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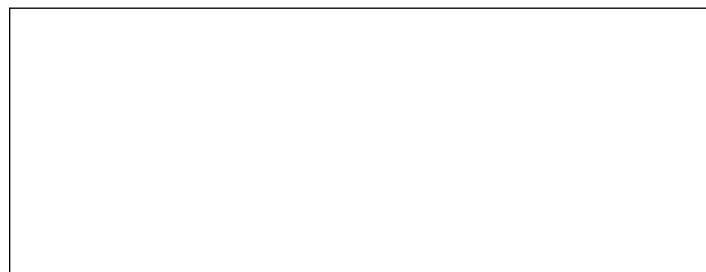

**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN THAT** a public scoping meeting for the Kingsbridge Armory Project (the proposed project) will be held on **Tuesday, February 11, 2025, at 4:00 PM**. The Office of the Deputy Mayor for Housing, Economic Development and Workforce (the lead agency) will hold the public scoping meeting remotely (register here: <https://bit.ly/kingsbridge-scoping>). The purpose of the scoping meeting is to provide the public with the opportunity to comment on the Draft Scope of Work proposed to be used to develop an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) for the proposed project. If you need reasonable accommodation such as a sign language interpreter or foreign language assistance in order to participate in the meeting, please call or email the contact person below. Requests must be submitted at least ten business days before the meeting and can also be requested through the virtual meeting registration.

Written comments on the Draft Scope of Work will be accepted by the lead agency until **Sunday, February 23, 2025, at 10:00 P.M.** at the contact address below.

Directing that an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) be prepared, the lead agency issued an Environmental Assessment Statement (EAS), Positive Declaration, and Draft Scope of Work on January 10, 2025. These documents are available for review on CEQR Access, see <https://a002-ceqraccess.nyc.gov/ceqr/> (search CEQR # 25DME006X) and from the contact person listed below.

The Co-applicants, the New York City Economic Development Corporation (NYCEDC) and the New York City Department of Citywide Administrative Services, are leading a collaborative process to reuse and redevelop a portion of Block 3247 in the Kingsbridge Heights neighborhood of the Bronx, New York (the "Proposed Project"). That portion includes the Kingsbridge Armory (the "Armory") Site at 1 West Kingsbridge Road (Block 3247, Lot 10), which is currently owned by NYCEDC, and the New York National Guard ("National Guard") Site (the "National Guard Site") at 10 West 195th Street (Block 3247, Lot 2), which is currently owned by the National Guard and occupied by two National Guard buildings (the "Project Site"). The Project Site occupies the portion of Block 3247 that is bounded by West 195th Street, Reservoir Avenue, West Kingsbridge Road, and Jerome Avenue.

The Proposed Project includes the adaptive reuse of the vacant, approximately 588,765-gross-square-foot (gsf) Armory, providing up to 760,000 gsf of floor area including a mix of new commercial, community facility, and light industrial uses. Further, it is assumed that the existing National Guard functions would be relocated, and the National Guard Site redeveloped with 500 new permanently affordable residential units (up to 497,000 gsf) in two buildings, replacing a one-story garage and a two-story office building. The Proposed Project would include a total of up to 1,257,000 gsf of new development at the Project Site.

The following discretionary actions would be required to facilitate the Proposed Project:

- Disposition of City-owned property to a private developer. The disposition of the Armory Site and the National Guard Site would require approval pursuant to New York City Charter Section 197-c and separate Mayoral and Borough Board approval pursuant to City Charter Section 384(b)(4).

- Acquisition of property from New York State for the redevelopment of the National Guard Site.
- A zoning map amendment to rezone the project block to accommodate a wider range of uses, such as light industrial.
- A zoning special permit may be required to permit an arena.
- Zoning text amendments may be required to increase permitted arena capacity, or to modify other requirements. A zoning text amendment may be required to modify minimum distance between buildings on the same zoning lot and maximum base height restrictions. A zoning text amendment pursuant to ZR Section 74-182(b) may be required to increase permitted arena capacity and allow parking in excess of what is currently permitted.
- Potential public financing by the New York City Department of Housing Preservation and Development and/or the New York City Housing Development Corporation (HDC) to facilitate the proposed permanently affordable housing units on the National Guard Site.

Since the Armory is a New York City Landmark, any proposed changes to the exterior of the Armory and the landmark site would require a Binding Report from the New York City Landmarks Preservation Commission (LPC) pursuant to the New York City Charter and the New York City Landmarks Law.

It is also anticipated that the Proposed Project would receive City, State, and Federal funding. Receipt of State funding would require review by the New York State Office of Parks, Recreation, and Historic Preservation (OPRHP) pursuant to Section 14.09 of the State Historic Preservation Act (SHPA). The Proposed Project may also involve Federal historic preservation tax credits for the proposed adaptive reuse of the Armory, which is a non-discretionary action that would require consultation with the National Park Service (NPS) and the New York State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO). The proposed alterations to the Armory would also be undertaken in accordance with the Secretary of Interior's Standards for Rehabilitation. In addition, receipt of federal funding would require consultation with SHPO and Federally recognized Tribal Nations in accordance with Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA).

**Notice of Adoption of Final Rule Amending the Subsidized Grocery Program**

A Notice of Public Hearing and Opportunity to Comment on a proposal by the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene ("Department") to amend Chapter 34 in Title 24 of the Rules of the City of New York ("RCNY") governing the subsidized grocery program was published in the City Record on November 1, 2024. A virtual public hearing was held on December 3, 2024. No one testified at the hearing and no written comments were received. The Department has not made any substantive changes to the proposed rule and now adopts such rule as indicated below.

**Statement of Basis and Purpose**

The Department is amending the rules for the subsidized grocery delivery program, called the Groceries to Go Program ("Program").

The Program was established to provide eligible Health and Hospital NYC Care members with diabetes or hypertension, and who are at risk for food insecurity, with money to purchase groceries through an online marketplace of local grocery stores. Due to the high rates of food insecurity in New York City and the overwhelming demand for the Program, the Department proposes several changes to Chapter 34 to reach more New Yorkers experiencing food insecurity. As of October 16, 2024, over 2,150 New Yorkers are on a waiting list for the Program. The rule change will allow the Department to enroll more new participants in the future.

First, the adopted rule requires households seeking to enroll in the Program to self-report experiencing food insecurity<sup>1</sup>, instead of a self-report of risk for food insecurity. Research shows that food insecurity may exacerbate outcomes related to diet-related chronic diseases,<sup>2</sup> including diabetes and hypertension, making New Yorkers with food insecurity and these conditions a high priority population for food support programs like Groceries to Go. Thus, when screening for program eligibility, the Department will stop using questions validated to identify people at risk for food insecurity<sup>3</sup> and instead use questions validated to identify individuals experiencing food insecurity.<sup>4</sup> This change will allow the Groceries to Go Program to reach eligible New Yorkers with a greater need for monthly credits to purchase groceries. The amended definition used for food insecurity is based on the definition used by the United States Department of Agriculture for the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP).

Additionally, the rule changes the reasons for removal from the Groceries to Go Program and allows for the removal of participants

from the program after three months of program inactivity, instead of after six months. The rule also limits program participation to a maximum of 18 cumulative months. Individuals removed following 18 cumulative months of participation would be assessed for eligibility to re-enroll in the program following a period of 18 or more months off the program. If the program is full at the conclusion of the 18-month or longer period after such an individual was removed from the program, that individual could join a waitlist. These changes will enable the Department to enroll more eligible New Yorkers in need of credits to purchase groceries.

The adopted rule also adjusts the number of program credits participating households receive to better reflect how the program is currently operating. Participating households with one to two people will receive \$110 per month and those with three or more people will receive \$270 per month. All participants receive a 50% discount, up to \$30 per month in savings, on purchases of fresh fruits and vegetables using their program credits. The \$30 per month in savings were previously named as credits received by participants but in practice, they are part of a separate discount and are not always fully utilized by participants.

Finally, this rule limits the number of credits participants can hold in their Groceries to Go accounts to three months' worth of credits. Under the rule, program participants will receive between \$0 and \$110 per month for households of one or two people and between \$0 and \$270 per month for households of three or more people, depending on the number of unused credits banked in their accounts. Limiting the number of credits that participants can carry will increase the Department's ability to accommodate additional participants.

The rules are as follows.

Deleted material appears in [brackets]. New material is underlined. The terms "shall" and "must" may be used interchangeably and denote mandatory requirements unless the context clearly indicates otherwise.

**Section 1.** Section 1-01 of chapter 34 of Title 24 of the Rules of the City of New York is renumbered as section 34-01.

**§ 2.** Subdivisions (a), (c), (d), (f) and (h) of section 34-01 of chapter 34 of Title 24 of the Rules of the City of New York, section 34-01 as renumbered by this rule, are amended to read as follows:

(a) *Definitions.* For purposes of [the] this section, the following terms have the following meanings:

The term "food insecurity" means that within [last 12 months of applying] the 12 months preceding application for enrollment or re-enrollment in the Program, the [individual] household had low or very low food security characterized by:

- (1) [Had concern regarding lack of food for their household;] Reduced quality, variety, and desirability of their diet, but the quantity of food intake and normal eating patterns were not substantially disrupted; or
- (2) [Lacked funds to purchase enough food for their household; or] At times during the year, eating patterns

of one or more household members were disrupted and food intake reduced because the household lacked money and other resources for food  
 [(3) Received food from a food pantry].

The term "household" means everyone who lives at the same address. The term "Program" means the Groceries to Go Program described in this section.

(c) *Eligibility criteria.* Only one [person] individual per household may be enrolled in the Program at any time. The Program will not accept applications from more than one [person] individual at the same address. The Program will only be available to individuals that meet all of the following eligibility criteria:

- (i) The individual is a Health and Hospitals New York City Care Member;
- (ii) The individual reports diagnosis of hypertension or diabetes;
- (iii) The individual reports [a risk for] having household food insecurity; [and]
- (iv) The individual is a New York City resident[.]; and

(v) For individuals removed from the Program after 18 cumulative months of Program participation, at least 18 months have elapsed following such individual's removal.

(d) *Program credits.* Program credits will be allocated as follows:

- (i) A household of one or two people will receive [ \$140] \$110 per month, or the maximum portion thereof that would bring such household's Program account balance up to a maximum of \$330;
- (ii) A household of three or more people will receive [ \$300] \$270 per month, or the maximum portion thereof that would bring such household's Program account balance up to a maximum of \$810;
- (iii) The program credits will be eligible to be used for food categories posted on the Department's website. The Department will consider promotion of overall health when determining such categories.

(f) *Enrollment capacity subject to available resources.* Enrollment capacity for [first time] applicants of the Program is on a first-come, first-serve basis among eligible New Yorkers. Enrollment capacity is subject to resource availability as determined by the Department.

(h) *Removal.* The Department may remove an individual from the Program for the following reasons: (i) the individual is no longer eligible; (ii) [inactivity for six months] the individual has participated in the Program for 18 cumulative months without a subsequent break from the Program of at least 18 consecutive months; or (iii) inactivity for three consecutive months; or (iv) non-compliance with this section or established vendor policies. Individuals may also be removed at any time upon their request. The Department will provide written notice to the individual that they will be removed from the Program stating the reason for removal. An individual may object to such removal by submitting an objection in writing to the Commissioner or his or her designee within 10 calendar days of receipt of the notice, if received by e-mail or fax, or 15 days if received by mail. The objection will be reviewed and the individual will be notified of the Department's determination regarding the removal of the individual from the Program. Such determination constitutes a final agency action.

WHEREAS, although there has been improvement in excessive staff absenteeism, extraordinarily high rates of attrition due to staff retirements and other departures continue to seriously affect the Department of Correction’s (DOC’s) staffing levels and create a serious risk to DOC’s ability to carry out the safety and security measures required for the maintenance of sanitary conditions; and access to basic services, including showers, meals, visitation, religious services, commissary, and recreation; and

WHEREAS, this Order is given to prioritize compliance with the *Nunez* Action Plan and to address the effects of DOC’s staffing levels, the conditions at DOC facilities, and health operations; and

WHEREAS, additional reasons for requiring the measures continued in this Order are set forth in Emergency Executive Order No. 140 of 2022, Emergency Executive Order No. 579 of 2024, and Emergency Executive Order 623 of 2024; and

WHEREAS, the state of emergency existing within DOC facilities, first declared in Emergency Executive Order No. 241, dated September 15, 2021, and extended by subsequent orders, remains in effect;

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to the powers vested in me by the laws of the State of New York and the City of New York, including but not limited to the New York Executive Law, the New York City Charter and the Administrative Code of the City of New York, and the common law authority to protect the public in the event of an emergency:

Section 1. I hereby direct that section 1 of Emergency Executive Order No. 705, dated December 9, 2024, is extended for five (5) days.

§ 2. This Emergency Executive Order shall take effect immediately and shall remain in effect for five (5) days unless it is terminated or modified at an earlier date.

EMERGENCY EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 709  
December 14, 2024

WHEREAS, it is of utmost importance to protect the health and safety of all persons in the custody of the Department of Correction (“DOC”), and of all officers and persons who work in the City of New York jails and who transport persons in custody to court and other facilities, and the public; and

WHEREAS, over 80 provisions in the various Court Orders entered in *Nunez v. City of New York*, 11 CV 5845 (SDNY), require DOC to consult with, and seek the approval of, the *Nunez* Monitor (“Monitor”) prior to implementing or amending policies on issues, including but not limited to, matters relating to security practices, the use of restraints, escorts, emergency lock-ins, de-escalation, confinement management of incarcerated individuals following serious acts of violence and subsequent housing strategies, and DOC may be held in contempt of court and sanctioned if it fails to appropriately consult with and obtain approval from the Monitor regarding policies in these areas; and

WHEREAS, as fully detailed in Emergency Executive Order 579 of 2024, DOC is already experiencing a significant staffing crisis, which poses a serious risk to the health, safety, and security of all people in custody and to DOC personnel; and

WHEREAS, attempting to comply with many of the provisions of Local Law 42 and the new BOC regulations, such as by transporting individuals to court without restraints, would require a massive increase in staff and other resources, which are not available; and

WHEREAS, even if DOC had such additional staffing and resources, that still would not obviate the direct threat to public safety posed by certain provisions of Local Law 42, nor would it obviate the fact that the Monitor has yet to approve implementation of those provisions as required by the *Nunez* Orders, nor would it obviate the fact that additional time would be needed to safely implement those provisions of Local Law 42 eventually approved by the Monitor, because, as the Monitor has expressly cautioned, the safe implementation of any new requirement or reform in DOC facilities requires planning time to “evaluat[e] the operational impact, update[e] policies and procedures, updat[e] the physical plant, determin[e] the necessary staffing complement, develop[] training materials, and provid[e] training to thousands of staff, all of which must occur before the changes in practice actually go into effect” [11 CV 5845 (SDNY) Dkt No. 758-3 at p. 61]; and

WHEREAS, on July 27, 2024, I issued Emergency Executive Order No. 624, and declared a state of emergency to exist within the correction facilities operated by the DOC, and such declaration remains in effect; and

WHEREAS, additional reasons for requiring the measures continued in this Order are set forth in Emergency Executive Order No. 625, dated July 27, 2024, and Emergency Executive Order 682, dated October 30, 2024; and

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to the powers vested in me by the laws of the State of New York and the City of New York, including but not limited to the New York Executive Law, the New York City Charter and the Administrative Code of the City of New York, and the common law authority to protect the public in the event of an emergency:

Section 1. I hereby direct section 1 of Emergency Executive Order No. 706, dated December 9, 2024 is extended for five (5) days.

§ 2. This Emergency Executive Order shall take effect immediately and shall remain in effect for five (5) days unless it is terminated or modified at an earlier date.
