The City Planning Commission (CPC), acting as lead agency, issued a Notice of Completion on October 11, 2024 for a Draft Environmental Impact Statement (DEIS) for the Atlantic Avenue Mixed-Use Plan (AAMUP) proposal in accordance with Article 8 of the Environmental Conservation Law. **A public hearing on the DEIS will be held on Wednesday, February 5, 2025, at 10:00 AM at the City Planning Commission Hearing Room, located at 120 Broadway, Lower Concourse, New York, New York 10271, in conjunction with the CPC's public hearing pursuant to ULURP. Comments are requested on the DEIS and will be accepted through 5:00 PM, Tuesday February 18, 2025. To continue to allow for broad public participation, DCP will hold the public hearing accessible both in-person and remotely via the teleconferencing application Zoom. Anyone attending the meeting in-person is encouraged to wear a mask.**

The New York City Department of City Planning (DCP), together with the New York City Department of Housing Preservation and Development (HPD) and Department of Citywide Administrative Services (DCAS), is proposing a series of land use actions including zoning map amendments, acquisition, disposition of City-owned property and Urban Development Action Area Project (UDAAP), and zoning text amendments (including establishing a new Special District and Mandatory Inclusionary Housing (MIH)) (collectively, the "Proposed Actions") that would facilitate the implementation of a neighborhood land-use plan along Atlantic Avenue in Prospect Heights, northwestern Crown Heights, and southern Bedford Stuyvesant in partnership with elected officials, City agencies, community boards, and local stakeholders.

The Proposed Actions would affect an approximately 21-block area, primarily along Atlantic Avenue in Brooklyn Community Districts (CDs) 3, and 8, and generally bounded by Vanderbilt Avenue to the west, Nostrand Avenue to the east, Herkimer Street to the north, and Bergen Street to the south. In addition, the Proposed Actions would affect two, separate, non-contiguous areas on a portion of two blocks bounded by:

- 6th Avenue to the west, Carlton Avenue to the east, Dean Street to the north, and St. Marks and Flatbush Avenues to the south.
- Halsey Street to the north, Macon Street to the south, Nostrand Avenue to the west and Marcy Avenue to the east.

In response to the comments received on the Draft Scope of Work, two additional development sites (Projected Development Sites 53 and 55) have been included in environmental analysis to account for development that could be facilitated by future discretionary actions not subject to the current ULURP land use application associated with the Proposed Actions. These two separate, non-contiguous sites in CD 2 and 8 are on a portion of two blocks bounded by:

- Fulton Street to the north, Atlantic Avenue to the south, Carlton Avenue to the west and Clermont Avenue to the east.
- Prospect Place to the north, Park Place to the south, New York Avenue to the west and Brooklyn Avenue to the east.

The Proposed Actions are intended to reinvigorate portions of the 120-foot-wide Atlantic Avenue thoroughfare and surrounding blocks and help mitigate the regional housing crisis by allowing the development of new housing, including affordable housing, and facilitating economic opportunity and the growth of local services and jobs in an area that has excellent public transit access and is near the major employment hubs of Downtown Brooklyn and Lower Manhattan. These actions will also be reinforced by investments into local community resources and the public realm to improve sustainability, safety, mobility, and neighborhood connectivity.

Related to the objectives above, the proposed actions also seek to facilitate the following redevelopments of five public- and non-profit-owned lots, including Dean Park Edge, Bergen Green, 457 Nostrand Avenue, 1134 Pacific Street, and 1110 Atlantic Avenue.

The Proposed Actions include discretionary actions that are subject to review under ULURP, Section 200 of the City Charter, and City Environmental Quality Review (CEQR) process, as follows:

- **Zoning Map Amendment to:**
 - o Rezone portions of existing M1-1, C6-2A, C6-3A, C6-3X, M1-4/R7A, R7A/C2-4, R7D/C2-4, R6B, and R6A districts to R7A, R7D, C6-3A, M1-1A/R6B, M1-2A/R6A, M1-3A/R7D, M1-4A/R9A, C4-3A, C4-5D, R7-2, and M1-3A districts and C2-4 commercial overlays.
- **Zoning Text Amendments to:**
 - o Establish the Special Atlantic Avenue Mixed-Use District largely coterminous with the Rezoning Area. The proposed special purpose district will include modifications to underlying use, bulk, parking and loading, and streetscape regulations. The proposed special district will include requirements and incentives related to active ground floor uses and job-generating uses and establish controls for building articulation and streetscape improvements along key corridors.
 - o Modify Appendix F for the purpose of establishing proposed R7A, R7-2, R7D, C6-3A, M1-1A/R6B, M1-2A/R6A, M1-3A/R7D, M1-4A/R9A, C4-3A, C4-5D, and R7-2 as MIH areas, applying the MIH program to require a share of new housing to be permanently affordable where significant new housing capacity would be

created.

- **Designation of Urban Development Action Areas (UDAA), Approval of an Urban Development Action Area Project (UDAAP), Acquisition, and Disposition of City-Owned Properties**
 - o Designation of UDAA's, project approval of an UDAAP, and disposition of the City-owned property for two parcels owned and managed by HPD on Block 1136 (Lots 29, 32, 33, 34, and 35) and Block 1143 (Lot 25). HPD seeks to designate a UDAAP for the purpose of disposition and development of affordable housing for older adults and families, as well as to provide on-site services and amenities for residents and other community facility uses.
 - o Acquisition and disposition actions related to the property for Block 1205, Lots 11, 14, and 111; Acquisition and disposition of City-owned property at Block 1126, Lot 32; acquisition of City-owned property at Block 1143, Lot 25, and disposition of City-owned property at Block 1844, Lot 1.
 - o In addition to these land use actions, potential Article XI disposition, tax exemption, and HPD financing for one or more sites to facilitate the development of affordable housing.

The Proposed Actions would allow for the development of new uses and higher densities at the projected and potential development sites. Under the RWCDS, the total development expected to occur on the 54 projected development sites under the With-Action condition which would consist of approximately 6,665,448 sf of floor area, including 5,321,642 sf of residential floor area (approximately 5,279 DU, 25-30% of units would be affordable pursuant to MIH with additional affordable housing to be provided pursuant to other City-based programs), 344,325 sf of local retail uses, 50,410 sf of destination retail uses, 472,574 sf of office and other commercial uses, 77,095 sf of industrial uses, and 389,402 sf of community facility uses, as well as no accessory parking spaces. The estimated population under the With-Action condition would include a total of approximately 12,933 residents and 3,559 workers on these projected development sites. The projected incremental (net) change between the No-Action and With-Action conditions that would result from the Proposed Actions would be an increase of 5,206,685 sf of residential floor area (5,143 DU), 286,507 sf of local retail space, 50,410 sf of destination retail space, 449,926 sf of office space and other commercial uses, 121,716 sf of community facility space, a net reduction of 160,276 sf of industrial spaces, 209 accessory parking spaces, and a net decrease of 81,000 sf of automotive related uses on the projected development sites.

In addition, the EIS contains a conceptual analysis that analyzes how discretionary actions created by the Proposed Actions could be used in the future and to generically assess the potential environmental impacts that could result. The Proposed Actions would create a new discretionary action; an authorization for floor area bonus and height modification with the provision of publicly accessible open space, for the City Planning Commission to consider. However, all potential significant adverse impacts related to these future discretionary actions would be disclosed through environmental review at the time of the application.

The Proposed Actions would result in significant adverse impacts related to Open Space (indirect), Shadows, Historic and Cultural Resources, Transportation, and Construction. Mitigation measures being proposed to address those impacts, where feasible and/or practical, are discussed below. If no feasible mitigation can be identified, an unavoidable significant adverse impact would result.

The DEIS considered two alternatives – a No-Action Alternative and a No Unmitigated Significant Adverse Impacts Alternative. The No-Action Alternative examines future conditions within the Affected Area but assumes the absence of the Proposed. In the No-Action Alternative, there would be no change to zoning, MIH, or the City Map within the Affected Area. The permanent affordable housing expected under the Proposed Actions would not be provided. In addition, as compared to the Proposed Actions, the benefits associated with improved economic activity, opportunities for high quality, and enhanced pedestrian conditions and vibrant commercial corridor along Atlantic Avenue would not be realized. The No Unmitigated Significant Adverse Impacts Alternative examines a scenario in which the density and other components of the Proposed Actions are modified to avoid the unmitigated significant adverse impacts associated with the Proposed Actions which include impacts related to open space, shadows, historic and cultural resources (archaeological and architectural), transportation (traffic, transit, and pedestrians), and construction. This alternative considers development that would not result in any significant adverse impacts that could not be fully mitigated. However, to eliminate all unmitigated significant adverse impacts, the Proposed Actions would have to be modified to a point

where the principal goals and objectives of the Proposed Actions would not be fully realized.





GENERAL PURPOSES**

The "Special Atlantic Avenue Mixed Use District" established in this Resolution is designed to promote and protect public health, safety and general welfare. These general goals include, among others, the following specific purposes:

- (a) to expand local employment opportunities and to promote the opportunity for workers to live in the vicinity of their work; and
- (b) to create a lively and attractive built environment that will provide amenities and services for the use and enjoyment of area residents, workers and visitors;
- (c) to enhance neighborhood economic diversity by broadening the range of housing choices for residents at varied incomes;
- (d) to encourage stability and growth in the neighborhood by permitting compatible light manufacturing and residential uses to coexist;
- (e) to ensure that the form and use of new buildings relates to and enhances neighborhood character and responds to unique corridors like Atlantic Avenue; and
- (f) to promote the most desirable use of land in the area and thus preserve, protect and enhance the value of land and buildings and thereby protect City tax revenues.

In conjunction with such #floor area# bonus, the Commission may authorize modifications to the applicable #bulk# regulations of this Resolution, or to the regulations governing #public plazas# in Section

37-70, inclusive, provided that the conditions and limitations of paragraph (a) and the findings of paragraph (b) are met.

(a) Conditions and limitations

The following conditions and limitations shall apply:

- (1) Modifications to the maximum permitted #building# height shall not result in an increase that exceeds 25 percent of the maximum #building# height otherwise permitted by the applicable district regulations; and
- (2) Modifications to the regulations governing #public plazas# shall be limited to:
 - (i) the basic design criteria set forth in Section 37-71, inclusive, other than the area dimensions of Section 37-712;
 - (ii) the access and circulation provisions set forth in Section 37-72, inclusive, other than hours of access set forth in Section 37-727; and
 - (iii) the types and standards for amenities, set forth in Section 37-74, inclusive.

(b) Findings


The Commission shall find that:

- (1) the public benefit derived from the #public plaza# merits the amount of additional #floor area# being granted pursuant to this Section;
- (2) the #public plaza# will be well-integrated with the overall pedestrian circulation network and contribute to an enhanced streetscape;
- (3) any modifications to #bulk# are the minimum extent necessary to reasonably accommodate the #public plaza# and the additional #floor area# granted pursuant to this Section and will not unduly obstruct access of light and air to surrounding #streets# and properties; and
- (4) any modifications to #public plaza# regulations are the minimum extent necessary, and will better align such #public plaza# regulations with unique site configurations or with the mixed-use character of the neighborhood.

The City Planning Commission may prescribe appropriate conditions and safeguards to minimize adverse effects on the character of the surrounding area.

Map 1 – Designated Streetscape Frontages



















AGREEMENT entered into this 16th day of December, 2024, by and between the City of New York and the New York City Public Advocate pursuant to and limited to their respective election to be covered by the New York City Collective Bargaining Law and their respective authorizations to the City to bargain on their behalf (hereinafter referred to jointly as the "Employer"), and the **Organization of Staff Analysts** (hereinafter referred to as the "Union") for the period from October 2, 2022 to October 21, 2026.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the parties hereto have entered into collective bargaining and desire to reduce the results thereof to writing,

NOW, THEREFORE, it is mutually agreed as follows:

ARTICLE I - UNION RECOGNITION AND UNIT DESIGNATION

Section 1.

The Employer recognizes the Union as the sole and exclusive collective bargaining representative for the bargaining unit set forth below, consisting of Employees of the Employer, wherever employed, whether fulltime, parttime, per annum, hourly or per diem, in the below listed title(s), and in any successor title(s) that may be certified by the Board of Certification of the Office of Collective Bargaining to be part of the unit herein for which the Union is the exclusive collective bargaining representative:

- Assistant to Public Advocate (94496)
- Assistant to Public Advocate, Research & Planning (94497)
- Office Assistant (Public Advocate) (94507)
- Special Assistant (Public Advocate) (94512)

Section 2.

The terms "Employee" and "Employees" as used in this Agreement shall mean only those persons in the unit described in Section 1 of this Article.

ARTICLE II - DUES CHECK OFF

Section 1.

- a. The Union shall have the exclusive right to the checkoff and transmittal of dues on behalf of each Employee and the Union and Employer agree to follow the process and procedures set forth in (i) the Mayor's Executive Order No. 98, dated May 15, 1969, entitled "Regulations Relating to the Checkoff of Union Dues"; and (ii) the Mayor's Executive Order No. 107, dated December 29, 1986 entitled "Regulations Governing Procedures for Orderly Payroll Checkoff of Union Dues," to the extent permitted by law.
- b. Any Employee may consent in writing to the authorization of the deduction of dues from the Employee's wages and to the designation of the Union as the recipient thereof. Such consent, if given, shall be in a proper form acceptable to the City, which bears the signature of the Employee.

Section 2.

- a. The Employer shall commence deduction of dues as soon as practicable, but in no case later than thirty (30) days after receiving proof of a signed dues check off authorization card.
- b. The Employer shall accept signed dues check off authorization cards, signed by means of written and/or electronic signatures. The right to membership dues shall remain in effect until the (i)

Employee is no longer employed in a title represented by the Union or (ii) the Employee revokes such dues check off authorization pursuant to and in accordance with the terms of the dues check off authorization card.

ARTICLE III - SALARIES

Section 1.

- a. Unless otherwise specified, all salary provisions of this Agreement, including minimum and maximum salaries, general increases and any other salary adjustments, are based upon a normal work week of 35 hours. An Employee who works on a parttime, per annum basis and who is eligible for any salary adjustments provided in this Agreement shall receive the appropriate prorata portion of such salary adjustment computed on the relationship between the number of hours regularly worked each week by such Employee and the number of hours in the said normal work week, unless otherwise specified.
- b. Employees who work on a part-time basis and who are eligible for any salary adjustment provided in this Agreement shall receive the appropriate prorata portion of such salary adjustment computed as follows, unless otherwise specified:

Per diem rate - 1/261 of the appropriate minimum basic salary.

Hourly Rate - 35 hour week basis 1/1827 of the appropriate minimum basic salary.

Hourly Rate - 20 hour week basis 1/1040 of the applicable part-time salary.
- c. The maximum salary for a title shall not constitute a bar to the payment of any salary adjustment or pay differentials provided for in this Agreement but the said increase above the maximum shall not be deemed a promotion.

Section 2.

Employees in the following title(s) shall be subject to the following specified salary(ies), salary adjustment(s), and/or salary range(s):

Section 3. Ratification Bonus

A lump sum cash payment in the amount of \$3,000, pro-rated for other than full time employees, shall be payable as soon as practicable upon ratification of the Agreement to those employees who are in active payroll status and in a title covered by this Agreement, as of the date of ratification. Active payroll status is defined as being in active payroll status ("B Status"), military leave with pay ("K status"), or on paid family leave. The lump sum cash payment shall be pensionable, consistent with applicable law.

All full time per annum and full time per diem employees who were in active status on the date of the ratification are entitled to receive the lump sum cash payment of \$3,000. Employees who were terminated for cause, resigned, retired, or otherwise separated from service prior to the date of ratification of this Agreement shall not be eligible for the lump sum cash payment. Part-time Employees shall receive a pro-rata lump sum cash payment the computation of which shall be based on their regularly scheduled hours between September 1, 2023 and August 31, 2024.

In no event shall any employee receive greater than \$3,000 in bonus payments pursuant to this section.

For the purposes of this section, any employee on terminal leave at the time of ratification will not be eligible for the ratification bonus payment.

Section 4. Wage Increase

- a. The general increases, effective as indicated, shall be:
 - i. Effective May 24, 2023, Employees shall receive a general wage increase of 3.00%.
 - ii. Effective May 24, 2024, Employees shall receive a general wage increase of 3.00%.
 - iii. Effective May 24, 2025, Employees shall receive a general wage increase of 3.25%.
 - iv. Parttime Employees and Employees whose normal work year is less than a full calendar year shall receive the increases provided in Section 4 (a)(i) to (a)(iii) on the basis of computations heretofore utilized by the parties for all such employees.
- b. The general increases provided for in this Section 4(a) shall be calculated as follows:
 - i. The general increase in Section 4(a)(i) shall be based upon the base rates of applicable titles in effect on May 23, 2023;
 - ii. The general increase in Section 4(a)(ii) shall be based upon the base rates of applicable titles in effect on May 23, 2024;
 - iii. The general increase in Section 4(a)(iii) shall be based upon the base rates of applicable titles in effect on May 23, 2025;

Section 5.

Each general increase provided herein, effective as of each indicated date, shall be applied to the rate in effect on the date as specified in Section 4 of this Article. In the case of a promotion or other advancement to the indicated title on the effective date of the general increase specified in Section 4 of this Article, such general increase shall not be applied, but the general increase, if any, provided to be effective as of such date for the title formerly occupied shall be applied.

Section 6.

For the purposes of this section, any employee on terminal leave at the time of ratification will be eligible for retroactive payments for general wage increases as detailed in Section 4, but will not be eligible for the ratification bonus as detailed in Section 3.

ARTICLE IV - WELFARE FUND

Section 1.

Effective September 6, 2026, there shall be a recurring \$839 per annum per employee (active and retiree) increase to the welfare fund contribution. The per annum per employee active and retiree contribution will increase from \$1,825 per annum to \$2,664 per annum.

Section 2.

The Union agrees to provide welfare fund benefits to domestic partners of covered employees in the same manner as those benefits are provided to spouses of married covered employees.

Section 3.

The parties acknowledge that any citywide health and welfare benefits fund changes negotiated on a citywide basis with the Municipal Labor Committee shall apply to the Union.

ARTICLE V - EDUCATION AND TRAINING FUND

Effective October 2, 2022, the covered titles shall be added to the OSA Education and Training Fund and there shall be a twenty-five dollar (\$25.00) per annum contribution made on behalf of each full-time per annum employee to the Organization of Staff Analysts.

ARTICLE VI - PRODUCTIVITY AND PERFORMANCE

Section 1. Performance Compensation

The Union acknowledges the Employer's right to pay additional compensation for outstanding performance.

The Employer agrees to notify the Union of its intent to pay such additional compensation.

ARTICLE VII - UNION ACTIVITY

Section 1.

Paid release time will be granted for labor-management activities (e.g. meetings of Labor-Management Committee, discussion with management of specific grievances, participation in grievance process, representing employees when they are interviewed or investigated, etc.).

Unpaid release time will be granted for union activities. All release time is subject to pre-approval by the Public Advocate's Office or a designee of the Public Advocate's Office subject to the operational needs of the Public Advocate's Office.

Section 2.

The Employer agrees not to discriminate in any way against any Employee for Union activity, but such activity shall not be carried on during working hours or in working areas except as specifically allowed by the provisions of this Agreement.

Section 3.

Individual Employee grievants shall be granted leave with pay for such time as is necessary to testify at hearings.

Leave with pay shall be granted to three Employees who are named grievants in a group grievance, for such time as is necessary for them to testify at their group arbitration hearings.

Section 4.

During the first thirty (30) calendar days from the date of hire, the Employer shall allow the Union to meet with a new employee for a reasonable amount of time during the employee's work time without charge to leave credits, provided that such meeting does not disrupt the operations of the Division or Office in which the employee works. The meeting may happen in person or virtually. Where practicable, this requirement may be satisfied by allowing the Union a reasonable amount of time during a formal employee orientation program to provide membership information to employees.

ARTICLE VIII - GRIEVANCE PROCEDURE

Effective upon the full execution of this collective bargaining agreement, the following grievance procedure shall apply to OSA represented employees:

Section 1. - Definition:

The term "Grievance" shall mean:

- a. A dispute concerning the application or interpretation of the terms of this collective bargaining agreement.
- b. An alleged wrongful disciplinary action taken against a member of the bargaining unit.
- c. A claimed violation, misinterpretation or misapplication of the written rules or regulations, policy or orders of the Employer.

Section 2.

For a grievance brought under Section 1(a) or (c), the following grievance procedure shall apply:

Employees may at any time informally discuss with their supervisors a matter which may become a grievance. If the results of such a discussion are unsatisfactory, the Employees may present the grievance at **Step I**.

Step I

The Employee and/or Union shall present the grievance in the form of a memorandum to the person designated for such purpose by the New York City Office of the Public Advocate not later than 120 days after the date on which the grievance arose. The Employee may also request an appointment to discuss the grievance. The person so designated by the New York City Office of the Public Advocate shall take any steps necessary to a proper disposition of the grievance and shall reply in writing regarding the disposition by the end of the sixth work day following the date of submission.

Step II

An appeal from an unsatisfactory decision at **Step I** shall be presented in writing to the person designated by the New York City Office of the Public Advocate for such purpose. The appeal must be made within six (6) working days of the receipt of the **Step I** decision. A copy of the grievance appeal shall be sent to the person who initially passed upon the grievance. The person designated to receive the appeal at this Step shall meet with the Employee and/or the Union for review of the grievance and shall issue a written reply to the Employee and/or the Union by the end of the tenth work day following the day on which the appeal was filed.

Step III

An appeal from an unsatisfactory decision at Step II may be presented by the Union for expedited arbitration to the Office of Collective Bargaining. Expedited arbitration hearings by the Office of Collective Bargaining will be conducted according to the following procedure:

- (1) The presentation of the case, to the extent possible, shall be made in the narrative form. To the degree that witnesses are necessary, examination will be limited to questions of material fact and cross examination will be similarly limited. Submission of relevant documents, etc., will not be unreasonably limited and may be submitted as a "packet" exhibit.
- (2) The Arbitrator shall not be precluded from attempting to assist the parties in settling a particular case.
- (3) A decision will be issued by the Arbitrator within thirty days. A recitation of the facts presented will not be necessary in the Award, however a brief explanation of the Arbitrator's rationale may be included. Bench decisions may also be issued by the Arbitrator.
- (4) Decisions of the Arbitrator shall not be considered as a precedent for any other case or entered into evidence in any other forum, proceeding or dispute, except for the purposes of enforcing the award.

Section 3.

Any grievance of a general nature affecting a large group of Employees and which concerns the claimed misinterpretation, inequitable application, violation, or failure to comply with the provisions of this Agreement shall be filed at the option of the Union at **Step III** of the grievance procedure, without resort

to previous steps. All other individual grievances in process concerning the same issue shall be consolidated with the "group" grievance.

Section 4.

If a decision satisfactory to the Union at any level of the grievance procedure is not implemented within a reasonable time, the Union may institute a grievance at **Step III** of the grievance procedure.

Section 5.

If the Employer exceeds any time limit prescribed at any step in the grievance procedure, the grievant and/or the Union may invoke the next step of the procedure.

Section 6.

The Employer shall notify the Union in writing of all grievances filed by covered Employees, all grievance hearings and all determinations. The Union shall have the right to have a representative present at any grievance hearing and shall be given 48 hours' notice of all grievance hearings.

Section 7.

Each of the steps in the grievance procedure, as well as time limits prescribed at each step of this grievance procedure, may be waived by mutual agreement of the parties.

Section 8. Grievance Procedure for Disciplinary Matters

For a grievance brought under Section 1(b), the following grievance procedure shall apply:

The General Counsel of the Office of the Public Advocate, or the General Counsel's designee, may discuss complaints or disciplinary problems with an Employee when such discussions are deemed necessary.

- a. After service upon an Employee of written charges of incompetence or misconduct, a meeting with the Employee, and at the Employee's option, a Union representative, shall be held with respect to such charges by a designee of the Human Resources Division, on behalf of the New York City Office of the Public Advocate. The Employee shall be served with written charges at least ten (10) days prior to the conference. Upon service of written charges of incompetence or misconduct upon an Employee, the Employee may be subject to a period of a suspension without pay pending hearing and determination of charges, which shall not exceed thirty (30) days. The Employee and/or the Union shall have the right to examine any witness(es) and to present a defense to the charges. A written decision shall be issued by the designee of the Human Resources Division. Disciplinary action, if any, shall be imposed consistent with the written decision.
- b. The Union or Employee may appeal the decision of the Human Resources Division to the General Counsel of the Office of the Public Advocate. Such appeal shall be made within ten (10) working days of the receipt of the decision. The General Counsel shall review such appeal and shall meet with the employee and the Union for review of the grievance. The General Counsel may rely solely on the evidentiary record presented pursuant to paragraph a. of this section. A decision shall be issued within fifteen (15) working days following the close of the conference.
- c. The Union may appeal the decision of the General Counsel. Such appeal shall be made within ten (10) working days of the receipt of the General Counsel's decision to the Commissioner of Labor Relations. The Union shall submit a copy of the charges and all prior step determinations including the General Counsel's decision with such appeal. The Commissioner of Labor Relations, or the Commissioner's designee, shall conduct a *de novo* hearing, which will include the presentation of witnesses and documentary evidence. The Commissioner of Labor Relations, or the Commissioner's designee, shall issue a written decision within thirty (30) days following the close of the hearing. The decision of the Commissioner of Labor Relations, or the Commissioner's designee, shall be final and binding.

Section 9.

Employees will not have access to the above disciplinary grievance process in Section 8 of this Article for the first twelve (12) months of their employment.

Terminations within 90 days of the start of the term of a newly elected Public Advocate shall not be considered discipline and will not be subject to the Grievance process in this Article.

EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 46

January 13, 2025

DEPUTY MAYORS AND SENIOR LEADERSHIP

By the power vested in me as Mayor of the City of New York, it is hereby ordered:

Section 1. There shall be eight Deputy Mayors. One shall be designated the First Deputy Mayor, one shall be designated the Deputy Mayor for Operations, one shall be designated the Deputy Mayor for Health and Human Services, one shall be designated the Deputy Mayor for Strategic Initiatives, one shall be designated the Deputy Mayor for Public Safety, one shall be designated the Deputy Mayor for Communications, one shall be designated the Deputy Mayor for Administration, who shall also be referred to as Chief of Staff, and one shall be designated the Deputy Mayor for Intergovernmental Affairs. There shall also be a Chief Counsel to the Mayor and City Hall.

§ 2. The First Deputy Mayor shall:

- a. Report directly to the Mayor.
- b. Advise and assist the Mayor regarding all policies, planning and programs related to the government of the City of New York and the exercise of the powers and duties of the Mayor.
- c. Advise and assist the Mayor regarding all policies, planning, and programs designed to promote quality and affordable housing; the economic development or growth of the City, including those relating to the City's overall business climate; the attraction, retention and expansion of domestic and global business enterprises in the City; commercial, industrial and residential development; waterfront development; energy, foreign trade and investment; film, theater and broadcasting; and tourism.
- d. Coordinate the activities and operations of the other Deputy Mayors to promote collaboration, and ensure that policies, operations, and administration of government are consistent and effective.
- e. Supervise and coordinate the Office of Management and Budget, the Office of Policy Planning and Delivery, the Department of Finance, the Office for Economic Opportunity, the Office of Minority and Women-Owned Business Enterprises, the Chief Efficiency Officer, the New York City Housing Authority, the Department of Housing Preservation and Development, the Office of Housing Recovery Operations, the Office to Protect Tenants, the Department of Small Business Services (which includes the Office of Nightlife), the Department of Consumer and Worker Protection, the Department of City Planning, the Department of Cultural Affairs, the Office of Media and Entertainment (which includes NYC Media, and the Office of Film, Theater & Broadcasting), the Landmarks Preservation Commission, the Office of Talent and Workforce Development, the Public Design Commission, and New York City Tourism + Conventions.
- f. Advise and assist the Mayor regarding all policies designed to implement and enhance the fiscal operations, financial and business management practices of the City.
- g. Supervise and coordinate the activities and operations of all administrations, departments, agencies, boards, offices, committees and commissions that do not directly report to the Mayor; another Deputy Mayor, the Chief of Staff, the Chief Counsel to the Mayor and City Hall, the Chief Technology Officer, or another member of the senior staff.
- h. Perform any function, power or duty of the Mayor, in relation to the authorization or execution of deeds and satisfactions, leases, easements, surrenders, restrictive declarations, mortgages and any other grants or acquisitions of estates or interests in real property and licenses, permits or other agreements affecting the use of real property, including authorizations and approvals to be made or given by the Mayor pursuant to sections 384, 824 and 1802 of the Charter and sections 3-119 and 25-805 of the Administrative Code.
- i. Perform any function, power or duty of the Mayor in relation to the authorization or execution of franchises, concessions and revocable consents and other agreements.
- j. Develop, supervise, and coordinate policies and programs relating to personnel and management practices, including authorizations and approvals to be made or given by the Mayor pursuant to section 20 of the Civil Service Law.
- k. Maintain liaison with and review the activities of the Civil Service Commission, the Tax Commission, the Tax Appeals Tribunal,

the Office of Administrative Tax Appeals, the Power Authority of the State of New York, the New York State Public Service Commission, the Port Authority of New York and New Jersey, the Rent Guidelines Board, the Housing Development Corporation, the Board of Standards and Appeals, the Trust for Governors Island, the Brooklyn Navy Yard Development Corporation, cultural and civic organizations (including but not limited to libraries, museums, performing arts, gardens, and zoos), the New York State Department of Economic Development, the New York City Empowerment Zones, the Empire State Development Corporation and its subsidiaries (including the Lower Manhattan Development Corporation) and other governmental and non-governmental agencies and offices with respect to matters of City economic development and programs.

- l. Serve as Chairperson of the Commercial Incentive Boundary Area Commission and the Industrial and Commercial Incentive Board.
- m. Serve on the Board of Trustees of the New York City Public Housing Preservation Trust, in accordance with subdivision 2 of section 628 of the Public Housing Law.
- n. Supervise and coordinate the New York City Economic Development Corporation as provided in the Amended and Restated Contracts between the City and the New York City Economic Development Corporation, and take such actions thereunder as are reserved to the Deputy Mayor.
- o. Perform any function, power or duty of the Mayor in relation to any contracts with or involving the New York City Industrial Development Agency or any other entity created for the purpose of issuing bonds for, or managing, any project relating to any matter described in this section.
- p. Act for and on behalf of the Mayor in the exercise of all functions, powers and duties which the Mayor may have pursuant to the New York State Local Finance Law, the New York State Financial Emergency Act for the City of New York, Article 10 of the Public Authorities Law, the New York City Municipal Water Finance Authority Act, and the New York City Transitional Finance Authority Act, as such laws may from time to time be amended, including, but not limited to, executing for and on behalf of the Mayor any agreement, amendment to such agreement or other document pursuant to such laws.
- q. Execute and deliver, in the name and on behalf of the City, official statements of the City relating to the issuance of the City's obligations.
- r. Perform any function, power or duty which the Mayor has and is authorized to delegate pursuant to sections 217, 219, 329 and 1301(2)(b) of the Charter and section 5-304 of the Administrative Code.
- s. Perform any function, power or duty of the Mayor in negotiating, executing and delivering any and all agreements, instruments and other documents necessary or desirable to effectuate any of the matters referred to in this section or any of the programs, projects and activities of any of the entities referred to in this section or in section 13.
- t. Pursuant to Chapter 68 of the City Charter and the Conflicts of Interest Board Rules, provide agency head approval, as permitted, for a position or conduct otherwise prohibited by Chapter 68; approve the acceptance of invitations to certain events, travel, and other gifts where it is in the City's interest for them to attend or accept such travel or gift; approve volunteering by Mayor's Office staff for not-for-profit organizations having business dealings with the City where it is in the City's interest to do so; and pursuant to Board Rule 1-14, approve designations of not-for-profit organizations for solicitations made by city employees.
- u. Perform the functions of a deputy mayor for economic development or comparable official under any statute, executive order, agreement or document that references such a deputy mayor or official.
- v. Represent the Mayor, when so directed by the Mayor, on any board, committee, commission or corporation of which the Mayor is a member.
- w. Perform such other duties as the Mayor may direct.

§ 3. The First Deputy Mayor hereby is delegated the authority to perform all functions, powers or duties of the Mayor which the Mayor is authorized to delegate in the event that the Mayor is unable to perform such functions, powers or duties for a reason specified in subdivision a of section 10 of the New York City Charter. In the event that the First Deputy Mayor is unable to perform such functions, powers or duties, or in the event that the First Deputy Mayor waives in writing the delegation contained herein, all such functions, powers or duties of the Mayor are hereby delegated to the Deputy Mayor for Health and Human Services.

§ 4. The Deputy Mayor for Operations shall:

- a. Report directly to the First Deputy Mayor.
 - b. Supervise and coordinate the Office of Climate and Environmental Justice, which reports to the Chief Climate Officer, the Department of Environmental Protection, the Department of Sanitation, the Department of Transportation, the Department of Parks and Recreation, the Department of Design and Construction, the School Construction Authority, the Department of Buildings, the Taxi and Limousine Commission, and the Office of Capital Project Development.
 - c. Maintain liaison with and review the activities of the Loft Board, the Sustainability Advisory Board, the Brooklyn Bridge Park Corporation, the Metropolitan Transportation Authority, and the Hudson River Park Trust.
 - d. Perform any function, power or duty of the Mayor, in relation to the authorization or execution of deeds and satisfactions, leases, easements, surrenders, restrictive declarations, mortgages and any other grants or acquisitions of estates or interests in real property and licenses, permits or other agreements affecting the use of real property, including authorizations and approvals to be made or given by the Mayor pursuant to sections 384, 824, and 1802 of the Charter and sections 3-119 and 25-805 of the Administrative Code.
 - e. Perform any function, power or duty of the Mayor in relation to the authorization or execution of franchises, concessions and revocable consents and other agreements.
 - f. Approve and sign applications to secure grant funds, submitted pursuant to provisions of the New York State Environmental Conservation Law or the rules and regulations of the State Department of Environmental Conservation, and sign any other documents as may be necessary to secure such funds.
 - g. Perform any function, power or duty which the Mayor has and is authorized to delegate pursuant to sections 217, 219, 329 and 1301(2)(b) of the New York City Charter, and pursuant to section 5-304 of the Administrative Code.
 - h. Perform any function, power or duty of the Mayor in negotiating, executing and delivering any and all agreements, instruments and other documents necessary or desirable to effectuate any of the matters referred to in this section or any of the programs, projects and activities of any of the entities referred to in this section.
 - i. Pursuant to Chapter 68 of the City Charter and the Conflicts of Interest Board Rules, for any of the entities referred to in this section: provide agency head approval as permitted for a position or conduct otherwise prohibited by Chapter 68; provide agency head approval for the acceptance by Mayor's Office staff of invitations to certain events, travel, and other gifts where it is in the City's interest for them to attend or accept such travel or gift; and provide agency head approval for volunteering by Mayor's Office staff for not-for-profit organizations having business dealings with the City where it is in the City's interest to do so.
 - j. Represent the Mayor when so directed by the Mayor, on any board, committee, commission or corporation of which the Mayor is a member.
 - k. Perform other such duties as the Mayor may direct.
- § 5. The Deputy Mayor for Health and Human Services shall:
- a. Report directly to the First Deputy Mayor.
 - b. Supervise and coordinate the New York City Health and Hospitals Corporation, the Department of Social Services (which includes the Human Resources Administration and the Department of Homeless Services), the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene, the Administration for Children's Services, the Department for the Aging, the Office of the Chief Medical Examiner, the Office of Immigrant Affairs, the Office to End Domestic and Gender-Based Violence, the Department of Veterans' Services, the Office of Community Mental Health, and the Office for People with Disabilities.
 - c. Maintain liaison with and review the activities of the Board of Health and the HIV Health and Human Services Planning Council.
 - d. Succeed to the powers and duties of the "Deputy Mayor – City Administrator of the City" under section 4 of the New York City Health and Hospitals Corporation Act (Chapter 1016 of the Laws of 1969), as amended (McKinney's Unconsolidated Laws section 7384).
 - e. Execute and deliver, in the name and on behalf of the Mayor, a certificate approving any borrowing of funds or pledge of assets or revenues by the New York City Health and Hospitals Corporation which would require the approval of the Mayor pursuant to the "Memorandum of Agreement Between New York City Health and Hospitals Corporation and The City of New York Relating to Operating Expenditures by the Corporation," dated July 1, 1970.

f. Perform any function, power or duty of the Mayor in negotiating, executing and delivering any and all agreements, instruments and other documents necessary or desirable to effectuate any of the matters referred to in this section or any of the programs, projects and activities of any of the entities referred to in this section.

g. Pursuant to Chapter 68 of the City Charter and the Conflicts of Interest Board Rules, for any of the entities referred to in this section: provide agency head approval as permitted for a position or conduct otherwise prohibited by Chapter 68; provide agency head approval for the acceptance by Mayor's Office staff of invitations to certain events, travel, and other gifts where it is in the City's interest for them to attend or accept such travel or gift; and provide agency head approval for volunteering by Mayor's Office staff for not-for-profit organizations having business dealings with the City where it is in the City's interest to do so.

h. Represent the Mayor, when so directed by the Mayor, on any board, committee, commission or corporation of which the Mayor is a member.

i. Perform such other duties as the Mayor may direct.

§ 6. The Deputy Mayor for Strategic Initiatives shall:

a. Report directly to the First Deputy Mayor.

b. Advise and assist the Mayor regarding all policies, planning and programs related to the Mayor's signature initiatives requiring major interagency collaboration.

c. Supervise and coordinate the City University of New York, the Department of Youth and Community Development, the Office of Food Policy, the Center for Innovation through Data Intelligence, the Children's Cabinet, the Mayor's Fund and the City Affiliated Non-Profits, the Office of Childcare and Early Childhood Education, the Office of Nonprofits, and the Office of Racial Equity (also known as the Office of Equity and Racial Justice, and consisting of the Young Men's Initiative, the Commission on Gender Equity, the Unity Project, the Pay Equity Cabinet, the Taskforce on Racial Inclusion & Equity, and NYC Her Future).

d. Maintain liaison with and review the activities of the City University Construction Fund.

e. f. Perform any function, power or duty of the Mayor in negotiating, executing and delivering any and all agreements, instruments and other documents necessary or desirable to effectuate any of the matters referred to in this section or any of the programs, projects and activities of any of the entities referred to in this section.

g. Pursuant to Chapter 68 of the City Charter and the Conflicts of Interest Board Rules, for any of the entities referred to in this section: provide agency head approval as permitted for a position or conduct otherwise prohibited by Chapter 68; provide agency head approval for the acceptance by Mayor's Office staff of invitations to certain events, travel, and other gifts where it is in the City's interest for them to attend or accept such travel or gift; and provide agency head approval for volunteering by Mayor's Office staff for not-for-profit organizations having business dealings with the City where it is in the City's interest to do so.

Supervise and coordinate the Fire Department, the Department of Correction, the Department of Probation, the Office of Municipal Services Assessment, the Office of Criminal Justice (which includes the Office for the Prevention of Hate Crimes, the Office to Prevent Gun Violence, and the Office of Special Enforcement), and the Office of Emergency Management (also known as NYC Emergency Management).

d. Maintain liaison with and review the activities of the Board of Correction.

e. f. Perform any function, power or duty of the Mayor in negotiating, executing and delivering any and all agreements, instruments and other documents necessary or desirable to effectuate any of the matters referred to in this section or any of the programs, projects and activities of any of the entities referred to in this section.

g. Pursuant to Chapter 68 of the City Charter and the Conflicts of Interest Board Rules, for any of the entities referred to in this

section and for the Commissioner of the Police Department: provide agency head approval as permitted for a position or conduct otherwise prohibited by Chapter 68; provide agency head approval for the acceptance by Mayor's Office staff of invitations to certain events, travel, and other gifts where it is in the City's interest for them to attend or accept such travel or gift; and provide agency head approval for volunteering by Mayor's Office staff for not-for-profit organizations having business dealings with the City where it is in the City's interest to do so.

h. Represent the Mayor, when so directed by the Mayor, on any board, committee, commission or corporation of which the Mayor is a member.

i. Perform such other duties as the Mayor may direct.

§ 8. The Deputy Mayor for Communications shall:

a. Report directly to the Mayor.

b. Advise and assist the Mayor and the City of New York regarding communications strategy.

c. Supervise and coordinate the Office of the Press Secretary (which includes the Office of Media and Research Analysis), the Office of the Director of Communications (which includes Speechwriting), the Office of Creative Communications, and the Office of Ethnic and Community Media.

d. Maintain liaison with communications positions (including Deputy Commissioners, Communications Directors, Press Secretaries, Creative Communications, and more) at departments, agencies, boards, offices, committees and commissions that directly report to the Mayor.

e. Perform any function, power or duty of the Mayor in negotiating, executing and delivering any and all agreements, instruments and other documents necessary or desirable to effectuate any of the matters referred to in this section or any of the programs, projects and activities of any of the entities referred to in this section.

f. Supervise and coordinate the Department of Citywide Administrative Services, the Office of International Affairs, the Office of Operations, the Office of Civic Engagement (consisting of the Public Engagement Unit, NYC Service, the Civic Engagement Commission, and the Community Affairs Unit), the Office of Sports, Wellness & Recreation, the Office of Special Projects and Community Events, the Office of Citywide Event Coordination and Management, Gracie Mansion, the Office of Scheduling and Executive Operations, the Office of Advance, the Office of Correspondence, the Office of Asylum Seeker Operations, the Office of Innovation and Emerging Markets, the Office of Appointments and the Office of Administrative Services.

c. Maintain liaison with and review the activities of the Campaign Finance Board, the Board of Elections, and the Panel on Education Policy.

d. Perform any function, power or duty of the Mayor in negotiating, executing and delivering any and all agreements, instruments and other documents necessary or desirable to effectuate any of the matters referred to in this section.

e. Pursuant to Chapter 68 of the City Charter and the Conflicts of Interest Board Rules, provide agency head approval, as permitted, for a position or conduct otherwise prohibited by Chapter 68; approve the acceptance of invitations to certain events, travel, and other gifts where it is in the City's interest for them to attend or accept such travel or gift; approve volunteering by Mayor's Office staff for not-for-profit organizations having business dealings with the City where it is in the City's interest to do so; and pursuant to Board Rule 1-14, approve designations of not-for-profit organizations for solicitations made by city employees.

f. Represent the Mayor, when so directed by the Mayor, on any board, committee, commission or corporation of which the Mayor is a member.

g. Supervise and coordinate the activities and operations of all administrations, departments, agencies, boards, offices, committees and commissions that directly report to the Mayor.

h. Perform such other duties as the Mayor may direct.

§ 10. The Deputy Mayor for Intergovernmental Affairs shall:

a. Report directly to the Mayor.

b. Represent the City and the Mayor in interactions with local, state, and federal government entities.

c. Supervise and coordinate offices of city, state and federal legislative affairs.

d. Perform any function, power or duty of the Mayor in executing registrations and submitting reports required by or pursuant to the New York State Lobbying Act (Legislative Law Article 1-A).

e. Perform any function, power or duty of the Mayor in negotiating, executing and delivering any and all agreements, instruments and other documents necessary or desirable to effectuate any of the matters referred to in this section.

f. Pursuant to Chapter 68 of the City Charter and the Conflicts of Interest Board Rules, for any of the entities referred to in this section: provide agency head approval as permitted for a position or conduct otherwise prohibited by Chapter 68; provide agency head approval for the acceptance by Mayor's Office staff of invitations to certain events, travel, and other gifts where it is in the City's interest for them to attend or accept such travel or gift; and provide agency head approval for volunteering by Mayor's Office staff for not-for-profit organizations having business dealings with the City where it is in the City's interest to do so.

g. Perform such other duties as the Mayor may direct.

§ 11. The Chief Counsel to the Mayor and City Hall shall:

a. Report directly to the Mayor.

b. Supervise and coordinate the Office of Administrative Trials and Hearings (including the Environmental Control Board), the Office of Contract Services, the Office of Labor Relations, the Business Integrity Commission, the Commission on Human Rights, the Department of Records and Information Services, the Office of Risk Management and Compliance, and the Mayor's Advisory Committee on the Judiciary.

c. Maintain liaison with and review the activities of the Conflicts of Interest Board, the Civilian Complaint Review Board, and the Commission to Combat Police Corruption.

d. Perform any function, power or duty of the Mayor in negotiating, executing and delivering any and all agreements, instruments and other documents necessary or desirable to effectuate any of the matters referred to in this section or any of the programs, projects and activities of any of the entities referred to in this section.

e. Pursuant to Chapter 68 of the City Charter and the Conflicts of Interest Board Rules, for any of the entities referred to in this section: provide agency head approval as permitted for a position or conduct otherwise prohibited by Chapter 68; provide agency head approval for the acceptance by Mayor's Office staff of invitations to certain events, travel, and other gifts where it is in the City's interest for them to attend or accept such travel or gift; and provide agency head approval for volunteering by Mayor's Office staff for not-for-profit organizations having business dealings with the City where it is in the City's interest to do so.

f. Represent the Mayor, when so directed by the Mayor, on any board, committee, commission or corporation of which the Mayor is a member.

g. Perform such other duties as the Mayor may direct.

§ 12. The Chancellor, the Police Commissioner, the Commissioner of Investigation, the Corporation Counsel, and the Chief Technology Officer shall report directly to the Mayor.

§ 13. Section 2 of Executive Order 3, dated January 19, 2022, is hereby amended to read as follows: § 2. The head of the Office of Technology and Innovation shall be the Chief Technology Officer of the City of New York, who shall also be known as the Commissioner of Information Technology and Telecommunications and Chief Information Officer where such titles are legally required. The Chief Technology Officer shall be appointed by and shall report to the Mayor.

§ 14. Executive Order 45, dated September 26, 2024 is hereby REVOKED.

§ 15. This Order shall take effect immediately.

EMERGENCY EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 726

January 13, 2025

WHEREAS, on September 2, 2021, the federal monitor in the Nunez use-of-force class action stated that steps must be taken immediately to address the conditions in the New York City jails; and

WHEREAS, on June 14, 2022, the federal court in Nunez approved the Nunez Action Plan, which “represents a way to move forward with concrete measures now to address the ongoing crisis at Rikers Island”; and

WHEREAS, although there has been improvement in excessive staff absenteeism, extraordinarily high rates of attrition due to staff retirements and other departures continue to seriously affect the Department of Correction’s (DOC’s) staffing levels and create a serious risk to DOC’s ability to carry out the safety and security measures required for the maintenance of sanitary conditions; and access to basic services, including showers, meals, visitation, religious services, commissary, and recreation; and

WHEREAS, this Order is given to prioritize compliance with the Nunez Action Plan and to address the effects of DOC’s staffing levels, the conditions at DOC facilities, and health operations; and

WHEREAS, additional reasons for requiring the measures continued in this Order are set forth in Emergency Executive Order No. 140 of 2022, Emergency Executive Order No. 579 of 2024, and Emergency Executive Order 623 of 2024; and

WHEREAS, the state of emergency existing within DOC facilities, first declared in Emergency Executive Order No. 241, dated September 15, 2021, and extended by subsequent orders, remains in effect;

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to the powers vested in me by the laws of the State of New York and the City of New York, including but not limited to the New York Executive Law, the New York City Charter and the Administrative Code of the City of New York, and the common law authority to protect the public in the event of an emergency:

Section 1. I hereby direct that section 1 of Emergency Executive Order No. 723, dated January 8, 2025, is extended for five (5) days.

§ 2. This Emergency Executive Order shall take effect immediately and shall remain in effect for five (5) days unless it is terminated or modified at an earlier date.

EMERGENCY EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 727

January 13, 2025

WHEREAS, it is of utmost importance to protect the health and safety of all persons in the custody of the Department of Correction (“DOC”), and of all officers and persons who work in the City of New York jails and who transport persons in custody to court and other facilities, and the public; and

WHEREAS, over 80 provisions in the various Court Orders entered in Nunez v. City of New York, 11 CV 5845 (SDNY), require DOC to consult with, and seek the approval of, the Nunez Monitor (“Monitor”) prior to implementing or amending policies on issues, including but not limited to, matters relating to security practices, the use of restraints, escorts, emergency lock-ins, de-escalation, confinement management of incarcerated individuals following serious acts of violence and subsequent housing strategies, and DOC may be held in contempt of court and sanctioned if it fails to appropriately consult with and obtain approval from the Monitor regarding policies in these areas; and

WHEREAS, as fully detailed in Emergency Executive Order 579 of 2024, DOC is already experiencing a significant staffing crisis, which poses a serious risk to the health, safety, and security of all people in custody and to DOC personnel; and

WHEREAS, attempting to comply with many of the provisions of Local Law 42 and the new BOC regulations, such as by transporting individuals to court without restraints, would require a massive increase in staff and other resources, which are not available; and

WHEREAS, even if DOC had such additional staffing and resources, that still would not obviate the direct threat to public safety posed by certain provisions of Local Law 42, nor would it obviate the fact that the Monitor has yet to approve implementation of those provisions as required by the Nunez Orders, nor would it obviate the fact that additional time would be needed to safely implement those provisions of Local Law 42 eventually approved by the Monitor, because, as the Monitor has expressly cautioned, the safe implementation of any new requirement or reform in DOC facilities requires planning time to “evaluat[e] the operational impact, update[e] policies and procedures, updat[e] the physical plant, determin[e] the necessary staffing complement, develop[] training materials, and provid[e] training to thousands of staff, all of which must occur before the changes in practice actually go into effect” [11 CV 5845 (SDNY) Dkt No. 758-3 at p. 61]; and

WHEREAS, on July 27, 2024, I issued Emergency Executive Order No. 624, and declared a state of emergency to exist within the correction facilities operated by the DOC, and such declaration remains in effect; and

WHEREAS, additional reasons for requiring the measures continued in this Order are set forth in Emergency Executive Order No. 625, dated July 27, 2024, and Emergency Executive Order 682, dated October 30, 2024; and

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to the powers vested in me by the laws of the State of New York and the City of New York, including but not limited to the New York Executive Law, the New York City Charter and the Administrative Code of the City of New York, and the common law authority to protect the public in the event of an emergency:

Section 1. I hereby direct section 1 of Emergency Executive Order No. 724, dated January 8, 2025 is extended for five (5) days.

§ 2. This Emergency Executive Order shall take effect immediately and shall remain in effect for five (5) days unless it is terminated or modified at an earlier date.
