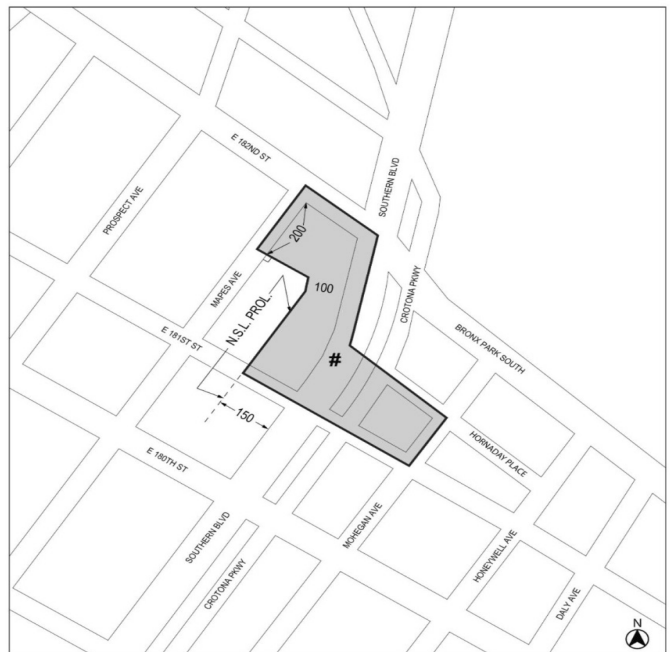

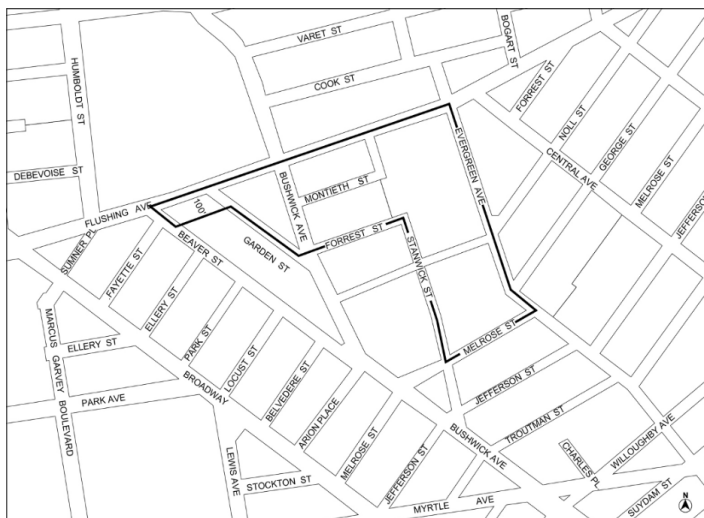

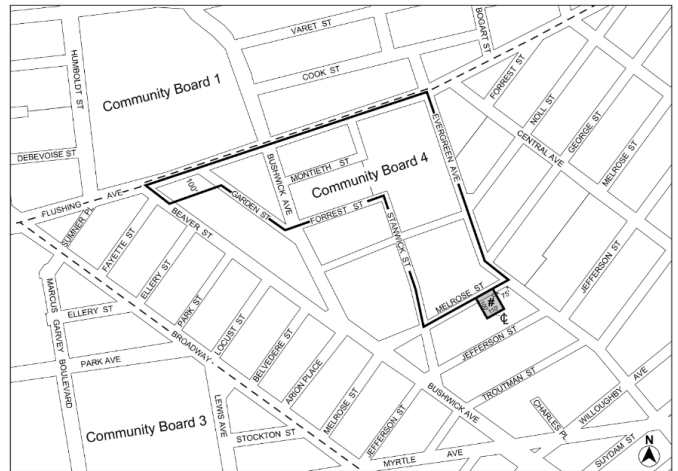

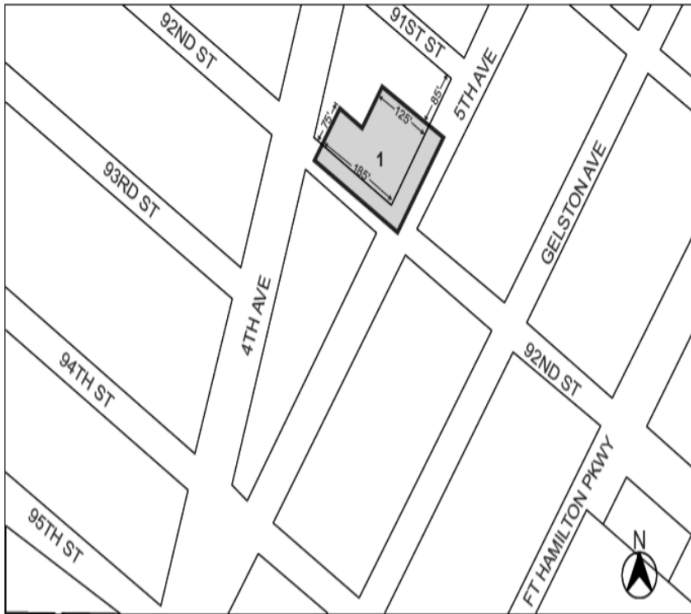

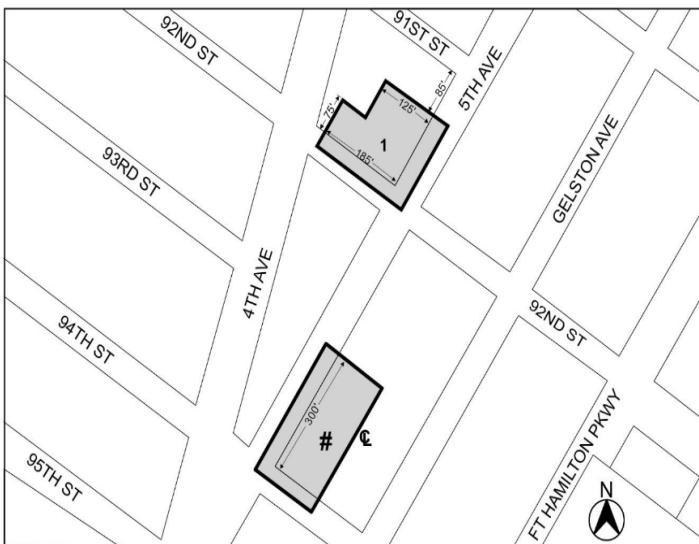

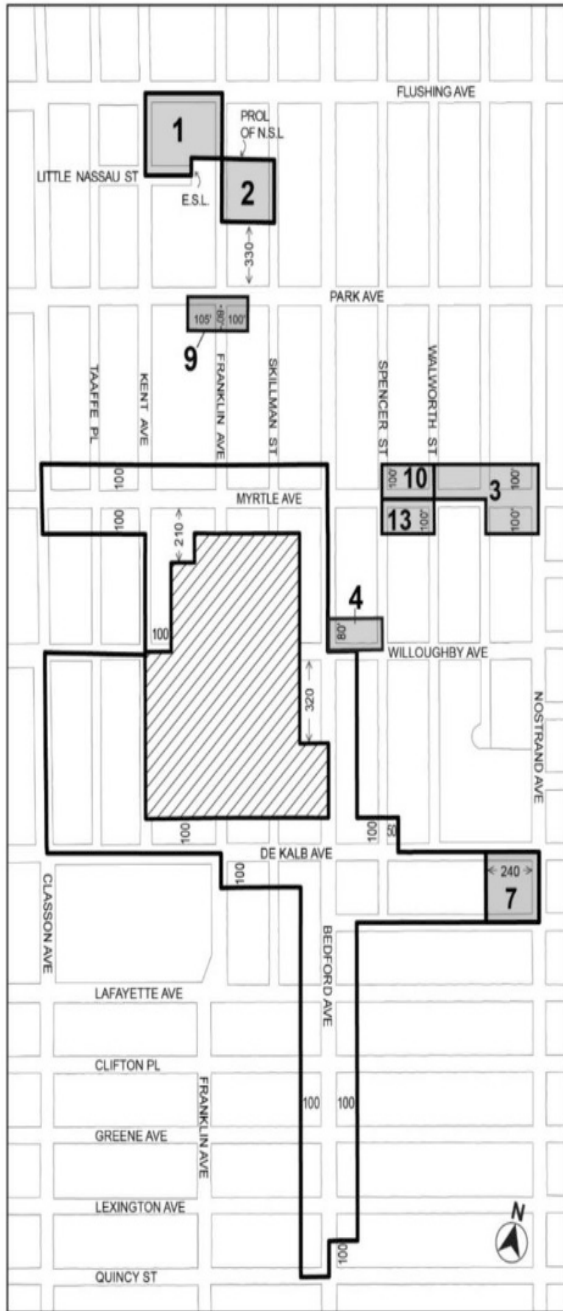

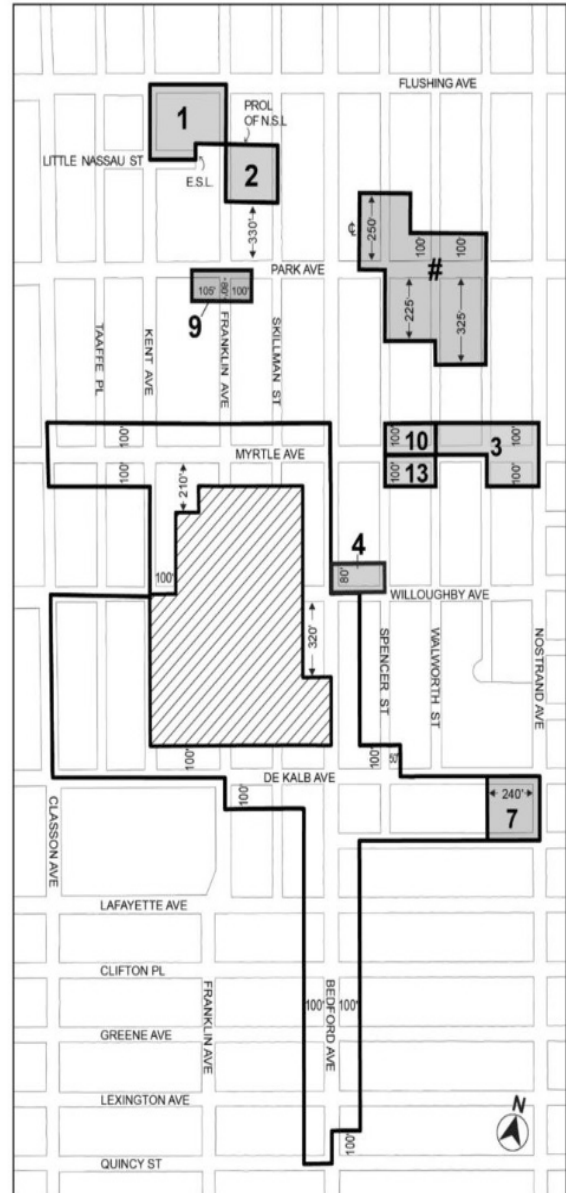

The Proposed Actions would affect Brooklyn Block 1715, Lots 3, 103, and part of (p/o) 54; Block 1716, Lots 1, 2, 59, 60, 61, 66, 70, and p/o 3; Block 1717, Lots 1, p/o 2 and 60; Block 1735, Lots 1, 3, 4, 5, 11, 12, 13, 14, 58, 59, 60, 61 and 62; and Block 1736, Lots 1, 10, 11, 13, 14, 61, 62, 63, 68, and p/o 18, collectively, the "Project Area". 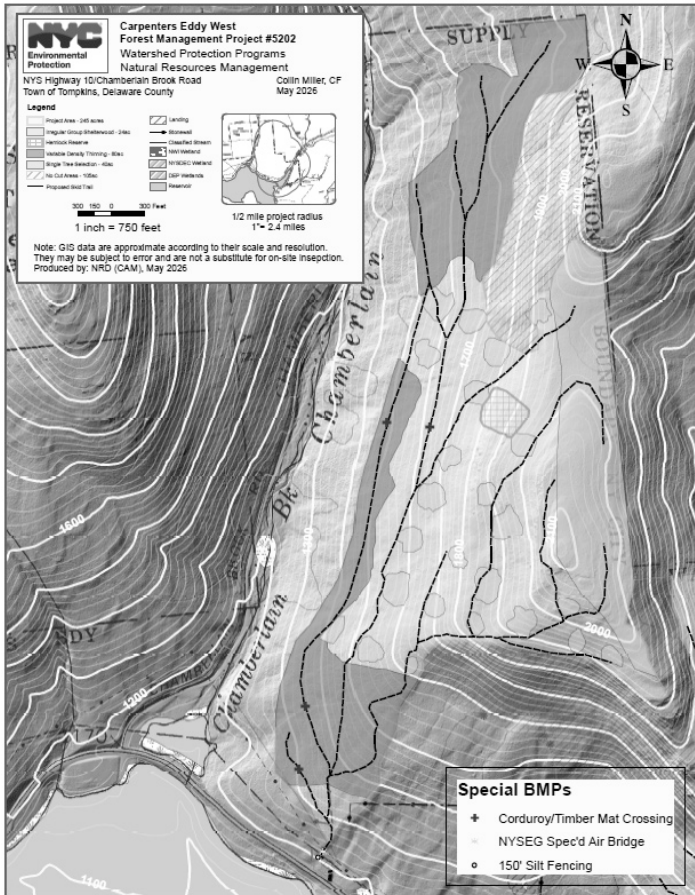

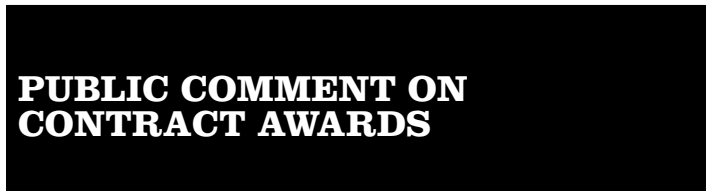
