New York City Economic Development Corporation ("NYCEDC") invites consultants to submit proposals for the provision of relocation services for sub-tenants and/or occupants currently located at Station Plaza in Downtown Jamaica, Queens. NYCEDC anticipates that the services will include development of a business outreach strategy, identification of potential relocation sites for impacted tenants, and provision of direct relocation assistance on behalf of NYCEDC and/or any applicable Agencies.

Station Plaza is an infrastructure project identified in the Jamaica 2007 Rezoning Plan and the 2015 Jamaica Now Action Plan as a priority to improve pedestrian safety and traffic circulation, improve open space and roadways, and support significant private investments in the downtown core. It is one of three infrastructure projects to increase pedestrian safety and improve circulation at key intersections in Downtown Jamaica. With the Sutphin Underpass (complete) and Atlantic Avenue Extension (near completion), Station Plaza is the third and final component. The development of a pedestrian plaza will require the identified buildings to be vacated in order for the design to be realized. Accordingly, NYCEDC will coordinate relocation assistance efforts for these in-place tenants and is seeking a consultant to support these efforts.

NYCEDC plans to select a consultant on the basis of factors stated in the RFP which include, but are not limited to: experience of key staff identified in the proposal, demonstrated successful experience in performing services similar to those encompassed in the RFP, the quality of the proposal, quality of the respondent's reputation and references, and the proposed fee and schedule. These services are expected to be funded by the Federal Transit Administration ("FTA").

It is the policy of NYCEDC to comply with all federal, state and City laws and regulations which prohibit unlawful discrimination because of race, creed, color, national origin, sex, age, disability, marital status and other protected category and to take affirmative action in working with contracting parties to ensure certified Minority and Women-owned Business Enterprises (MWBEs) share in the economic opportunities generated by NYCEDC's projects and initiatives. On or about December 30, 2024, the City of New York ("the City") will submit a request to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development for the release of Community Development Block Grant-Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) funds authorized under the Community Development Act of 1974, as amended, and the Continuing Appropriations Act, 2023 (Public Law 117-180), to undertake a project known as NYCHA Green Infrastructure for the purpose of managing stormwater runoff across seventeen (17) New York City Housing Authority ("NYCHA")-owned developments. The funds will be requested for three (3) of these sites (GI Sites):

1. Ocean Hill Apartments
2. Stuyvesant Gardens I
3. Stuyvesant Gardens II

These three (3) sites are also a part of the NYCHA preservation initiative: Permanent Affordability Housing Together ("PACT") program. Through PACT, NYCHA intends to submit application(s) to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development ("HUD") for the disposition of public housing property, including Ocean Hill Apartments, Stuyvesant Gardens I and II, as authorized under Section 18 of the U.S. Housing Act of 1937 as amended and implementing regulations at 24 C.F.R. Part 970 ("Section 18"), the Rental Assistance Demonstration ("RAD") created by the Consolidated and Further Continuing Appropriations Act of 2012 (Public Law 112-55) and the corresponding Notice H 2019-09 PIH 2019-23 (September 5, 2019). The City of New York acting through the New York City Department of Housing Preservation & Development ("NYC HPD") is serving as the Responsible Entity ("RE") for NYCHA pursuant to the National Environmental Policy Act ("NEPA") 24 C.F.R. Part 58. Approval of the disposition and conversion of public housing property will facilitate the PACT program and the rehabilitation and preservation of such housing as long-term, project-based Section 8 assisted housing. NYCHA will convey the (3) sites through a ground lease to Bed Stuy Collective LLC, a joint entity consisting of Karel Companies and Dantes Partners. There is a separate public notice available for review and to issue comments on the PACT project at the HPD website: <https://www.nyc.gov/site/hpd/services-and-information/environmental-review.page>.

The City proposes to award \$3,502,998.48 in CDBG-DR funds to NYCHA, which will procure a contractor to install green infrastructure at the GI Sites as part of the NYCHA Green Infrastructure project. The GI Sites will include a total of four (4) assets. These include sub-surface slow-release detention chambers, which will temporarily store rainwater below ground and then release it slowly into the combined sewer after the storm has passed and capacity has returned, and retention chambers, which are designed to collect rain and channel it to below-ground natural aquifers.

The green infrastructure practices in this project are all located in parking lots or other open spaces on NYCHA properties. Excavation is required to install subsurface chambers and reconstruct catch basins and outlet control structures that are reconnected to existing sewer pipes. Once installation and reconstruction are complete, the area will be backfilled, resurfaced, and restored to its pre-existing condition; features at or above ground level will be replaced in kind. For each green infrastructure practice, the sewer's capacity is fixed.

Women Forward NYC LGBTQ+/TGNC Grant Application

The Office for the Prevention of Hate Crimes (OPHC) seeks grant proposals for projects that support LGBTQ+/transgender and gender non-conforming (TGNC) serving organizations that address anti-violence needs, including social determinants of safety (e.g., economic mobility, health, and housing stability) as part of Women Forward NYC.

Background: Women Forward NYC

In January 2024, Mayor Eric Adams announced Women Forward NYC, a \$43 million, 42 initiative living action plan for gender equity. Women Forward NYC, under the leadership of the Adams administration, is a unique public-private partnership with leaders in community organizations, philanthropy, business, academia, and civic engagement. The action plan employs a holistic approach to address immediate needs, tackle long-standing disparities, and deepen New York City's longstanding leadership in advancing women's issues. Women Forward NYC, with a special emphasis on supporting historically marginalized populations, focuses on interventions in three key areas:

1. Economic Mobility

- Build pipelines toward higher-wage, in-demand career pathways
- Improve financial literacy and access to financial resources
- Dismantle barriers to work and increased incomes

2. Health

- Address inequities in sexual, chronic, and reproductive health
- Reduce Black and Brown maternal mortality rates
- Improve access to comprehensive medical treatment
- Enhance mental health education and outreach

3. Public Safety & Housing Stability

- Increase initiatives that reduce violence against women, LGBTQ+ women, nonbinary New Yorkers, and women of color
- Expand interventions to prevent domestic violence and support survivors
- Provide a continuum of services for low-income families to keep them in their homes or accelerate their leave from shelter and back into their communities

Addressing Violence Against the LGBTQ+ Community

Data from the NYPD shows that violence against the LGBTQ+ community has been on the rise in New York City. In 2023, there were 140 anti-LGBTQ+ hate crimes reported in New York City, increasing 25% from 2022¹. Some parts of the LGBTQ+ community also report higher rates of violence. At a national level, transgender and gender non-conforming (TGNC) people experience higher levels of violence compared to cisgender people², and bisexual people face higher levels of domestic violence compared to straight people³. Intervention is urgently needed to address bias and violence against the LGBTQ+ community.

As part of Women Forward NYC, the Adams administration hosted a roundtable discussion in August 2024 addressing violence against the LGBTQ+ community in partnership with the Office for the Prevention of Hate Crimes, Community Affairs Unit, Unity Project, Commission on Gender Equity, Mayor's Office to End Gender-Based Violence, NYC Commission on Human Rights, the Mayor's Office of Equity and Racial Justice, and the Mayor's Office of Criminal Justice. The roundtable convened NYC LGBTQ+ community leaders—especially organizations run by or serving transgender, gender non-conforming, and nonbinary (TGNC) people—to discuss anti-violence efforts for LGBTQ+/TGNC people in NYC.

This convening provided a space for collaboration between advocates and City government. The participants defined violence broadly, both discussing physical violence and social determinants of safety including, but not limited to:

- Religious intolerance
- Poverty
- Lack of affirming housing/shelter spaces
- Intimate partner violence
- Lack of affirming care/culturally competent healthcare workers

Grant Details

To support projects addressing violence against the LGBTQ+ community, the Office for the Prevention of Hate Crimes ("OPHC"), will grant funding to up to three projects to NYC-based organizations, in amounts ranging from \$10,000 to approximately \$13,000. Co-applications between multiple organizations for a collaborative project can request larger aggregate amounts of funding.

To receive funding, organization must have PASSPort and NYC's Payee Information Portal (PIP) accounts.

Required project specifications:

- Projects must focus on addressing violence against the LGBTQ+/TGNC community, by pursuing an intervention designed to result in a reduction of physical violence (e.g., intimate partner violence) or institutional violence (e.g., lack of affirming health care or housing spaces).
- Project scopes must fit into the grant range available. If the scope exceeds available funding, applications must describe what other funding sources will supplement the project.

Optional, not required project specifications:

- Proposals that collaborate with New York City government and improve New York City government's capacity to support the LGBTQ+ community.

Application

Interested parties must fill out the attached application form, providing contact, project, and budget information by **11:59 P.M. January 31, 2025**.

Review, Function, and Funding

Applications will be scored blindly by an evaluation committee comprised of City employees.

Evaluation criteria :

- Clear logic model connecting the proposed intervention to a measurable reduction of physical or institutional violence.
 - Proposals must clearly demonstrate how they fit into one or more of the following categories. Please note proposals can address more than one of the following categories.
 - Economic Mobility
 - Health
 - Public Safety & Housing Stability
- Clear nexus to supporting LGBTQ+/TGNC communities.
- Realistic, tangible deliverables resulting from the proposal.
- Ability to accomplish the proposed deliverables by June 30, 2025 with the funding available.
- Only completed applications will be considered. Submission of an application does not guarantee funding.

Award notification and post-award process:

- Official notification of application status and award decisions will be sent via email from the Mayor's Office, through OPHC@cityhall.nyc.gov
- Awardees are required to submit receipts and invoices after the completion of the funded project, in addition to a closing report reviewing the description of process execution, evaluation of key performance metrics, and documentation of deliverables. The City will provide a template for the closing report to grant awardees.
- Grant recipients will receive half of the allocated funding at the beginning of their project time, once they have finalized all official contracting documents, and then the second half of funding upon completion of the project (by June 30, 2025).
