

#### **Notice of Adoption of Rule**

Pursuant to the authority vested in the Office of Administrative Trials and Hearings (OATH) by Sections 1043 and 1049(4)(g) of the New York City Charter, OATH has amended the table of violations in Title 48 § 7-02(a) of the Rules of the City of New York ("RCNY") to add 56 RCNY § 1-04(c)(5) and 56 RCNY §1-04(i)(4) to the table of violations eligible for Community Service.

This amendment was published as a proposed rule in The City Record on September 10, 2025. A public hearing was held on October 21, 2025. No testimony regarding the amendment was given at the public hearing, and OATH did not receive any written comments from the public.

#### Statement of Basis and Purpose of Rule

OATH has amended the table of violations in 48 RCNY § 7-02(a) to add 56 RCNY § 1-04(c)(5) and 56 RCNY § 1-04(i)(4) to the table of violations eligible for Community Service in lieu of paying a civil monetary penalty if the Respondent admits to a Specified Violation alleged in a summons before a hearing date, or if the Specified Violation is sustained after a hearing.

OATH began offering community service to eligible respondents in June 2017 as part of the Criminal Justice Reform Act ("CJRA"). The New York City Council passed the CJRA to create the opportunity for civil enforcement of low-level, non-violent offenses. This legislation was enacted on June 13, 2016. As part of the CJRA, Local Law 73 of 2016 added new provisions to section 1049 of the City Charter that require OATH Hearing Officers to offer an option to perform community service in lieu of paying a monetary civil penalty for certain specified violations of the Administrative Code of the City of New York and certain violations of rules of the Department of Parks and Recreation.

In August 2025, the Department of Parks and Recreation (DPR) adopted amendments that expand the categories of illegal behavior for which the Department's Enforcement Officers can issue a notice of violation (sometimes called a summons) to protect the natural environments under the jurisdiction of DPR and increase the penalties associated with certain violations.

OATH has added 56 RCNY § 1-04(c)(5) and 56 RCNY §1-04(i)(4) to the violations table, along with the corresponding monetary penalty for the violation of each rule as enumerated in 56 RCNY § 1-07, and the equivalent community service hour requirement. The amendment sets an equivalent community service hour requirement of two (2) hours for a violation of 56 RČNY § 1-04(c)(5) for storing and/or leaving vending property on DPR property and six (6) hours for a violation of 56 RCNY §1-04(i)(4) for abandoning an animal in a DPR property.

OATH's authority for this rule is found in section 1049(4)(g) of the New York City Charter.

New material is underlined. [Deleted material is in brackets.]

Section 1. Subdivision (a) of section 7-02 of chapter 7 of Title 48 of the Rules of the City of New York is amended as follows:

#### § 7-02 Eligibility for Community Service.

(a) Except as provided in subdivision (c), a Respondent who admits the charge on or before a hearing date or is found responsible after a hearing for any Specified Violation can perform Community Service instead of paying a monetary civil penalty. The Specified Violations, monetary civil penalties, and corresponding Community Service hour requirements are found below:

The Conflicts of Interest Board intends to amend Section 1-11 of Title 53 of the Rules of the City of New York to adjust the dollar amount in the definition of "Ownership Interest" (Charter Section 2601(16)) from \$55,000 to \$64,000, to reflect changes in the Consumer Price Index for the metropolitan New York-New Jersey-Pennsylvania region published by the United States Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics.

Where can I find the Conflicts of Interest Board rules? The Conflicts of Interest Board Rules are in title 53 of the Rules of the City of New York.

What rules govern the rulemaking process? The Conflicts of Interest Board must meet the requirements of Section 1043 of the City Charter when creating or changing rules. This notice is made according to the requirements of Section 1043 of the City Charter.

#### Statement of Basis and Purpose

Charter Section 2603(a) requires the Conflicts of Interest Board to adjust for inflation every four years the dollar amount established in the definition of "ownership interest" in Charter Section 2601(16). This amount was established as \$25,000 in Charter Section 2601(16), effective January 1, 1990. The adjustment, which appears in Board Rules Section 1-11, reflects changes in the Consumer Price Index ("CPI") for the metropolitan New York-New Jersey-Pennsylvania region as published by the United States Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics. According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, and as reflected in the chart below, the CPI for the metropolitan area increased from 135.1 in January 1990 to 347.3 in August 2025, reflecting a total increase of 157.1%. Thus, the dollar amount of the ownership interest identified in the Charter should be adjusted to \$64,000, rounded to the nearest \$1,000.
