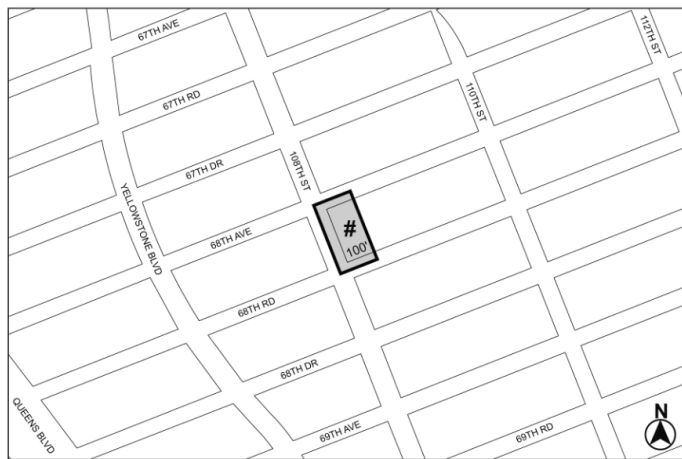

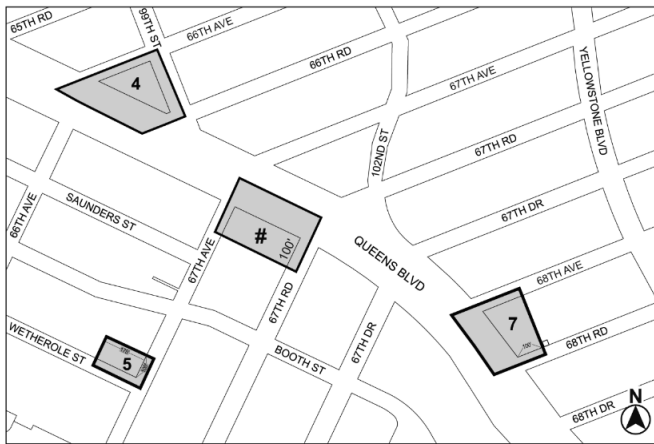

Statement of Basis and Purpose of Proposed Rule

The Department of Buildings (the Department) is proposing to add a new section 101-20 to Title 1 of the Rules of the City of New York to address incomplete inspections. Specifically, the rule would address situations in which an inspector arrives to perform a scheduled electrical, plumbing or construction inspection but the inspection cannot be completed because the permit holder or licensee is not prepared or willing to assist Department inspectors in conducting the inspection, or cannot provide full access to the permitted work.

Incomplete inspections place heavy burdens on the Department's resources as a result of the time spent by the Department personnel that perform the inspections. When an inspection is incomplete, an inspector will be required to return to the same site on another

occasion to complete the inspection. In some cases, inspectors must return to the same site on multiple occasions before the inspection is completed.

For example, between 2021 and May of 2026, there were approximately 44,000 instances in which inspectors arrived to perform electrical inspections but could not complete the inspections because the permit holder or licensee did not attend the scheduled appointment or was not prepared or willing to assist in the inspection or could not provide full access to the work. This costs the City over \$2 million. During that period, a single company accounted for approximately 1,800 of those missed appointments.

In addition, late cancellations cost the Department approximately several thousand dollars in salary and overhead for the inspector and administrative staff who set up appointments, vehicle fuel costs, etc. As the appointments are scheduled in advance and involve coordination with owners, contractors and our staff, if an appointment is cancelled late, the inspector cannot just move on to another appointment and the time scheduled for that appointment is wasted.

Since the Department does not charge fees for performing these inspections, there is currently no mechanism for the Department to recover the cost of these unnecessary, repeat visits. In addition, these repeat visits lead to increased wait times for other applicants.

Proposed section 101-20 would allow the Department to impose a fee of \$200 for each incomplete inspection to recoup the cost incurred by the Department to attend the inspection appointment.

In addition, this rule would provide that an incomplete inspection may not be rescheduled until the associated fee has been paid, and that extended failure to pay such fees or incurrence of repeated incomplete inspections may result in suspension, revocation or denial of an application to renew a license or registration.

The Department's authority for these rules is found in sections 643 and 1043(a) of the City Charter and section 28-116.3 of Title 28 of the New York City Administrative Code.

Asterisks (***) indicate unamended text.

"Shall" and "must" denote mandatory requirements and may be used interchangeably in the rules of this department, unless otherwise specified or unless the context clearly indicates otherwise.

Subchapter A of chapter 100 of Title 1 of the Rules of the City of New York is amended to add a new section 101-20 to read as follows:

§101-20 Incomplete inspections.

(a) Applicability. This section applies to registered design professionals, licensees, general contractors, third-party contractors, owners and filing representatives who request an inspection of an electrical, plumbing or construction installation.

(b) Definitions. For purposes of this section, the following terms have the meanings set forth below:

Full Access. The inspector has unobstructed entry to the completed installation and can reach all relevant components, equipment, and equipment rooms required for completion of the inspection.

Incomplete inspection. A scheduled inspection that must be rescheduled because the permit holder or licensee fails to appear, fails to prepare the site, is unfamiliar with the scope of work, or fails to provide full access, documentation, or conditions necessary for the Department to conduct the inspection.

An incomplete inspection includes, but is not limited to, the following circumstances:

- (1) Failure to keep appointment.** The permit holder or licensee is not present at the inspection site at the scheduled inspection time.
- (2) Incomplete installation.** The installation to be inspected is not sufficiently complete to permit the scheduled inspection to be conducted.
- (3) Inspection declined.** The permit holder or licensee is observed leaving the site prior to, or at the time of, inspection, or is present on-site but refuses or otherwise declines to proceed with the scheduled inspection.
- (4) Late cancellation.** A cancellation request is received by the Department fewer than three (3) business days prior to the scheduled appointment.
- (5) Incomplete access.** The inspector is not given full access.
- (6) Unprepared site.** The inspector cannot complete the inspection for reasons including lack of required safety

measures, absence of necessary documentation, or other specific condition identified by the inspector.

- (7) Unfamiliar with scope of work.** The permit holder or licensee is not sufficiently familiar with the installation to be inspected to answer the inspector's inquiries or otherwise facilitate the inspection.

(c) Fee. The Department will charge a permit holder a fee of two hundred dollars (\$200) for each inspection scheduled by such permit holder that results in an incomplete inspection.

(d) Rescheduling incomplete inspection. The permit holder may not reschedule an incomplete inspection until the fee set forth in subdivision (c) of this section has been paid to the Department.

(e) Disciplinary referral. The Department may, in its sole discretion, refer a licensee or registered design professional who has incurred repeated incomplete inspections or failed to pay a fee imposed pursuant to subdivision (c) of this section within one (1) calendar year of the incomplete inspection to the appropriate units for further enforcement, including suspension, revocation or denial of renewal of a license or registration pursuant to §28-401.19(14) or (16) or §28-104.2.1.2 of the Administrative Code.

(f) Challenge process.

- (1) Challenge.** A challenge to a fee imposed for an incomplete inspection pursuant to this section may be made in accordance with this subdivision within 30 days after the imposition of such fee.

- (2) Acceptable proof.** Each challenge submission must be filed electronically through the Department's website. The submission must include a written statement describing the basis of the appeal and attach all supporting documentation, which may include, but is not limited to, time-stamped photographs, video recordings, inspection scheduling records, site access logs, proof of communication with Department staff, or other relevant documentation demonstrating site readiness, attendance, or extenuating circumstances. Appeals submitted without sufficient supporting evidence may be denied.

(3) Notification of challenge determination.

- (i) The decision to dismiss or uphold the fee is at the sole discretion of the Department.**
- (ii) Upon completion of the review, the Department will issue a notice of determination to the challenger.**
