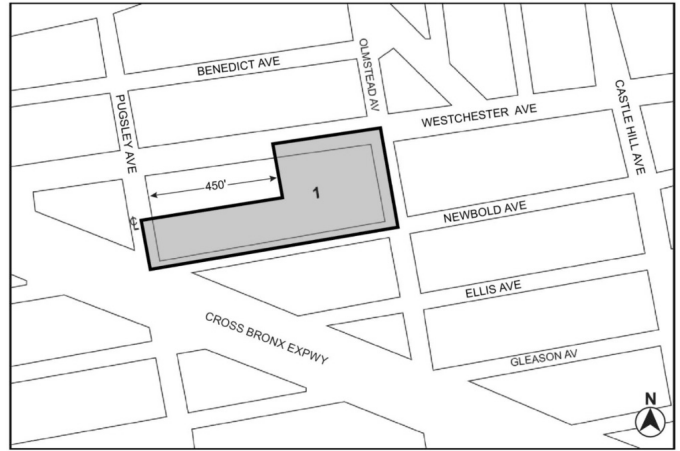

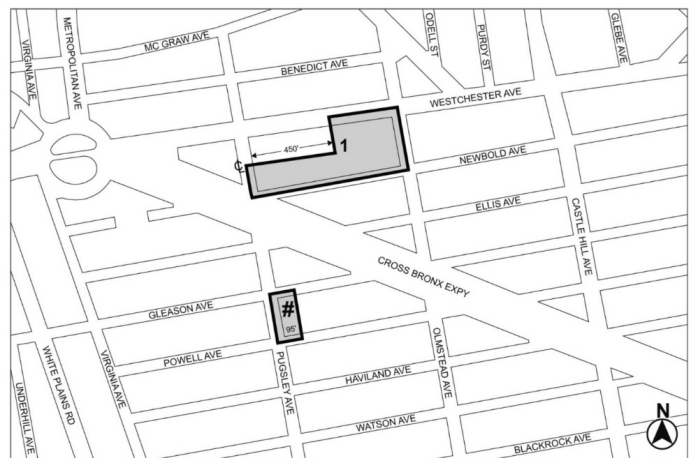

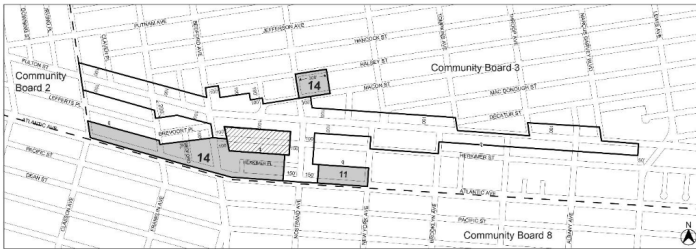

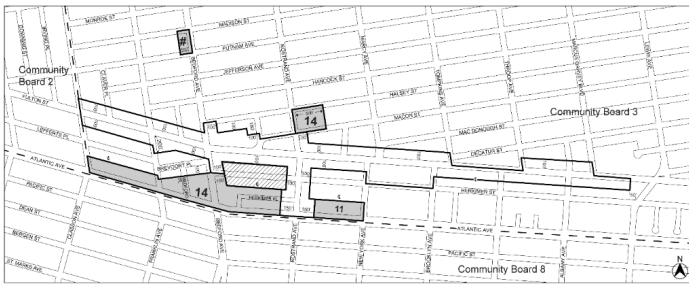

CAPA REGULATORY AGENDA FY 2027

Pursuant to section 1042 of the Charter, the New York Department of Sanitation (DSNY) sets forth below its regulatory agenda for the City’s fiscal year of 2027:

the New York City Charter and sections 24-204, 24-219, and 24-221 of the Administrative Code of the City of New York, the Department of Environmental Protection is adopting amendments to the Noise Code Penalty Schedule, codified in Chapter 47 of Title 15 of the Rules of the City of New York (RCNY), to conform to changes made to Chapter 28 of Title 15 of the Rules of the City of New York, related to the performance of noise monitoring at certain construction sites. The required public hearing was held on April 3, 2026. DEP received no comments regarding the adoption of this rule amendment.

Statement of Basis and Purpose of Rules

On December 22, 2025, DEP published a final rule in the City Record adding new provisions to Chapter 28 of Title 15 of the Rules of the City of New York, which will require noise monitoring devices be employed at specified construction sites. The rule became effective on April 21, 2026.

Among these new provisions are section 28-101(o), which specifies when and where noise monitoring devices must be used, and section 28-101(p), which sets forth the requirements for the installation and maintenance of the required devices.

In light of these changes, DEP is amending the Noise Code Penalty Schedule (15 RCNY Chapter 47) to add penalties for violation of sections 28-101(o) and 28-101(p) of Chapter 28 of Title 15 of the Rules of the City of New York, so that such sections can be enforced.

The penalties for violations of section 28-101(o) of the Rules of the City of New York reflect the existing penalties for violations of section 24-228 of the Administrative Code of the City of New York, which prohibits unreasonable noise from construction devices. The penalties for violations of section 28-101(p) reflect the existing penalties for less serious charges under Chapter 28 of the Rules of the City of New York.

These penalties escalate from \$560 for a first offense to \$1,680 for a third offense for failure to use a noise monitoring device, and from \$220 for a first offense to \$660 for a third offense for failure to install or maintain a noise monitoring device as specified.

The text of the Rule follows.

Section 1. The table set forth in section 47-02 of Chapter 47 of Title 15 of the Rules of the City of New York is amended by adding two new entries, immediately following the entry for section 28-101(m), to read as follows:

1. **SUBJECT:** Rule relating to the removal, storage and disposal of encumbrances.
 - A. **Reason:** DSNY is proposing to amend its rule relating to the removal, storage and disposal of encumbrances to clarify its procedures.
 - B. **Anticipated Content:** To clarify procedures relating to the removal, storage or disposal of encumbrances.
 - C. **Objectives:** Modification of such rule will simplify the procedures relating to the removal, storage and disposal of encumbrances.

- D. Legal basis: Section 1-05 of Title 16 of the Rules of the City of New York, Section 16-128 of the Administrative Code of the City of New York, and Sections 753(a) and 1043 of the New York City Charter.

2. SUBJECT: Rules governing requirements relating to the provision of waste collection service by certain private hauling companies to business establishments within Commercial Waste Zones.

- A. Reason: In November 2019 comprehensive waste reform legislation to reform the private carting industry in New York City was signed into law. Local Law 199 of 2019 authorizes DSNY to create a commercial waste zone system in New York City for the collection and removal of solid waste and recyclable materials generated by businesses in such newly-created waste collection zones throughout the City. DSNY may promulgate new rules that are consistent with the local law as may be necessary.
- B. Anticipated Content: Pursuant to Local Law 199, DSNY may promulgate rules under Title 16 of the Rules of the City of New York to carry out the mandates of Local Law 199, including rules governing customer service for commercial establishments, operational requirements for private carting companies, health and safety protective measures for private carting employees, and recycling and organics requirements, following its creation of 20 designated commercial waste zones across New York City in the first half of 2020.
- C. Objectives: DSNY may promulgate rules governing private carter and business customer practices consistent with the implementation plan for comprehensive reform of the commercial waste industry. The rules will improve and enhance the City's regulatory practices pertaining to commercial waste collection, transport and disposal in the City.
- D. Legal basis: Title 16 of the Rules of the City of New York; and Section 1043 of the New York City Charter.
- E. Types of individuals and entities likely to be affected: Private waste hauling carters and generators of commercial waste who receive private carting collection service.
- F. Other relevant laws: None.

1. **SUBJECT**: Cyclist Permission to Deviate from Some Traffic Control Devices
 - A. Anticipated contents: Amend section 4-12(p) allowing cyclists to:
 - Follow Pedestrian Control Signals when crossing an intersection, except where otherwise indicated by traffic control devices, and provided that the cyclist yields to pedestrians in the crosswalk.
 - Turn on Red Signal: Cyclist must stop and yield to pedestrians and, if merging into a travel lane, yield to oncoming traffic on the intersecting street turning onto an intersecting street during a steady red light. Under this proposed rule, a cyclist may not turn across opposing lanes of traffic.
 - Proceed through red signal/stop signs at "Top of the T": Cyclist must stop and yield to pedestrians before being allowed to proceed through red signal indication or Stop sign at "top of the T" locations.
 - B. Reason: Enhance safety for cyclists.
 - C. Objectives: To formalize existing behavior after successful 2018 pilot indicating that these "permissions" do not increase the number of crashes. To provide consistency between the NYC Administrative Code and the Traffic Rules.
 - D. Legal basis: Section 2903(a) of the New York City Charter.
 - E. Other relevant laws: Section 19-195.1 of the NYC Administrative Code (Local Law 154 of 2019), New York Vehicle & Traffic Law Section 1111.
 - F. Types of individuals and entities likely to be affected: Cyclists, drivers, and the general public.
 - G. Approximate schedule: Second Quarter of FY 2027.

2. **SUBJECT**: Updates to Newsrack Rules
 - A. Anticipated contents: Amend the Highway Rules to update newsrack dimensions, construction materials, location, and placement standards; update penalty schedule.
 - B. Reason: Newsrack rules have not been updated since 2016 and do not align with Local Law and current department practices.

3. **SUBJECT**: Adopt-A-Planting

However, these contracts are at capacity, which prevents increasing the number of planted areas within the right-of-way. Sponsors and volunteers who participate in this proposed program would offset the cost associated with the maintenance of existing planted areas and allow DOT to utilize its limited maintenance resources where most needed. This proposed rule would allow for the beautification of new areas in the right-of-way, assist in storm water management, and enhance the quality of life for local residents and businesses nearby.
 - C. Objectives: Create Adopt-A-Planting program requirements including application process and maintenance obligations and define areas eligible for adoption.
 - D. Legal basis: Section 2903(a) of the New York City Charter.
 - E. Other relevant laws: None.
 - F. Types of individuals and entities likely to be affected: General public (volunteers), businesses (sponsors), and landscape maintenance contractors (providers).

Notice of Pedicab Registration Plate Lottery

Pursuant to Section 20-251 of the New York City Administrative Code and Section 2-426a of Title 6 of the Rules of the City of New York, the Department of Consumer and Worker Protection (DCWP) has conducted an annual review of pedicab registrations and found that the number of registration plates issued has fallen below 840. As set forth below, DCWP will begin accepting applications for pedicab registration plates to fill any vacancies up to the legal limit of 850.

Online Lottery Application Period:

DCWP will accept applications for pedicab registration plates for 20 business days following the date of publication of this Notice, which makes the Application Period May 1, 2026 to June 1, 2026.

DCWP will not consider applications submitted after the Application Period.

Lottery Application Submission Guidelines:

- Visit nyc.gov/BusinessToolbox to access, complete, and submit the application.
- All completed applications must be received by 5:00 P.M. on June 1, 2026.
- DCWP will accept only one application from each applicant.
- You can submit the application even if you are not a currently licensed Pedicab Business, but **you must obtain a valid Pedicab Business license before DCWP will issue a registration plate.**
- DCWP will not accept applications from any licensees that have been assigned the legal limit of 30 registration plates already.

Selection Process:

- At the close of the Application Period, DCWP will assign each accepted application a "Priority Number" using a computer-generated random number selection program.
 - If there are more applicants than available registration plates, DCWP will make offers to applicants in order of Priority Number.
 - If there are more available registration plates than applications, DCWP will offer each applicant one plate, with the possibility of applying for more than one plate.
- DCWP will notify all eligible applicants of the opportunity to apply for a registration plate. Within 45 days of receiving that notice, an applicant must prove that its pedicab complies with all New York City laws and rules governing pedicab registration, including passing a pedicab inspection.
- If an applicant fails to comply with all of the registration requirements within the allotted time, DCWP's offer to that applicant will become void, DCWP will remove the applicant from the application pool, and DCWP will offer the opportunity to the applicant with the next Priority Number.

5. has continued or can be expected to continue indefinitely; and
6. constitutes a substantial handicap to such person's ability to function normally in society.

Individuals enrolled in New York State (NYS) Office for People with Developmental Disabilities (OPWDD) services are ineligible for the services provided through the contracts that would result from this RFP. However, they may utilize the proposed services while awaiting enrollment in OPWDD.

EXECUTIVE ORDER No. 16

April 24, 2026

MAYOR'S OFFICE OF DEED THEFT PREVENTION

WHEREAS, New Yorkers deserve to be protected and safe in their homes, which can be achieved through robust prevention of and protection against predatory deed theft; and

WHEREAS, deed fraud and deed theft occurs when someone records fraudulent deeds, mortgages, or other liens against a property without the owner's knowledge or consent; and

WHEREAS, criminals have targeted homeowners across the City, using fraud, coercion, and deception to steal homes from families who have lived in New York City for decades; and

WHEREAS, since 2014, there have been thousands of complaints of deed theft in New York City, concentrated primarily in Brooklyn and Queens, demonstrating the persistent and systemic nature of this problem; and

WHEREAS, scammers have routinely targeted vulnerable homeowners, particularly seniors and immigrants in historically Black neighborhoods, threatening their housing stability, generational wealth, and community cohesion; and

WHEREAS, despite changes to state law, homeowners remain vulnerable and deed theft continues to undermine public confidence in property systems and municipal oversight; and

WHEREAS, a coordinated, Citywide response is necessary to prevent deed theft, ensure quick intervention where fraud is suspected, support victims, and protect generational wealth for New Yorkers while expanding pathways to secure homeownership;

NOW, THEREFORE, by the power vested in me as Mayor of the City of New York, it is hereby ordered:

Section 1. Mayor's Office of Deed Theft Prevention. There is hereby established a Mayor's Office of Deed Theft Prevention ("the Office") within the New York City Department of Finance ("DOF"). The Office shall be headed by a director ("the Director") to be appointed by the Mayor and who shall report to the Commissioner of Finance.

§ 2. Powers and Duties. The Director shall, in coordination with the Commissioner of Finance, have the power and duty to:

- a. Develop a whole-of-government approach to coordinate efforts to prevent, detect, investigate, and respond to deed theft across City agencies, and to facilitate collaboration with New York State partner agencies, as appropriate, including but not limited to DOF, the New York City Sheriff's Office, the New York City Commission on Human Rights, the New York City Department of Consumer and Worker Protections, the New York City Department of Housing Preservation and Development, the New York City Law Department, the New York City District Attorneys' Offices, the New York State Office of the Attorney General, and other relevant agencies and partners as determined by the Director;
- b. Expand strategic enforcement efforts and reviews of property records and other documents that contain indicia of potential deed theft and monitor and promote City agency cooperation with the judiciary in their review of potential deed theft cases;
- c. Build on DOF's existing efforts to combat deed theft, including but not limited to flagging suspicious deed recordings, receiving and acting on homeowner complaints, monitoring trends and behaviors for enforcement purposes, working with law enforcement to pursue accountability, and advancing legislative and policy reforms;
- d. Conduct public education and outreach across all five boroughs, in coordination with relevant agencies and community partners, with particular focus on neighborhoods where deed theft is most prevalent;
- e. Promote preventive measures, including expanding enrollment in property and deed alert systems that notify owners of changes to property records;
- f. Identify and coordinate data and information sharing among City agencies and with New York State partner agencies, as appropriate, to identify instances of deed theft and trends that may assist enforcement efforts; and
- g. Perform any other duties assigned by the Mayor or the Commissioner of Finance to fulfill the purposes of this Order.

§ 3. Deed Theft Prevention Advocate. There shall be a Deed Theft Prevention Advocate in the Office who shall support homeowners and coordinate outreach across the City, including by assisting complainants through the reporting process and helping victims navigate the correction of records of the City Register and the county clerk of the county of Richmond and related property tax relief processes where applicable.

§ 4. Agency Cooperation. Mayoral agencies shall cooperate with and provide assistance to the Office upon request of the Director to carry out its duties.

§ 5. Effective Date. This Order shall take effect upon the execution of an agreement, pursuant to Section 1121 of the New York City Charter, between the Office of the Mayor and DOF, in order for DOF to provide budgetary, administrative, and similar functions, consistent with such section, for the Office.
