolution. Digital photos must be a minimum of 800 x 600 pixels. Photographs must be arranged into PDF no larger than 11" x 17". The following photos must be submitted;
- [(xiii)] 1. Elevation photos. Color photographs of [the retaining wall and] at least one view of the entire [street front] public right-of-way facing elevation for all reports, regardless of the retaining wall's [final wall rating. Photographs must be at least 3" x 5" (76mm x 127mm) in size, unless otherwise requested by the Department. The photographs must be dated and both the original photographs and all required copies shall be in color. The page/sheet size for attachments must not exceed 11" x 17" (280mm x 430mm).] filing condition;
2. Representative photos. Color photographs showing the general conditions of the retaining wall must be included with the report. Additionally, photographs of the high side of the retaining wall, including ground conditions immediately behind and in the front of the retaining wall are also required.
3. Detailed condition photos. Color photographs of specific conditions must be clearly labeled and indicate the status designation. The locations of conditions required by item H of this subparagraph (iii) must be provided.
- A. All SREM, SMR, and unsafe conditions must be cataloged.
- B. If retaining wall status is safe, submit a minimum of three typical conditions.
- (P) The classification of the retaining wall for the current report filing cycle, as determined by the following guidelines:
1. If there are no unsafe conditions, no conditions that are SREM or SMR, then the retaining wall is classified as safe.
2. If there is at least one unsafe condition, then the retaining wall must be classified as unsafe.
3. If there is at least one condition that is SREM and there are no unsafe conditions, then the retaining wall must be classified as SREM.
4. If there is at least one condition that is SMR and there are no unsafe or SREM conditions, then the retaining wall must be classified as SMR.
5. A report may not be filed describing the same condition at the same location as SREM for two consecutive report filing cycles. The QRWI must certify that all of the conditions identified in the previous report as requiring repair have been corrected, or the retaining wall must be classified as unsafe;
- [(xiv)] (Q) The seal and signature of the [qualified retaining wall inspector] QRWI who performed the critical examination, or under whose direct supervision the [condition assessment] critical examination was performed.
- [(4)] All reports and supporting documents must be submitted to the Department in an electronic format.]
- [(e)] (4) Report filing requirements.
- [(1)] (i) The requirements of this rule apply to owners of retaining walls with a height of ten feet or more and fronting a public right-of-way. The Commissioner will determine which additional retaining walls and/or parts thereof are required to file in accordance with this section.
- [(2)] (ii) Owners of retaining walls who are required to file a report must do so once during each five-year report filing cycle established by the Department, depending on the borough, as described in [subsection (5)] subparagraph (v) below. [The next complete report filing cycle runs from January 1, 2014 to December 31, 2018.]
- [(3)] (iii) An acceptable report must be filed within the applicable one-year filing window to avoid a late filing penalty.
- [(4)] (iv) The report must be submitted to the Department along with a filing fee as specified in the rules of the Department.
- [(5)] (v) Staggered inspection cycle. Beginning January 1, [2014] 2024 an acceptable report [for each retaining wall to which this rule applies] is due in accordance with the following [filing] windows:
- [(i)] (A) For retaining walls located within the Borough of the Bronx, an acceptable report must be filed within the [filing] one-year window starting January 1, [2014] 2024 and ending December 31, [2014] 2024, and every fifth year thereafter.
- [(ii)] (B) For retaining walls located within the Borough of [the] Manhattan, an acceptable report must be filed within the [filing] one-year window starting January 1, [2015] 2025 and ending December 31, [2015] 2025, and every fifth year thereafter.
- [(iii)] (C) For retaining walls located within the Borough of Staten Island, an acceptable report must be filed within the [filing] one-year window starting January 1, [2016] 2026 and ending December 31, [2016] 2026, and every fifth year thereafter.
- [(iv)] (D) For retaining walls located within the Borough of Queens, an acceptable report must be filed within the [filing] one-year window starting January 1, [2017] 2027 and ending December 31, [2017] 2027, and every fifth year thereafter.
- [(v)] (E) For retaining walls located within the Borough of Brooklyn, an acceptable report must be filed within the [filing] one-year window starting January 1, [2018] 2028 and ending December 31, [2018] 2028, and every fifth year thereafter.
- Exception: Beginning on January 1, 2029, owners whose retaining walls have their most recent status as "No Report Filed" may file a report prior to the start of their designated filing window provided that all applicable civil penalties set out in subdivision (d) of this section are paid at the time of filing. No additional filing is required in the designated filing window.
- (vi) Initial compliance reports for new retaining walls that are subject to this rule shall be filed as follows:
- (A) The report must be filed five years from the date of first work permit issued for the construction of retaining wall, if that five-year date falls within the

- applicable filing window according to the location of the wall.
- (B) If five years from the date of first work permit issued falls outside the applicable filing window according to the location of the wall, then the initial report must be filed within the applicable one-year filing window for the next five-year cycle.
- [(6)] (vii) A report must be filed within sixty (60) days of the date on which the [qualified retaining wall inspector] QRWI completed the [condition assessment, but not more than one (1) year after completion of the close-up inspection.] critical examination, as defined in subparagraph (ix) of paragraph (2) of subdivision (c) of this section. If such report is not filed within such sixty (60) days, a new critical examination is required.
- (viii) A report may not be filed more than one (1) year after completion of the critical examination.
- (ix) If the report is not acceptable and is rejected by the Department, a revised report must be filed within forty-five (45) days of the date of the Department's rejection, after which the original file date will no longer be valid. If the report is not acceptable after two (2) rejections, a new initial filing fee must be paid, as specified in the rules of the Department.
- (x) Failure to submit a revised report addressing the Department's objections within one (1) year of the initial filing requires a new [conditional assessment] critical examination, including a new close-up [assessment] inspection.
- [(7)] (xi) A subsequent report may be filed within a five-year report filing cycle to change a retaining wall's status or the completion date for repairs of SREM or unsafe conditions for that cycle.
- [(f)] (5) Unsafe conditions.
- (1) If any retaining wall is found in an unsafe condition, the qualified retaining wall inspector or the person in charge of the retaining wall must notify the Department by calling 311 and then calling the Department directly with the 311 complaint number within 24 hours of discovering the unsafe condition.]
- [(2)] (i) Upon discovery of an unsafe condition, the owner of the retaining wall, his or her agent, or the person in charge of the retaining wall must immediately commence such repairs or reinforcements and any other appropriate measures, such as cordoning off areas that may be dangerous, and erecting fences, sidewalk sheds and safety netting as may be required to secure the safety of the public and to make the retaining [wall safe] wall's structure and appurtenances conform to the provisions of the Administrative Code.
- (ii) All unsafe conditions must be corrected within 90 days from the submission of the critical examination report.
- (iii) If, due to the scope of the repairs, the unsafe conditions cannot be corrected within the required 90 days, the QRWI must recommend a timeframe for repairs as noted in item (M) of subparagraph (iii) of paragraph (3) of subdivision (c). The owner of the retaining wall is responsible for ensuring that the conditions described in the compliance report as unsafe are corrected and all actions recommended by the QRWI are completed within this timeframe. The owner must notify the Department of any deviation from the timeframe to make corrections as specified in the QRWI's report. The subsequent report must include supporting documents from the QRWI justifying the request for a new time frame.
- [(3)] (iv) Within two weeks after repairs to correct the unsafe condition have been completed, the [qualified retaining wall inspector] QRWI must inspect the premises. [The qualified retaining wall inspector must obtain permit sign-offs as appropriate and] The QRWI must promptly file with the Department a detailed amended report stating the revised report status of the retaining wall, along with a filing fee as specified in the rules of the Department, and the owner must obtain permit sign-offs as appropriate.
- (v) If the report is not acceptable and is rejected by the Department, a revised report must be filed within forty-five (45) days of the date of the Department's rejection.
- (vi) If the report is not acceptable after two (2) rejections, a new amended filing fee as specified in the rules of the Department is required.
- (vii) Protective measures must remain in place until an amended report is accepted; however, the [qualified retaining wall inspector] QRWI may request permission for the removal of the protective measures upon submission of a signed and sealed statement certifying that an assessment was conducted, the conditions were corrected, and the protective measures are no longer required. Permission may be granted at the Commissioner's sole discretion.
- [(4)] (viii) The Commissioner may grant an extension of [time of] up to ninety (90) days to complete the repairs required to [remove] correct an unsafe condition upon receipt and review of an [initial] extension application submitted by the [qualified retaining wall inspector] QRWI on behalf of the owner, together with:
- [(i)] A copy of the original report for that report filing cycle and all required documentation submitted with such report;]
- [(ii)] (A) Notice that the [retaining wall and surrounding area] premises have been secured for public safety by means of a [shed, bracing,] fence or other appropriate measures as may be required;
- [(iii)] (B) A copy of the contract indicating scope of work to correct unsafe conditions;
- [(iv)] (C) The [qualified retaining wall inspector's] QRWI's estimate of length of time required for repairs;
- [(v)] (D) A statement of all applicable permit requirements;
- [(vi)] A notarized affidavit by the owner of the retaining wall that work will be completed within the time of the qualified retaining wall inspector's stated estimate; and]
- [(vii) a] (E) A fee as specified in the rules of the Department[.];
- [Financial considerations will not be accepted as a reason for granting an extension.
- (5) A further extension will be considered only upon receipt and review of a further extension application, together with notice of:]

- [(i)] (F) An unforeseen delay or circumstance (e.g., weather, labor strike, fire) affecting the substantially completed work; [or] and
- [(ii)] Unforeseen circumstances; or
- [(iii)] The nature of the hazard that requires more than ninety (90) days to remedy (e.g., new retaining wall to be built).]
- [(G)] Progress photos showing current repairs.

Financial considerations will not be accepted as a reason for granting an extension.

- [(6)] Notwithstanding any extensions granted to commence the repair of an unsafe condition, all work to repair an unsafe condition must be completed within 365 days of filing a report of an unsafe condition with the Department.]
- [(g)] (6) Conditions classified as [safe with repair and/or engineering monitoring] SREM.
- [(1)] (i) The owner of the retaining wall is responsible for ensuring that the conditions described in the report of [condition assessment] critical examination as safe with repair and/or engineering monitoring are [repaired, the wall is restored to a safe condition,] corrected and all actions recommended by the [qualified retaining wall inspector] QRWI are completed within the time frame recommended by the [qualified retaining wall inspector,] QRWI and are not left to deteriorate into unsafe conditions [before the next condition assessment]. It is the owner's responsibility to notify the Department of any deviation from the timeframe to make corrections as specified in [qualified retaining wall inspector's] the QRWI's report. [Such notification] The subsequent report must [be accompanied by] include supporting documents from the [qualified retaining wall inspector] QRWI justifying the request for a new time frame. [The Department may approve or disapprove such request.]
- [(2)] (ii) A report may not be filed describing the same condition and pertaining to the same location on the retaining wall as [safe with repair and/or engineering monitoring] SREM for two consecutive report filing cycles.
- [(3)] (iii) The [qualified retaining wall inspector] QRWI must certify the correction of each condition reported as requiring repair in the previous report filing cycle, [or] report conditions that were reported as [safe with repair and/or engineering monitoring] SREM in the previous report filing cycle as unsafe if not corrected at the time of the current [assessment] critical examination, or report corrections that were made in the previous cycle as unsafe if they need further or repeated repair at the time of the current cycle.

[(h)] (d) Civil Penalties.

- (1) Failure to file. An owner who fails to file the required acceptable [condition assessment] initial compliance report will be liable for a civil penalty of [one] five thousand dollars (\$[1,000]5,000) per year immediately after the end of the applicable filing window.
- (2) Late filing. In addition to the penalty for failure to file, an owner who submits a late filing will be liable for a civil penalty of [two hundred fifty] one thousand dollars (\$[250.00]1,000) per month, commencing on the day following the filing deadline of the assigned filing window period and ending on the filing date of an acceptable initial report.
- (3) Failure to correct unsafe conditions. [In addition to the penalties provided in this section, an] An owner who fails to correct an unsafe condition will be liable for a civil penalty of one thousand dollars (\$1,000) per month, pro-rated daily, until the unsafe condition is corrected, unless the commissioner grants an extension

of time to complete repairs pursuant to this section. This penalty will be imposed until the Department receives an acceptable amended report indicating the unsafe conditions were corrected[,] or [until] an extension of time is granted.

- (4) Failure to correct SREM conditions. An owner who fails to correct a SREM condition reported as requiring repair in the previous report filing cycle and subsequently files the condition as unsafe shall be liable for a one-time civil penalty of two thousand dollars (\$2,000).

- [(i)] (5) Challenge of civil penalty.

[(1)] (i) An owner may challenge the imposition of any civil penalty authorized to be imposed pursuant to this subdivision by providing proof of compliance. Examples of such proof must include, but are not limited to, a copy of an acceptable initial report, a copy of the acceptable amended report, copies of approved extension of time requests while work was/is in progress, or written proof from a [qualified retaining wall inspector] QRWI that the unsafe conditions observed at the retaining wall were corrected and the violation was dismissed.

- [(2)] (ii) Challenges must be made in writing within thirty (30) days from the date of service of the violation by the Department and must be sent to the office/unit of the Department that issued the violation. The decision to dismiss or uphold the penalty is at the sole discretion of the Department.

[(j) Penalty] (e) Full or partial penalty waivers; eligibility and evidentiary requirements. Owners may request a waiver of penalties assessed for violation of Article 305 of Title 28 of the Administrative Code, or rules enforced by the Department. Requests must be made in writing and must meet eligibility and evidentiary requirements as follows:

- (1) Owner status.
 - (i) A new owner requesting a waiver due to change in ownership who receives a notice of violation that was issued to the property after the transfer of ownership must submit proof of a recorded deed showing evidence of transfer of ownership to the current owner after penalties were incurred, as well as any other documentation requested by the Department. [The new owner may only request a waiver in one of the following circumstances:
 - (A) The new owner has obtained full tax exemption status from the New York City Department of Finance; or
 - (B) The new owner took title of the property as part of an economic development program sponsored by a government agency.]

The waiver period shall be from the date of the deed to the date of the violation issuance.

- (ii) A new owner of a government-owned property requesting a waiver due to change in ownership must submit official documentation from the government entity affirming that the premises was entirely owned by the government entity during the period for which a waiver is requested.
- (iii) An owner may be granted a waiver of penalties upon submission of a copy of an order signed by a bankruptcy [petition, together with proof that either the Department or the New York City Law Department was served with a "Notice of Bar Date."] judge.
- (iv) An owner may be granted a waiver of penalties if a state of emergency is declared that prevents an owner from conducting an inspection, filing a report, or correcting unsafe conditions.

- (2) Retaining wall status. An owner requesting a waiver because the wall was removed must submit city or Departmental records showing evidence of the removal of the retaining wall prior to the filing deadline.
- (k) Alternate report filing requirements for owners of more than 200 retaining walls in multiple boroughs. Notwithstanding any other provisions of this section, the inspection and reporting requirements set forth above for retaining walls shall not apply to owners of 200 or more retaining walls in multiple boroughs with a height of ten feet or more and fronting on a public right-of-way who on the effective date of this rule (i) employ full-time professional engineers and (ii) have an established inspection procedure for such retaining walls acceptable to the Department. Such inspection procedure must comply with Article 305 of Title 28 of the Administrative Code. Such owners must file inspection reports for all such retaining walls in a form acceptable to the Department.]

What are we proposing? The Taxi and Limousine Commission ("TLC") is proposing to amend its rules to create an Interior Advertising Provider License applicable to for-hire-vehicles.

A few days after the hearing, copies of all comments submitted online, copies of all written comments, and a summary of oral comments concerning the proposed rule will be available to the public at the Office of Legal Affairs.

What authorizes the Commission to make this rule? Sections 1043 and 2303 of the City Charter and Section 19-503 of the New York City Administrative Code authorize the Commission to make this proposed rule. This proposed rule was not included in TLC's regulatory agenda for fiscal year 2025 because it was not contemplated when the Commission published the agenda.

Where can I find the Commission's rules? The Commission's rules are in Title 35 of the Rules of the City of New York.

What rules govern the rulemaking process? TLC must meet the requirements of Section 1043 of the City Charter when creating or changing rules. This notice is made according to the requirements of Section 1043 of the City Charter.

Statement of Basis and Purpose

The TLC is proposing rules to implement Local Law 33 and Local Law 56 of 2024 amending the Administrative Code of the City of New York, in relation to interior advertising in for-hire vehicles and the compensation derived from such advertising revenue by for-hire vehicle drivers. This initiative will permit qualified vendors to offer information, news and entertainment for passengers via tablets installed in for-hire-vehicles while enabling drivers to be paid a share of the revenue and will facilitate the payment of gratuities through the tablets.

Specifically, the proposed rules would establish:

- A formal procedure for the licensing and supervision of businesses that provide approved electronic tablets and software for interior advertising in for-hire vehicles, including appropriate penalties for the violation of these rules.
- A framework to access and assess the gross revenue generated by each licensed interior advertising provider through each approved interior advertising device. This will give TLC the data necessary to provide a report examining the compensation received by drivers and adjust the rate of compensation as necessary.
- Rules and penalties to monitor and enforce against any negative consequences drivers may face for choosing not to display interior advertisements, such as deactivations or changes to amounts or types of rides assigned to for-hire vehicle drivers.
- Technical requirements for approved tablets and software and provision for the issuance of licenses to Interior Advertising Providers whose systems meet such requirements. Developed in consultation with the New York City Office of Technology and Innovation, these rules provide content standards, safety features, privacy protection, and security requirements for interior advertising hardware and software. In particular, driver and passenger data are safeguarded by limiting interior advertising device functionality, including prohibiting the capturing of personal identifying information, credit card transactions, internet access, recording and camera capabilities, screen sharing, and wireless transmission, while mandating secure access and device functionality.
- Requirements for passenger controls to ensure a comfortable passenger experience, such as giving passengers an opportunity to turn off or mute the screen.

After the feedback from the August 13, 2024 hearing on an earlier rule proposal, TLC has made the following changes to these rules.

Section 3: §59A-21(c)(5) allows for other entities, such as leasing companies, to enter into business arrangements with Interior Advertising Providers for tablet management, so long as these arrangements do not result in any charges or fees to Drivers.

Section 5: §59A-31(f) expands certain tablet button functions.

Section 10: §59D-20(f) provides that the 15% advertising airtime required to be provided by TLC will be calculated per passenger trip for Interior Advertising Systems that are integrated with High Volume For-Hire Services, since trip information may be shared between these two systems. This section also provides a mechanism for facilitating tipping through the tablet if the financial transaction occurs and is processed through a TLC-licensed base with an integrated application and not through the Interior Advertising system.

Section 16: §80-17(k) provides the mechanism for facilitating tipping through the tablet if the financial transaction occurs and is processed through a TLC-licensed base with an integrated application and not through the Interior Advertising system.

Section 19, which creates new Sub-Chapter 59E, contains the following:

- §59E-02(d) allows for broader financial agreements between Interior Advertising Providers and Drivers beyond contracts, such as “terms and conditions” agreements.
- §59E-05 establishes a requirement that Interior Advertising Provider software security testing standards must satisfy a national standard and includes a requirement for commercial general liability insurance.
- §59E-15(a) requires Gross Revenue information to be submitted to TLC by Interior Advertising Providers in order to calculate the Gross Revenue per tablet and investigate Driver non-payment claims. §59E-15(c)(1) addresses the manner in which Gross Revenue is calculated to account for financial arrangements between Interior Advertising Providers and other licensees. §59E-15(c)(2) changes the term “pay” to “compensate” to account for other forms of accepted monetary compensation to Drivers (e.g. giftcards) and increases the amount of time between the broadcasting of electronic media and Driver compensation to account for varying compensation models.
- §59E-16(a) clarifies software requirements for material modifications. §59E-16(b) accounts for varying types of financial arrangements between Interior Advertising

Providers and Drivers and requires Drivers to sign such arrangements.

- §59E-22 allows tablets assigned to one specific driver to bypass log-in requirements. This section clarifies that the 15% of TLC-provided content is calculated based on advertising airtime and distinguishes how this 15% is calculated between Base-integrated and non-integrated Interior Advertising Systems. Integrated Interior Advertising systems will calculate airtime based on passenger trip and non-integrated Interior Advertising Systems will be calculated on an hourly basis. Specific passenger facing functions are updated to include personalized content and the facilitation of gratuities. This section requires Interior Advertising Provider software security to comply with a national standard

TLC’s authority for these rules is found in section 2303 of the New York City Charter and section 19-503 of the New York City Administrative Code.

New material is underlined.

[Material inside brackets indicates deleted material.]

Section 1. Section 51-03 of Title 35 of the Rules of the City of New York is amended by adding three new definitions, in alphabetical order, to read as follows:

Interior Advertising Provider is a business that has been licensed by the Commission to own, sell, lease, make available for use, provide and/or supply Approved Electronic Tablets and Software for Interior Advertising Systems in For-Hire Vehicles.

Interior Advertising/Interior Advertising System are terms used interchangeably referring to an integrated system consisting of an Approved Electronic Tablet and Software, complying with the technical requirements set forth in Sub-Chapter 59E, installed in a For-Hire Vehicle.

Electronic Tablet/Approved Tablet/Approved Electronic Tablet are terms used interchangeably referring to all Interior Advertising System hardware in For-Hire Vehicles

Section 2. Section 59A-18 of Title 35 of the Rules of the City of New York is amended by adding a new subdivision (d), to read as follows:

(d) **Business Requirements – Nondiscrimination.** No Owner of a For-Hire Vehicle may discriminate against or impose any negative consequences on a Driver based on whether or not the Driver chooses to operate a For-Hire Vehicle with an Interior Advertising System, or based on the brand or affiliation of the Interior Advertising System. Negative consequences and/or discrimination include but are not limited to: refusing to lease a For-Hire Vehicle to a Driver, imposing an additional charge for leasing a For-Hire Vehicle without an Approved Electronic Tablet, reducing the compensation provided to the Driver, either directly or indirectly through manipulating the number or type of rides assigned to the Driver, or disciplinary action.

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Section 3. Subdivision (c) of section 59A-21 of Title 35 of the Rules of the City of New York is amended by adding a new paragraph (5), to read as follows:

(5) **Interior Advertising System Revenue.** A lessor cannot charge, request or accept any fee from a driver for revenue generated from an Interior Advertising System.

§59A-21(c)(5)	Fine: First violation: \$500; Second and subsequent violations: \$1,000 and/ or suspension for up to 30 days. - (2) The Commission will not approve any advertising for the exterior of a For-Hire Vehicle that consists, in whole or in part, of roof top advertising.
- (3) An Owner must not display or attempt to display any advertising on the interior of a For-Hire Vehicle unless the advertising has been authorized by the Commission and a License has been issued to the Interior Advertising Provider in accordance with the provisions of Sub-Chapter 59E of this chapter.

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Section 5. Section 59A-31 of Title 35 of the Rules of the City of New York is amended by adding a new subdivision (f), to read as follows:

(a) To establish a formal procedure for the licensing and supervision of businesses that own, sell, lease, make available for use, provide or supply approved electronic tablets and software for interior advertising in for-hire vehicles.

(b) To establish technical requirements for tablets and software and provide for the issuance of licenses to Interior Advertising Providers whose systems meet such requirements.

(c) To establish services to be provided by Interior Advertising Providers.

(d) To establish appropriate penalties for the violation of these rules.

§59E-02 Penalties

(a) Unlicensed Activity

(1) Unlicensed Activity is the act of providing or advertising the provision of any Commission-regulated service by

(A) Any Licensee whose License is suspended, revoked, or expired and not yet renewed, or

(B) Any person who does not hold a Valid License from the Commission for interior advertising.

(2) Unlicensed Activity specifically includes the activities listed in §59E-08 of these Rules and can result in License revocation, and other penalties.

(b) Specific Penalties.

Specific penalties for violating a Rule will be shown at the end of the Rule. The penalty provision will also state whether the violator must attend the Hearing.

(c) Payment of Fines.

(1) Fines are due within thirty (30) days of the day the Respondent is found guilty of the violation, unless the Respondent files an appeal of the decision issued by the Office of Administrative Trials and Hearings within the time required by sub-chapter 5 of Title 48 of the Rules of the City of New York, in which case the payment of the fines will be deferred until 30 days after the date of the appeal decision.

(2) If the fine is not paid by the close of business on the date due, the Commission will notify the Respondent in writing that the Respondent's License will be suspended in 10 business days of the date of the notification until the fine is paid, unless the Respondent demonstrates to the Commission, in person or in writing, that the fine has been paid.

(d) Non-Renewal, Suspension or Revocation of License

(1) Non-renewal of License. If an Interior Advertising Provider License is not timely renewed, the Interior Advertising Provider must immediately notify

(A) the Commission, specifying the date of License expiration; and

(B) each Driver who is using the Approved Tablets under the expired License.

Upon expiration of the Interior Advertising Provider License, the Interior Advertising Provider must not enter into any new contracts or agreements with Drivers for Gross Revenue sharing, sale, lease or use of the Approved Tablets under the expired License, and must not renew existing contracts with Drivers who are using the Approved Tablets under the expired License.

(2) Suspension. While the Interior Advertising Provider's License is suspended, the Interior Advertising Provider must not enter into any new contracts or agreements with Drivers for Gross Revenue sharing, sale, lease or use of any Approved Tablets under the suspended License. If an Interior Advertising Provider License has been suspended by the Commission for a period of at least thirty (30) days, the Interior Advertising Provider must immediately notify, in writing, each Driver who is using an Approved Tablet under the suspended License, as well as the Driver's affiliated Base,

(A) of the dates during which the License is suspended,

(B) that the Driver has the option to terminate its contract or agreement with the Interior Advertising Provider by providing written notice to the Interior Advertising Provider, or if its contract will expire during the period of suspension that Driver has the option not to renew its contract,

(C) that the Driver must immediately stop operating the Approved Tablet and immediately remove the Approved Tablet from the For-Hire Vehicle;

(D) that the Driver is entitled to any payments for contracted or agreed upon services with the Interior Advertising Provider up until the suspension date, regardless of whether the Driver exercises the option to renew or terminates the contract or agreement.

(3) Revocation

(A) If an Interior Advertising Provider's License has been revoked by the Commission, the Interior Advertising Provider must immediately notify, in writing, each Driver who is using an Approved Tablet under the revoked License, as well as the Driver's affiliated Base,

(i) that its contract or agreement with the Interior Advertising Provider will be deemed terminated ten (10) days following the date of License revocation, and

(ii) that its contract or agreement may be terminated earlier by the Driver by giving written notice of termination.

(B) Upon revocation of the Interior Advertising Provider's License, the Interior Advertising Provider must not

(i) enter into any new contracts or agreements with Drivers for Gross Revenue sharing, sale, lease or use of an Approved Tablet under the revoked License, or

(ii) renew existing contracts or agreements with Drivers who are using any Approved Tablets under the revoked License.

(C) An Interior Advertising Provider whose License has been revoked must provide de-installation/removal at no charge to each Driver who used an Approved Tablet under the revoked License.

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\$59E-03 Definitions Specific to this Sub-Chapter

(a) *Applicant* means an Applicant for an original or renewal Interior Advertising Provider License.

(b) *Electronic Media* means any broadcasted content on Electronic Tablets.

(c) *Gross Revenue* means the revenue generated by the Interior Advertising Provider.

(d) *Identifying Information* means any information that can be used to identify or locate an individual, including but not limited to name, address, social security number, unmasked or non-truncated credit, debit, or prepaid card numbers, together with any other information that relates to an individual who has been so identified, and any other information that is otherwise subject to privacy or confidentiality laws and associated rules and regulations. The display or disclosure of only the last four digits of a credit, debit, or prepaid card number is not Personal Information. The name of a Driver and the Driver's Commission license number is not Identifying Information.

(e) *Interior Advertising Provider* means a business that has been licensed by the Commission and that owns, sells, leases, makes available for use, provides or supplies Approved Electronic Tablets and Software for Interior Advertising Systems in For-Hire Vehicles.

(f) *Interior Advertising / Interior Advertising System* is used interchangeably in this sub-chapter—and in this sub-chapter ONLY—and means any component of Hardware and/or Software used for interior advertising.

(g) *License*. When the term "License" is used by itself in this sub-chapter—and in this sub-chapter ONLY—it means an Interior Advertising Provider License.

(h) *Licensee*. When the term "Licensee" is used by itself, in this sub-chapter-- and in this sub-chapter ONLY-- it means an Interior Advertising Provider Licensee.

(i) *Software / Approved Software* is used interchangeably in this sub-chapter and means all application functions and content on Electronic Tablets/Hardware.

(j) *Approved Tablet / Electronic Tablet / Approved Electronic Tablet / Hardware* is used interchangeably in this sub-chapter—and in this sub-chapter ONLY—and means all Interior Advertising System hardware in For-Hire Vehicles.

(k) *Update* means all revisions, updates, patches, modifications, corrections, releases, versions, fixes and enhancements to Software or Hardware that is a component of the Interior Advertising System.

\$59E-04 Licensing – General Requirements

(a) *Licensees*. An Applicant for an Interior Advertising Provider License or its renewal may be an individual or a Business Entity.

(b) *Approval of Tablet Model*. Each model of Approved Tablet offered under an Interior Advertising Provider's License must be approved by the Chairperson prior to making it available for sale, lease, or use by Drivers.

(c) *Certification*. Any new or renewal application for an Interior Advertising Provider License must be filed using a form approved by the Chairperson. The Applicant must swear (or affirm) that the information in the Application is true, under penalty of perjury.

(d) *Proof of Identity*. The individual or Business Entity Person submitting the application for an Interior Advertising Provider License must provide to the Commission:

(1) a valid form of photo identification issued by the United States, a state or territory, or any political subdivision of a state or territory, and

(2) a valid social security number.

(e) *Age*. The individual or Business Entity Person applying for an Interior Advertising Provider License or its renewal must be at least 18 years of age.

(f) *Fit to Hold a License*. The individual or Business Entity Person applying for an Interior Advertising Provider License or its renewal must demonstrate that they are Fit to Hold a License.

(g) *Partnership Filings*. When the Applicant is a partnership, it must file with the clerk of the county where the principal place of business is located. In addition, each partner must satisfy the requirements of identity and age, as specified in subdivisions (d) and (e), of this subdivision.

(h) Corporate or LLC Filings. When the Applicant is a corporation, it must provide:

- (1) current contact information for its principal officers and shareholders, or that of an authorized representative of the principal shareholders, and
- (2) a valid EIN number.

(i) Payment of Fines and Fees.

(1) An Applicant, including an applicant for a renewal License, must pay, and provide proof of payment of, any outstanding fines, taxes, or fees owed by the Applicant to

- (A) the Commission,
- (B) NYC Department of Finance,
- (C) NYC Department of Consumer and Worker Protection,
- (D) NYS Department of State, and
- (E) NYS DMV's Traffic Violations Bureau, or
- (F) any of their successor agencies.

(2) This requirement includes payment of fines and fees owed as of the date of the application by

- (A) any Business Entity Persons of the Applicant,
- (B) any Business Entity of which the Applicant is a Business Entity Person, and
- (C) any Business Entity of which a Business Entity Person of Applicant is also a Business Entity Person.

(j) Address. An Applicant must give the Commission the Applicant's current Mailing Address and Email Address as required by §59E-13 of these Rules.

§59E-05 Licensing – Specific Requirements

(a) Approval for New License. The Commission will not issue an Interior Advertising Provider License to any Applicant unless the Commission approves the tablet and software proposed for in-vehicle use by the Applicant. In determining whether to approve the Applicant, the Commission will consider, in its sole discretion, whether the documentation required to be submitted by the Applicant pursuant to subdivision (b) of this section adequately demonstrates that the Applicant's Interior Advertising System complies with all of the requirements set forth in §59E-22 of these Rules, or as such requirements may be waived or modified by the Commission pursuant to subdivision (e) of this section.

(b) Documentation for Interior Advertising System Approval. The Applicant must submit with its License application the following documentation for tablets and software for which Commission approval is sought.

- (1) Documentation demonstrating that an independent third party that is accredited by the American National Standards Institute-American Society of Quality National Accreditation Board ("ANAB") to perform International Organization for Standardization ("ISO") 9001 certifications has performed acceptance testing consistent with the acceptance test plan, and the successful results of the acceptance testing.
- (2) A procedures manual/user guide that describes the features and operations of the Interior Advertising System.
- (3) Demonstration Models
 - (A) One working demonstration model of the Electronic Tablet and Software, inclusive of all components required for complete functionality of the Interior Advertising System.
 - (B) A second demonstration model installed in a vehicle for demonstration purposes and to allow approval by the Commission of the installation method and location of the Interior Advertising System. In its decision to approve the location and installation of the Interior Advertising System, the TLC will consider the safety of the Passenger, Passenger ergonomics, the impact of modifications on the proper functioning of the vehicle or other required equipment, and any comments provided by Interior Advertising Providers and industry, passenger, or safety organizations.
- (4) Interior Advertising System Training. Applicants must provide to the personnel of the Commission or its designee, at no cost to the Commission, training sessions on the

functionality of the Interior Advertising System.

(5) Information Security and Use of Identifying Information Policy. The Applicant must submit with its License application an information security and use of Identifying Information policy that includes, at a minimum, the following information:

(A) a statement of internal access policies relating to Identifying Information for employees, contractors, and third parties, if applicable. Such internal access policy must be limited only to those employees, contractors, or third parties who have a business need to access Identifying Information; Applicant must annually review and update internal access policies, or more frequently as required by the Commission. Such internal access policies must be made publicly available;

(B) procedures for notifying the Commission and affected parties of any breach of the security of the system, pursuant to section 899-aa of the General Business Law; and

(C) a statement of the Applicant's policies regarding the use of passenger geolocation and Identifying Information, which must include, at a minimum, a prohibition on the use, monitoring, or disclosure of trip information, including the date, time, pick-up location, drop-off location, and real-time vehicle location and an electronic, passenger-facing mechanism where passengers can control their privacy settings electronically with respect to such use.

(c) Modification of Interior Advertising System. The Interior Advertising Provider must submit an application for approval of any material modification of the Interior Advertising System, including all documentation required by subdivision (b) of this section. This includes any modification to the Interior Advertising System after the Commission has issued a License for such Interior Advertiser that would materially alter the functionality, performance characteristics, security measures, or technical environment of the Interior Advertising System, and modifications of interfaces to other systems licensed by the Commission.

(d) Interior Advertising System Approval Upon Renewal. If upon renewal of the Interior Advertising Provider License,

(1) the Interior Advertising Provider seeks approval of a modification of the Interior Advertising System, the Interior Advertising Provider must meet all of the requirements applicable to a modification of the Interior Advertising System pursuant to subdivision (c) of this section; or

(2) the Interior Advertising Provider does not seek approval of a modification of the Interior Advertising System and there has been no modification of the Interior Advertising System since the prior Commission approval of the Interior Advertising Provider or prior Commission approval of a modification of the Interior Advertising System, the Interior Advertising Provider must submit to the Commission a certification to that effect.

(e) Waivers or Modifications. Except where expressly prohibited by law, the Commission may, in its discretion, waive or modify any requirements for licensing under this sub-chapter in the interests of public safety and convenience. Requests for waivers or modifications must be submitted in writing to the Commission.

(f) If the Approved Tablets and/or Approved Software is not functioning properly, the Interior Advertising Provider must cease its operations with respect to such Approved Tablets until such time as the Approved Tablets and/or Approved Software are functioning properly.

(g) Required Insurance. After submission of an application for a new Interior Advertising Provider License, an Applicant must provide to the Commission proof of the insurance required in this subdivision when the Commission requests it. Upon submission of an application to renew an Interior Advertising Provider License, the Interior Advertising Provider Licensee must provide to the Commission proof of the insurance required in this subdivision.

(1) Commercial General Liability Insurance.

(A) The Applicant must maintain Commercial General Liability ("CGL") Insurance covering the Applicant as Named Insured and the City as an Additional Insured in the amount of at least Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000) per occurrence. The insurance must protect the City and the Applicant from all claims, including but not limited to claims for property damage and/or bodily injury that may arise

from any of the operations performed or to be performed by or on behalf of the Applicant in connection with any of the activities licensed under this Sub-Chapter. Coverage under this insurance must be at least as broad as that provided by the most recently issued Insurance Services Office ("ISO") Form CG 0001 and must be "occurrence" based rather than "claims-made."

(B) If the Applicant's subcontractor(s) is/are performing or will perform operations in connection with any of the activities licensed under this Sub-Chapter, either the Applicant's CGL Insurance under subparagraph (A) of this paragraph must cover the subcontractor(s) or such subcontractor(s) must maintain its/their own CGL Insurance subject to all other requirements herein.

(C) The CGL Insurance must name the City, together with its officials and employees, as an Additional Insured with coverage at least as broad as the most recently issued ISO Form CG20 10.

(2) General Requirements for Insurance Coverage and Policies.

(A) All required insurance policies must be maintained with companies that may lawfully issue the required policy and have an A.M. Best rating of at least A- / "VII" or a Standard and Poor's rating of at least A, unless prior written approval is obtained from the Commission.

(B) All insurance policies must be primary (and non-contributing) to any insurance or self-insurance maintained by the City.

(C) The Applicant must be solely responsible for the payment of all premiums for all required insurance policies and all deductibles or self-insured retentions to which the policies are subject, whether or not the City is an insured under the policy.

(D) There must be no self-insurance program with regard to any insurance required under this subdivision unless approved in writing by the Commission. Any self-insurance program must provide the City with all rights that would be provided by traditional insurance required under this subdivision, including but not limited to the defense obligations that insurers are required to undertake in liability policies.

(E) The City's limits of coverage for all types of insurance required under this subdivision must be the greater of:

- (i) the minimum limits set forth in this subdivision; or
- (ii) the limits provided to the Applicant as Named Insured under all primary, excess, and umbrella policies of that type of coverage.

(3) Proof of Insurance.

(A) For each policy required under this subdivision, the Applicant must file with the Commission a Declarations Page issued by the insurer. All Declaration Pages must be:

- (i) in a form acceptable to the Commission and certify the issuance and effectiveness of such policies of insurance, each with the specified minimum limits;
- (ii) accompanied by the endorsement in the Applicant's Commercial General Liability Insurance policy by which the City has been made an Additional Insured pursuant to subparagraph (C) of paragraph (1) of this subdivision; and
- (iii) accompanied by either a duly executed "Certification by Insurer" in the form provided by the Commission or copies of all policies referenced in the Declarations Page. If complete policies have not yet been issued, binders are acceptable, until the complete policies have been issued, at which time such policies must be submitted.

(B) The Applicant must provide the Commission with a copy of any policy required under this subdivision upon demand by the Commission or the New York City Law Department.

(C) Acceptance by the Commission of a Declarations Page or a policy does not excuse the Interior Advertising Provider from maintaining policies consistent

with all provisions of this subdivision (and ensuring that subcontractors maintain such policies) or from any liability arising from its failure to do so.

(D) If the Interior Advertising Provider receives notice, from an insurance company or other person, that any insurance policy required under this subdivision will expire, be cancelled, or terminated for any reason, the Interior Advertising Provider must immediately forward a copy of the notice to the Commission and the New York City Comptroller at:

(4) Miscellaneous Insurance Provisions.

(A) Whenever notice of loss, damage, occurrence, accident, claim or suit is required under a Commercial General Liability policy maintained in accordance with this subdivision, the Interior Advertising Provider must provide the insurer with timely notice thereof on behalf of the City. Notice must be given even where the Interior Advertising Provider may not have coverage under such policy (for example, where one of the Interior Advertising Provider's employees was injured). Notice must expressly specify that "this notice is being given on behalf of the City of New York as Additional Insured" and contain the following information:

- the number of the insurance policy;
- the name of the named insured;
- the date and location of the damage, occurrence, or accident;
- the identity of the persons or things injured, damaged, or lost; and
- the title of the claim or suit, if applicable.

The Interior Advertising Provider must simultaneously send a copy of the notice to:

If the Interior Advertising Provider fails to comply with the requirements of this subparagraph, the Interior Advertising Provider must indemnify the City for all losses, judgments, settlements and expenses, including reasonable attorneys' fees, arising from an insurer's disclaimer of coverage citing late notice by or on behalf of the City.

(B) Insurance coverage in the minimum amounts required in this subdivision shall not relieve the Interior Advertising Provider Licensee of any liability for indemnification under this Sub-Chapter.

(C) The Interior Advertising Provider waives all rights against the City, including its officers and employees, for any damages or losses that are covered under any insurance required under this subdivision (whether or not such insurance is actually procured or claims are paid under such insurance) or any other insurance applicable to the activities of the Interior Advertising Provider and/or its subcontractors required to be licensed under this Sub-Chapter.

(D) If the Interior Advertising Provider requires any subcontractor to procure insurance in connection with any of the activities licensed under this Sub-Chapter and requires the subcontractor to name the Interior Advertising Provider as an additional insured under such insurance, the Interior Advertising Provider must ensure that such entity also names the City, including its officials and employees, as an additional insured with coverage at least as broad as the

most recently issued ISO form CG 20 26.

§59E-05(g)	Penalty: \$1,500 fine and/or suspension up to 60 days or revocation	Appearance REQUIRED
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(h) Renewals of Required Insurance Policies. The Interior Advertising Provider must submit to the Commission Certificates of Insurance confirming renewals of insurance before coverage of insurance policies required under subdivision (g) of this section expires. Certificates of Insurance must comply with the requirements of subparagraph (g)(3)(A) above.

§59E-06 Licensing – Fees and Term of License

(a) Application Fee. Every application for a new or renewal Interior Advertising Provider License must be accompanied by a non-refundable application fee of \$500 annually for each License to be issued or renewed for the term as provided in subdivision (c) of this section.

(b) Form of Payment. All application fees must be paid by credit card, debit card, or electronic check.

(c) Term of License. The term of an Interior Advertising Provider License will be three years

(d) When to File for Renewal.

(1) A renewing Applicant must file a completed application at least sixty (60) days before the expiration date of the License.

(2) A renewing Applicant can file a completed application up to 90 days after the expiration date as a “late application.” When a late application is submitted, the License will remain expired until the application for renewal is approved by the Commission. If an extended License renewal application is approved, the renewal License expiration date will be based on the original expiration date of the License and not the extended date.

(3) In order to renew an Interior Advertising Provider License, all suspensions must be cleared.

(e) Suspended Licenses. If a License is suspended and it is also due to be renewed, the Interior Advertising Provider must apply for renewal as required in subdivision (d) above if the Interior Advertising Provider wants to renew the License. Failure to complete the renewal requirements means that the License cannot be renewed.

§59E-07 Licensing – Cause for Denial

(a) Failure to Continuously Comply. Whenever the Commission determines that the Interior Advertising Provider no longer meets the requirements for the License, the Commission may suspend or revoke the License and deny any application for renewal.

(b) Summary Suspension. Nothing in this section limits the authority of the Commission to summarily suspend any Interior Advertising Provider License when a threat to public health, safety, or welfare exists.

(c) Failure to Complete Application Requirements

(1) The Chairperson may deny an application for a new License if the Applicant has not completed all the requirements of an application within ninety (90) days of the date the application is filed.

(2) The Chairperson may deny an application for a renewal License if the Applicant has not completed all the requirements of an application within 90 days after the expiration date of the current License.

(d) Additional Consideration of an Application. If a review of the application leads the Chairperson to believe that the Applicant may not be Fit to Hold a License, the Chairperson may seek additional information from the Applicant. This request for additional information may be an in-person interview, telephone call, letter, e-mail, or other method of communication. This additional consideration may result in the denial of the application. Failure to provide any requested information within the time frame requested, or failure to appear at a scheduled interview will result in a denial of the application.

§59E-08 General Requirements – Unlicensed Activity

Interior Advertising Provider License Required. An individual or Business Entity must not do or attempt to do the following: sell, lease, make available for use, install, maintain, service or repair an Approved Tablet in any Commission-licensed vehicle, or enter into or renew a contract with a Driver for the Gross Revenue sharing, sale, lease, use, installation, maintenance, service or repair of any Approved Tablet without a Valid Interior Advertising Provider License.

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§59E-09 General Requirements – Compliance with Applicable Law

(a) Licenses and Permits. An Interior Advertising Provider must obtain all licenses and permits required by applicable local, state, or federal law for such Interior Advertising Provider's business.

(b) Payment of All Fines and Fees. An Interior Advertising Provider must pay all fines, fees, and taxes it owes to any federal, state, or local governmental jurisdiction when they are due.

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§59E-10 General Requirements – Indemnification

(a) General Indemnification. An Interior Advertising Provider must defend, indemnify and hold the City, its officers and employees harmless from any and all third-party claims (even if the allegations of the lawsuit are without merit) or judgments for damages on account of any losses, including for injuries or death to any person or damage to any property and from costs and expenses (including reasonable attorneys' fees) to which the City, its officers and employees may be subjected or which it may suffer or incur allegedly arising out of any operations of the Interior Advertising Provider and/or its employees, agents or subcontractors in connection with any of the activities licensed under this sub-chapter to the extent resulting from any negligent act of commission or omission, any intentional tortious act, or failure to comply with any of the provisions of this sub-chapter. Insofar as the facts or law relating to any third-party claim would preclude the City from being completely indemnified by the Interior Advertising Provider, the City shall be partially indemnified by the Interior Advertising Provider to the fullest extent permitted by law.

(b) Infringement Indemnification. An Interior Advertising Provider must defend, indemnify and hold the City harmless from any and all third-party claims (even if the allegations of the lawsuit are without merit) or judgments for damages and from costs and expenses (including reasonable attorneys' fees) to which the City may be subjected or which it may suffer or incur allegedly arising out of or in connection with any infringement by the Interior Advertising Provider, its agents or subcontractors of any copyright, trade secrets, trademark or patent rights or any other property or personal right of any third party in the conduct of the licensed activities. Insofar as the facts or law relating to any third-party claim would preclude the City from being completely indemnified by the Interior Advertising Provider, the City shall be partially indemnified by the Interior Advertising Provider to the fullest extent permitted by law.

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§59E-12 General Requirements – Notice to TLC

(a) Material Change in Information. An Interior Advertising Provider must notify the Commission in writing on a form approved by the Commission of any material change in the information contained in its current Interior Advertising Provider License application or renewal, including but not limited to Information Security & Use of Personal Information Policies.

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§59E-13 Business Requirements – Mailing and Email Address

(a) Each Interior Advertising Provider must designate and provide to the Commission the street address of its primary Interior Advertising Provider location as its Mailing Address.

(b) An Interior Advertising Provider must have and provide to the Commission at all times a working Email Address and telephone number.

(c) An Interior Advertising Provider must report any change of Mailing Address, Email Address, and telephone number to the Commission in a form acceptable to the Commission.

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(d) Any communication from the Commission is sufficient if sent to the last Mailing Address or email address provided by the Interior Advertising Provider.

(a) Change to Application Information. An Interior Advertising Provider must notify the Commission of any changes to its application information, including the current contact information for its principal officers and shareholders, or that of an authorized representative of the principal officers and shareholders, as well as the location of its business premises, mailing address, corporate name, trade name, or any other material deviation from the description of or information regarding the Interior Advertising Provider as stated in the original or change application.

§59E-14(a)	Penalty: \$1,000-\$5,000 fine and suspension until consent of Commission is obtained or change in business ownership is withdrawn, or revocation	Appearance REQUIRED
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§59E-15 Business Requirements – Gross Revenue Sharing

(a) Required Information. An Interior Advertising Provider must collect and transmit to the Commission on a monthly basis in a format, layout and procedure prescribed by the Commission.

(1) With respect to the Gross Revenue generated by interior advertising in For-Hire Vehicles:

(A) a list of TLC Driver license numbers for drivers who used an Approved Tablet provided by such Interior Advertising Provider month; and

(B) the Gross Revenue generated by each Approved Tablet provided by such Interior Advertising Provider and used by a driver in that month, including component elements such as the metrics by which Gross Revenue is calculated, measured, and recorded, and how compensation is accumulated on each Approved Tablet through those metrics, including but not limited to:

(i) The amount of time an Approved Tablet was accumulating revenue

(ii) The amount of time an Approved Tablet was broadcasting content

(C) the amount paid to the driver for that month.

(2) Timely Submission of Gross Revenue Records. An Interior Advertising Provider must submit Gross Revenue Records to the Commission by no later than the 15th day of each month, covering the preceding calendar month. For example, all September Gross Revenue records will be due on or by October 15th. The following penalties accrue with respect to each untimely submission of Gross Revenue Records.

(1) An Interior Advertising Provider must not deduct any fees from Gross Revenue when calculating Gross Revenue to determine the minimum amount to be paid to each Driver operating an Approved Tablet, including but not limited to: credit card processing fees or charges, installation or deinstallation fees, operating fees, rental fees, fees paid to other licensees, damages, repair and replacement fees, deposits, taxes, fines, tips, surcharges, interest.

(2) When calculating Gross Revenue, an Interior Advertising Provider must not deduct any time that an Interior

Advertising System is muted during a Driver's shift.

(3) An Interior Advertising Provider must compensate each Driver operating an Approved Tablet in a For-Hire Vehicle on no less than a weekly basis. Payments to a Driver and access to these funds must be provided at no cost to the Driver, no later than two weeks after the broadcasting of the Electronic Media. The Interior Advertising Provider must pay the Driver, including any sublessee Drivers, and if the Interior Advertising Provider delegates or assigns this responsibility to another party, the Interior Advertising Provider is responsible for making full payment to the Driver if any designee or assignee fails to pay the Driver as required, and the Driver reports non-payment to the Interior Advertising Provider or the agent within three years.

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§59E-16 Business Requirements – Sale, Lease or Use of Interior Advertising System

All of the following conditions apply with regard to an Interior Advertising Provider's sale, lease, making available for use, and installation of an Interior Advertising System for use in a For Hire Vehicle:

- (a) The Interior Advertising Provider must not sell, lease, make available for use, or install an Interior Advertising System for use in a For Hire Vehicle unless the Interior Advertising System has been approved by the Commission pursuant to this sub-chapter and the Interior Advertising System installed in the For Hire Vehicle is materially identical to the Interior Advertising System that was approved pursuant to §59E-05;
- (b) Prior to the sale, lease, making available for use, or installation of an Interior Advertising System, an Interior Advertising Provider must present to the Driver a contract, or terms and conditions, meeting the requirements set forth in §59E-17 of these Rules. Such contract terms and conditions must be agreed to and signed or accepted by the Driver;
- (c) Prior to installation of an Interior Advertising System, or prior to making an Interior Advertising System operational, the Interior Advertising Provider must offer to the Driver, at no additional charge, at least one training session on the proper use and operation of the Interior Advertising System. The content of the training must be sufficient to enable the Driver to properly operate the Interior Advertising System.

§59E-16(a)-(c)	Penalty: \$500-\$1,500 fine and/or suspension up to 60 days or revocation for each subdivision violated	Appearance REQUIRED
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(d) The Interior Advertising Provider must reimburse the Driver for any and all Fines caused by a failure of the Interior Advertising or any of its Components, including the Approved Tablet and Approved Software to perform in accordance with the Interior Advertising requirements as required by §59E-22 of these Rules where such failure is not attributable to the acts or omissions of the Driver, the abuse or misuse of the Interior Advertising System or other circumstances beyond the control of the Interior Advertising Provider. For purposes of this provision, the term "Fine" means any and all fees, fines, or financial penalties imposed on a Driver by the Commission or other any City agency, relating to interior advertising in For-Hire Vehicles.

(e) In the case of a Fine covered by subdivision (d) of this section, the Driver must make reasonable efforts to mitigate the amount of the Fine, including not operating the Interior Advertising System if the Driver knows or has reason to know the Approved Tablet or Approved Software is malfunctioning.

(f) If the Interior Advertising Provider subcontracts any services related to the Interior Advertising System, the Interior Advertising Provider will be fully responsible to the Driver for the acts and omissions of its subcontractors and of persons either directly or indirectly employed by such subcontractors.

(g) Receipts to Drivers for all Payments.

(1) An Interior Advertising Provider must give a Driver a written or electronic receipt for every payment made under the contract and these Rules.

(2) The receipt must include

(A) the name of the Driver

(B) the TLC Driver license number

(C) the date

(D) the payment amount

(E) the payment purpose

§59E-17(g)	Penalty: \$200 fine	Appearance NOT REQUIRED
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§59E-17 Business Requirements – Contract with Driver

The contract or agreement between the Interior Advertising Provider and the Licensed Driver for the lease, or use of an Approved Electronic Tablet, required by §59E-16 of these rules, must contain provisions specifying that:

(a) The Interior Advertising Provider agrees to compensate the Driver on no less than a weekly basis.

(b) Each party agrees that any limitation of liability in the contract or agreement shall not apply to any and all damages, fines, penalties, deficiencies, losses, liabilities, and expenses (including reasonable attorneys' fees) arising from direct claims between the parties based on damage to real or tangible personal property, death or bodily injury caused by the negligent or willful conduct of a party.

(c) Termination of the relationship is permitted as follows:

(1) The Interior Advertising Provider must provide to the Driver de-installation, return, or removal of the Approved Tablet at no charge.

(2) The Interior Advertising Provider or the Driver may terminate the relationship upon ten (10) days written notice to the other party.

(d) The Interior Advertising Provider and the Driver will agree that the contract is deemed to be executed in the City and State of New York, regardless of the domicile of the parties, and is governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of New York (notwithstanding New York choice of law or conflict of law principles) and the laws of the United States, where applicable.

(e) The Interior Advertising Provider and the Driver agree that any and all claims asserted by or against either party arising under or related to the contract will be heard and determined either in the courts of the United States located in the City of New York or in the courts of New York State located in the City of New York.

(g) Availability. The contract, or terms and conditions, must be made available to the Driver at all times. Electronic signatures are permissible for electronic contracts or terms and conditions and all signed electronic contracts or terms and conditions must be transmitted electronically to the Driver by the Interior Advertising Provider.

(d) All data required to be collected and transmitted pursuant to this section must be transmitted according to a schedule prescribed by the Commission.

(e) Maintain Driver Information. An Interior Advertising Provider must maintain information of all Drivers with whom the Interior Advertising Provider has contracts or agreements.

(b) Reporting Requests for Gift or Gratuity. An Interior Advertising Provider, any person acting on the Interior Advertising Provider's behalf and the Interior Advertising Provider's employees must immediately report to the Commission and the NYC Department of Investigation any request or demand for a gift, gratuity, or thing of value by any employee, representative, or member of the Commission or by any public servant.

(c) Offer of Gifts and Gratuities. An Interior Advertising Provider or any person acting on the Interior Advertising Provider's behalf and the Interior Advertising Provider's employees must not offer or give any gift, gratuity, or thing of value to any employee, representative, or member of the Commission or to any other public servant.

An Interior Advertising Provider must notify the Commission immediately by telephone and in writing or email within 24 hours after receiving any offer of a gift or gratuity prohibited by subdivision (a) of this section.

(e) Fraud, Misrepresentation & Larceny. An Interior Advertising Provider, while performing its duties and responsibilities as an Interior Advertising Provider, must not commit or attempt to commit, alone or in concert with another, any act of fraud, misrepresentation, or larceny. Examples of fraud, misrepresentation or larceny include, but are not limited to:

- (1) falsification of Gross Revenue data;
- (2) adjustment or manipulation of the Interior Advertising System;
- (3) falsification of Trip Data.

§59E-21(d)-(e)	Penalty: \$10,000 fine and revocation	Appearance REQUIRED
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(f) Willful Acts of Omission and Commission.

(1) Omission. While performing the duties and responsibilities of an Interior Advertising Provider, an Interior Advertising Provider must not deliberately fail to perform, alone or with another, any act whose failure to perform is against the best interests of the public, although not specifically mentioned in these Rules.

(2) Commission. While performing the duties and responsibilities of an Interior Advertising Provider, an Interior Advertising Provider must not deliberately perform, alone or with another, any act that is dishonest, fraudulent or against the best interests of the public, although not specifically mentioned in these Rules.

§59E-21(f)	Penalty: \$150-\$350 fine and/or suspension up to 30 days or revocation	Appearance REQUIRED
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(g) Notice of Criminal Conviction.

(1) An Interior Advertising Provider must notify the Commission in writing within two (2) days after any criminal conviction of the Interior Advertising Provider or any of the Interior Advertising Provider's Business Entity Persons.

(2) Such notification must be in writing and must be accompanied by a certified copy of the certificate of disposition of the conviction issued by the clerk of the court.

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(h) Threats, Harassment, Abuse. An Interior Advertising Provider must not threaten, harass, or abuse any governmental or Commission representative, public servant, or other person while performing their duties and responsibilities as a Licensee.

§59E-21(h)	Penalty: \$350-\$1,000 fine and/or suspension up to 30 days or revocation	Appearance REQUIRED
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(i) Use or Threat of Physical Force. An Interior Advertising Provider must not use or attempt to use any physical force against a Commission representative, public servant, or other person while performing their duties and responsibilities as a Licensee.

§59E-21(i)	Penalty: \$500-\$1,500 fine and/or suspension up to 60 days or revocation	Appearance REQUIRED
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(j) Failure to Cooperate with Law Enforcement. An Interior Advertising Provider must cooperate with all law enforcement officers and representatives of the Commission at all times.

§59E-21(j)	Penalty: \$250 fine	Appearance NOT REQUIRED
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(k) Failure to Cooperate with the Commission. An Interior Advertising Provider must answer and comply as directed with all questions, communications, notices, directives, and summonses from the Commission or its representatives. An Interior Advertising Provider must produce their Commission License and other documents whenever the Commission requires.

§59E-21(k)	Penalty: \$250 fine and suspension until compliance	Appearance REQUIRED
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§59E-22 Technical Requirements – Approved Electronic Tablet

No Electronic Tablet or Interior Advertising Software will be approved by the Commission pursuant to this sub-chapter unless it complies with the all the requirements set forth in this section, unless such requirements are waived or modified by the Commission pursuant to subdivision (e) of §59E-05 of these Rules.

(a) Driver, vehicle, and software authentication.

(1) Upon boot-up, the Electronic Tablet must automatically check for and install any Software Updates prior to allowing the Driver to engage the Electronic Tablet.

(2) Unless assigned to a specific Driver, the Electronic Tablet must only allow the Driver to engage the Electronic Tablet and Approved Software upon log-in using either biometrics or username and password, validated against a system-initiated search of Valid TLC Licenses.

(3) If any required functionality or hardware is disconnected or inoperable, the Interior Advertising Provider must notify the Driver that the Electronic Tablet needs to be serviced and must not allow any Driver to engage the Electronic Tablet until the Electronic Tablet is repaired to full functionality or replaced.

(4) The Electronic Tablet must automatically log a Driver out of the Electronic Tablet if another Driver logs into the Electronic Tablet.

(5) The Electronic Tablet must prevent a Driver from logging into more than one Electronic Tablet at the same time.

(b) Driver functionality and interaction.

(1) Unless the Electronic Tablet is assigned to a specific Driver, the Interior Advertising System must enable the Driver to log off and log on.

(2) The Interior Advertising System must allow a Driver to interact with the Electronic Tablet and/or Approved Software ONLY when the Vehicle is standing or stopped, except that the Electronic Tablet may permit a Driver to engage or disengage the Electronic Tablet with a single touch using pre-programmed buttons or using voice activation while the vehicle is in motion.

(c) Passenger functionality and interaction.

(1) Any Passenger-facing screen displaying third-party content must be authorized by the TLC and adhere to the following specifications:

(A) the Passenger must be able to turn off any Passenger-facing screen (i.e. render the screen blank and muted) at any time, without obstruction

(B) the volume of any Passenger-facing device must be mutable and must be controlled by the Passenger, without obstruction, and

(C) a Passenger-facing screen must display content that includes a reminder about the payment of a gratuity from a passenger to a driver.

(2) any Passenger-facing device that displays third-party content must display content provided by the TLC, subject to the following limitations:

(A) The content provided by the TLC will be in the same format as the third-party content displayed by the Passenger-facing device, and

(B) At least fifteen percent (15%) of the Passenger-facing device's advertising airtime will be comprised of TLC-provided content.

(i) If an Interior Advertising System is integrated with a High Volume For-Hire

Service (i.e. Passenger information is shared), the 15% advertising airtime must be calculated and played/broadcasted based upon each new dispatched trip.

(ii) If an Interior Advertising System is not integrated with a High Volume For-Hire Service (i.e. Passenger information is not shared), the 15% advertising airtime must be calculated and played/broadcasted on an hourly basis.

(3) Specific Passenger-facing functions:

(A) No internet browser capability.

(B) Only advertisements, personalized content, and games, that adhere to the content requirements in this chapter, through a software application.

(C) No payment transaction capability.

(D) No capturing of identifying information, as defined by NYC Ad. Code §12-2301 and the Office of Technology and Innovation Privacy Protection Protocols.

(E) An Approved Tablet may facilitate gratuities to the Driver through the means provided in Chapter 59B of these rules.

(4) Accessibility. Interior Advertising Providers must provide the following accommodations for Passengers with vision disabilities:

(A) the ability for a Passenger with a vision disability to engage Approved Tablet features without requiring the assistance of a Driver

(B) audio instructions that include a reminder about the payment of a gratuity from a passenger to a driver

(5) Approved Tablets must not contain sharp features, such as corners, and must remain securely mounted or attached to a stationary component of a For-Hire Vehicle.

(d) Interior Advertising System interoperability.

The Interior Advertising System must be able to receive any Commission mandated change to the Approved Tablet and/or Approved Software via wireless communication initiated by the Interior Advertising Provider.

(e) Advertisements and other passenger-facing content other than TLC-provided content.

All Approved Tablets must conform to the following specifications:

(1) All Passenger-facing content must comply with TV-Y through TV-G ratings in accordance with the standards established by the TV Parental Guidelines rating system from 8AM – 8PM daily or a similar rating in industries where such rating exist, e.g. the Entertainment Software Rating Board's rating system for video games.

(2) No Passenger-facing content may contain, imply, or declare endorsement by the City, the Commission, or any other agency of the City without the prior written consent of the Commission;

(3) No Passenger-facing content may contain any content that falls within the following categories:

(A) Advertisements or any other material or information promoting unlawful or illegal goods, services, or activities;

(B) Advertisements or any other images, material or information containing obscene images or material (see New York Penal Law 235.00, as such provision may be amended from time to time);

(C) Advertisements or any other material, images, or description, which, if sold or loaned to a minor for monetary consideration with knowledge of its character or content, would give rise to a violation of New York Penal Law 235.21 (see also New York Penal Law 235.20) as such provisions may be amended from time to time;

(D) Advertisements or any other images, material or information that are libelous, defamatory, infringe intellectual property rights, including but not limited to trademark, copyright or patent

rights, of a third party, or violate New York Civil Rights Law Section 50, as such provisions may be amended from time to time;

(E) Advertisements or any other images, material or information that demean or disparage an individual or group of individuals. For purposes of determining whether any such advertisements or other images, material or information demean or disparage an individual or group of individuals, the Interior Advertising Provider will determine whether a reasonably prudent person of the For-Hire Vehicle ridership using prevailing community standards, would believe that such advertisements or other images, material or information ridicule or mock, are abusive or hostile to, or debase the dignity or stature of, an individual or group of individuals;

(F) Advertisements or any other material or information that propose a commercial transaction where the material or information contained in it is false, misleading, or deceptive; and

(G) Advertisements or any other material or information that propose a commercial transaction pertaining to or promote tobacco or tobacco-related products;

(f) Security.

All features of the Interior Advertising System required by this section, including the collection, transmission and maintenance of data by the Interior Advertising Provider, must comply and remain in compliance with the latest version of National Institute of Standards and Technology Special Publication 800-53 and the information security and use of identifying information policy the Interior Advertising Provider has on file with the TLC pursuant to subdivision (b) of §59E-05.

(g) Data Retention.

All data required to be collected, transmitted and maintained pursuant to this section must be maintained for at least three (3) years.

(h) Inspection by TLC.

The Interior Advertising Provider must enable the Commission to inspect all components, including Hardware and mounting of the Interior Advertising System.

(i) Only one Approved Tablet may be operated in a For-Hire Vehicle at any one time, pursuant to subdivision (i) of §59E-22.

**Notice of Public Hearing and Opportunity to Comment on
Proposed Rules**

What are we proposing? The Taxi and Limousine Commission ("TLC") is proposing to amend its rules to improve wheelchair accessible taxicab service by changing how the Taxi Improvement Fund is administered primarily by eliminating the maintenance payments to owners and the \$1 incentive payments to the drivers and increasing the grant payment for conversion from \$14,000 to \$35,000.

When and where is the Hearing? TLC will hold a public hearing on the proposed rule. The public hearing will take place at 10:00 am on January 9, 2024. The public hearing will be held online using Zoom. There will be no in person public hearing. The public hearing will be livestreamed on TLC's website at www.nyc.gov/tlc. What authorizes the Commission to make this rule? Sections 1043 and 2303 of the City Charter and Section 19-503 of the New York City Administrative Code authorize the Commission to make this proposed rule. This proposed rule was not included in TLC's regulatory agenda for fiscal year 2024 because it was not contemplated when the Commission published the agenda.

Where can I find the Commission's rules? The Commission's rules are in Title 35 of the Rules of the City of New York.

What rules govern the rulemaking process? TLC must meet the requirements of Section 1043 of the City Charter when creating or changing rules. This notice is made according to the requirements of Section 1043 of the City Charter.

Statement of Basis and Purpose

This proposed rule package will substantially increase the Hack-Up Payment to Medallion Owners in order ease the burden of compliance with TLC's recently adopted rule requiring that all taxicab hack-ups must be with Wheelchair Accessible Vehicles.

In order for TLC's Taxicab Improvement Fund ("TIF") to afford the increased upfront payments, the proposal will eliminate the Accessible Vehicle Operation Payments that were previously paid to Medallion Owners under rule 58-50(h)(1)(ii) and the per-trip payment previously paid to Drivers of Accessible Taxicabs under rule 58-50(h)(2). Elimination of these payments became essential when the Memorandum Decision and Order of the United States District Court, Southern District of New York was released on August 29, 2024 (*The Taxis for All Campaign, et al v. TLC, et al* (11 Civ. 0237 (GBD))).

That Order mandates that the TLC "immediately take all necessary steps to modify TLC's current 50% rule to implement a 100% Rule" to ensure that 50% of all active Medallions (those Medallions currently affixed to Taxicab Vehicles and not in storage) are being operated with a Wheelchair Accessible Vehicle ("WAV") by March 31, 2025 and 50% of all authorized Medallions are attached to a WAV by the end of 2028.

Savings realized by eliminating the per-trip bonuses to Drivers and Operational Payments to Medallion Owners will be used to more than double the Hack-Up Payment amount to Medallion Owners described in TLC Rule 58-50(h)(1)(i), from the current figure of \$14,000.00 to a new total of \$35,000.00.

For many Medallion Owners, purchasing and hacking up a WAV has become prohibitively expensive, despite the monies from the TIF that have been used to help Medallion Owners defray such costs in the past.

The manufacturer's suggested retail price ("MSRP"), when combined with expected sales taxes, expected fees, and standard financing, has climbed steadily in recent years to levels that put these vehicles out of reach for many buyers. For several of the most popular wheelchair accessible vehicles, the total cost estimate ranges anywhere from \$79,468.00 for a Ford Transit Connect Accessible to \$99,029.00 for a Toyota Sienna Hybrid Accessible. In contrast, the total cost estimate for the most popular non-accessible taxi vehicles ranges from \$40,345.00 for a Toyota Camry Hybrid to \$50,778.00 for a Ford Escape Hybrid. On average, the total cost of a WAV is almost twice that of a non-accessible vehicle.

This vast price differential has become cost-prohibitive for many private vehicle owners, ultimately forcing them to permanently take their vehicles out of service after retirement or risk declaring bankruptcy.

This rule package and the increased Hack-Up Payment amount that it contains, are designed to address these concerns.

TLC proposes the following changes in this rule package:

- updating the TIF definition by removing the option to use TIF funds for purposes beyond the costs of purchasing Accessible Vehicles, such as driver training and the Accessible Vehicle dispatch program.
- removing Taxi Improvement Driver Incentive Payments from the authorized non-cash payments made by Technology System Providers and E-Hail Application Providers to Drivers who lease Taxis.
- specifying that TIF may only be allocated to Medallion owners placing an accessible vehicle into service and removing authorized allocations to Drivers of Medallion vehicles.
- increasing TIF hack up payments from \$14,000 to \$35,000 and eliminating the \$16,000 allocation for operational payments going towards the maintenance of the accessible vehicle.

- establishing the TIF grant terms for Medallion owners receiving the initial hack up payment.
- repealing the technical requirements for Technology System Providers and E-Hail Application Providers relating to Taxi Improvement Driver Incentive Payments.

*** indicates unamended text.

Section 1. Section of 51-03 of Title 35 of the Rules of the City of New York is amended to read as follows:

Taxicab Improvement Fund is the City-managed fund, which is funded by the Taxicab Improvement Surcharge and from which subsidy payments will be made to Medallion Owners or their Agents, or Drivers, who are required to purchase an Accessible Vehicle pursuant to Section 58-50 of these rules, and to Drivers who operate Taxicabs required to be accessible pursuant to Section 58-50 of these rules. Monies remitted to the Taxicab Improvement Fund will be used to make grants of equal, set amounts to all vehicle owners of vehicles in use with Medallions who will be required to purchase Accessible Vehicles under Section 58-50 of these rules. [Monies in the Fund may also be used for other purposes, including, but not limited to, offsetting the costs associated with driver training and funding the Accessible Vehicle dispatch program established in Chapter 53 of these rules. Monies in the Fund will also be paid to Drivers who operate Accessible Taxicabs, including those required to be accessible pursuant to Section 58-50 of these rules.]

Section 2. Paragraphs (1) and (2) of subdivision (f) of section of 58-21 of Title 35 of the Rules of the City of New York are amended to read as follows:

(f) Non-Cash Payments.

- (1) For any lease of a Taxicab (vehicle and Medallion) under paragraph 58- 21(c)(1) or 58-21(c)(2), an Owner (or Owner's Agent) must pay a Driver, on a daily basis, the total amount of all non-cash payments, including E-Payments through the Technology System (if any), made during the Driver's shift, less the Taxicab Improvement Surcharge payable to the Taxicab Improvement Fund as set forth in Section 66-25. [For trips provided in WAV vehicles, the Taxicab Improvement Driver Incentive Payment (as specified in TLC Rule 58-50(h)(2)) shall be paid directly to the Driver by the Technology System Provider and/or E-Hail Application Provider at the time and in the manner required by the Commission.] Drivers leasing a Taxicab on a weekly basis under section 58-21(c)(1)(i)E, 58-21(c)(1)(i)F, 58-21(c)(2)(i)E or 58-21(c)(2)(i)F may, at the Driver's discretion, be paid on a weekly basis. Payments to a Driver and access to these funds must be provided at no cost to the Driver. An Owner or the Owner's Agent must:
 - (i) Pay the Driver, including any sublessee Drivers, and if the Owner or the Owner's Agent delegates or assigns this responsibility to another party, the Owner or the Owner's Agent shall be responsible for making full payment to the Driver if any designee or assignee fails to pay the Driver as required, and Driver reports non-payment to the Owner or Owner's Agent within 90 days of non-payment.
- (2) For any lease not described in paragraph (1), an Owner (or Owner's Agent) must pay the Driver, on no less than a weekly basis, the total amount of all non-cash payments, including E-Payments through Technology System (if any), made during that period, less the Taxicab Improvement Surcharge payable to the Taxicab Improvement Fund as set forth in Section 66-25. [For trips provided in WAV vehicles, the Taxicab Improvement Driver Incentive Payment (as specified in TLC Rule 58- 50(h)(2)) shall be paid directly to the Driver by the Technology System Provider and/or E-Hail Application Provider at the time and in the manner required by the Commission.] Payments to a Driver and access to these funds must be provided at no cost to the Driver. An Owner or the Owner's Agent must:
 - (i) Pay the Driver, including any sublessee Drivers, and if the Owner or Owner's Agent delegates or assigns this responsibility to another party, the Owner or the Owner's Agent shall be responsible for making full payment to the Driver if any designee or assignee fails to pay the Driver as required, and Driver reports non-payment to the Owner or the Owner's Agent within 90 days of nonpayment.

Section 3. Subdivision (h) of section 58-50 of Title 35 of the Rules of the City of New York is amended to read as follows:

(h) Taxi Improvement Fund Allocations. Owners of Medallions who are seeking to place an Accessible Taxicab into service and [Drivers of Medallions] who have submitted all required forms and documentation as specified by the Chairperson will receive allocations from the Taxi Improvement Fund as follows:

(1) Owners of Medallions who have placed an Accessible Taxicab into service as required under subdivisions (a) through (c) will receive:

(i) Hack-up Payment. A one-time subsidy payment of at least \$[14]35,000, determined by the Commission and posted on the Commission's website. Such payment will be the same for all eligible Medallion Owners. Such a payment will be allocated to a Medallion only if the Accessible Vehicle operating on such Medallion has not previously received such a payment. This determination will be based on the Vehicle Identification Number (VIN) of the Accessible Vehicle.

(ii) Accessible Vehicle Operational Payments. A series of equal payments adding up to a total of \$16,000. The frequency and amount of such payments will be determined by the Commission and posted on the commission's website, but such payments will be made at least three (3) times per year. Such payments will be the same for all eligible Medallion Owners. Payments will be issued provided that the Accessible Taxicab:

- A. Meets the vehicle inspection requirements of section 58-29 of these Rules,
- B. With the exception of the first payment following initial Hack-up, has completed a minimum of 250 Passenger trips since the previous inspection.
- C. Was logged onto the Accessible Taxi Dispatcher system through the Dispatch Equipment while in operation during the period since the previous inspection.

(2) Drivers of Accessible Taxicabs will receive periodically a per-trip payment for each Passenger trip while driving an Accessible Taxicab. The per-trip payment amount will be determined based on a review of available funds and the availability of drivers. The per-trip payment amount will be posted on the TLC Web site.

(3) Allocation amounts provided for in paragraphs (1) and (2) of this subdivision will be reviewed and adjusted as provided in subdivision (h) of this section.]

Section 4. Section 58-50 of Title 35 of the Rules of the City of New York is amending by adding a new subdivision (i), to read as follows:

(i) Terms of Taxi Improvement Fund Grants.

(1) Medallion Owner Application.

(i) A Medallion Owner must file an application for a grant in the form and manner specified by the Chairperson and must provide all documentation required by the Commission. The Medallion Owner is subject to all requirements of this Chapter regarding representations and information provided to the Chairperson.

a. The application for the grant must be submitted within six months of the date on which the Accessible Vehicle is Hacked-up.

(ii) The Medallion Owner must place the Accessible Vehicle into service before the payment from the Taxi Improvement Fund will be provided to the Medallion Owner.

(iii) A Medallion will be eligible for a Taxi Improvement Fund grant once every seven years. Provided, however, that in no instance will a grant be paid more than once for the same Accessible Vehicle.

(2) No Outstanding Fines or Fees.

All open items against the Medallion Owner must be cleared, including but not limited to summonses issued by the Commission, outstanding fines and penalties owed to the Commission and incomplete License renewal requirements.

(3) Causes For Denial.

The Chairperson may deny a Taxi Improvement Fund application submitted by an Owner who fails to meet the requirements of these rules. The Commission will inform the Owner, in writing, of the specific reason(s) for this denial. In

addition to other reasons set forth in this subchapter, the Chairperson may deny an application for funding if any of the following occurs:

(i) The Medallion Owner has failed to submit all of the required documentation within 30 days of the initial submission of the Taxi Improvement Fund application.

(ii) The history of the Medallion Owner, including substantiated complaints of fraudulent activity or criminal convictions, indicates that, in the judgment of the Chairperson, the application should be denied.

(iii) There are material misrepresentations or material errors of omission in the Taxi Improvement Fund application or accompanying documentation.

(iv) The Owner attempts to conceal the identity of a party having an interest in the ownership of the Medallion.

(4) Additional Consideration of an Application for a Taxi Improvement Fund Grant.

If a review of the application leads the Chairperson to believe that the Owner-Applicant may not be qualified to receive a Taxi Improvement Fund grant, the Chairperson may seek additional information from the Owner-Applicant. This request for additional information may be an in-person interview, telephone call, letter, e-mail, or other method of communication. This additional consideration may result in the denial of the application. Failure to provide any requested information within the time frame requested, or failure to appear at a scheduled interview will result in denial of the application of the Taxi Improvement Fund grant.

(5) Service Requirements.

(i) The Taxi Improvement Fund allocation will be awarded for a qualified Accessible Vehicle as defined in section 67-06(b)(1) of TLC Rules.

(ii) The Vehicle Identification Number (VIN) of the qualified Accessible Vehicle will be recorded by TLC for the purposes of TIF funding allocation. The Taxi Improvement Fund allocation will only be available for a specific VIN on one occasion.

(iii) The Medallion Owner must ensure that the Medallion remains Hacked-Up with an Accessible Vehicle for a period of five consecutive years.

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(6) Failure to Meet Requirements.

(i) If the Medallion Owner fails to keep an Accessible Vehicle in service for the full period of five years, the equivalent of funds on a pro rata basis, determined by the number of months an Accessible Vehicle was not in service during the 5-year period beginning when the grant was made available to the Medallion owner, must be repaid by the Medallion Owner to the Commission.

(ii) The Accessible Vehicle must remain active for the full period of five years, in accordance with Administrative Code Section 19-504(g), except where storage is required by TLC Rule 58-30(c), TLC Rule 58-46(a) or TLC Rule 58-46(c).

(iii) The Medallion Owner must comply with orders from the Commission to repair or replace the Accessible Vehicle within 10 days.

This report is issued pursuant to Section 25-318 of the Administrative Code of the City of New York, which requires a report from the Landmarks Preservation Commission for plans for the construction, reconstruction, alteration, or demolition of any improvement or proposed improvement which is owned by the City or is to be constructed upon property owned by the City and is or is to be located on a landmark site or in a historic district or which contains an interior landmark.

The Landmarks Preservation Commission, at the Public Meeting of October 8, 2024, following the Public Hearing of the same date, voted to issue a positive report for the proposed work, as put forward in your application completed on September 11, 2024.

The proposal consists of the installation of two flagpoles with a brown finish and set into granite bases located within a planting bed at the north elevation of the Swedish Cottage. The proposal was shown in a digital presentation titled “Proposal For New Flag Poles” dated October 8, 2024, prepared by the Historic House Trust of NYC, and consisting of nine slides, featuring photographs, line drawings, and a photo montage, all of which were presented as components of the application at the Public Hearing and Public Meeting; and in drawings labeled G001 and A410, dated October 29, 2024, prepared by John G. Waite, RA.

In reviewing this proposal, the Commission noted that the Central Park Scenic Landmark Designation Report describes the park as an English Romantic style public park designed in 1858 by Frederick Law Olmstead and Calvert Vaux. The Commission further noted that the Swedish Cottage was constructed in Sweden for the 1876 Philadelphia Exposition in Fairmont Park, and moved to its current site within Central Park.

With regard to this proposal, the Commission found that the installation of the flagpoles will not cause damage to the building or the site; that the size, scale and placement of the proposed flagpoles, located within a planting bed in front of the Swedish Cottage, are in keeping with the scale and proportions of the building, and will not obscure or detract from significant architectural features; that the granite base of the flagpoles is in keeping with materials and natural features found throughout the park including Belgian block pavers, and that the dark brown finish of the poles will recede against the dark finish of the building; and that the location and presence of the flagpoles next to the building and in an area well screened by trees will not detract from the special character of the Central Park Scenic Landmark. Based on these findings, the Commission determined the work to be appropriate to the building and the scenic landmark and

voted to issue a positive report. Therefore, Commission Advisory Report 25-01251 is being issued.)

This report is issued on the basis of the building and site conditions described in the application and disclosed during the review process. To the Mayor, the Council, and the NYC Department of Parks and Recreation,

This report is issued pursuant to Section 25-318 of the Administrative Code of the City of New York, which requires a report from the Landmarks Preservation Commission for plans for the construction, reconstruction, alteration, or demolition of any improvement or proposed improvement which is owned by the City or is to be constructed upon property owned by the City and is or is to be located on a landmark site or in a historic district or which contains an interior landmark.

The Landmarks Preservation Commission, at the Public Meeting of October 29, 2024, following the Public Hearing of the same date, voted to issue a positive advisory report for the proposed work at the subject premises, as put forward in your application completed on October 9, 2024.

The proposal consists of the rebuilding and modifying the design of the stepped granite block cheek walls, located at a stair in the northwestern section of the park, near West 122nd Street and Morningside Drive, with the reconstructed walls, featuring a progression of sloped profiles, as well as concrete cores, concealed by salvaged granite block cladding and roughhewn granite coping stones; replacing remnants of masonry and/or poured concrete swales at the sides of the cheek walls with granite block swales; and replacing a modern metal railing with two metal railings, painted black, anchored at the steps, and set inboard of the granite block cheek walls, as shown in a 19 page digital presentation, labeled “Morningside Park 114th, 116th and 122nd Street Staircases Reconstruction”; dated October 29, 2024; prepared by NYC Parks; submitted as a components of the application; and presented at the Public Hearing and Public Meeting.

In reviewing this proposal, the Commission noted that the Morningside Park Scenic Landmark Designation Report describes the park as a picturesque public park designed in 1873, with design revisions made in 1887, by Frederick Law Olmsted and Calvert Vaux, and architectural site features designed by Jacob Wrey Mould, Julius Munckwitz, Calvert Vaux, and Montgomery A. Kellogg. The Commission also noted that some stairs within the park historically featured bluestone steps and carefully cut rockwork flanking the steps; that many of the steps and flanking walls were subsequently altered and much of the rockwork edging has been re-worked over the years; and that the original design of the existing cheek walls of this stair is not fully known.

With regard to this proposal, the Commission found that the design of the existing rebuilt walls, featuring a stepped profile and simple pattern of stacked granite blocks, is not a significant later alteration;

that the change from the stepped profile at the walls to a more gradual and informal sloped profile will not detract from any of the unifying features of the stair or this section of the park; that the height of the walls, closely following the adjoining sloping topography, will support the historic prominence of the surrounding landscape; that the proposed coping stones and concealed concrete cores will help improve drainage and address existing disrepair; that the reused granite blocks as stacked and mortared masonry cladding will be consistent with stone historically used within this section of the park in terms of their masonry type and rough hewn surfaces; and that the proposed metal railings will be simply designed and in keeping with other railings within the park in terms of placement, material, finish and details. Based on these findings, a quorum of Commissioners voted to support the application as presented.

In addition, some of the Commissioners recommended that the applicants and the Public Design Commission further explore installing a single railing, instead of paired railings, in consultation with the Commission staff.

Subsequently, on November 15, 2024, the Commission received a 36 page presentation, titled "Morningside Park 114th, 116th and 122nd Street Staircases Reconstruction" and dated September 9, 2024, which included restorative work and alterations at and near staircases, pathways, and a plaza, near Morningside Avenue, West 114th Street and West 116th Street, including resetting and replacing in-kind select bluestone treads at the stairs; removing modern metal railings; installing , black painted metal handrails at the sides of all of the stairs and at the center of the wider stairs; resetting boulders, functioning as cheekwalls, in conjunction with installing concealed drainage equipment; repointing the masonry at the cheekwalls, as needed; the replacement of asphalt pavement at pathways; and grey tinted concrete landings at stairs in-kind; the installation of black painted metal lampposts at asphalt paving and within landscaping, adjacent to stairs; the construction of a granite block swale, adjacent to a pathway; and resetting metal lampposts and their stone pedestals; stone pavers, copings, and a pier; and a stone bench, as well as installing a dome shaped metal grate cover over a drop inlet within a naturalistic stormwater basin ("bird bath").

With regard to this additional work, the Commission finds that certain aspects of the work are in accordance with the provisions set forth in Title 63 of the Rules of the City of New York, Section 2-11 for Repair, Restoration, Replacement, and Re-creation of Building Facades and Related Exterior Elements, including Section 2-11(c)(3) for pointing mortar joints; and Section 2-11(d)(1)(i) for in-kind material replacement; and Section 2-18 for Barrier-Free Access, including Section 2-18(e)(1) for handrail alterations. Furthermore, with regards to these or other aspects of the work, the Commission finds that the proposed lampposts and swale will be typical in terms of placement and in keeping with lampposts and swales found throughout the park in terms of design, size, materials and finishes; and that the proposed grate will be simply designed, small in size and neutral in finish, helping it remain a discreet presence. Based on these findings, the Commission determined this additional work to also be appropriate to the scenic landmark.

This report is issued pursuant to Section 25-318 of the Administrative Code of the City of New York, which requires a report from the Landmarks Preservation Commission for plans for the construction, reconstruction, alteration, or demolition of any improvement or proposed improvement which is owned by the City or is to be constructed upon property owned by the City and is or is to be located on a landmark site or in a historic district or which contains an interior landmark.

The Landmarks Preservation Commission reviewed a proposal for alterations within a playground (“3rd Street Playground”), near Prospect Park West and 3rd Street, including the removal of modern installations, including, fencing, benches, a drinking fountain, and play equipment, and the installation of concrete, asphalt, and flagstone paving; play equipment; boulders; 3’ tall metal fencing; wood and metal benches; a bottle filler; trash receptacles; and wood decking around the tree pits; as well as installing a dark finished, vinyl coated metal mesh at the metal picket fencing at the perimeter of the playground and installing a new black painted metal cabinet (RPZ enclosure) in the landscape to the west of the playground, as described and shown in a 32 page presentation, including existing and proposed condition site plans; historic photographs; existing condition photographs; and renderings; titled “Third Street Playground”; dated October 25, 2024; and prepared by the Prospect Park Alliance as components of the application.

The Commission notes that Prospect Park as a primarily naturalistic style park designed in 1866-73 by Frederick Law Olmsted and Calvert Vaux. The Commission also notes that a playground was first built within this section of the park in the early 20th century; and that the play equipment within the playground was replaced in the late 20th century and early 21st century.

The Landmarks Preservation Commission has reviewed a proposal for installing telecommunications poletop antennas and shroud, and associated transmitter boxes mounted on existing light poles, the design and attachment of which are in accordance with the guidelines established by the Public Design Commission. The work will occur at a light pole located adjacent to the St. Paul's Chapel and Graveyard Individual Landmark. The work consists of replacing one (1) grey finished telecommunications poletop antenna and transmitter box in-kind, in conjunction with replacing the pole shaft and base, in-kind; and temporarily removing and reinstalling any existing attachments to the new shaft, as needed, as described and shown in existing conditions photographs, locator map, poletop manager print out, manhole cover diagram, and a letter, dated November 6, 2024, prepared by Judith Garcia of NYC OTI, and submitted as components of the application.

Final Notice and Public Explanation of a Proposed Activity in a Federal Flood Risk Management Standard (FFRMS) Designated Floodplain

To: All Interested Agencies, Groups and Individuals

This is to give notice that the City of New York’s Mayor’s Office of Management and Budget (OMB) has conducted an evaluation as required by Executive Order 11988, in accordance with HUD regulations at 24 CFR 55.20 Subpart C Procedures for Making Determinations on Floodplain Management and Wetlands Protection. The activity is funded under the NYC Department of Housing Preservation and Development’s (HPD) Demolition Program and under U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) grant #B-24-MC-0104.

The proposed project is located at 706 Ocean View Avenue, Brooklyn (Kings County), New York (Block 8677, Lot 5). The extent of the FFRMS floodplain was determined using a Climate Informed Science Approach (CISA).

The subject property is a 1,178-square-foot, multiple-dwelling, detached building with wood framing and masonry walls. This is a residential structure that includes two stories and a cellar. The building is vacant, open, and unguarded; the brick walls are heavily deteriorated with bulging and cracking indicating stress failure at those locations. At least two walls are structurally compromised, and their potential collapse poses a danger to the public adjacent property. The Supreme Court of the State of New York has found sufficient reason to order the building’s demolition, which would include the removal of asbestos-containing materials (if applicable), demolition of the structure, removal of the foundation, grading the property, replacing the sidewalk, and the safe disposal of all debris in accordance with all NYC Department of Buildings rules and regulations.

The building sits on a 2,400-square-foot lot (approximately .06 acres), two structures in from the western corner of Brighton 7th Street and Ocean View Avenue. The surrounding community of Brighton Beach is a developed, mixed-use area situated in both a 100-year floodplain and a 500-year floodplain bounded approximately by Brighton Beach Avenue on the south, the Belt Parkway on the north, Ocean Parkway on the west, and the Sheepshead Bay on the east.

OMB has considered the following alternatives and mitigation measures to minimize adverse impacts and to restore and preserve natural and beneficial values: taking no action, fencing the property, sealing/stabilizing the building, erecting sidewalk sheds, and rehabilitating the property. The City does not have the legal authority to rehabilitate the property, and none of the remaining alternatives would alleviate the health and safety threat.

OMB has reevaluated the alternatives to demolishing this structure and has determined that it has no practicable alternative. Environmental files that document compliance with steps 3 through 6 of Executive Order 11988, will be provided for public inspection as noted in the last paragraph of this notice for receipt of comments.

There are three primary purposes for this notice. First, people who may be affected by activities in floodplains and those who have an interest in the protection of the natural environment should be given an opportunity to express their concerns and provide information about these areas. Second, an adequate public notice program can be an important public educational tool. The dissemination of information and request for public comment about floodplains can facilitate and enhance Federal efforts to reduce the risks and impacts associated with the occupancy and modification of these special areas. Third, as a matter of fairness, when the Federal government determines it will participate in actions taking place in floodplains, it must inform those who may be put at greater or continued risk.

WHEREAS, this Order is given to prioritize compliance with the *Nunez* Action Plan and to address the effects of DOC's staffing levels, the conditions at DOC facilities, and health operations; and

WHEREAS, additional reasons for requiring the measures continued in this Order are set forth in Emergency Executive Order No. 140 of 2022, Emergency Executive Order No. 579 of 2024, and Emergency Executive Order 623 of 2024; and

WHEREAS, the state of emergency existing within DOC facilities, first declared in Emergency Executive Order No. 241, dated September 15, 2021, and extended by subsequent orders, remains in effect;

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to the powers vested in me by the laws of the State of New York and the City of New York, including but not limited to the New York Executive Law, the New York City Charter and the Administrative Code of the City of New York, and the common law authority to protect the public in the event of an emergency:

Section 1. I hereby direct that section 1 of Emergency Executive Order No. 690, dated November 14, 2024, is extended for five (5) days.

§ 2. This Emergency Executive Order shall take effect immediately and shall remain in effect for five (5) days unless it is terminated or modified at an earlier date.

EMERGENCY EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 694 November 19, 2024

WHEREAS, it is of utmost importance to protect the health and safety of all persons in the custody of the Department of Correction (“DOC”), and of all officers and persons who work in the City of New York jails and who transport persons in custody to court and other facilities, and the public; and

WHEREAS, over 80 provisions in the various Court Orders entered in *Nunez v. City of New York*, 11 CV 5845 (SDNY), require DOC to consult with, and seek the approval of, the *Nunez* Monitor (“Monitor”) prior to implementing or amending policies on issues, including but not limited to, matters relating to security practices, the use of restraints, escorts, emergency lock-ins, de-escalation, confinement management of incarcerated individuals following serious acts of violence and subsequent housing strategies, and DOC may be held in contempt of court and sanctioned if it fails to appropriately consult with and obtain approval from the Monitor regarding policies in these areas; and

WHEREAS, as fully detailed in Emergency Executive Order 579 of 2024, DOC is already experiencing a significant staffing crisis, which poses a serious risk to the health, safety, and security of all people in custody and to DOC personnel; and

WHEREAS, attempting to comply with many of the provisions of Local Law 42 and the new BOC regulations, such as by transporting

individuals to court without restraints, would require a massive increase in staff and other resources, which are not available; and

WHEREAS, even if DOC had such additional staffing and resources, that still would not obviate the direct threat to public safety posed by certain provisions of Local Law 42, nor would it obviate the fact that the Monitor has yet to approve implementation of those provisions as required by the *Nunez* Orders, nor would it obviate the fact that additional time would be needed to safely implement those provisions of Local Law 42 eventually approved by the Monitor, because, as the Monitor has expressly cautioned, the safe implementation of any new requirement or reform in DOC facilities requires planning time to “evaluat[e] the operational impact, update[e] policies and procedures, update[e] the physical plant, determin[e] the necessary staffing complement, develop[] training materials, and provid[e] training to thousands of staff, all of which must occur before the changes in practice actually go into effect” [11 CV 5845 (SDNY) Dkt No. 758-3 at p. 61]; and

WHEREAS, on July 27, 2024, I issued Emergency Executive Order No. 624, and declared a state of emergency to exist within the correction facilities operated by the DOC, and such declaration remains in effect; and

WHEREAS, additional reasons for requiring the measures continued in this Order are set forth in Emergency Executive Order No. 625, dated July 27, 2024, and Emergency Executive Order 682, dated October 30, 2024; and

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to the powers vested in me by the laws of the State of New York and the City of New York, including but not limited to the New York Executive Law, the New York City Charter and the Administrative Code of the City of New York, and the common law authority to protect the public in the event of an emergency:

Section 1. I hereby direct section 1 of Emergency Executive Order No. 691, dated November 14, 2024 is extended for five (5) days.

§ 2. This Emergency Executive Order shall take effect immediately and shall remain in effect for five (5) days unless it is terminated or modified at an earlier date.
