81-744**Transfer of development rights from listed theaters**

For the purposes of the Theater Subdistrict:

A "listed theater" shall mean a theater designated as listed pursuant to Section 81-742 (Listed theaters).

A "granting site" shall mean either a #zoning lot# or that portion of a #zoning lot# occupied by a "listed theater" and comprised of those block and lot numbers specified for such theater pursuant to the table in Section 81-742, as such block and lots existed on January 12, 1998. Additionally, a "granting site" shall include any #zoning lot# occupied by a "listed theater", where the #floor area# bonus provisions of Section 81-745 (Floor Area Bonus for Rehabilitation of Existing Listed Theaters) have been utilized. However, a "granting site" shall not include any #zoning lot# occupied by a "listed theater" located within the geographical area covered by the 42nd Street Development Land Use Improvement Project, adopted by the New York State Urban Development Project in 1984, as such Project has and may be subsequently amended.

A "receiving site" shall mean a #zoning lot# or the portion of a #zoning lot# located within the Theater Subdistrict to which development rights of the "granting site" are transferred. However, no portion of a "receiving site" shall be located within the 42nd Street Development Project Area. In addition, for #zoning lots# containing "listed theaters," that portion of the #zoning lot# occupied by the "listed theater" and comprised of the block and lot numbers specified for such theater, pursuant to the table in Section 81-742, shall not be included in the "receiving site."

Any "receiving site" divided by a district boundary or Theater Subdistrict Core boundary may locate #bulk# in accordance with the provisions of Section 81-746 (Additional provisions for zoning lots divided by district or subdistrict core boundaries).

(a) **Transfer of development rights by certification**

The City Planning Commission shall allow, by certification, a transfer of development rights from a "granting site" to a "receiving site," except that any "granting site," or portion thereof, located outside the Theater Subdistrict, may not transfer development rights to any portion of a "receiving site" within the Special Clinton District, provided that:

- (1) the maximum amount of #floor area# transferred from a "granting site" is shall be:
 - (i) the sum of:
 - (a) the basic maximum #floor area ratio# established pursuant to Sections 81-211 (Maximum floor area ratio for non-residential or mixed buildings) or 81-214 (Special provisions for transfer of development rights from listed theaters within the Special Clinton District), as applicable, for such "granting site" as if it were undeveloped; and
 - (b) any bonus #floor area# granted pursuant to Section 81-745;
 - (ii) less the total #floor area# of all existing #buildings# or portions of #buildings# on the "granting site" and #floor area# attributed to the "granting site" that has been previously used or transferred;
- (2) each transfer, once completed, irrevocably reduces the amount of #floor area# that may be #developed# or #enlarged# on the #zoning lot# containing the "granting site" by the amount of #floor area# transferred;
- (3) the maximum amount of #floor area# transferred to a "receiving site" shall not exceed the basic maximum #floor area ratio# established pursuant to Section 81-211 for such "receiving site" by more than 20 percent;
- (4) the provisions of Section 81-743 (Required assurances for continuance of legitimate theater use) are met; and
- (5) appropriate legal documents are executed ensuring that a contribution in an amount equal to 10 dollars* per square foot of transferred #floor area# be deposited in the Theater Subdistrict Fund established pursuant to paragraph (h) of Section 81-741 (General provisions) at the earlier of either the time of closing on the transfer of development rights pursuant to this Section or the filing for any building permit for any #development# or #enlargement# that anticipates using such development rights.

The Commission shall review such amount no more than once every three years and no less than once every five years and shall adjust the amount to reflect any change in assessed value of all properties on #zoning lots# wholly within the Theater Subdistrict.

81-745**Floor area bonus for rehabilitation of existing listed theaters**

The City Planning Commission may allow, by special permit, may authorize bonus #floor area# for substantial rehabilitation or restoration of any theater listed as a "listed theater" in Section 81-742 (Listed theaters), in accordance with the provisions of this Section.

(a) **Conditions for rehabilitation bonus**

As a condition for the issuance of a special permit under the provisions of this Section, the following requirements shall be satisfied:

(1) **Location of #development#**

The #development# or #enlargement# for which a theater rehabilitation bonus is granted is located on the same #zoning lot# as the "listed theater."

(2)(1) **Qualification of substantial rehabilitation**

Substantial rehabilitation work qualifying for a #floor area# bonus shall consist of major structural changes for the purpose of improving a theater's design and its commercial viability for legitimate theater #use#, or historic restoration of the interior of a theater designated as an interior landmark.

Substantial rehabilitation may include, without limitations, such work as expanding stage wings, re-raking the orchestra, increasing rehearsal, dressing room or lobby and ancillary spaces, improving accessibility beyond applicable legal requirements, or historic restoration. It may also include reconversion to legitimate theater #use# of an original legitimate theater currently in other #use#. Substantial rehabilitation does not mean normal theater maintenance, painting or improvements to mechanical systems alone.

(3)(2) **Timing and commitment**

- (i) there shall be a contractual commitment or commitments for the construction work involved in the substantial rehabilitation;
- (i) for any bonus #floor area# approved by special permit pursuant to this Section, an appropriate legal document shall be executed and recorded against the #zoning lot#, providing that:
 - (a) no temporary certificate of occupancy shall be granted by the Department of Buildings for the portion of the building identified as utilizing the bonus #floor area# granted pursuant to this Section until the Chairperson has certified that the substantial rehabilitation work qualifying for the #floor area# bonus is substantially complete; and
 - (b) no permanent certificate of occupancy shall be granted by the Department of Buildings for the portion of the building utilizing such bonus #floor area# until the Chairperson has certified that the substantial rehabilitation work qualifying for the #floor area# bonus is finally complete;
- (ii) the requirements of Section 81-743 (Required assurances for continuance of legitimate theater use) shall be satisfied; and
- (iii) a rehabilitation bonus shall not be granted for a substantial rehabilitation completed before May 13, 1982.

(b) **Amount of rehabilitation bonus**

The amount of bonus #floor area# granted for a qualifying theater rehabilitation shall be at the discretion of the Commission after consideration of the following findings:

- (1) how and to what extent the proposed rehabilitation will improve the theater's suitability for #use# as a legitimate theater; and

- (2) how the proposed rehabilitation will contribute toward satisfying the needs of the Theater Subdistrict;
- (3) whether the bonus #floor area# will unduly increase the #bulk# of any #development# or #enlargement#, density of population or intensity of #use# on any #block# to the detriment of occupants of #buildings# on the #block# or the surrounding area; and
- (4) whether the distribution and location of such #floor area# bonus will adversely affect the surrounding area by restricting light and air or otherwise impair the essential character or future development of the surrounding area.

Such bonus #floor area# shall not exceed 20 percent of the basic maximum #floor area# permitted on the #zoning lot# containing the #development# or #enlargement# "listed theater" by the regulations of the underlying district, except that in the case of an underlying C6-4, C6-5 or M1-6 District, the bonus #floor area# shall not exceed 44 percent of the basic maximum #floor area# permitted in such underlying district, and except that in the case of a #zoning lot# located partially in a C6-5.5 District and partially in a C6-7T District, the Commission may allow bonus #floor area# to be utilized anywhere on the #zoning lot#.

For purposes of applying the provisions of Section 11-42 (Lapse of Authorization or Special Permit by the City Planning Commission Pursuant to the 1961 Zoning Resolution) to a special permit granted pursuant to this Section, "substantial construction" shall mean substantial rehabilitation, as described in paragraph (b) of this Section, of the subject theater for which a #floor area# bonus has been granted to a related #development# or #enlargement#.

The Commission may prescribe appropriate conditions and safeguards to minimize adverse effects on the character of the surrounding areas.

Future Subdivision of Certain Plan Review Sites

For any #plan review site# that does not comply with Section 107-08 (Future Subdivision of Certain Plan Review Sites), the City Planning Commission may authorize a future subdivision into two or more #zoning lots#, provided that the Commission finds that:

- (a) to the greatest extent possible, all individual trees of six-inch #caliper# or more, the existing topography, and all land located within a #designated open space#, are preserved under future #development# options within an #area of no disturbance#;
- (b) such subdivision complies with the goals described in paragraph (c) of Section 107-00 (GENERAL PURPOSES); and
- (c) where vehicular access and egress are located on an #arterial#, the location of such vehicular access and egress permits better site planning.

Any subdivision that is proposed to take place within the Special District after November 2, 2023, shall be filed with the City Planning Commission. A site plan and An #area plan# shall indicate the distribution of #bulk# for the individual #zoning lots# submitted to the Commission. Such approved subdivision shall then be recorded in the land records and indexed against all #zoning lots#.

For the purpose of applying the provisions of this Section, a subdivision includes reconfiguration of a #zoning lot# in a manner that would change its area or any dimension of such #zoning lot#.

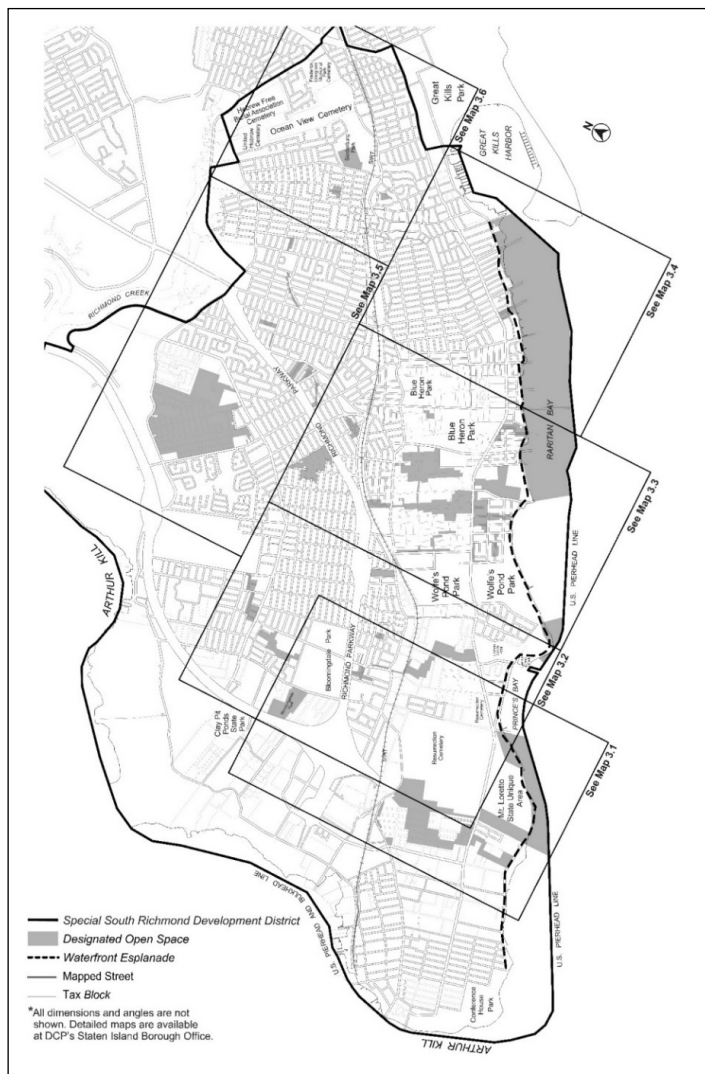

Special South Richmond Development District Plan

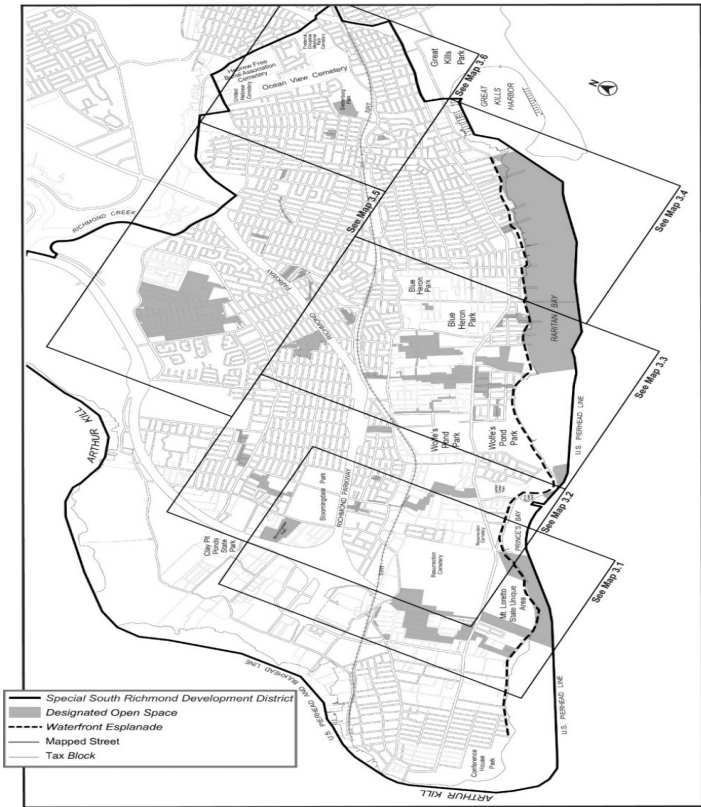
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Map 3 — Open Space Network

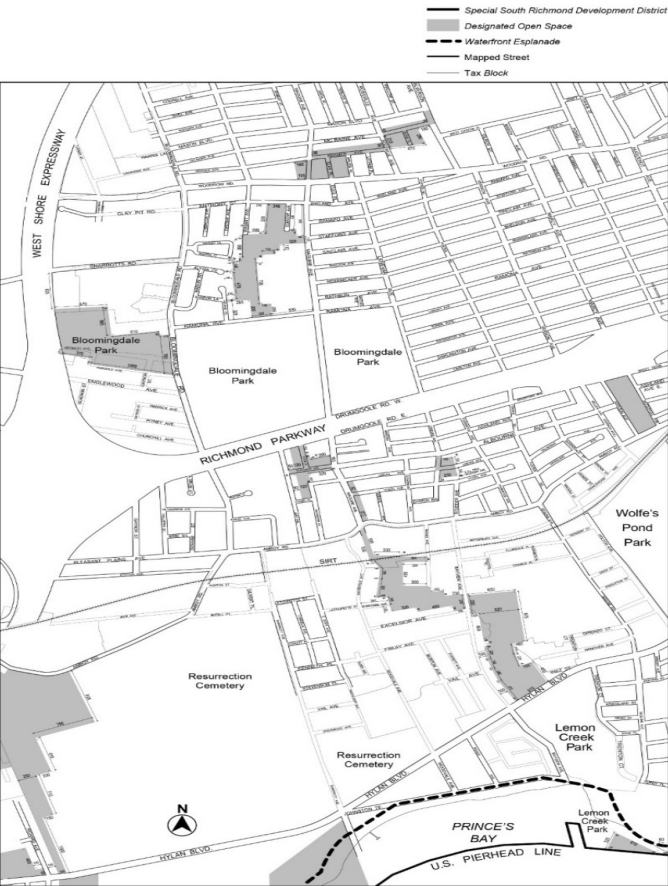

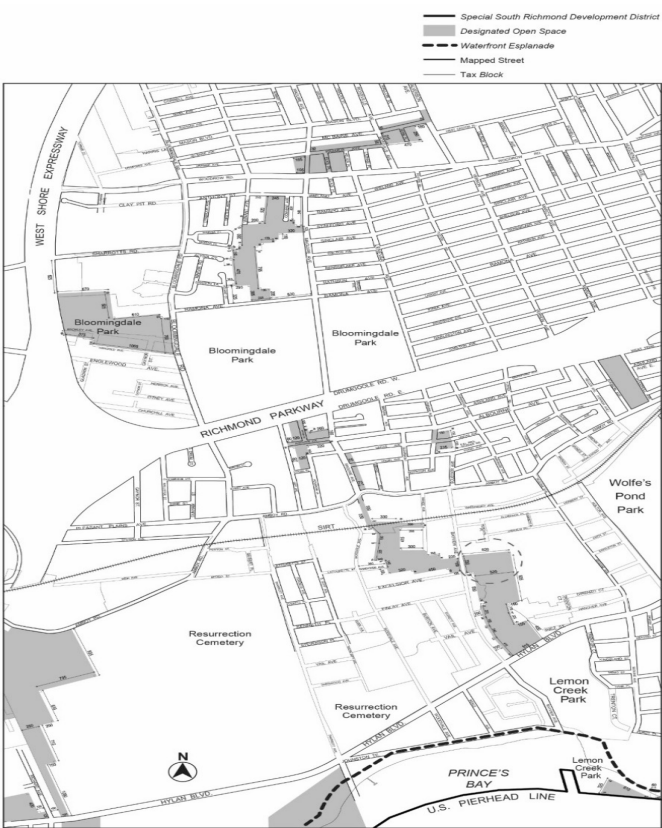


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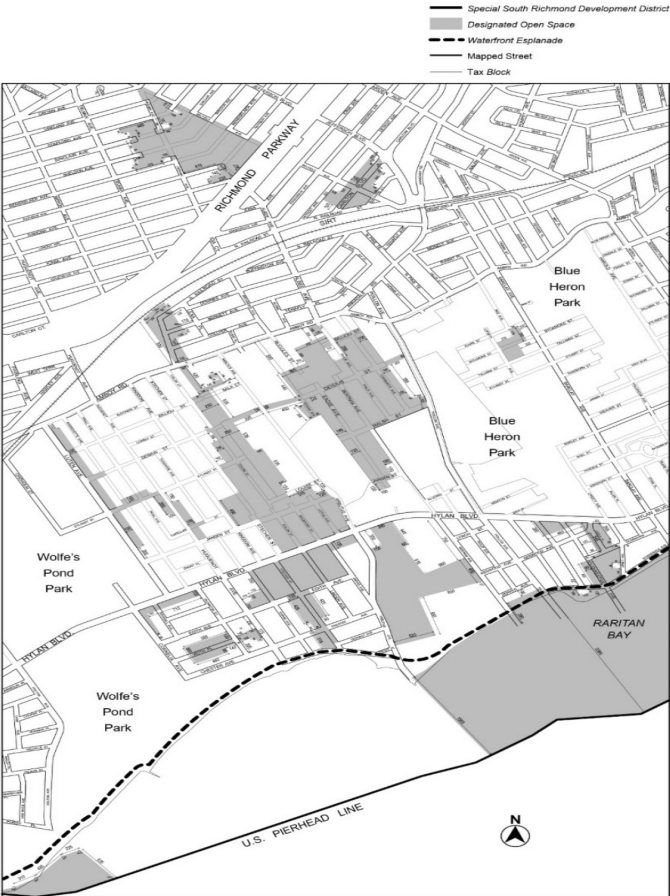
Map 3.2 — Open Space Network

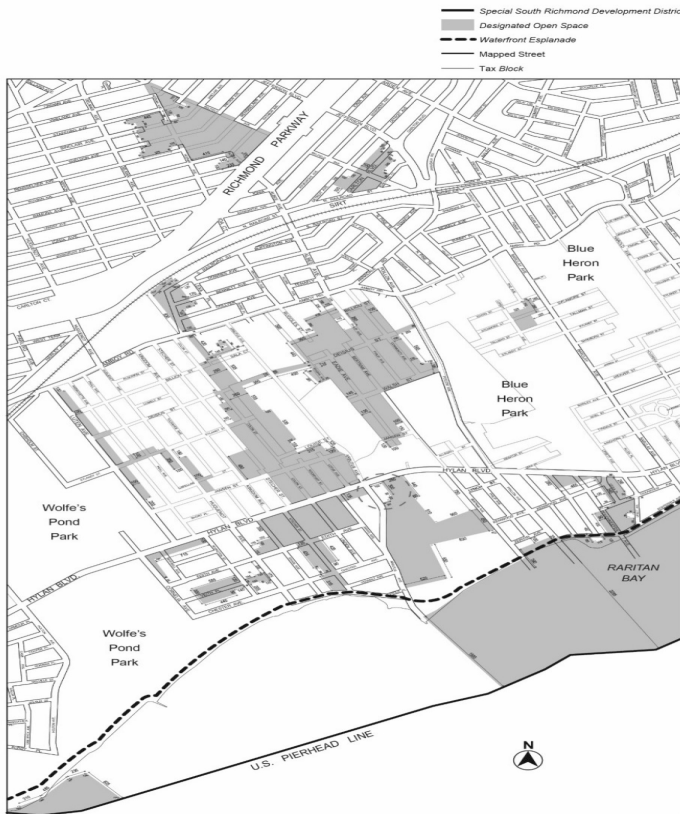


Map 3.3 — Open Space Network

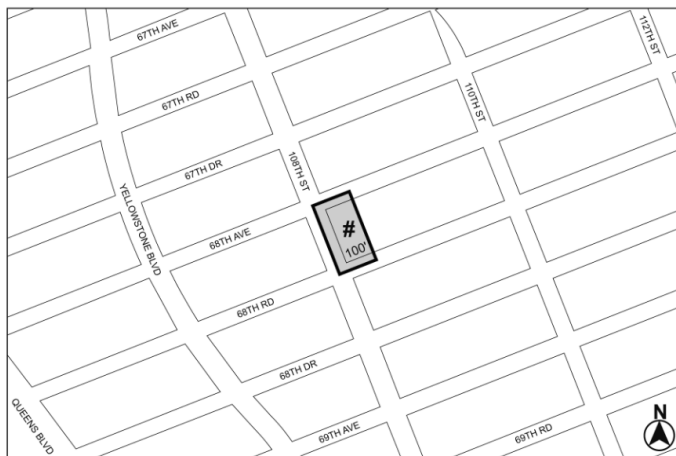

What authorizes the Department to make this amendment?

Section 389(b) of the New York City Charter provides that "heads of mayoral agencies shall have the power to adopt rules to carry out the powers and duties delegated to the agency head or the agency by or pursuant to federal, state or local law." Charter section 1043(a) authorizes each agency to "adopt rules necessary to carry out the powers and duties delegated to it by or pursuant to federal, state or local law." Local Law 8 of 2026 requires DOHMH to promulgate rules for determining whether a building has passed or failed an inspection for rats.

Where can I find the NYC Health Department's rules? The rules of the Department are in Title 24 of the RCNY.

What laws govern the rulemaking process? The Department must meet the requirements of section 1043 of the Charter when creating or changing rules. This notice is made according to the requirements of section 1043(b) of the Charter.

Statement of Basis and Purpose

Local Law 8 of 2026 ("Local Law 8") amended the Administrative Code of the City of New York by adding a new section 17-133.4 related to building inspections and reporting following complaints related to rats and conditions that attract rats. Local Law 8 requires the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene (the "Department") to make its best effort to inspect a building for signs of rat activity or conditions that attract rats within 14 days of receipt of a complaint or service request submitted to the Department through the 311 customer service center or other means.

The Department must record certain information during each inspection, including whether the building has passed or failed the inspection, as determined by the Department. The proposed rule would clarify how the Department determines whether a building passes or fails an inspection for rats, and specify the abatement measures the person in control of such building must take.

The proposed rule is as follows.

"Shall" and "must" denote mandatory requirements and may be used interchangeably in the rules of this Department, unless otherwise specified or unless the context clearly indicates otherwise.

New material is underlined.

Section 1. Title 24 of the Rules of the City of New York is amended by adding a new chapter 41 to read as follows:

Chapter 41: Inspections for Rats

§ 41-01 Scope and applicability.

This Chapter applies to inspections of properties for rats and conditions conducive to rats pursuant to New York City Health Code Article 151 and New York City Administrative Code Section 17-133.4.

§ 41-02 Definitions.

When used in this Chapter, the following terms have the following

meanings:

"Compliance inspection" means an inspection conducted on private property after a property fails its initial inspection and receives a Commissioner's Order to Abate.

"Department" means the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene.

"Health Code" means the New York City Health Code.

"Person in control" means the owner, part owner, managing agent or occupant of premises or property, or any other person who has the use or custody of the same or any part thereof.

§ 41-03 Property inspections for rats and conditions conducive to rat activity.

(a) When the Department inspects properties for rats pursuant to its authority under Health Code Article 151, if the Department observes in interior or exterior areas any active signs of rats or conditions conducive to rats, such observation shall be prima facie evidence of a violation.

- Active signs of rats may include but are not limited to: tracks, fresh droppings, burrows, active runs, fresh gnawing, and live rats seen.
- Conditions conducive to rats may include but are not limited to: the presence of dense weeds or other vegetation that are serving as sources of shelter or harborage for rats; accumulation of refuse that may feed and attract rats and other material in or on which rats may find shelter, hide or nest; the presence of cracks, gaps or holes in building exteriors or interiors that enable the free movement of rats; the presence of food or water accessible to, and capable of, sustaining a rat population; and unsanitary conditions that attract rats.

(b) If a violation is found, the person in control of a property subject to Health Code Section 151.02 must take such measures as may be necessary to prevent and control the harborage and free movement of rats, which may include, but are not limited to, inspecting for active signs of rats and conditions conducive to rats; cleaning up droppings and urine, sanitizing, and washing away rub marks; storing all garbage in hard plastic or metal containers with a tight-fitting lid; removing clutter and debris from yards, basements, and landscaping; repairing holes and cracks and pest-proofing doors, windows, vents, and drains; and hiring a pest professional licensed by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation to inspect and treat for rats. However, the taking of any or all of such measures shall not be deemed a sufficient defense to a violation if the Department has observed any active sign of rats at the time of a compliance inspection.
